BIRKENHEAD.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Bur-  
gesses of the borough of Birkenhead, being  
the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said  
borough, have made application to the Ministry  
of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order  
under sections 297 and 303 of the Public  
Health Act, 1875, to partially repeal, alter, or  
amend:—

(1) Section 69 of the Birkenhead Corpora-  
tion Water Act, 1907, and section 10 of the  
Birkenhead Corporation Act, 1914, so as to  
provide for an extension of the borrowing  
powers under those sections to £1,322,000,  
or such further sum as may be sanctioned by  
the Ministry of Health for the completion  
of the Alwen Reservoir and line of pipes for  
conveying water therefrom to Birkenhead  
and the accessory works;

(2) Section 21 of the Birkenhead Cor-  
poration Act, 1902, so as to provide for an  
extension of the borrowing powers under  
that section for purposes of the water under-  
taking to a sum of not exceeding £60,000, or  
such further sum as may be sanctioned by  
the Ministry of Health;

(3) Section 48 of the Birkenhead Corpora-  
tion Act, 1897, and the provisions of any  
other Local Acts or Acts confirming Pro-  
visional Orders in force in the said borough  
with reference to sinking funds for the re-  
payment of debt, so as to enable the rate  
prescribed for the accumulation of such  
sinking funds to be altered; and

(4) For the several purposes of the appli-  
cation or for purposes connected with, in-  
cidental to, or consequent on those purposes  
to make any such alteration or amendment  
of the said Local Acts, or of any other Local  
Act or of any Act, confirming a Provisional  
Order made in pursuance of any of the Sani-  
tary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875,  
and in force in the said borough as may be  
necessary or desirable;

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional  
Order should be issued in compliance with the  
said application;
