Now, therefore, by this Order, made in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 7 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said Certificate, and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof, and I further order the said Certificate to be given up and to be cancelled.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

WHOLESALE MANTLE AND COSTUME
TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES
FOR MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, for the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade in Great Britain, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 20th November, 1919, hereby give Notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to fix General Minimum Time-rates, Piece-work Basis Time-rates, and Overtime Rates for Male Workers, and to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, as shown in the Schedule set out below:—

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

PROPOSED GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR
MALE WORKERS.

Section I.—For Male Workers other than
Learners.

(a) For Cutters, Knifemen, Tailors, Fitters-up, Passers, Pressers, and Machinists, as defined in Section I. of Part IV. of this Schedule, 1s. 5d. per hour.

(b) For Under-Pressers and Plain Machinists, as defined in Section I. of Part IV. of this Schedule, 1s. 3d. per hour.

(c) For all other Workers:

(1) Workers other than Homeworkers, 1s. 2d. per hour.

(2) Homeworkers, 1s. 2d. per hour.

Section II.—For Male Learners (as defined in
Section II. of Part IV. of this Schedule).

Per Week of 48 hours.

When employed under 15 years of age, 12s., or 3d. per hour.

When employed at 15 and under 16 years of age, 14s., or 3½d. per hour.

When employed at 16 and under 17 years of age, 16s., or 4d. per hour.

When employed at 17 and under 18 years of age, 20s., or 5d. per hour.

When employed at 18 and under 19 years of age, 29s., or 7½d. per hour.

When employed at 19 and under 20 years of age, 3s., or 8½d. per hour.

When employed at 20 and under 21 years of age, 38s., or 9½d. per hour.

When employed at 21 and under 22 years of age, 43s., or 10½d. per hour.

(a) The weekly rates for Learners, as set out above, are based on a week of 48 hours, and they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours spent under contract of employment by a Learner in the factory or workshop in any week is less than 48.

(b) Learners commencing employment in the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade at and over the age of 19 may serve a period of six months at 30s. per week of 48 hours, or 7½d. per hour; and thereafter, a period of six months at 35s. per week of 48 hours, or 8½d. per hour. Provided that these general minimum time-rates shall be increased by 6s. per week of 48 hours, or 1½d. per hour, in the case of any such worker who is 22 years of age or over. Learners to whom this sub-section applies shall, on the expiration of one year's service in the trade, receive such general minimum time-rates as their age may entitle them to under the foregoing provisions.

PART II.

PROPOSED PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES FOR MALE WORKERS.

(a) For Cutters, Knifemen, Tailors, Fitters-up, Passers, Pressers, and Machinists, as defined in Section I. of Part IV. of this Schedule, 1s. 6½d. per hour.

(b) For Under-Pressers and Plain Machinists, as defined in Section I. of Part IV. of this Schedule, 1s. 4½d. per hour.

(c) For all other Workers, 1s. 3½d. per hour.

In cases where a worker is employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker an amount not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-rate applicable. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies the above condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers other than Learners.

PART III.

PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES.

MALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).

Section I.

(a) In accordance with Section 3 (1), (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week, 48.

On any day (other than Saturday), 9.

On Saturday, 5.

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

Section II.—The Trade Board propose to fix Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker whether engaged on Time-work or on Piece-work, in excess of the declared normal number of hours, as follows, that is to say:—

(1) For the first two hours' overtime on any day, except Saturdays, Sundays, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rates shall be equivalent to Time and a Quarter, that is to say, one-

and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

(2) For overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all overtime on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time and a Half, that is to say, one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

(3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Double Time, that is to say, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be Time and a Quarter except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this section. The Overtime Rate shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday), the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday, exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided—

(a) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9½.

(b) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

(c) That where a worker is of the Jewish religion and subject to the provisions of Section 48 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, is employed on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply to such worker in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday," and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

In the application of these Provisos, where the employer requires attendance on any day on which it is not the established practice of the employer to require attendance, all time worked on such day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) shall be paid for at time and a quarter for the first two hours and time and a half thereafter.

NOTE.—The hours which young persons are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.

PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

Section I.

A Cutter is any person:—

(a) who is employed in:

(i) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings or other materials.

(ii) Laying-up, hooking-up, or folding cloth or linings, or other materials.

(iii) Cutting cloth or linings, or other materials.

