WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm Regulations") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915, and other enactments:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner herein-after appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said regulations:—

1. In regulation 5A for the words "Road

Stone Control Committee" there shall be substituted the words "Joint Roads Committee."

2. In regulation 18A for the words "enemy agent" wherever they occur there shall be substituted the words "foreign agent," and for the definition of "enemy agent" the following definition shall be substituted:

"'foreign agent' includes any person who is or has been or is reasonably suspected of being or having been employed by a foreign power either directly or indirectly for the purpose of committing an act, either within or without the United Kingdom, prejudicial to the safety or interests of the State, or who has or is reasonably suspected of having, either within or without the United Kingdom, committed or attempted to commit such an act in the interests of a foreign power."

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) The County Court of Durham held at Bishop Auckland and Wolsingham shall cease to be held at Wolsingham, and shall be held at Bishop Auckland under the name of the County Court of Durham held at Bishop Auckland.

(2) The County Court of Lancashire held at Blackpool and Fleetwood shall cease to be held at Fleetwood, and shall be held at Blackpool under the name of the County Court of Lancashire held at Blackpool.

(3) The County Court of Lincolnshire held at Horncastle and Lincoln shall be held by the name of the County Court of Lincolnshire held at Lincoln and Horncastle.

(4) The County Court of Radnorshire held at Rhayader and Llandrindod Wells shall cease to be held at Rhayader, and shall be held at Llandrindod Wells under the name of the County Court of Radnorshire held at Llandrindod Wells.

(5) The County Court of Cheshire held at Wrexham and Llangollen shall cease to be held at Llangollen, and shall be held at Wrexham under the name of the County Court of Cheshire held at Wrexham.

(6) The County Court of Wiltshire held at Bradford-on-Avon and Trowbridge shall cease to be held at Bradford-on-Avon, and shall be held at Trowbridge under the name of the County Court of Wiltshire held at Trowbridge.

(7) This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1920, and shall be read with the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899, which shall have effect as amended by this Order.

BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.

In the Matter of David Bock.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied, as the result of an enquiry conducted by the Certificates of Naturalization (Revocation) Committee, that David Bock, to whom a certificate of naturalization, numbered 12739, was granted on the 15th August, 1902, has shown himself by act and speech to be disaffected and disloyal to His Majesty, and during the recent war unlawfully

traded with subjects of an enemy state, and was engaged in a business which was to his knowledge carried on in such manner as to assist an enemy in the war, and further that the continuance of the certificate is not conducive to the public good.

Now, therefore, by this Order, made in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section 7 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said certificate, and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof, and I further order the said certificate to be given up and to be cancelled.

PROFITEERING ACT, 1919.

Whereas by the Profiteering Act, 1919 (hereinafter referred to as the Act) certain powers are conferred on the Board of Trade with a view to the checking of profiteering:

And whereas under Section 2 of the Act the Board of Trade are empowered to authorise Local Authorities to establish Local Committees and to delegate to those committees any or all of the powers of the Board under the Act in respect of any articles or classes of articles or sales (except the power of the Board to fix prices) and to make regulations and give directions as to the constitution, powers and procedure of committees so established:

Now therefore, the Board of Trade in the exercise of the above recited powers do hereby authorise each Local Authority mentioned or referred to or included in the definition of the Schedule hereto to establish a Local Committee and do hereby delegate to all Local Committees so established all the powers of the Board in relation to retail sales under Section 1 of the Act (except the power of the Board to fix maximum prices under paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) and the powers of the Board under sub-section (7) of that section) and do hereby make the regulations set out in the Schedule hereto as to the constitution, powers and procedure of Local Committees established as aforesaid.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS FOR LOCAL COMMITTEES AND APPEAL TRIBUNALS ESTABLISHED UNDER THE PROFITEERING ACT, 1919, IN IRELAND.

Definitions.

In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires:

"The Act" means the Profiteering Act, 1919.

"Local Authority" means the Council of a Borough or other Urban District, including a County Borough and the Council of a Rural District.

"Local Committee" means any Local Committee appointed by the Local Authority under these regulations, or any Sub-Committee or Special Sub-Committee appointed by the Local Committee, and consisting of members of the Local Committee.

"Appeal Tribunal" means any Appeal Tribunal established by the Board of Trade under the Act, or any Committee of such Appeal Tribunal appointed by the Appeal Tribunal and consisting of members of the Appeal Tribunal.

"Prescribed" means Prescribed by the Board of Trade.

Other words or expressions which are defined by the Act have the same meaning as in the Act.

