### CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD.

The three Warrants set forth below are concerned with the establishment of the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Force Cross, the Distinguished Flying Medal and the Air Force Medal, the institution of which was announced in the London Gazette of 3rd June, 1918 (No. 30723, page 6533):—

#### ROYAL WARRANT INSTITUTING DECORATIONS AND MEDALS FOR THE ROYAL AIR FORCE.

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India: To all to whom these presents shall come. Greeting!

Whereas We are desirous of signifying Our appreciation of acts of valour, courage and devotion to duty performed by Officers and Men in Our Air Force and in the Air Forces of Our Self-governing Dominions beyond the Seas, We do hereby, for Us, Our heirs and successors, institute and create two decorations to

be designated the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Force Cross, and two Medals, to be designated the Distinguished Flying Medal and the Air Force Medal, and We do hereby direct that the following regulations shall be made governing the said Decorations and Medals:—

Firstly. It is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Cross shall be granted only to such Officers and Warrant Officers of Our said Forces as shall be recommended to Us for an act or acts of valour, courage or devotion to duty performed whilst flying in active operations against the enemy.

Secondly. It is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Cross shall be silver and shall consist of a Cross flory terminated in the horizontal and base bars with bombs, the upper bar terminating with a rose, surmounted by another cross composed of aeroplane propellers charged in the centre with a roundel within a wreath of laurels a rose winged ensigned by an Imperial Crown thereon the letters R.A.F. On the reverse the Royal Cypher above the date 1918. The whole attached to the clasp and ribbon by two sprigs of laurel.

Thirdly. It is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Cross shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a ribbon one inch and a quarter in width, which shall be in colour

violet and white in alternate horizontal stripes of one-eighth of an inch in depth.

Fourthly. It is ordained that the award of the Distinguished Flying Cross shall entitle the recipient to have the initials D.F.C. appended to his name.

Fifthly. It is ordained that the Air Force Cross shall be granted only to such Officers and Warrant Officers of Our said Forces as shall be recommended to us for an act or acts of valour, courage or devotion to duty whilst flying though not in active operations against the enemy.

Sixthly. It is ordained that the Air Force Cross shall be silver and shall consist of a thunderbolt in the form of a cross, the arms conjoined by wings, the base bar terminating with a bomb surmounted by another cross composed of aeroplane propellers, the four ends enscribed with the letters G.V.R.I. In the centre a roundel thereon, a representation of Hermes mounted on a hawk in flight bestowing a wreath. On the reverse the Royal Cypher above the date 1918. The whole ensigned by an Imperial Crown and attached to the clasp and ribbon by two sprigs of laurel.

Seventhly. It is ordained that the Air Force Cross shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a ribbon one inch and a quarter in width, which shall be in colour red and white in alternate horizontal stripes of one-eighth of an inch in depth.

Eighthly. It is ordained that the award of the Air Force Cross shall entitle the recipient to have the initials A.F.C. appended to his name.

Ninthly. It is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Medal shall be granted only to such Non-commissioned Officers and Men of Our said Forces as shall be recommended to Us for an act or acts of valour, courage or devotion to duty performed whilst flying in active operations against the enemy.

Tenthly. It is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Medal shall be silver and oval-shaped, bearing Our Effigy on the obverse and on the reverse within a wreath of laurel a representation of Athena Nike seated on an aeroplane, a hawk rising from her right arm above the words "for Courage." The whole ensigned by a bomb attached to the clasp and ribbon by two wings.

Eleventhly. It is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Medal shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a ribbon of one inch and a quarter in width, which shall be in colour violet and white in alternate horizontal stripes of one-sixteenth of an inch in depth.

Twelfthly. It is ordained that the award of the Distinguished Flying Medal shall entitle the recipient to have the initials D.F.M. appended to his name.

Thirteenthly. It is ordained that the Air Force Medal shall be granted only to such Non-commissioned Officers and Men of Our said Forces as shall be recommended to Us for an act or acts of valour, courage, or devotion to duty performed whilst flying, though not in active operations against the enemy.