(iv) Dividing—that is the process ordinarily carried on by cutters or their assistants of dividing, parting, or separating the parts of garments after being cut, and of assembling them into suitable bundles for making-up; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a cutter or knifeman, as defined in this Section.

A Knifeman is any person:—

(a) who is employed on hand electric or hand-knife operations; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a knifeman or cutter, as defined in this Section.

A Tailor is any person:—

(a) who is employed in sewing by hand in the process of making a garment or portion of a garment; and

(b) has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a tailor, as so defined.

A Fitter-up is any person:—

(a) who is employed in fitting-up—that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, basting, or machining, which consists of preparing or fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being basted, sewn, or machined, such work of preparing or fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances; sewing, basting, or machining forming no part of process of fitting-up; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a fitter-up or tailor, as defined in this Section.

A Passer is any person:—

(a) who is employed in examining garments in the process of being made up or upon completion; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a passer or tailor, as defined in this Section.

A Presser is any person:—

(a) who is employed in pressing off by hand or by machine; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a presser or under-presser, as defined in this Section.

A Machinist is any person:—

(a) who is employed in machining other than as a plain machinist, as hereinafter defined; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a machinist or plain machinist, as defined in this Section.

A Plain Machinist is any person:—

(a) who is employed in the process of making up plain sleeves, facings, linings, inside pockets, quilting, and padding; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a plain machinist or a machinist.

An Under-Presser is any person:—

(a) who is employed in pressing processes other than pressing off; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as an under-presser or presser.

Section II.

A Male Learner is a worker who:—

(a) is employed during the whole or a substantial part of his time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(b) has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a male learner on his first employment in the branch or branches of the trade, as described in Part V. of this Schedule, without a certificate or registration, for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at his employment, the probation period shall be included in his period of learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions of this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if he works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of his parent or guardian.

Section III.—The expression “Home-worker” shall be held to mean a worker who works in his own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART V.

The respective minimum rates of wages set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all male workers in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour dated 20th November, 1919, that is to say, women's, girls' and children's ready-made and wholesale bespoke tailoring, and all women's, girls' and children's retail bespoke tailoring carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments, and any other branch of women's, girls' and children's tailoring, which is not included within the scope of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board, including:—(1) All operations and processes of cutting, making or finishing by hand or machine of coats, costumes, tailored skirts, coat-frocks, mantles, service clothing or similar garments made by tailoring processes; (2) (a) the altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-mentioned tailored garments, except where included within the scope of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board; (b) the cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of the garments; (3) the lining with fur of any of the above-mentioned garments, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments; (4) (a) all processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making, altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-mentioned tailored garments other than hand-embroidery or hand-drawn thread work on garments made of linen or cotton, or of mixed linen and cotton; (b) the following processes, if done by machine—namely, thread-drawing, thread-clipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling and paring; (5) warehousing, packing and all other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned branches of

tailoring; but excluding—(1) those branches of women's or girls' bespoke tailoring and all operations or processes covered by the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919; (2) the making of head-gear; (3) the making of rubberised or oilskin garments; (4) warehousing, packing and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the premises.

PART VI.

Section I.—The above minimum rates of wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911 as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

Section II.—The above minimum rates of

wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposals to fix which may be lodged with them within two months from the 13th January, 1920. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, for the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade in Great Britain as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 20th November, 1919, hereby give notice as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to fix General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates, and Overtime Rates for Female Workers, and to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, as shown in the Schedule set out below:—

Section II.—For Female Learners as defined in Section II. of Part IV. of this Schedule.

(a) Learners other than those specified in Sub-section (b) of this Section:—

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

PROPOSED GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

Section I.—For female workers (other than learners as specified in Section II. of Part I. of this Schedule), namely:—

(a) Workers other than those specified in sub-section (b) of this Section:—

(i) Workers other than homeworkers, 8½d. per hour.

(ii) Homeworkers, 8½d. per hour.

(b) Workers employed as Cutters, Trimmers, and Fitters-up as defined in Section I. of Part IV. of this Schedule:—

Workers under 19 years of age, 8½d. per hour.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 9d. per hour.

Workers of 20 years of age and over, 9½d. per hour.

Provided that in the event of any female worker being employed for the first time as a Cutter, Trimmer, or Fitter-up at or over the age of 19 years, the rate to be paid during the first two months of her employment shall be at 1d. per hour less than the general minimum time-rate appropriate to her age, as set out in Sub-section (b) above.