PART I.

Constitution of Local Committees.

1. The Local Authority may appoint a Local Committee under the Act consisting of not less than seven, and not more than twenty-five, members to act for the district of the Local Authority. Provided that the Board of Trade, in pursuance of its powers under the Act may make, as respects any particular district, any modification of this provision.

2. The Local Authority may from time to time appoint such additional members of the Local Committee as in the opinion of the Authority may be necessary; so, however, that there shall not at any time be more than twenty-five members. The Local Authority may also fill vacancies caused by death, retirement or otherwise on the Local Committee, and in any case in which they are of opinion that it is desirable, in order to secure the due administration of the Act so to do, the Local Authority may revoke the appointment of any member.

3. In the appointment of members of the Local Committee the Local Authority shall provide that not less than two members of the Committee shall be women. The Local Authority shall also provide for the adequate representation of Labour on each Committee.

4. The expenses of any Local Committee established by a Local Authority in Ireland shall be defrayed by the Local Authority out of the same fund or rates as expenses incurred by the Local Authority under the Public Health Act, 1878.

PROCEDURE.

5. The Local Committee shall elect a Chairman, who shall preside at the Meetings of the Committee. If the Chairman is absent from any meeting the members present shall choose one of themselves to preside, and that member shall, for the time being, have all the powers of the Chairman.

6. The Local Committee may appoint a clerk and such other officials as may be necessary, and the clerk may take proceedings on behalf of the Local Committee in a Court of Summary Jurisdiction.

7. The Local Committee may act through Sub-Committees appointed by the Local Committee consisting of members of the Local Committee, and containing one woman member and adequate representation of labour in each case,

and such Sub-Committee shall have all the powers of the Local Committee under these Regulations other than the power to take proceedings before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction. In any case in which the Sub-Committee consider that proceedings should be taken they shall report to the Local Committee, who may act on their report. These Regulations shall so far as applicable apply to such Sub-Committees.

8. The quorum of the Local Committee, or of any Sub-Committee of the Local Committee, shall be such number of members not being less than three as the Local Committee may decide.

9. All complaints to the Local Committee shall be heard in public, unless the Local Committee in any particular case, due regard being given to the interests of the parties and to all the circumstances of the case, direct that the complaint or any part of the proceedings thereon shall be heard in private; provided always that the Local Committee may exclude the parties and the public at any time during the hearing of a complaint for the purpose of conferring upon any question affecting the decision of the complaint.

10. Questions before the Local Committee shall be decided by a majority of such of the members of the Committee as are present and vote, but a member shall not take part in the consideration of, or vote upon any question relating to, a complaint where he is a trade competitor of the person against whom the complaint has been lodged (in this Part referred to as the Respondent), or in which such member is otherwise personally interested; and a member shall not vote on any question affecting the decision of the complaint unless he has been present throughout the proceedings upon the hearing of the complaint.

11. In the event of an equality of votes, the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

12. The Board of Trade may, if they think fit, prescribe notices and any other documents or forms which may be used for facilitating the proceedings of the Local Committee in the operation of the Act.

13. Notices and other documents required to be delivered to the Local Committee shall be sent to the office of the clerk to the Local Committee, and may be delivered at, or sent by post to, that office. Notices required to be sent to a complainant or to a respondent may be sent by post to or delivered at such person's place of business or usual or last known place of abode.

14. Unless otherwise directed in any case by the Board of Trade, a complaint shall be made to the Local Committee for the district or area in which the sale or transaction complained of took place.

Lodging and Hearing of Complaints.

15. The complaint shall be made in writing to the office of the clerk to the Local Committee, and shall be delivered at, or sent by post so as to be delivered at, that office within four days of the date of the sale or transaction which is the subject of the complaint or within such extended time as may be allowed by the Local Committee in any particular case. Provided that in no case shall the time be extended beyond fourteen days without the consent of the Board of Trade.

16. The written complaint shall be considered by the Local Committee, and in any case in which the Local Committee are of opinion that the complaint does not give the required particulars, or does not disclose *prima facie* grounds for hearing the complaint, it shall be competent to the Local Committee (a) after giving the complainant an opportunity of being heard to dismiss the complaint without calling upon the respondent; or (b) to notify the complainant that unless further and better particulars or grounds of complaint, as the case may be, be given, the complaint will be dismissed; and in the latter case unless such further and better particulars, or grounds of complaint, as appear to the Committee to justify further action on their part, are delivered to them not more than three days after such notification has been sent to the complainant, or within such extended time as may be allowed by the Local Committee, the complaint shall be dismissed.

