BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.

In the Matter of Paul Erhard Segitz.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalisation.

Whereas I am satisfied as the result of an enquiry conducted by the Certificates of Naturalisation (Revocation) Committee that the Certificate of Naturalisation numbered 16817, granted to Paul Erhard Segitz on the 7th June, 1907, is revocable under the pro-

visions of Section 7 (2) (d) of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, and that the continuance of the certificate is not conducive to the public good.

FUR TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO FIX CERTAIN MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Fur Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Fur) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to fix general minimum piece-rates for male and female workers and piece-work basis time-rates for certain female workers, as follows:—

PART II.

PROPOSED PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES
(FEMALE WORKERS).

Section I.—Proposed Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Female Workers (including Home-Workers) employed as Machinists, Liners or Finishers in the Furriers' Section of the trade:—

(a) Machinists, 60s. per week of 48 hours.

(b) Liners and Finishers, 50s. per week of 48 hours.

Section II.—In the case of the above-mentioned classes of female workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid shall be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker, not less than 1s. 3d. per hour in the case of Machinists and not less than 1s. 0½d. per hour in the case of Liners and Finishers.

Section III.—For the purpose of this Notice a "Home-Worker" is defined to be a worker who works in her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART III.

Section I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Section II.—The above minimum rates of wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 6th January, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Fur Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2. It is desirable that Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

Provision as to movement for slaughter into the parts of the Scheduled District not included in the Prohibited Area.

3.—(1) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by railway or by vessel without a licence from premises not situate within the Scheduled District to a railway station or landing place in the Scheduled District which is not situate in the Prohibited Area; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing place to any slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District which is not situate in the Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or landing place is situate.

(2) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises not situate within the Scheduled District to any slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District which is not situate in the Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

Movement within the Scheduled District excluding the Prohibited Area.

4. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his district should be permitted to be moved from premises in the Scheduled District not situate in the Prohibited Area to any other premises in the Scheduled District not situate in the Prohibited Area, he may authorize such movement by a Movement Licence.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

5.—(1) Where the movement authorized by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughterhouse from premises other than a railway station or landing place

an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ about six inches long on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle, and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(2) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in a Prohibited Area.

(3) Where the movement authorized by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority, or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(4) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorized to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorized to be moved.

(5) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(6) A movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorized by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(7) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(8) A copy of a Licence which authorizes movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

Movement through the Prohibited Area by Rail.

6. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Prohibited Area where they are moved through the Prohibited Area by railway from a place outside such area to another place outside such area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such area except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

General Provisions as to Movement.

7. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

8. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorizing—

(i) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii) movement into or out of a foot-and-mouth disease infected place; or

(iii) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

9. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Board, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

10.—(1) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Holding of Markets and Sales in the Scheduled District (except in the Prohibited Area).

11.—(1) A market or sale of animals may be held on any premises in the Scheduled District except in the Prohibited Area if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter, and the market or sale is authorized by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorized under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3) An animal exposed at a market or sale

authorized under this Article shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 5 of this Order.

Offences.

12.—(1) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

13. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

14. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty.

Short Title.

15. This Order may be cited as the WEST SUSSEX AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 2), and shall be read with the principal Order.

EAST KENT (MUZZLING AND CONTROL
OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1920.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

*Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of
certain Inner Area.*

1. No dog shall be moved out of the Area described in the Schedule hereto unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Board authorising such movement and signed by an Officer of the Board, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Board may think necessary or desirable and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to:—
(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Board under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of deten-

tion and isolation; or (b) the movement of a dog through such area by railway from a place outside the area to another place outside the area without unnecessary delay and without being rebooked within the area.

*Control and Muzzling of Dogs in certain
Inner Area.*

2.—(1) A dog in the Area described in the Schedule hereto shall at all times

(a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle, and shall also be led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment: Provided that the requirement as to leading shall not apply to a dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep;

(b) whilst in or on any other place be—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle:

Provided that paragraph (b) shall not apply to any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants or to any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin or rabbits.