Provided that learners commencing at 16 and under 18 years of age shall, on attaining the age of 18 years, be entitled, during the remainder of their learnership period, to receive 6s. 6d. per week of 48 hours in addition to the general minimum time-rates applicable, as set out in this column.

(i) The general minimum time-rate for learners under 14 years shall be 2½d. per hour. Such learners shall from the age of 14 be entitled to the amounts shown in Column 1 above, all employment prior to that age being disregarded.

(ii) The advances to be given to learners commencing under 21 years of age shall become due as from the first Monday in January and July of each year, the learner being entitled to her first advance on the first Monday in January or July, as the case may be, provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.

(iii.) A learner shall cease to be a learner and be entitled to the full general minimum time-rate applicable to her under Section I. of Part I. of this Schedule upon the fulfilment of the following conditions:—

Age of Entering upon Employment and Conditions.

Under 15 years of age—The completion of not less than 3 years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years.

15 and under 16 years of age—The completion of not less than 2 years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years.

16 and under 21 years of age—The completion of 2 years' employment.

21 years of age and over—The completion of 1 year's employment.

(iv) No female learner shall be held to be entitled to the full general minimum time-rate under Section I. of Part I. of this Schedule until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had. Provided that in determining the age of entry and the length of employment, all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

(b) Learners who are occupied wholly or mainly in:—

(a) Fitting-up;

(b) Hooking-up material composed solely of cotton or linen to be used in making overalls and other similar washable garments:—

When employed under 16 years of age, 15s. per week of 48 hours or 3½d. per hour.

When employed at 16 years and under 17 years, 18s. per week of 48 hours or 4½d. per hour.

When employed at 17 years and under 18 years, 22s. per week of 48 hours or 5½d. per hour.

The weekly rates for learners as set out in this Section are based on a week of 48 hours, and they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours spent under contract of employment by a learner in the factory or workshop in any week is less than 48.

PART II.

PROPOSED PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

For all Female Workers (other than Cutters, Trimmers and Fitters-up, and other than Learners occupied in Fitting-up and Hooking-up as specified in Section II. (b) of Part I. of this Schedule:—

(a) Workers (other than Homeworkers), 9½d. per hour.

(b) Homeworkers, 9½d. per hour.

In cases where a worker is employed on piece-work each piece-rate must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 9½d. per hour to an Ordinary worker. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers other than Learners.

PART III.

PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES.

Female Workers (all ages).

Section I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week	- - - -	48
On any day (other than Saturday)	- - - -	9
On Saturday	- - - -	5

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

Section II.—The Trade Board propose to fix Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker, whether engaged on time-work or on piece-work, in excess of the declared normal number of hours, as follows, that is to say:—

1. For the first two hours' overtime on any day, except Saturdays, Sundays, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to time-and-a-quarter, that is to say, one-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

2. For overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all overtime on Saturdays the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to time-and-a-half, that is to say, one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

3. For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to double time, that is to say, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

4. For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be time-and-a-quarter except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section. The Overtime Rate shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday), the number of hours worked exceeds nine or, in the case of Saturday, exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided—

(a) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9½.

(b) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

(c) That where a worker is of the Jewish religion and subject to the provisions of Section 48 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, is employed on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply to such worker in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

In the application of these Provisos, where the employer requires attendance on any day on which it is not the established practice of the employer to require attendance, all time worked on such day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) shall be paid for at time-and-a-quarter for the first two hours and time-and-a-half thereafter.

NOTE.—The hours which female workers and young persons are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.

PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

Section I.—Cutters, Trimmers and Fitters-up shall be deemed to be workers who are substantially occupied in one or more of the following processes, that is to say:—

(a) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings, or other materials.

(b) Laying-up, hooking-up or folding cloth or linings, or other materials.

(c) Cutting cloth or linings or other materials.

(d) Trimming, that is, the process as ordinarily carried on of cutting and assembling together the linings and fittings of garments.

(e) Dividing, that is, the process as ordinarily carried on by Cutters or their Assistants, of dividing, parting or separating the parts of garments after being cut, and of assembling them into suitable bundles for making-up.

(f) Fitting-up, that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, basting, or machining, which consists of preparing and fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being basted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing and fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances; sewing, basting or machining forming no part or process of fitting-up.