Complaints delivered after the expiration of the fourth day after the date of the sale or transaction complained of, or after such extended time as may be allowed in any particular case, shall be dismissed forthwith.

17. If on the preliminary investigation or consideration of the complaint, the Local Committee are satisfied that a *prima facie* cause of complaint has been disclosed, the Local Committee shall hear the complaint, and at least three days before the hearing of the complaint shall send to the complainant and to the respondent notice in writing of the date and place fixed for the hearing.

18. For the purpose of ascertaining the facts relevant to the decision of the complaint the Local Committee shall hear such witnesses as they think fit, provided that they shall in all cases give the complainant and respondent an opportunity of being heard.

19. The Local Committee may summon to appear before them any person whom they wish to examine, and whose evidence may in their opinion be relevant to the complaint under investigation, and may call for the production of any documents relevant to the complaint.

20. The complainant and respondent may conduct their own case before the Local Committee, or may be represented by persons appointed by them for that purpose.

21. The Local Committee shall have power to require any person appearing before them to give evidence on oath, and shall have power to authorise any person to administer an oath for the purpose.

22. If upon the hearing of the complaint, the Local Committee are satisfied that a profit has been made, or has been sought, on the sale or offer for sale of an article which is, in view of all the circumstances, unreasonable, the Local Committee shall declare the price which would yield a reasonable profit, and shall require the seller to re-pay to the complainant any amount paid by the complainant in excess of such price, and they may take proceedings against the seller before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction. Provided always that in declaring the price which would yield a reasonable profit a rate of profit which does not exceed the fair average rate earned by persons in the same way of business as the seller upon the sale of similar articles under pre-war conditions shall not be deemed unreasonable.

23. If, on the hearing of the complaint, the Local Committee are not satisfied that an unreasonable profit has been made or sought, they shall dismiss the complaint.

24. The decision of the Local Committee upon a complaint shall be forthwith communicated in writing by the Local Committee to the complainant and to the respondent.

25. Either party to the complaint, if aggrieved by any order or decision of the Local Committee other than a decision to take proceedings before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction, may appeal to the Appeal Tribunal for the Area against the decision of the Local Committee by delivering to the Local Committee in the prescribed form in duplicate a notice of appeal, not later than three clear days after the decision in writing of the Local Committee shall have been delivered to the complainant and respondent, or within such extended time as, for good reasons shown, the Local Committee may allow.

The Local Committee shall thereupon send to the other party to the appeal the duplicate notice of appeal. If an appeal is duly made from the decision of the Local Committee action on any order made by the Local Committee respecting such decision shall be suspended until the decision of the Appeal Tribunal has been duly communicated to the Local Committee.

26. The Local Committee shall, in any case in which notice of appeal is given, send forthwith to the Appeal Tribunal for the Area the notice of appeal and the written complaint, together with any documents in the possession of the Local Committee relating to the complaint, and the Local Committee may indicate the reasons for their decision.

27. The Local Committee shall furnish to the Appeal Tribunal any other information respecting the decision of the Local Committee upon any complaint which is the subject of an appeal to the Appeal Tribunal, and may appoint a member of the Local Committee or some other person duly authorised in that behalf to appear and place before the Appeal Tribunal the grounds upon which the Local Committee came to the decision which is the subject of the Appeal.

28. A Register shall be kept by the Local Committee recording the decisions of the Local Committee and of any Sub-Committee on each complaint, together with a copy of the complaint.

PART II.

Appeal Tribunals.

29. There shall be Appeal Tribunals acting within such areas as the Board of Trade may appoint, consisting of such persons as may be appointed for the purpose by the Board of Trade.

30. The Appeal Tribunals may act through committees appointed by the Appeal Tribunal consisting of members of the Appeal Tribunal.

31. The Appeal Tribunal shall, unless a Chairman has been appointed by the Board of Trade, elect a Chairman who shall preside at the meetings of the Tribunal. If the Chairman is absent from any meetings the members present shall choose one of themselves to preside, who shall have all the powers of the Chairman.

32. The Regulations contained in the preceding paragraphs of these Regulations shall

so far as applicable apply in the case of the Appeal Tribunal, with the substitution of "Appeal Tribunal" for "Local Committee."

33. As soon as may be after receiving a notice of appeal the Appeal Tribunal shall fix a date for the hearing of the appeal, and at least three days before the date fixed the Appeal Tribunal shall send to the parties to the appeal, and to the Local Committee whose decision is the subject of the Appeal, notice in writing of the date and place fixed for the hearing of the appeal.

