THE PROFITEERING ACT, 1919. MOTOR SPIRIT.

Whereas under the powers conferred upon them by the provisions of the Profiteering Act,

1919, the Board of Trade, by Order dated the 2nd day of October, 1919, fixed maximum prices for the sale of Motor Spirit used or capable of being used for supplying motive power to vehicles whether taxed or not, both wholesale and retail, and such Order was entitled "The Profiteering Act, 1919, Maximum Prices Order (No. 2)":

And whereas the Board of Trade think fit to revoke such Order:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade do hereby order that the Profiteering Act, 1919, Maximum Prices Order (No. 2) shall as and from the date of the signing hereof be revoked, but without prejudice to any liability incurred under or any penalty, forfeiture or punishment incurred in respect of any offence committed against such Order.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF TRADE
UNDER THE PROFITEERING ACT, 1919.**

Whereas Section 1 of the Profiteering Act, 1919, provides that the Act may be applied by Order of the Board of Trade to any article or class of articles declared by the Order to be one or one of a kind in common use by the public, or being material, machinery or accessories used in the production of such articles, but that the Act shall not apply to any articles which are from time to time declared to be controlled articles.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade do hereby declare that the articles or class of articles set out in the Schedule annexed hereto are articles of a kind in common use by the public and are articles which are not controlled, and do hereby order that the Profiteering Act, 1919, shall apply to each and every articles or class of articles contained in the Schedule to this Order.

This Order shall come into force forthwith,

and may be cited as the Profiteering Act, 1919, Order (No. 2).

DEFENCE OF THE REALM.

THE HAY (RETURNS) ORDER, DATED OCTOBER 16TH, 1919, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATIONS 2 G AND 2 JJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

The Board of Trade, deeming it expedient to make further exercise of the powers conferred on them by Regulations 2 G and 2 JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations for the purpose of regulating and maintaining the supply of Hay, hereby order as follows:—

1.—(a) Every person who has acquired or may hereafter acquire hay of the 1919 crop grown in Great Britain (whether chaffed or chopped or not) direct from the actual producer thereof, and whether such hay has been actually delivered or is still to be delivered to the person acquiring the same or to his order, and every person who has imported or may hereafter import into Great Britain hay of the 1919 crop produced outside Great Britain (whether chaffed or chopped or not) shall, subject to the provisions of Sub-clauses (b) and (c) hereof, on or before the 28th day of October, 1919, make to the Central Council, Forage Department (Board of Trade), 47, Victoria Street, Westminster, London, S.W. 1, a return in the form set out in the Schedule hereto (which return shall comprise all such hay so acquired or imported at any time prior to and including the 30th September, 1919), and shall thereafter, on or before the 4th day of each succeeding month, make a return in such form as aforesaid to the Central Council aforesaid in respect of the preceding month.

(b) Provided that a person acquiring or importing such hay solely to feed to animals in his possession or under his control need not make further returns after the first return except as regards such succeeding months in which he may have acquired or imported further quantities of such hay (unless he shall be required by the Central Council aforesaid to make a return for any particular month).

(c) The provisions of this Order shall not apply to hay acquired or imported and used for feeding to horses or other animals owned by the Army Council, the Admiralty, or the Air Ministry, or for feeding to horses maintained and used exclusively for agricultural purposes or for feeding to stallions used exclusively for stud purposes or for feeding to brood mares, weaned foals and yearlings.

2. If any person who is required by this Order to make a return refuses or without lawful excuse neglects to make a return as required by this Order to the best of his knowledge and belief or makes or causes to be made a false return, that person is guilty of a summary offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

3. In this Order "Hay" includes Clover, Mixtures and Sainfoin.

4.—(a) This Order may be cited as The Hay (Returns) Order, 1919, and shall come into force on the date of signature hereof.

(b) This Order does not apply to Ireland.

**THE AMERICAN GOOSEBERRY
MILDEW ORDER OF 1919.**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in

them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Application of the Order.

1. This Order shall apply to England and Wales.

Definitions.

2. In this Order—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries;

“Disease” means the disease affecting gooseberry and currant bushes which is known as *Sphaerotheca mors-uvae*, or American Gooseberry Mildew; and “diseased” means affected with disease;

“Bush” means a gooseberry bush or currant bush, and includes a cutting, stock, or seedling, and any part of a bush except the fruit;

“Inspector” means, where the context permits, an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority;

“The Local Authority” means, as regards any District, the Local Authority for the District under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Notification of Disease.

3. An outbreak or suspected outbreak of disease on premises on which gooseberry or currant bushes are grown for sale shall be reported forthwith to the Board or to an Inspector of the Board by the occupier of the premises.

Prohibition of Movement of Diseased Bushes.

4.—(1) No diseased bush shall be sold, offered for sale, or moved from any premises until it has been so pruned as to remove all visible traces of disease. An Inspector if he is not satisfied that the diseased bushes on any premises will be pruned before removal as required by this Article, may, by notice served on the occupier of the premises, prohibit the removal of the diseased bushes from the premises until he has passed them as being free from visible disease.