(2) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box or other receptacle, so con-

structed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

(3) Article 4 (*Control of Dogs in Scheduled District*) of the East Kent (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 (No. 2), (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," shall not apply to the Area described in the Schedule to this Order.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

3.—(1) Any dog found in or on any public place in the area described in the Schedule hereto, in respect of which the provisions of this Order as to control or muzzling are not being complied with, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority in the manner directed by Article 5 of the principal Order (*Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs*), which Article shall apply accordingly.

(2) Articles 2 and 3 of the principal Order shall apply to dogs moved in contravention of this Order.

Offences.

4.—(1) If a dog is moved in contravention of Article 1 of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If any dog is not kept under control in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty.

Short Title.

7. This Order may be cited as the East Kent (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1920, and shall be read with the principal Order.

**CORN PRODUCTION ACT, 1917.
AGRICULTURAL WAGES BOARD
(ENGLAND AND WALES).**

PROPOSAL TO VARY THE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR HORSEMEN, COWMEN, SHEPHERDS AND HWSMON (BAILIFFS) IN ANGLESEY AND CARNARVON.

The Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales) hereby give Notice, as required by the above Act, that they propose to make the following Order:—

1. The rates of wages fixed by the Order of the 25th September, 1919, shall not apply to any male workman of 18 years of age and over employed wholly or mainly as Horseman, Cowman, Shepherd or Hwsmon (Bailiff) in the area comprising the administrative counties of Anglesey and Carnarvon (except the parish of Llysaen), and in lieu thereof the wages payable for employment of any male workman of the said age and of any of the said classes employed in the said area shall be for a week of 61 hours (including Sunday) in Summer and 58 hours (including Sunday) in Winter, not less than wages at the following minimum rates, that is to say:—

For workmen of 21 years of age and over, 46s. per week.

For workmen of 20 and under 21 years of age, 44s. per week.

For workmen of 19 and under 20 years of age, 43s. per week.

For workmen of 18 and under 19 years of age, 41s. 6d. per week.

2. Provided that where a whole-time workman is employed by the week or any longer period, the wages payable to him for the hours of work agreed between him and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) shall not be less than the amount specified in clause 1 above and applicable to that workman, notwithstanding that those hours are less than the hours specified in the said clause.

3. The differential rates for overtime in the case of employment of any workman to whom this Order applies shall, in lieu of any differential rates which would otherwise be applicable, be as follows, that is to say:—

(a) In respect of overtime employment on weekdays:—

For workmen of 21 years of age and over, 10d. per hour.

For workmen of 20 and under 21 years of age, 9½d. per hour.

For workmen of 19 and under 20 years of age, 9½d. per hour.

For workmen of 18 and under 19 years of age, 9d. per hour.

(b) In respect of overtime employment on a Sunday:—

For workmen of 21 years of age and over, 1s. per hour.

For workmen of 20 and under 21 years of age, 11½d. per hour.

For workmen of 19 and under 20 years of age, 11½d. per hour.

For workmen of 18 and under 19 years of age, 11d. per hour.

4. For the purpose of the above rates the following employment is defined as overtime employment, that is to say:—

(a) All employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday or such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the workman, except:

(i) time spent on such day in connection with the feeding and cleaning of stock; and

(ii) in the case of any workman who under an agreement with his employer is entitled in each half-year either to one week's holiday on full pay or to payment of double pay for one week's work.

(b) All employment in excess of 61 hours per week (including Sunday) in Summer.

(c) All employment in excess of 58 hours per week (including Sunday) in Winter.

5. For the purpose of the above rates the expression "employment in summer" shall mean employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and ending on the last Sunday in October, and the expression "employment in winter" shall mean employment during the rest of the year.