34. On the hearing of the appeal, the Appeal Tribunal may dismiss the appeal and confirm the decision of the Local Committee, or may vary the decision, as to them seems just, and may declare the price which would yield a reasonable profit, and require the seller to repay to the complainant any amount paid by the complainant in excess of such price. The Appeal Tribunal may also, if they think fit, take proceedings against the seller in a Court of Summary Jurisdiction.

35. The decision of the Appeal Tribunal shall be forthwith communicated in writing to the parties to the appeal, and to the Local Committee against whose decision the appeal has been made.

36. A record of the decision of the Appeal Tribunal on each appeal shall be entered in a register of appeals to be kept for the purpose.

SIR,

(1) The Profiteering Act, 1919, which was passed on the 19th August, 1919, empowers the Board of Trade as and when it appears necessary or expedient to establish or to authorise any Local Authority to establish Local or other Committees, and to delegate to such Local or other Committees any or all of the powers of the Board under the Act other than the power of the Board to fix prices.

The Act further authorises the Board of Trade to make Regulations, and to give directions as to the constitution, powers and procedure of the Committees to be established, and the districts for which such Committees shall act, and requires that such regulations shall provide for a right of appeal by the seller from any order or decision of the Local Committee other than a decision to take proceedings before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction.

Being convinced that the powers conferred on the Board by the Act can be most expeditiously and satisfactorily administered by Local Committees appointed by the Local Authorities, I have decided to invite the Local Authorities to appoint Local Committees, to which Committees I propose to delegate the power to investigate, hear, and determine all complaints arising out of the retail sale and distribution of those articles or classes of articles to which the Act shall from time to time be applied by order of the Board of Trade.

A copy of the Act and of the Regulations which have been made for the guidance and assistance of the Local Committees are enclosed herewith.

This circular sets out fully the constitution, powers and procedure of the Committee, and the matters with which the Committees will have to deal. For the purpose of easy reference the circular is divided into paragraphs.

(2) *The Scope of the Act.*—The Act only applies to any article or class of articles to which it is applied by Order of the Board of Trade, such article or class of articles being declared by the Order to be one or one of a kind in common use by the public or to be material, machinery, or accessories used in the production of such articles.

The Act does not apply to any articles which are from time to time declared to be controlled, nor to the sale of any article for export from the United Kingdom, nor to the sale of articles by public auction or competitive tender, nor does the Act apply to any sale or other transaction which took place before the passing of the Act.

It is intended that Orders shall be made from time to time by the Board of Trade applying the Act to the articles or class of articles set out in such Orders, and that copies of the Orders shall be supplied to the Local Committees. Copies of the Orders already made are enclosed herewith.

(3) *Constitution of Local Committees.*—In accordance with the provisions of the Act the Local Authorities, as defined in the Regulations, are invited to appoint Local Committees for their respective districts.

The number of persons to be appointed to such Local Committee is left to be determined by the Local Authority according to the needs of the district, but must not be less than seven or more than twenty-five.

Generally speaking, it is desirable that cases should be heard by a body of not more than five persons, but it is necessary to appoint more than this number to form the Local Committee because all the members will not be able always to be present. Furthermore, in some places it will, no doubt, be found convenient that the Committee should sit in separate sections, and at different centres. For this purpose the Regulations provide for the appointment of Sub-Committees.

This should not be done unless the circumstances are such as to make it clearly desirable and in determining what system to adopt the Local Authority will no doubt have regard to the requirements of the district.

In view of the fact that the Act only remains in force for a period of six months, it will be appreciated that it is desirable that the Local Committees should be appointed without delay. I shall accordingly be obliged if a meeting of the Local Authority is immediately convened for this purpose. A form is enclosed with this letter for giving particulars of the persons appointed to form the Local Committee, and this form should be returned to the Board of Trade within three days of the appointment of the Local Committee.

(4) *Qualification of Members of the Committee.*—The functions of the Local Committee will be of a judicial nature, and it is therefore important that persons should be appointed to the Committee who will consider the cases impartially.

Subject to the special provisions contained in the Act and Regulations as to the constitution of the Committee, it is left to the discretion of the Local Authority to appoint persons within

or without their own body, and they should not hesitate to select persons who are not members of the Authority, wherever this is desirable.

The Act and the Regulations provide for the inclusion of women on all Local Committees, and at least two members of each Local Committee should be women.

As the work of the Committees will closely concern the working classes, it is imperative that they should be adequately represented on the Committees.