Fourteenthly. It is ordained that the Air Force Medal shall be silver and oval-shaped, bearing Our Effigy on the obverse and on the reverse within a wreath of laurel a representation of Hermes mounted on a hawk in flight bestowing a wreath. The whole ensigned by a bomb attached to the clasp and ribbon by two wings.

Fifteenthly. It is ordained that the Air Force Medal shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a ribbon one inch and a quarter in width, which shall be in colour red and white in alternate horizontal stripes of one-sixteenth of an inch in depth.

Sixteenthly. It is ordained that the award of the Air Force Medal shall entitle the recipient to have the initials A.F.M. appended to his name.

Seventeenthly. It is ordained that Foreign Officers and gradings of an equivalent rank to those above mentioned who have been associated in Military operations with Our Army or Our Indian, Dominion or Colonial Military Forces, shall be eligible for the award of the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Force Cross, the Distinguished Flying Medal, and the Air Force Medal.

Eighteenthly. It is ordained that in cases where Officers, Warrant Officers, and Men who have been awarded one of the above decorations or medals shall be recommended for a further act of valour, courage or devotion to duty, he shall be awarded a bar to be attached to the ribbon by which the decoration or medal is suspended, and for every additional such act an additional bar may be awarded.

Nineteenthly. It is ordained that the names of those upon whom We may be pleased to confer the above decorations and medals shall be published in the London Gazette, and that a Register thereof shall be kept in the Office of Our Secretary of State for the Royal Air Force.

Twentiethly. It is ordained that any person whom by an especial Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual We declare to have forfeited the above decorations, medals and bars shall return the same to the Office of Our Secretary of State for the Royal Air Force, and that his name shall be erased from the Register of those upon whom the said decorations, medals and bars shall have been conferred.

Lastly. We reserve to Ourselves, Our heirs and successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting, or dispensing with these Regulations or any part thereof by a notification under Our Royal Sign Manual.

ROYAL WARRANT AMENDING THE THIRD, SEVENTH, ELEVENTH AND FIFTEENTH CLAUSES OF THE ROYAL WARRANT INSTITUTING DECORATIONS AND MEDALS FOR THE ROYAL AIR FORCE.

Whereas We did, by Royal Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated 3rd June, 1918, institute and create two decorations designated

the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Force Cross and two Medals designated the Distinguished Flying Medal and the Air Force Medal to be awarded to Officers and Men in Our Air Force and in the Air Forces of Our Self-governing Dominions beyond the Seas in recognition of acts of valour, courage and devotion to duty:

And whereas We are desirous that certain alterations should be made in the regulations governing the said Decorations and Medals:

Now, therefore, We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, ordain that the following ordinances shall be substituted for the corresponding ordinances in the said Royal Warrant, and shall henceforth be construed and have the same effect as if they formed part of the said Royal Warrant:—

Thirdly. It is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Cross shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a ribbon one inch and a quarter in width which shall be in colour violet and white in alternate diagonal stripes of one-eighth of an inch in width running at an angle of 45 degrees from left to right.

Seventhly. It is ordained that the Air Force Cross shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a ribbon one inch and a quarter in width which shall be in colour red and white in alternate diagonal stripes of one-eighth of an inch in width running at an angle of 45 degrees from left to right.

Eleventhly. It is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Medal shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a ribbon of one inch and a quarter in width which shall be in colour violet and white in alternate diagonal stripes of one-sixteenth of an inch in width, running at an angle of 45 degrees from left to right.

Fifteenthly. It is ordained that the Air Force Medal shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a ribbon one inch and a quarter in width which shall be in colour red and white in alternate diagonal stripes of one-sixteenth of an inch in width running at an angle of 45 degrees from left to right.

And whereas We are desirous that certain alterations should be made in the regulations governing the said Decorations and Medals.

It is ordained that the Air Force Cross shall be granted to such Officers and Warrant Officers of Our said Forces as shall be recommended to Us for an act or acts of valour, courage or devotion to duty whilst flying though not in active operations against the enemy, and may also be granted to individuals not belonging to Our Air Force (whether Naval, Military or Civil) who render distinguished service to Aviation in actual flying.

