By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

HEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition)
Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section I of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue

Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

- (1) That the following headings should be deleted:—
 - (A) Silver coin, British;

- (a) Fish, except the following:—Tinned, preserved or frozen fish, chinchards, sprats, herrings and crayfish.
- (2) That the following headings should be added:—

(A) Silver Bullion, Specie and British Coin;

(A) Fish, except the following:—Tinned, preserved or frozen fish, chinchards, sprats, herrings, crayfish and prawns.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 29th day of August, 1919, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property in the parish of Shipston-on-Stour, in the county of

Worcester, now vested in us:

"Whereas under and by virtue of an Indenture bearing date the 29th day of September, 1863, and made between Richard Badger the younger, of Shipston-on-Stour, in the county of Worcester, Gentleman, of the one part, and us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, of the other part, certain lands, tenements and hereditaments situate in the parish of Shipston-on-Stour aforesaid, shown within the green and pink verges on the Plan drawn on the said Indenture, and particularly described in the two Schedules thereto, became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us:

"And whereas the said lands, tenements

"And whereas the said lands, tenements and hereditaments are not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant, but are now in our possession, but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed:

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same or of the proceeds thereof for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said lands, tenements and hereditaments or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit should be sold or disposed of and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands, tenements and hereditaments or in any part or parts thereof in such manner as shall appear to us advisable:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said lands, tenements and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid, under and by virtue of the said Indenture with their appurtenances and all our estate, right, title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs, executors, administrators or assigns or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other public securities in England.
"And we further recommend and propose

that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other

Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been ap-

proved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the Diocese of Coventry.

Notice of Intention to make a Special ORDER TO BE CITED AS THE TRADE BOARDS (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief, and Household Goods and Linen Piece AND LINEN Goods) Order, 1919.

The Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that he intends, pursuant to the powers con-ferred upon him by section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to the trade specified in the appendix to this notice, and to vary any existing Act or Order affected thereby.

APPENDIX.

TRADE.

The Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Trade (that is to say):

- 1. The making of such articles as are specified in (a) and (b) below from linen or cotton or mixed linen and cotton fabrics (excepting knitted fabrics), or from other textile fabrics when the work is carried on in establishments mainly engaged in the making of such articles from the beforementioned fabrics, viz.:
 - (a) Handkerchiefs (including Mufflers or Flags when made in association or conjunction with Handkerchiefs);
 - (b) Bed Linen, Towels, Dusters, Table Napery, Bed Spreads, Tea Cloths, Table Centres, Sideboard Cushion Covers, or similar household articles;

including all or any of the following operations:

- (i) Hooking, cutting or tearing the material;

aternar;
(ii) Vice-folding;
(iii) Machine hemming, hem-stitching, spoking, over-locking, button-holing, and other plain or fancy machine stitching;

(iv) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework done by machine, whether before or after the making of the articles of the description specified above;

(v) The following processes if done by machine:—Thread drawing, thread-clipping, topsewing, scalloping, nickel-ling and paring; (vi) All processes of laundering,

- smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, finishing, warehousing, packing, and other similar operations incidental to or appertaining to the making of the articles specified above.
- 2. The making-up in linen warehouses or in establishments mainly engaged in linen lapping, or linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile fabrics in the piece, or of linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile articles cut from the piece, including:

cutting, lapping, orna-Measuring, menting, boxing, warehousing, packing and similar operations.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 and 1918.

The Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, for the Tin Box and Canister Trade in Great Britain

as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 12th June, 1914, have given notice that they have varied the General Minimum Time Rates for female workers from $5\frac{1}{2}$ d. to $7\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour, and for male workers (other than knife hands or press hands) of the age of 21 years and upwards from 34s. 3d. per week of 52 hours to 1s. per hour, and for male knife hands or press hands of the age of 21 years and upwards to 1s. 2d. per hour, with variations in the General Minimum Time Rates fixed for younger female and male workers.

The Trade Board have also given notice that they have fixed Piece Work Basis Time Rates for female and male workers 25 per cent. above the General Minimum Time Rates applicable, and have fixed Overtime Rates for male and female workers whether employed on Time Work or on Piece Work to apply to Overtime as defined by them on the basis of time and a quarter for the first two hours of overtime, time and a half thereafter and for all overtime on Saturdays, double time for all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory

The Trade Board have also given notice that have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 30th October, 1919, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the minimum rates of wages as varied and fixed by the Trade Board and specifying 3rd November, 1919, as the date from which the rates shall become effective.

On application to the Trade Board, further information will be given as to the minimum rates fixed, if in the opinion of the Trade Board the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.

This type of mine is hard to see, and special precautions are therefore necessary to ensure that a good lookout is kept. The striking of low floating flotsam should be avoided.

4. A serious accident has occurred to a vessel at anchor from the explosion of a drifting mine which came into contact with an obstruction on the hull.

When vessels have to anchor in areas where drifting mines may be found it is necessary that all obstructions should as far as possible be removed and gangways triced up before dark in order to minimise risk.