(5) *Disqualification of Trade Competitors.*—The Act and Regulations provide that no member of the Local Committee shall sit or adjudicate in any case or complaint in which he is a Trade Competitor of the person against whom the complaint under investigation has been lodged.

The necessity for this provision will be clear to all the members of the Local Committee, and it is essential that this provision should be rigorously enforced otherwise the decision of the Committee may be nullified.

The Regulations further provide that no member of the Local Committee shall sit or adjudicate on any complaint in which he is in any way personally interested.

(6) *Expenses of the Local Committee.*—In accordance with the provisions of Sub-Section (1) of Section 7 of the Act, the expenses of any Local Committee established by the Local Authorities are to be defrayed by the Local Authorities out of such fund or rate, and in such manner as may be directed by the Board of Trade.

The Board of Trade accordingly direct in the Regulations that the expenses of any Local Committee established in Ireland shall be defrayed by the Local Authority in like manner as if they were expenses under the Public Health Act, 1878. Any fines imposed at the instance of a Local Committee established by a Local Authority under the Act are to be applied in aid of the same fund or rate.

(7) *Procedure.*—The Regulations provide that the complaints shall be made to the Local Committee in writing within four days of the date of the sale or transaction which is the subject of the complaint or within such extended time, not exceeding fourteen days, as the Local Committee may allow. On the hearing of the complaint the Local Committee are entitled subject to any special provision in the Regulations to regulate their own procedure.

(8) *Evidence.*—Subject to any special directions contained in the Regulations it will be for the Local Committee to determine what evidence shall be taken to elucidate the facts of the complaint under consideration. The complainant and respondent to the complaint have the right of being heard by the Committee in all cases, and may appear by themselves or by Counsel or Solicitor, or other person appointed by them for the purpose.

The Regulations entitle the Local Committee to summon any person to appear before the Committee, and to furnish such information and produce such documents as the Committee may require. In the event of any person failing to comply with any Order of the Local Committee (which would include an Order summoning him to appear before the Committee), he will be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding Fifty Pounds,

or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month, or to both such imprisonment and fine.

The Committee will only call before them persons whose evidence is relevant to the complaint which is the subject of investigation, and the Committee should only take proceedings in a Court of Summary Jurisdiction for failure to comply with a summons to appear before the Committee when it is clearly established that the failure to appear has been occasioned as a result of wilful defiance, *e.g.*, refusal to comply with one or more orders of the Committee after due warning of the penalty involved.

(9) *Production of Documents.*—In accordance with the Regulations the Local Committee are entitled to call for the production of such documents as may be required by the Committee for the purpose of investigating, hearing or determining any complaint or complaints.

Local Committees will note particularly the provisions of Regulation 9 to the effect that all complaints to a Local Committee are to be heard in public unless in any particular case, due regard being given to the interests of the parties and to all the circumstances of the case, the Local Committee direct that the complaint or any part of the proceedings thereon shall be heard in private. The power to direct proceedings to be heard in private should be exercised in any case where an application for the purpose is made by any person or where any person is required to produce confidential books or documents and any books or documents produced or information given in the course of proceedings held in private must be treated as confidential unless the person giving or producing the same otherwise agrees, or in cases where the information and documents are required for the purpose of legal proceedings.

A form for summoning witnesses to appear before the Local Committee and calling for the production of documents is enclosed herewith,

(10) *False Statements.*—In accordance with the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the Act, if any person on any investigation or complaint shall knowingly or recklessly furnish information or make any representation which is false in any material particular, he will be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding Fifty Pounds, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months, or to both such imprisonment and fine.

Proceedings should only be taken under Section 1 (4) of the Act in cases in which the Local Committee or Appeal Tribunal, as the case may be, are satisfied that the information given or representations made were given or made with the wilful intention of misleading the Committee or Tribunal or recklessly without belief in their truth.

(11) *Jurisdiction of the Committee on the Hearing of the Complaint.*—On the hearing of the complaint the Local Committee, after giving the parties an opportunity of being heard, may either dismiss the complaint, or may, if they are satisfied that the profit made or sought on the retail sale of the article which is the subject of the complaint was, in view of all the circumstances, unreasonable, declare the price which would yield a reasonable profit, and require the seller to repay to the complainant any amount paid by the complainant in excess of such reasonable price.

In addition to making the Order referred to above the Local Committee may take proceedings against the seller in a Court of Summary Jurisdiction, and if, on such proceedings, the Court is satisfied that the price charged or sought was such as to yield a profit which is in view of all the circumstances unreasonable, the seller will be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding Two Hundred Pounds, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months, or to both such imprisonment and fine.