Thirteenthly. It is ordained that the Air Force Medal shall be granted to such Non-commissioned Officers and Men of Our said Forces as shall be recommended to Us for an act or acts of valour, courage or devotion to duty performed whilst flying though not in active operations against the enemy, and may also be granted to individuals not belonging to Our Air Force (whether Naval, Military or Civil) who render distinguished service to Aviation in actual flying.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM  
(LIQUOR CONTROL).ORDER (FURTHER AMENDMENT) OF THE

**DIRECTIONS OF THE BOARD OF TRADE AS TO THE SALE OF COAL FOR BUNKERING CERTAIN SHIPS AT PORTS IN THE UNITED KINGDOM, DATED THE 27TH NOVEMBER, 1919.**

1. Subject as hereinafter provided—the prices specified in the Schedule hereto shall be charged as fixed prices for all coal supplied for bunkering the following ships or classes of ships on or after the 1st December, 1919 (including coal supplied under existing contracts), such coal being limited to coal for the ship's own use:—

- (a) Trawlers and other fishing boats;
- (b) Ships engaged in the coasting trade of the United Kingdom while actually so engaged;
- (c) Tugs, barges and other miscellaneous craft whilst navigating inland waters or in, near, or about the coasts of the United Kingdom.

2. Where the coal is sold to a broker, merchant or exporter, the broker's, merchant's or exporter's commission on re-sale must be charged by way of addition to the colliery price.

3. Except where otherwise specified in the Schedule, the prices are nett f.o.b. at the nearest shipping places to the collieries and for cash within seven days after shipment. Where it has been the custom for owners of regular liners to receive longer credit, the practice may be continued in respect of bunkers supplied to them for such liners, provided that the above nett payment shall in every case be made not later than the 25th of the month following the delivery of the coal. If the coal is shipped at a more distant place the extra railway and shipping dues may be charged.

Provided that the extra railway and shipping dues as compared with those for shipment at the nearest shipping place to the colliery must in all cases be charged for coal when shipped at ports outside the limits prescribed below for each colliery district, namely:—

*Scotland.*

Scottish ports south of the Tay.

*Northumberland.*

Amble and shipping places on the Tyne (south side).

*Durham.*

Middlesbrough and shipping places on the Tyne (north side).

*Cumberland.*

Cumberland ports.

*Lancashire.*

Lancashire ports and Birkenhead.

*North Wales.*

Mersey ports and ports in Cheshire and Flintshire.

*Yorkshire, Nottingham, Derby and Leicester.*

(1) Humber ports, including Grimsby.

(2) Lancashire ports and Birkenhead.

Provided also that in the case of anthracite from collieries in South Wales shipped at ports east of Port Talbot, the extra railway and shipping dues, as compared with those for shipment at the nearest shipping place to the colliery, shall in all cases be charged.

4.—(a) These prices are nett, and no discount, rebate or allowance of any kind, either in money, quantity, credit or otherwise, is to be given to any buyer, and the quantities to be paid for shall be the quantities certified by the colliery, railway or harbour authority as customary.

5. Part V of the Directions of the Board of Trade as to the Sale of Coal, dated the 28th May, 1919, shall not on and after the 1st December, 1919, apply to the sale of coal for bunkering the ships or classes of ships specified in Article 1 of these Directions.