6. For the purpose of the application of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a workman who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

The Agricultural Wages Board, as required by the above Act, will consider any objections to the above proposal which may be lodged with them within one month from the date of this Notice. All objections should be in writing, and should be addressed to the Secretary, the Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales), 80, Pall Mall, London, S.W. 1. The objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

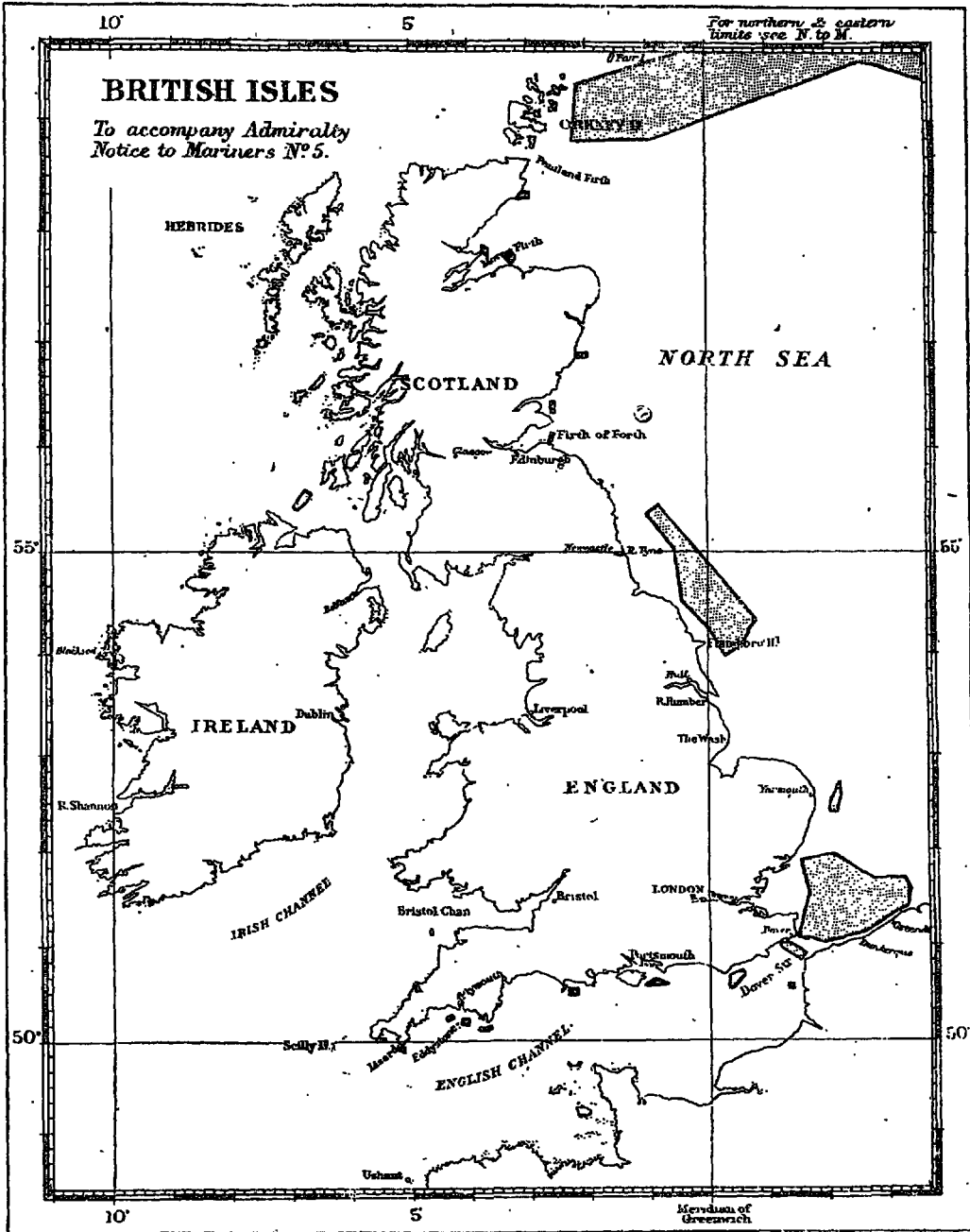

The foregoing restrictions have been rendered necessary owing to danger of sunken mines on the bottom. Attention is drawn to the cautionary note on the charts on this subject.

The areas defined above, with the exception of a portion of No. 19, are shaded on the accompanying chartlet, which is intended to provide a ready means of reference.