The Local Committee should only take proceedings in a Court of Summary Jurisdiction in cases in which the Local Committee are satisfied, after due consideration, that the circumstances are such as to justify proceedings being taken, and that there is a reasonable prospect of such proceedings being successful. In deciding whether proceedings should be taken in any particular case the Local Committee should have regard to all the circumstances of the case. In accordance with the provisions of the Act any fines imposed by a Court of Summary Jurisdiction on proceedings initiated at the instance of the Local Committee are to be applied in aid of the fund or rate out of which the expenses of the Local Committee are required to be paid. It must, however, be borne in mind that in the event of any proceedings initiated by the Local Committee being unsuccessful it is in the power of the Court to make an order for the costs of such proceedings against the Local Committee.

(12) *Appeals.*—The Regulations provide for Appeal Tribunals to which appeals may be made by either party to the complaint from any order or decision of the Local Committee other than a decision to take proceedings before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction.

A list of the Appeal Tribunals, together with the names and addresses of the clerks will be sent to the Local Committees in due course. The Areas of the Appeal Tribunals will be counties or combinations of counties. Pending the receipt of the lists containing the names and addresses of the clerks to the Appeal Tribunals, any appeals lodged against the decision of the Local Committee will be retained by the clerk to such Local Committee.

An appeal from the decision of the Local Committee to the Appeal Tribunal must be made not later than three clear days after the decision in writing of the Local Committee shall have been delivered to the parties to the complaint, or within such extended time as for good reasons shown the Local Committee may allow. A form is prescribed, of which a copy is enclosed, for making the appeal.

(13) *Alleged Profiteering by Wholesale Traders to be referred to the Board of Trade.*—If upon the investigation, or determination of any complaint it shall appear to the Local Committee or Appeal Tribunal that the price charged or sought about which the complaint was made is in view of all the circumstances unreasonable, but that the unreasonable price so charged or sought was due to the price charged by the wholesale trader the Local Committee or Appeal Tribunal should dismiss the complaint and may refer the case to the Board of Trade.

(14) *Restriction of Trade to be Avoided.*—Local Committees and Appeal Tribunals should bear in mind that it is not the intention

of the Board of Trade to take any action which will hamper or restrict legitimate commercial enterprise or which will prevent any person or company from making a reasonable profit on their business transactions.

Local Committees and Appeal Tribunals should have regard to this when exercising the powers conferred upon them by the Board.

(15) *Proceedings of a Committee or Tribunal are Privileged.*—The Act provides that any investigation by a Committee or Tribunal appointed under the Act shall for the purposes of the law relating to libel and slander be deemed to be proceedings before a Court exercising judicial authority.

(16) *Publicity.*—In order that the establishment of the Local Committee may be brought to the notice of members of the public it is desirable that notification of the establishment of a Local Committee, and of the action to be taken to bring complaints to the notice of the Committee should be advertised or published in the local press circulating in the district of each Local Committee.

(17) *Report of Cases decided by each Local Committee and Appeal Tribunal.*—Each Local Committee and Appeal Tribunal should render a report to the Board of Trade on the first Monday in each month giving particulars of each complaint or appeal heard and determined by the Local Committee or Appeal Tribunal, as the case may be, during the preceding month, together with the decision thereon. The report should also contain particulars of any proceedings taken before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction, and the decision of the Court on such proceedings.

PROFITEERING ACT, 1919.

Whereas under Section 2 of the Profiteering Act, 1919, the Board of Trade are empowered to authorise Local Authorities to establish Local Committees and to make Regulations and give directions as to the constitution, powers and procedure of the Local Committees so established:

And whereas by Order dated the 9th September, 1919, the Board of Trade did authorise Local Authorities to establish Local Committees and did make the Regulations set out in the Schedule to the said Order giving directions as to the constitution, powers and procedure of the Local Committees established by Local Authorities:

And whereas by Order dated the 2nd October, 1919, the Board of Trade did make Regulations and did give directions as to the constitution, powers and procedure of such Joint Local Committees as may from time to time be established by two or more Local Authorities with the consent of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is now deemed expedient to amend Regulations 3, 6, 13, 15, 16 and 30 of the Regulations made on the 9th September, 1919, and 2nd October, 1919, respectively:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in exercise of the above recited powers, do hereby rescind Regulations 3, 6, 13, 15, 16 and 30 of the Regulations made on the 9th September, 1919, and 2nd October, 1919, respectively, and do hereby make the Regulations set out in the

Schedule to this Order in lieu of the Regulations hereby rescinded.