6. These Directions shall not apply to purchases made by the Admiralty.

7. These Directions and the prices specified in the attached Schedule may be varied as occasion requires.

**GENERAL MINIMUM TIME RATES AND OVERTIME  
RATES FOR SPECIAL CLASSES OF FEMALE  
WORKERS**

EFFECTIVE AS FROM 1ST DECEMBER, 1919.\*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under that Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the branches of trade covered by the Trade Boards (Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving) Order, 1913, that is to say, the making of sugar confectionery, cocoa, chocolate, jam, marmalade, preserved fruits, fruit and table jellies, meat extracts, meat essences, sauces and pickles; the preparation of meat, poultry, game, fish, vegetables and fruit for sale in a preserved state in tins, pots, bottles and similar receptacles; the processes of wrapping, filling, packing and labelling in respect of articles so made or prepared, excluding the covering and filling of biscuits, wafers and cakes with chocolate or sugar confectionery, having given due notice on 17th June, 1919, of Proposal to Vary the Minimum Rates for female workers then in operation in respect of certain classes of Female Workers, hereby give notice that they have varied such Minimum Rates in respect of the classes of Female Workers specified in Section (1) of the Schedule set out below, and that the Minimum Rates as varied are shown in the Schedule set out below which is incorporated herewith.

And the Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 28th November, 1919, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates as varied by the Trade Board, and specifying 1st December, 1919,\* as

the date from which such Minimum Rates shall become effective.

\*NOTE. Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 7th December, 1919.

**SCHEDULE.**

**SECTION I.—The General Minimum Time Rates for Female Workers who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any of the following occupations, that is to say:—**

Cocoa making.

Boiling sugar for boiled sweets, other than the boiling of sugar in vacuum pans.

Broguing of hermetically sealed receptacles containing meat, poultry, fish or soup, during process of cooking.

Hand-soldering of hermetically sealed receptacles containing meat, poultry, fish or soup.

Tongue pumping.

Butchers' or pork-butchers' work in preparing meat for sausages or "smalls."

Brining vegetables for pickling.

Making extract of meat.

shall be as follows:—

Workers of 24 years of age and upwards,  
11d. per hour, *i.e.*, 44s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 23 and under 24 years of age,  
10½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 41s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 22 and under 23 years of age,  
9¾d. per hour, *i.e.*, 39s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 21 and under 22 years of age,  
9¼d. per hour, *i.e.*, 37s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age,  
8d. per hour, *i.e.*, 32s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age,  
7d. per hour, *i.e.*, 28s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age,  
6d. per hour, *i.e.*, 24s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age,  
5½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 22s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age,  
4½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 17s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age,  
3½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 13s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers under 15 years of age, 2½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 9s. per week of 48 hours.

**SECTION II.—The above General Minimum Time Rates shall be payable subject to the following condition:—**

That in the case of workers under 24 years of age the minimum rates are payable subject to the worker being employed under conditions which in the circumstances of the case afford a reasonable prospect of advancement to the minimum rate of 44s. per week of 48 hours. Otherwise the minimum rate payable shall be 44s. per week of 48 hours irrespective of age.

**SECTION III.—The Overtime Rates shall be payable, calculated in the manner set out in the Schedule of the Notice fixing minimum rates for overtime issued by the Trade Board and dated 6th June, 1919, and shall apply in substitution for the above general minimum time-rates in respect of all hours worked in**

excess of the number of hours therein declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

SECTION IV.—The above Minimum Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION V.—The above Minimum Rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

# TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918. SUGAR CONFECTIONERY AND FOOD PRESERVING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

## PROPOSAL TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM TIME- RATES AND OVERTIME RATES AND TO FIX PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES, FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under that Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the branches of trade covered by the Trade Boards (Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving) Order, 1913, hereby give notice as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to fix Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Male and Female Workers and to vary the General Minimum Time-Rates for Male Workers and for Female Workers (other than those specified in the Notice issued by the Board dated 1st December, 1919) set out in the Schedule of their Notice dated 3rd March, 1919, and that they also propose (the Minister having given his consent to such Notice being given) to vary the General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Workers set out in the Schedule of the Notice issued by the Board and dated 1st December, 1919, and the Overtime-Rates for Male and Female Workers set out in the Schedule of the Notice issued by the Board and dated the 6th June, 1919, the minimum rates of wages as proposed to be fixed and varied being as shown in the Schedule attached hereto.

### SCHEDULE.

#### PART I.

#### *Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-rates.*

A. For (a) all male workers; and for (b) female workers who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any of the following occupations:—

Cocoa making.

