PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the 10th day of January, 1910, and known generally as the Civil Service (Consolidating) Order in Council, 1910, and hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order," it is provided that, with certain provisions and exceptions, the qualifications of all such persons as may seek or be proposed for appointment to any situation or employment in any of His Majesty's Civil Establishments shall, before they are so appointed, be tested by or under the directions of the Civil Service Commissioners, and that no person (save as excepted thereby) shall be appointed to any such establishment until a certificate of his qualification shall have been issued by the Civil Service Commissioners declaring that he has satisfied them, among other things, that he is free from any physical defect or disease which would be likely to interfere with the proper discharge of his duties:

And whereas the said requirement was modified by Clause (1) of the Order in Council of the 23rd October, 1918, whereby it was provided that where an officer holding a pensionable situation, and having been appointed with a certificate of qualification, is nominated by the Head of a Department for the issue of a further certificate of qualification in respect of his promotion in the same Department, or of his transfer to another Department, the said Commissioners may grant their said certificate of qualification on being satisfied that he is duly qualified in respect of age, character, knowledge and ability, without requiring evidence that he fulfils the condition as to freedom from physical defect or disease specified in Clause 3 of the principal Order, provided that they are satisfied that the situation to which he is promoted or transferred does not require a higher degree of physical capacity than the situation which he already holds:

And whereas it is expedient that the above provision should apply where the said Commissioners think fit to officers who hold pensionable situations in any of His Majesty's Civil Establishments whether they were appointed

thereto with a certificate of qualification or otherwise:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Clause (1) of the Order in Council of the 23rd October, 1918, shall be modified by the substitution of the words "in any of His Majesty's Civil Establishments" for the words "and having been appointed with a certificate of qualification" and by the omission of the word "further," and by the insertion of the words "at their discretion, if they see fit," after the words "the Commissioners may," and accordingly the clause shall run as follows:—

(1) Where an officer holding a pensionable situation in any of His Majesty's Civil Establishments is nominated by the Head of a Department for the issue of a certificate of qualification in respect of his promotion in the same Department, or of his transfer to another Department, the Commissioners may, at their discretion, if they see fit, grant their certificate of qualification on being satisfied that he is fully qualified in respect of age, character, knowledge and ability, without requiring evidence that he fulfils the condition as to freedom from physical defect or disease specified in Clause 3 of the principal Order, provided they are satisfied that the situation to which he is promoted or transferred does not require a higher degree of physical capacity than the situation which he already holds.

1. The County Court of Kent held at Deal and Sandwich shall cease to be held at Sandwich, and shall be held at Deal under the name of the County Court of Kent held at Deal.

2. The Parishes set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order shall cease to form part of the said District and shall be transferred to, and form part of, the Districts set opposite to their names respectively in the second column thereof.

3. The County Court of Denbighshire held at Wrexham and Llangollen shall cease to be held at Llangollen, and shall be held at Wrexham under the name of the County Court of Denbighshire held at Wrexham.

4. Paragraph 5 of the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council dated the 25th day of November, 1919, is hereby revoked.

5. From and after the end of January, 1920, the County Court of Hampshire held at Christchurch and Bournemouth shall cease to be held at Christchurch, and shall be held at Bournemouth under the name of the County Court of Hampshire held at Bournemouth.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1920, except as regards paragraph 5 hereof, and shall be read with the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899, which shall have effect as amended by this Order.

WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas it is desirable to extend the Increase of Rent, &c. (Amendment) Act, 1918, to the Isle of Man:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Increase of Rent, &c. (Amendment) Act, 1918, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:—

In Section 1, for the words "thirtieth day of September nineteen hundred and seventeen" there shall be substituted the words "first day of February nineteen hundred and eighteen."

In the proviso of Section 1 after the words "Board of Agriculture" there shall be added the words "for the Isle of Man."

In the said proviso, after the words "Isle of Man" (above inserted) there shall be omitted all the words down to and including the words "for Ireland."

In Section 2, for the words "(Amendment) Act, 1918," there shall be substituted the words "Isle of Man (Amendment) Act, 1919."