SCHEDULE.

AMENDED REGULATIONS FOR LOCAL COMMITTEES AND JOINT LOCAL COMMITTEES UNDER THE PROFITEERING ACT, 1919.

3. In the appointment of Members of the Local Committee the Local Authority shall provide that not less than two members of the Committee shall be women. The Local Authority shall also provide for the adequate representation of labour on each Committee, and in order to provide for compliance with Regulation 30 shall further provide for the representation of the Local Food Control Committee by the appointment to the Local Committee of not less than three members of the Local Food Control Committee or three members nominated by the Local Food Control Committee having jurisdiction in the district.

6. The Local Committee may appoint a Clerk and such other officers as may be considered necessary, and the Clerk may take proceedings on behalf of the Local Committee in a Court of Summary Jurisdiction.

13. Notices and other documents required to be delivered to the Local Committee shall be sent to the Office of the Clerk to the Local Committee, and may be delivered at, or sent by post to, that office. Notices required to be sent to a complainant or to a respondent may be sent by post to or delivered at such person's place of business or usual or last known place of abode.

15. The complaint shall be made in writing to the Office of the Clerk to the Local Committee, and shall be delivered at, or sent by post, so as to be delivered at, that office within four days of the date of the sale or transaction which is the subject of complaint, or within such extended time as may be allowed by the Local Committee in any particular case, provided that in no case shall the time be extended beyond fourteen days without the consent of the Board of Trade.

16. The written complaint shall be considered by the Local Committee, and in any case in which the Local Committee are of opinion that the complaint does not give the required particulars, or does not disclose prima facie grounds for hearing the complaint, it shall be competent to the Local Committee (a) after giving the complainant an opportunity of being heard, to dismiss the complaint without calling upon the respondent; or (b) to notify the complainant that unless further and better particulars or grounds of complaint, as the case may be, be given the complaint will be dismissed; and in the latter case unless such further and better particulars, or grounds of complaint, as appear to the Committee to justify further action on their part, are delivered to them not more than three days after such notification has been sent to the complainant, or within such extended time as may be allowed by the Local Committee, the complaint shall be dismissed.

30. The Special Sub-Committee shall consist of five members, of whom not less than three shall be members of the Local Food Control Committee or shall be members nominated by the Local Food Control Committee having jurisdiction in the district.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS FIXED) FOR
FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS.

EFFECTIVE AS FROM 1ST DECEMBER, 1919.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Corset Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919, having given due notice on 16th August, 1919, of Proposal to Fix General Minimum Time Rates, Piece-work Basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Female and Male Workers, hereby give Notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they have fixed General Minimum Time Rates, Piece-work Basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Female and Male Workers, and have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as fixed are as shown in the Schedule set out below, which is incorporated herewith.

And the Trade Board further give Notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 25th November, 1919, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the minimum rates of wages fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying 1st December, 1919,* as the date from which such minimum rates of wages shall become effective.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 7th December, 1919.

(i) The general minimum Time-Rates for learners under 14 years of age shall be 9s. per week of 48 hours, or 2½d. per hour, and from the age of 14 years they shall be entitled to the amounts shown in column I above as if they had commenced at 14.

(ii) The weekly rates set out above are based on a week of 48 hours, and are subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours actually spent by the learner in the factory or workshop in any week is less than 48.

(iii) The advances to be given to learners commencing at under 21 years of age shall become due as from the first Monday in January and July of each year, the learner being entitled to her first advance from the first Monday in January or July as the case may be, provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.

(iv) A learner shall cease to be a learner and be entitled to the full general minimum Time-Rate applicable to her under Section I (a) of Part I of this Schedule, upon the fulfilment of the following conditions:—

Age of Entering upon Employment and Conditions.

Under 15 years of age—

The completion of not less than 3 years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years.

15 and under 16 years of age—

The completion of not less than 2 years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years.

16 and under 21 years of age—

The completion of 2 years' employment.

21 years of age and over—

The completion of 1 year's employment.

(v) No female learner shall be held to be entitled to the full general minimum Time-Rate under Sub-section (a) of this Section until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had. Provided that in determining the age of entry and the length of employment all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

Section II.—*Male Workers.*

Workers of 22 years of age and upwards, 1s. 1½d. per hour.

Workers of 21 and under 22 years of age, 1s. per hour.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 10½d. per hour.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 9d. per hour.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 7½d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 6d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 5d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 4d. per hour.