(2) An Inspector may, by notice served on the occupier of premises to which diseased bushes have been moved in contravention of this Article, require him to move the bushes forthwith to the premises from which they were so moved, or alternatively to move the bushes to other suitable premises specified in the notice, and to remove by pruning and to destroy all visible traces of disease before the bushes are again moved.

Powers of Dealing with Disease.

5.—(1) An Inspector may, upon production, if so required, of his appointment, enter and examine any premises on which gooseberry or currant bushes are growing, and if he finds diseased bushes thereon, and he is not satisfied that the occupier is taking sufficient steps to control the disease, he may, by notice served on the occupier of the premises, require him to adopt one or more of the following measures:

(a) to destroy all diseased fruit;

(b) to spray the bushes with a suitable fungicide to the satisfaction of the Inspector;

(c) to prune out and burn forthwith all diseased shoots from each tree or bush.

(2) A notice under this Article may prescribe the time within which the adoption of any measures thereby prescribed shall be completed.

Prohibition of Sale or Consignment of Diseased Gooseberries.

6. The sale or exposure for sale or consignment for sale of diseased fruit is prohibited; provided that this Article shall not apply to fruit consigned in bags direct to a factory for manufacturing purposes, but in such case the bags shall be sterilised by steam or destroyed immediately after the contents have been removed.

Information to be given as to Diseased Bushes.

7. Every person who has or has had in his possession or under his charge any diseased bushes and every person who as auctioneer, salesman, or otherwise has sold or offered for sale any such bushes shall, if so required in writing by the Board or an Inspector of the Board, give the Board or an Inspector of the Board, as the case may be, all such information as he possesses as to the persons in whose possession or under whose charge they are or have been; provided that any information given under this Article shall not be available as evidence against the person giving the same in any prosecution under the Order, except in respect of an alleged failure to comply with this Article.

Powers of Entry.

8. An Inspector, upon production if so required of his appointment, may for the purpose of enforcing the Order enter any land or premises and examine any bushes thereon.

Prohibition of Importation of Bushes.

9. The landing in England or Wales of any gooseberry bush brought from any place out of Great Britain (except the Channel Islands) is prohibited.

Service of Notices, &c.

10.—(1) For the purpose of this Order a notice shall be deemed to be served on any person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there; and a notice purporting to be signed by an Inspector shall be *prima facie* evidence that it was signed by him as an Inspector.

(2) A copy of every notice served under this Order shall be sent to the Board by the Inspector by whom the notice is signed.

Notification of Order.

11. This Order shall be published by each Local Authority in accordance with any direction given by the Board.

Offences.

12. Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty, not exceeding ten pounds, who does any act in contravention of this Order, or fails to do any act which, by this Order or any notice served on him under this Order, he is required to do.

Commencement.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, 1919.

Revocation of Order.

14. The Orders described in the Schedule hereto are hereby revoked: provided that such revocation shall not—

(1) affect the previous operation of any such Order or anything duly done or suffered under any such Order; or

(2) affect any right, privilege, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred under any such Order; or

(3) affect any penalty incurred in respect of any offence committed against any such Order; or

(4) affect any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, or penalty as aforesaid;

and any such investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed, as if this Order had not been made.

3. Provided that where a whole-time workman is employed by the week or any longer period, the wages payable to him for the hours of work agreed between him and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) shall not be less than the amounts specified in Clause 1 above and applicable to that workman, notwithstanding that those hours are less than 54.

4. Provided also that in the case of a workman of less than 18 years of age to whom this Order applies, the minimum rates and overtime rates shall, during the first two months of his employment in agriculture, be 20 per cent. less than the rates which, but for this provision, would be applicable to him under the preceding clauses of this Order.

5. For the purpose of the above rates the following employment is defined as overtime employment, that is to say:—

(a) All employment on a Sunday.

(b) All employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the workman.

(c) All employment in excess of 9½ hours on any other day.

6. For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a workman who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

7. This Order shall apply to all male workmen who are wholly or partly employed in agriculture within the meaning of Section 17 (1) of the Corn Production Act, 1917; in the above-mentioned area during such time as they are so employed.

8. This Order shall come into operation

on the twenty-seventh day of October, 1919.

Between 14 and 15 years of age, not less than 2s. per week.

Between 15 and 16 years of age, not less than 2s. 6d. per week.

Between 16 and 17 years of age, not less than 3s. per week.

Between 17 and 18 years of age, not less than 4s. 6d. per week,
more than the amount determined under the above Act for the area in which he is employed as the value of the provision of full board and lodging for a 7-day week for a workman of his age.

2. In this Order the expression "approved authority or organisation" means an authority or organisation which has for one of its objects the placing of boys in suitable employment and which is for the time being approved by the Board (by order or otherwise) for the purposes of this Order.

The Agricultural Wages Board, as required by the above Act and the Regulations made thereunder, will consider any objection to the above Proposed Order which may be lodged with them within one month of the date of this Notice. All objections should be in writing and should be addressed to the Secretary, the Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales), 80, Pall Mall, London, S.W. 1. The objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.