Boiling sugar, for boiled sweets, other than the boiling of sugar in vacuum pans.

Broguing of hermetically-sealed receptacles containing meat, poultry, fish or soup, during the process of cooking.

Hand-soldering of hermetically-sealed receptacles containing meat, poultry, fish or soup.

Tongue pumping.

Butchers' or pork butchers' work in preparing meat for sausages or "smalls."

Brining vegetables for pickling.

Making extract of meat.

#### *Proposed Variation.*

Workers under 15 years of age, from 2½d. to 3d. per hour, i.e., 12s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, from 3½d. to 4d. per hour, i.e., 16s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 4½d. to 5½d. per hour, i.e., 21s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 5½d. to 6½d. per hour, i.e., 26s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, from 6d. to 7½d. per hour, i.e., 30s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, from 7d. to 8½d. per hour, i.e., 34s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, from 8d. to 9½d. per hour, i.e., 38s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 21 and under 22 years of age, from 9½d. to 10½d. per hour, i.e., 42s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 22 and under 23 years of age, from 9½d. to 11½d. per hour, i.e., 46s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 23 and under 24 years of age, from 10½d. to 1s. 0½d. per hour, i.e., 50s. per week of 48 hours.

For workers of 24 years of age and upwards and those to whose employment the general minimum time-rate of 44s. per week is applicable under B. of Section I. and under Section II. of the Schedules of the Notices issued by the Trade Board dated 3rd March and 1st December, 1919, respectively—from 11d. per hour to 1s. 1½d. per hour, i.e., 54s. per week of 48 hours.

B. For Female workers other than those specified in A above:—

Workers under 15 years of age, from 2½d. to 3d. per hour, i.e., 12s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, from 3½d. to 4d. per hour, i.e., 16s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 4½d. to 5½d. per hour, i.e., 21s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 5½d. to 6½d. per hour, i.e., 26s. per week of 48 hours.

For workers of 18 years of age and upwards and others to whose employment the general minimum time-rate of 26s. per week of 48 hours is applicable under the terms of Section I. A. (a) of the Schedule of the Notice issued by the Trade Board dated 3rd March, 1919:—From 6½d. to 7½d. per hour, i.e., 30s. per week of 48 hours.

The Trade Board also propose to vary the provision with regard to the conditions under which certain classes of female workers may be paid a lower rate for a certain period on first entering the trade, which is set out in



para. (b) of Section I.A. of the Schedule of their Notice of 3rd March, 1919, as follows:

*Provision at present in force.*

In the case of female workers of the age of 18 years and upwards who have been employed in the trade for an aggregate period of less than 12 months and cannot suitably be engaged on piece-work, such workers shall, until the expiry of such 12 months period of employment in the trade, be paid at a rate of not less than 24s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 6d. per hour, in lieu of the minimum rate of 26s. per week of 48 hours, provided that the Trade Board shall have issued a Certificate, on the ground that they are satisfied that the employment is not merely temporary or seasonal, authorising such lower rate to be paid, or have received an application for such Certificate which is still under consideration.

*Proposed provision.*

In the case of female workers (other than female workers specified in Part I. A. of this Notice) of the age of 18 years and upwards who have been employed in the trade for an aggregate period of less than six months, and cannot suitably be engaged on piece-work, such workers shall, until the expiry of such six months period of employment in the trade, be paid at a rate not less than 28s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 7d. per hour, in lieu of the minimum rate of 30s. per week of 48 hours, provided that the Trade Board shall have issued a Certificate, on the ground that they are satisfied that the employment is not merely temporary or seasonal, authorising such lower rate to be paid, or have received an application for such Certificate which is still under consideration.

## PART II.

### PROPOSED PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES.

A. For (a) all male workers; and  
For (b) female workers who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any of the following occupations:—

Cocoa making.

Boiling sugar for boiled sweets, other than the boiling of sugar in vacuum pans.

Broguing of hermetically-sealed receptacles containing meat, poultry, fish or soup, during process of cooking.