Workers under 15 years of age, 3d. per hour.

Workers commencing employment in the Corset Trade for the first time at and over the age of 19 may serve a period of 6 months at 7d. per hour, and thereafter a period of six months at 8½d. per hour. On the expiration of one year's service in the trade, these workers shall receive such rates as their age may entitle them to under the foregoing provisions.

PART II.

PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME RATES.

Section I.—Female Workers.

(a) All Female Workers other than Home-workers, 9½d. per hour.

(b) Home-workers, 9½d. per hour.

In the case of all female workers employed on piece work, each piece rate paid must be such as will yield in the circumstances of the case not less than 9½d. per hour to an *ordinary worker*. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers other than learners.

Section II.—Male Workers.

All Male Workers, 1s. 3½d. per hour.

In the case of all male workers employed on piece work, each piece rate paid shall be such as would yield in the circumstances of the case not less than 1s. 3½d. per hour to an *ordinary worker*. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers of 22 years of age and upwards.

PART III.

OVERTIME RATES—MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS—ALL AGES.

Section I.

(a) In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On any day (other than Saturday)	9
On Saturday	5

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

Section II.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker, *whether engaged on Time work or on Piece work*, in excess of such normal number of hours, shall be as follows, that is to say:—

1. For the *first two hours'* overtime on any day, except Saturdays, Sundays, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rates shall be equivalent to *time and a quarter*—that is to say, one and a quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

2. For overtime *after the first two hours'* overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays,

and for all overtime on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to *time and a half*—that is to say, one and a half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

3. For all time worked on *Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays* the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to *double time*—that is to say, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

4. For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be *time and a quarter*, except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section. The Overtime Rate shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds 9 or, in the case of Saturday, exceeds 5, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided—

(a) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on 5 days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9½.

(b) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

But in the application of these provisos, where the employer requires attendance on any day on which it is not the established practice of the employer to require attendance, all time worked on such day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) shall be paid for at time and a quarter for the first two hours and time and a half thereafter.

NOTE.—The hours of work which female workers and young persons are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.

PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

SECTION I.—A female learner is a worker who—

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning, and

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if she

works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION II.—The expression "Home-worker" shall be held to mean a worker who works in her own home or any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART V.

The above minimum rates of wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Act, to all workers who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

(a) The manufacture of corsets, stays, children's corset bodices, infants' stay bands, bust confiners, such as brassieres and bandeaux when boned or with elastic webbing in their construction.

(b) The manufacture of support or abdominal belts and similar articles except where made in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of surgical instruments.

(c) The assembling of stocking suspenders in conjunction with or in association with the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

(d) All warehousing, packing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above General Minimum Time Rates, Piece-work basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above General Minimum Time Rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

GENERAL ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) REGULATING THE SALE AND SUPPLY OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR ON CHRISTMAS DAY IN ENGLAND AND WALES.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following General Order:—

Areas to which the Order Applies.

1. This Order applies to all areas or parts of areas situate in England or Wales to which the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, have been applied.

Hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold on Christmas Day.

2. The hours during which intoxicating liquor may (subject to the provisions of Article 3 hereof) be sold and supplied on Christmas Day in licensed premises and clubs, whether for consumption on or off the premises shall be as follows:—

(a) In the Welsh Area and the West Gloucestershire Area, the hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m. for consumption on the premises, and the hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. for consumption off the premises.

(b) In each of the other areas, the hours during which by the provisions of Article 2 of the Orders of the Board for the said areas such sale or supply for consumption on or off the premises is permitted on Sundays.

And Article 2 of each of the said Orders of the Board shall be read as if the provisions of this Article were inserted therein.

Sale of Spirits for Consumption off the Premises Prohibited.

3. No spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club or be dispatched or taken therefrom on Christmas Day, and Article 3 of each of the said Orders shall be read as if the provisions of this Article were inserted therein.

Duration of the Order.

2. This Order shall be in force on the 15th, 16th, 17th, 18th, 19th, 20th, 22nd, 23rd and 24th days of December, 1919.

Effect of Order.

3. During such time as this Order is in force it shall be lawful, notwithstanding anything to

the contrary contained in the Orders of the Board for the aforesaid areas, to despatch intoxicating liquor from licensed premises at any time in the forenoon.

Provided always that nothing herein shall be deemed to authorise the despatch of spirits on Saturday, the 20th day of December.

Other Provisions of the Orders to Remain in Force.

4. Save as by this Order expressly provided, the provisions of each of the said Orders shall remain in full force.