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of All Souls College, Oxford, on the 15th day of November, 1919, and sealed on the 5th day of December, 1919, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

WHEREAS the University of Oxford Commissioners under and by virtue of all and every the powers in that behalf enabling them contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, did by an Instrument under their Seal, dated the 16th day of June, 1881, make certain Statutes thereunto annexed for the College of All Souls of the Faithful Departed, commonly called All Souls College, in the University of Oxford.

And whereas such Statutes were approved by her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council, on the 3rd day of May, 1882, and have since been altered and amended from time to time.

And whereas at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for that purpose, and held on the 15th day of November, 1919, it was unanimously resolved, by those present and voting at the Meeting, that the further alteration in the said Statutes hereinafter specified should be made, that is to say:—

In Statute III. (April 1913 Edition).

"Statute III., Clause 12, of the said Statutes shall have effect as if the word 'seven' had been inserted therein in lieu of the word 'five,' and Statute III., Clause 15, of the said Statutes shall have effect as if the words 'Professor or' had been inserted therein between the word 'any' and the words 'Public Reader' and as if the words 'whose emolument is provided or augmented out of the revenues of the College' had been omitted therefrom."

Now, We, the Warden and College, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do hereby submit the aforesaid alteration made by us in the Statutes governing the said College to the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, and humbly pray that the same may be approved and confirmed.

WHEREAS at Versailles, on the 28th day of June, 1919, a Treaty of Peace with Germany (hereinafter referred to as "the Treaty") was signed on behalf of His Majesty; and

Whereas it was provided in the Treaty that the property of German nationals within the territory or under the control of an Allied or Associated State might be constituted a pledge for enemy liabilities upon the conditions laid down in the Treaty; and

Whereas by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, it was provided that His Majesty might make such appointments, establish such offices, make such Orders in Council, and do such things as appeared to Him to be necessary for carrying out the Treaty, and for giving effect to any of the provisions thereof; and

Whereas by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means His Majesty has power and jurisdiction in China; and

Whereas there is now in China certain property of German nationals under the control of His Majesty, and it is expedient to make provision for charging such property with the payment of the liabilities for which it may be constituted a pledge by the Treaty in the manner hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in Him vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. All property rights and interests in China belonging to German nationals at the date when the Treaty comes into force (not being property rights or interests acquired under any general licence issued by or on behalf of His Majesty) and the net proceeds of their sale, liquidation, or other dealings therewith, so far as such property rights and interests or such net proceeds are vested in or otherwise under the control of the Custodian of enemy property or other British authority under the Trading with the Enemy Acts or the Trading with the Enemy Regulations, are hereby charged:—

(a) First, with payment of the amounts due in respect of claims by British nationals with regard to their property rights and in-

terests, including companies and associations in which they are interested in German territory, or debts owing to them by German nationals, and with payment of any compensation awarded by the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal or by an arbitrator appointed by that Tribunal in pursuance of paragraph (e) of Article 297 of the Treaty, and with payment of claims growing out of acts committed by the German Government or by German authorities since the 31st July, 1914, and before the 4th August, 1914.

(b) Secondly, with payment of the amounts due in respect of claims by British nationals with regard to their property rights and interests in the territories of Austria-Hungary, Bulgaria, and Turkey in so far as those claims are not otherwise satisfied.

Provided that any particular property rights or interests so charged may at any time, if the Minister thinks fit, be released from the charge so created.

2. In the application and enforcement of the charge created by this Order the claims of or debts owing to British nationals resident or carrying on business in China shall enjoy priority over the claims of or debts owing to other British nationals.

3. With a view to making effective and enforcing such charge as aforesaid:—

(a) No person shall, without the consent of the Custodian, transfer, part with, or otherwise deal in any property, right, or interest subject to the charge, and if he does so he shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months, or to both such imprisonment and fine.