Hand-soldering of hermetically-sealed receptacles containing meat, poultry, fish or soup.

Tongue pumping.

Butchers' or pork butchers' work in preparing meat for sausages or "smalls."

Brining vegetables for pickling.

Making extract of meat.

1s. 4d. per hour.

In the case of workers employed on piece-work each piece-rate paid must be such as will yield in the circumstances of the case not less than 1s. 4d. per hour to an Ordinary worker. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies the foregoing condition regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers of 24 years of age and upwards.

B. For all female workers other than those specified in A. above, 9d. per hour.

In the case of workers employed on piece-work each piece-rate paid must be such as will yield in the circumstances of the case not less than 9d. per hour to an Ordinary

worker. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies the foregoing condition regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers of 18 years of age and upwards.

## PART III.

### PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES.

Overtime Rates, calculated on the minimum rates set out above in the manner set out in the Schedule of the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated the 6th June, 1919, shall apply, in substitution for the above minimum rates, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours therein declared by the Trade Board to be the normal numbers of hours of work in the trade.

## PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above proposed minimum rates of wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Act, to all workers who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade of making Sugar Confectionery, Cocoa, Chocolate, Jam, Marmalade, Preserved Fruits, Fruit and Table Jellies, Meat Extracts, Meat Essences, Sauces, and Pickles; the preparation of Meat, Poultry, Game, Fish, Vegetables and Fruit for sale in a preserved state in tins, pots, bottles and similar receptacles; the processes of wrapping, filling, packing and labelling in respect of articles so made or prepared; excluding the covering and filling of biscuits, wafers and cakes with chocolate or sugar confectionery. Provided that notwithstanding anything contained in this Section, the above minimum rates shall not apply to Clerks, Salesmen, Saleswomen, Travellers, Engineers, Carpenters, Vanmen, Watchmen, Outside Messengers, Cleaners of Premises, Timekeepers, or to any other workers whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of the foregoing excluded classes.

SECTION II.—The above proposed minimum rates of wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION III.—The above proposed minimum rates of wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Fix and to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 4th December, 1919. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.**

(DATED 2ND DECEMBER 1919.)

**BUCKINGHAMSHIRE AND DISTRICT  
(MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS)  
ORDER OF 1919 (No. 2).**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in

them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

*Alteration of Limits of Scheduled District.*

1. The Buckinghamshire and District (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") shall be read and have effect as if the Scheduled District described in the First Schedule hereto were substituted for the Scheduled District described in the Schedule to the principal Order.

*Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of certain Inner Area.*

2. No dog shall be moved out of the Area described in the Second Schedule hereto unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Board authorising such movement and signed by an Officer of the Board; and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Board may think necessary or desirable and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to:—  
(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Board under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation; or (b) the movement of a dog through such area by railway from a place outside the area to another place outside the area without unnecessary delay and without being rebooked within the area.

*Control and Muzzling of Dogs in certain Inner Area.*

3.—(1) A dog in the Area described in the Second Schedule hereto shall at all times

(a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle, and shall also be led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment: Provided that the requirement as to leading shall not apply to a dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep;

(b) whilst in or on any other place be—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle:

Provided that paragraph (b) shall not apply to any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants or to any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin or rabbits.

(2) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

(3) Article 4 (*Control of Dogs in Scheduled District*) of the principal Order shall not apply to the Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order.

*Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of  
Uncontrolled Dogs.*

4.—(1) Any dog found in or on any public place in the area described in the Second Schedule hereto, in respect of which the provisions of this Order as to control or muzzling are not being complied with, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority in the manner directed by Article 5 of the principal Order (*Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs*), which Article shall apply accordingly.

(2) Articles 2 and 3 of the principal Order shall apply to dogs moved in contravention of this Order.

*Offences.*

5.—(1) If a dog is moved in contravention of Article 2 of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If any dog is not kept under control in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

6. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Commencement.*

7. This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of December, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

*Short Title.*

8. This Order may be cited as the Buckinghamshire and District (Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 (No. 2), and shall be read with the principal Order.

