The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas it was Ordered in Council on the 21th Instant, that for the more effectual Execution of the Directions which have been given for the Seizure of Horses belonging to Papists or Reputed Papists, which shall be above the value of Five Pounds, according to an Act of Parliament made in the first year of the Reign of His Majesty and the late Queen Mary, Entituled, An Act for the better Securing the Government by Disarming Papists and Reputed Papists; And that for the Encouragement of such Persons as have been or shall be Active and Diligent in the Discovery and Seizure of such Horses, the said Act should have in their own use a fourth part of the Money arising upon the sale or Disposal of the said Horses, the King's Majesty, when sold or otherwise disposed of, the Charge of Keeping the said Horses be-

ing first deducted; It is hereby further Ordered, That for the better Discovery and Seizure of Horses belonging to Papists or Reputed Papists, above the value of Five Pounds as aforesaid, Mr. Attorney General do take care, that all Persons whatsoever that shall Conceal or not Discover such Horses being in their Custody, be Prosecuted according to Law.