(b) Every person owning or having the control or management of any property right or interest subject to the charge (including where the property right or interest consists of shares, stocks, or other securities issued by a company, municipal authority, or other body, or any right or interest therein, such company, authority, or body) shall, unless particulars thereof have already been furnished to the Custodian in accordance with the Trading with the Enemy Acts, 1914 to 1918, or the Trading with the Enemy Consolidation Regulations, 1918, within one month from the date when this Order comes into operation, by notice in writing communicate the fact to the Custodian, and shall furnish the Custodian with such particulars in relation thereto as the Custodian may require, and if any person fails to do so he shall, on summary conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds.

(c) Where the property charged consists of inscribed or registered stock, shares, or other securities, any company, municipal authority, or other body by whom the securities were issued or are managed shall, on application being made by the Custodian, enter the Custodian in the books in which the securities are inscribed or registered, as the proprietor of the securities subject to the charge, and the Custodian shall, subject to the consent of the Minister, have power to sell or otherwise deal with the securities as proprietor of which he is so registered or inscribed.

(d) The Minister may by order vest in the Custodian any property rights and interests subject to the charge, or the right to transfer

the same, and for that purpose section 4 of the Trading with the Enemy (Amendment) Act, 1916, shall apply as if such property rights and interests were property belonging to an enemy or enemy subject.

(e) If any person called upon to pay any money or to transfer or otherwise to deal with any property rights or interests has reason to suspect that the same are subject to such charge as aforesaid, he shall, before paying, transferring, or dealing with the same, report the matter to the Custodian, and shall comply with any directions that the Custodian may give with respect thereto.

4. All decisions of the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal constituted under Section VI of Part X of the Treaty, if within the jurisdiction of that Tribunal, shall be final and conclusive, and binding on all courts.

5. For the purpose of enforcing the attendance of witnesses before the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal, whether sitting in China or not, and compelling the production before the Tribunal of documents, the Minister shall have power to issue orders which shall have the like effect as if the proceedings before the Tribunal were an action in the court, and the order were a formal process issued by that court in the due exercise of its jurisdiction, and shall be enforceable by that court accordingly, and disobedience to any such order shall be punishable as contempt of court.

6. Sections IV, V, and VI of Part X of the Treaty relating to property rights and interests, to contracts, prescriptions and judgments, and to the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal, and all provisions of the said Treaty affecting or relating to the charge created by this Order shall have full force and effect as law.

7. The time at which the periods of prescription or limitation of right of action referred to in Article 300 of the Treaty shall begin again to run shall be at the expiration of six months after the coming into force of the Treaty, and the period to be allowed within which presentation of negotiable instruments for acceptance or payment, and notice of non-acceptance or non-payment or protest may be made under Article 301, shall be six months from the coming into force of the Treaty.

8. Rules made during the war by any recognised Exchange or Commercial Association providing for the closure of contracts entered into before the war by an enemy, and any action taken thereunder are hereby confirmed, subject to the provisos contained in paragraph 4 (a) of the Annex to Section V of Part X of the Treaty.

9. The power under Article 155 of the China Order in Council, 1904, or under any Order amending the said Order, to make King's Regulations, shall extend to the issue of regulations for the purpose of enforcing the charge created by this Order, and for making such arrangements as may be required for establishing and assessing the claims and debts for the payment of which the property charged is rendered liable, and for the payment, in whole or in part, of the sums due.

10. This Order may be cited as the China (Treaty of Peace) Order in Council, 1919, and shall be read as one with the China Order in Council, 1904, and with any Order amending the same.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the date when the Treaty of Peace comes into force.

On the 17th June last a fire occurred on a Russian motor-launch in the Harbour of Archangel, and a Russian tug and a picket boat from an American Man-of-War proceeded

to render assistance, Mr. Haines going in the tug.

Just before the tug reached the launch an explosion took place on board the latter. Immediately the tug got alongside, the crew of the launch abandoned her.

Mr. Haines at once went on board the launch and endeavoured to extinguish the fire, but being unable to do so, he ordered the other boats to lay off, while he went down into the magazine and brought up on deck a quantity of ammunition and a large quantity of gasoline and some rifles. Then calling the picket boat alongside, he passed these stores aboard her.

While Mr. Haines was alone on board the launch, the cabin abaft the engine room and before the magazine took fire.

The fire was ultimately got under, but not before the launch had been gutted.

