By virtue of an Act passed in the 24th year of the Reign of His Majesty King George III., intituled "An Act to repeal so much of two Acts made in the 10th and 15th years of the Reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes The Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown for making out Writs for the Election of Members to serve in Parliament in the manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other provisions for the like purposes"; and of an Act passed in the 26th year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to further limit and define the time for proceeding to Election during the Recess."

To be hereby give notice, that it hath been certified to me in writing under the Hands of Two Members serving in this present Parliament, that the Right Hon. Sir Albert Henry Stanley, late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the Borough of Ashton-under-Lyne is become a Peer of the United Kingdom, and that a Writ of Summons hath been issued to him under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom to summon him to Parliament, and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a New Writ for the Electing of a Member to serve in this present

Parliament for the said Borough at the end of six days after the insertion of this Notice in the London Gazette.