II. GENERAL INFORMATION REGARDING MINES.

1. Mariners are warned that a certain number of mines have sunk without exploding. It is possible that some of these mines lying on the bottom may still be dangerous. Surface vessels navigating these areas should therefore, whenever possible, have a clear depth of at least six feet between their keels and the bottom when in the vicinity of shoal water or in the approaches to ports and harbours which were subjected to mining operations during the war.

2.

3. Mariners are notified that a small percentage of drifting mines are known to exist in a waterlogged condition, a fraction of which may be dangerous. This type of mine is hard to see, and special precautions are therefore necessary to ensure that a good lookout is kept. The striking of low floating flotsam should be avoided.

4. A serious accident has occurred to a vessel at anchor from the explosion of a drifting mine which came into contact with an obstruction on the hull.

When vessels have to anchor in areas where drifting mines may be found it is necessary that all obstructions should as far as possible be removed and gangways triced up before dark in order to minimise risk.

Former Notice.—No. 2098 of 1919; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in Force:—

Section I.

DEFINITIONS OF TERMS.

Firth of Forth.—All the waters bounded on

the east by a straight line joining Elieness and Fidra, and extending as far as the tide flows.

The Port.—The limits of the Dockyard Port of Rosyth are:—

On the east a line drawn 180° (S. 18° W. Mag.), through the south point of Carron harbour in the county of Fife to the south shore of the Firth of Forth.

On the west a line drawn 0° (N. 18° E. Mag.) through Carriden house to the north shore of the Firth of Forth.

King's Harbour Master.—The King's Harbour Master, Rosyth.

Thick or Foggy Weather.—Any weather conditions, such as fog, mist, falling snow or heavy rainstorms which prevent objects 500 yards off being clearly visible.

Section II.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS.

Until further notice the following Regulations are to be observed by all merchant ships in the Firth of Forth. All orders and instructions given by the King's Harbour Master or any patrol vessel are to be implicitly obeyed.

2. The ordinary rules for navigation and safe conduct are to be adhered to in the Firth of Forth except so far as they are affected by these Regulations.

3. Nothing in these Regulations exonerates the owner, master or agent of any ship from any neglect of the ordinary rules for the navigation and safe conduct of ships.

4. Merchant vessels may enter or leave the Firth of Forth at any time, but must not leave without first obtaining port clearance from the Collector of Customs.

5. All vessels navigating near to, or passing the north extreme of the Granton-Gunneth ledge dolphin defences, are to do so at slow speed to avoid damage being done to the pile extracting barges.

Section III.

NAVIGATION OF THE DOCKYARD PORT—VESSELS TO KEEP CLEAR OF H.M. SHIPS.

By Day.—When any of H.M. Ships or other vessel in charge of H.M. officers is about to pass—

Outwards, through the Bridge channel, she will hoist the letter "O" flag at the fore, or

Inwards, through the Bridge channel, she will hoist the Union flag at the fore, and the signal stations at North Queensferry and the Dockyard will repeat this signal. All other vessels, craft and boats of every description under way are to keep out of the way of the said ship flying the "O" flag or Union flag as the case may be, provided always the said ship shall be navigated with due care and moderate speed and that she shall so far as

possible be kept on that side of the channel which lies to her own starboard side.

Letter "O" flag is yellow and red, diagonal

By Night.—The signal stations mentioned above will hoist—

Two red lights for an inward bound vessel.

Three red lights for an outward bound vessel.

Note.—The inward-bound vessel is always to give way to the outward-bound vessel.

Torpedo-boat destroyers will continue to use the South channel, and neither "O" flag nor the Union flag will be flown by torpedo-boat destroyers or signal stations.

CAUTION AS TO ANCHORING.

No merchant vessel, craft or boat of any description is to make fast to or lay at any dolphins or structure of the Boom Defences.

No vessel is permitted to anchor within the limits of the Dockyard Port without the permission of the King's Harbour Master.

If unavoidably obliged to do so, care must be taken to keep well clear of the fairway and of H.M. Ships at anchor or moored.

Variation.— 18° W.

Note.

This Notice is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against these Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.