Mr. Haines displayed great gallantry in rendering the service, for had the fire reached the magazine an explosion would undoubtedly have occurred, and he would have had no chance of saving his life.

Section IV. The rates set out in this Part of this Schedule are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours, and shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours spent by the worker on the employers' premises in any week is less than 48.

PART III.

Proposed Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers of all Ages.

Section I.—The minimum rates for Overtime in respect of Male and Female Workers to apply in respect of hours worked by a worker employed on Time work in excess of the declared normal number of hours set out below shall be as follows, that is to say:—

1. For all Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime rate shall be equivalent to Time and a Half, that is to say, one and a half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

2. For all time worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime rate shall be equivalent to Double Time, that is to say, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

3. For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime rate shall be Time and a Half, except in so far as a higher Overtime rate is payable under the provisions of paragraph 2 above.

Section II. In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board declare the Normal Number of Hours of Work to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On Saturday	5
On any other week day	8½

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holi-

days shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime rates shall apply.

Section III. The Overtime rates shall not apply to Piece workers.

Section IV. The hours of Overtime which female workers and young persons are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice a learner is defined to be a worker who:—

(1) (a) In the case of Male persons, is employed during the whole or a substantial part of his time in learning Cutting or Nailing in the Furriers' branch of the trade, by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning;

(b) In the case of Female persons, is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning Machining or Lining and Finishing in the Furriers' branch of the trade by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(2) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

PART V.

The above respective minimum rates of wages shall apply subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts to all workers in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Fur) Order, 1919, that is to say:—The dressing, dyeing and making-up of Furs or of Skins for furriers' purposes; including the dressing or dyeing or general preparation of furs or skins; the manufacture of furs or skins into garments, rugs, or other articles; the re-making, repairing or cleaning of articles made from furs or skins where carried on by fur dressers or fur manufacturers; the lining with fur of coats, cloaks, mantles, capes, gloves or similar articles where carried out by fur manufacturers; bundling, packing, warehousing and other operations carried on by fur skin merchants, fur dressers, fur dyers or fur manufacturers, but excluding the making-up of fur toys, purses, boots, shoes or slippers, the making of fur hats when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making or trimming of men's, women's or children's headgear from other materials; warehousing, packing and other similar operations carried on in shops wholly, mainly or substantially engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the premises.

PART VI.

Section I. The above minimum rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Section II. The above minimum rates of wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

Section II.—Folders; Hand-Fitters; Parters, Separaters and Makers-up; who have had not less than three years' experience after the age of nineteen years in one or more of the occupations specified in this Section.

Section III.—Overtime Rates calculated on the minimum rates set out above, in the manner set out in the Schedule of the above-mentioned Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated the 26th November, 1919, shall apply in substitution for the above minimum rates, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board, in the Schedule above referred to, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

Section IV.—No variation is proposed in the minimum rates for Male Workers set out in the above-mentioned Notice, in respect of any class of Male Workers other than those specified above.

Section V.—The above proposed minimum rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

**ISLE OF WIGHT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH
DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 4).**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in

them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

*Withdrawal of Restrictions from parts of
Scheduled District.*

1. (1.) The restrictions on the movement of animals imposed by the Isle of Wight (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919, hereinafter referred to as the principal Order, shall apply only to the Prohibited Areas described in the Schedule hereto, and the principal Order shall apply thereto subject to the modification hereinafter appearing.

(2.) An animal may be landed in a Prohibited Area without a licence, and an animal so moved may be moved forthwith from the place of landing to any slaughterhouse within the Island if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of landing is situate.

(3.) An animal moved with a Licence under this Order shall be moved direct to the slaughterhouse specified therein and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and slaughtered within four days after its arrival.

*Continued Prohibition of Movement out
of Island.*

2. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to affect the operation of the Order of the Board dated 20th October, 1919, which prohibits the movement of cattle, sheep, goats, or swine out of the administrative county of the Isle of Wight.

Revocation of Orders.

3. The Isle of Wight (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1919 (Nos. 2 and 3) are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the Isle of Wight (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919 (No. 4), and shall be read with the principal Order.