FIRTH OF FORTH—TRAFFIC  
REGULATIONS.

*Former Notice.*—No. 1402 of 1919; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

## Section I.

## DEFINITIONS OF TERMS.

*Firth of Forth.*—All the waters bounded on the east by a straight line joining Elieness and Fidra, and extending as far as the tide flows.

*The Port.*—The limits of the Dockyard Port of Rosyth are:—

On the east a line drawn  $180^{\circ}$  (S.  $18^{\circ}$  W. Mag.) through the south point of Carron harbour in the county of Fife to the south shore of the Firth of Forth.

On the west a line drawn  $0^{\circ}$  (N.  $18^{\circ}$  E. Mag.) through Carriden house to the north shore of the Firth of Forth.

*King's Harbour Master.*—The King's Harbour Master, Rosyth.

*Thick or Foggy Weather.*—Any weather conditions such as fog, mist, falling snow or heavy rainstorms which prevent objects 500 yards off being clearly visible.

## Section II.

## GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS.

Until further notice the following Regulations are to be observed by all merchant ships in the Firth of Forth. All orders and instructions given by the King's Harbour Master or any patrol vessel are to be implicitly obeyed.

2. The ordinary rules for navigation and safe conduct are to be adhered to in the Firth of Forth except so far as they are affected by these Regulations.

3. Nothing in these Regulations exonerates the owner, master or agent of any ship from any neglect of the ordinary rules for the navigation and safe conduct of ships.

4. Merchant vessels may enter or leave the Firth of Forth at any time, but must not leave

without first obtaining port clearance from the Collector of Customs.

### Section III.

#### NAVIGATION OF THE DOCKYARD PORT—VESSELS TO KEEP CLEAR OF H.M. SHIPS.

*By Day.*—When any of H.M. Ships or other vessel in charge of H.M. officers is about to pass—

Outwards, through the Bridge channel, she will hoist the letter "O" flag at the fore, or

Inwards, through the Bridge channel, she will hoist the Union flag at the fore,

and the signal stations at North Queensferry and the Dockyard \_\_\_\_\_ will repeat this signal. All other vessels, craft and boats of every description under way are to keep out of the way of the said ship flying the "O" flag or Union flag as the case may be, provided always the said ship shall be navigated with due care and moderate speed and that she shall so far as possible be kept on that side of the channel which lies to her own standard side.

Letter "O" flag is yellow and red, diagonal.

*By Night.*—The signal stations mentioned above will hoist—

Two red lights for an inward bound vessel.

Three red lights for an outward bound vessel.

### Section IV.

#### PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

Subject to the exemptions hereinafter detailed, all vessels navigating in the waters of the Firth of Forth from a line drawn 180° (S. 18° W. Mag.) through the south point of Carron harbour in the county of Fife to the south shore of the Firth of Forth westward as far as the tide flows shall be conducted by pilots licensed by the Leith Trinity House.

A pilot station is established on Inchkeith. In-coming vessels proceeding westward of this line should stop off Inchkeith to pick up the pilot.

Exemptions:—

(a) Those vessels exempted under Section II. (3) of the Pilotage Act, 1913.

(b) All vessels owned and registered in any port within the Firth of Forth whose

master or mate is in possession of a pilotage certificate from the Leith Trinity House.

(c) All British coasting traders who make 40 visits per annum to the Firth of Forth, such vessels having on board a master or mate having a pilotage certificate from the Leith Trinity House.

### Section V.

#### CAUTION AS TO ANCHORING.

No merchant vessel, craft or boat of any description is to make fast to or lay at any dolphins or structure of the Boom Defences.

No vessel is permitted to anchor within the limits of the Dockyard Port without the permission of the King's Harbour Master.

If unavoidably obliged to do so, care must be taken to keep well clear of the fairway and of H.M. Ships at anchor or moored.

### Section VI.

*Variation.*—18° W.

#### *Note.*

This Notice is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

#### *Caution.*

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against these Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that an infringement of the directions contained in this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.