Section II.—A female learner is a worker who:—

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(b) Has received a certificate, or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner on her first employment, in

the branch or branches of the trade described in Part V. of this Schedule, without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

Section III.—The expression "Home-worker" shall be held to mean a worker who works in her own home, or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART V.

The respective minimum rates of wages set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all female workers in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 20th November, 1919, that is to say, women's, girls', and children's ready-made and wholesale bespoke tailoring, and all women's, girls', and children's retail bespoke tailoring carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments, and any other branch of women's, girls', and children's tailoring which is not included within the scope of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Board, including:—(1) All operations and processes of cutting, making, or finishing by hand or machine of coats, costumes, tailored skirts, coat-frocks, mantles, service clothing, or similar garments made by tailoring processes; (2) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of any of the above-mentioned tailored garments, except where included within the scope of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board; (b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of the garments; (3) The lining with fur of any of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments; (4) (a) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making, altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of any of the above-mentioned tailored garments other than hand-embroidery or hand-drawn thread work on garments made of linen or cotton or of mixed linen and cotton; (b) The following processes if done by machine, namely, thread-drawing, thread-clipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling and paring; (5) Warehousing, packing, and all other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned branches of tailoring; but excluding:—(1) Those branches of women's or girls' bespoke tailoring and all operations or processes covered by the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919; (2) The making of head-gear; (3) The making of rubberised or oilskin garments; (4) Warehousing, packing, and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the premises.

PART VI.

Section I.—The above minimum rates of wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

Section II.—The above minimum rates of wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposals to fix which may be lodged with them within two months from the 13th January, 1920. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

BRUSH AND BROOM TRADE BOARD
(GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO FIX GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES AND TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Great Britain, for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Board's (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to fix general minimum piece-rates for male workers employed in:—

- (1) Pan Work,
- (2) Hairs,
- (3) Painting Brush-making,
- (4) Hand Finishing,
- (5) Bone Brush-making,

and for Female Workers employed in:—

Hand Drawing.

The Trade Board also propose (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to notice of proposal being given) to Vary the Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in their notice dated 31st December, 1919, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 29th December, 1919, so that in lieu of the Overtime Rates at present fixed the Overtime Rates in respect of hours worked by a worker employed on piece-work in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the notice above referred to to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(a) For the first two hours' overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary

Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be:—

(i) For male workers, a rate which is equivalent to the general minimum piece-rate applicable as set out above, or, where no general minimum piece-rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, is equivalent to a piece-rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker at least the same amount of money as the general minimum time-rate, with the addition in both cases of one-quarter of the general minimum time-rate which, under the terms of the Trade Board's notice, dated 31st December, 1919, would be applicable to the worker if he were employed on time-work.

(ii) For female workers, a rate which is equivalent to the general minimum piece-rate applicable as set out above, or, where no general minimum piece-rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, is equivalent to a piece-rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker not less than $9\frac{1}{4}$ d. per hour, with an addition in both cases of $2\frac{5}{16}$ d. per hour.

(b) For overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be:—

(i) For male workers, a rate which is equivalent to the general minimum piece-rate applicable as set out above, or, where no general minimum piece-rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, is equivalent to a piece-rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker at least the same amount of money as the general minimum time-rate, with the addition in both cases of one-half of the general minimum time-rate which, under the terms of the Trade Board's notice, dated 31st December, 1919, would be applicable to the worker if he were employed on time-work.

(ii) For female workers, a rate which is equivalent to the general minimum piece-rate applicable as set out above, or, where no general minimum piece-rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, is equivalent to a piece-rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker not less than $9\frac{1}{4}$ d. per hour, with an addition in both cases of $4\frac{1}{8}$ d. per hour.

(c) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be:—

(i) For male workers, a rate which is equivalent to the general minimum piece-rate applicable as set out above, or, where no general minimum piece-rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, is equivalent to a piece-rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker at least the same amount of money as the general minimum time-rate, with the addition in both cases of the general minimum time-rate which, under the terms of the Trade Board's notice, dated 31st December, 1919, would be applicable to the worker if he were employed on time-work.

(ii) For female workers, a rate which is equivalent to the general minimum

piece-rate applicable as set out above or, where no general minimum piece-rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, is equivalent to a piece-rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker not less than 9½d. per hour, with an addition in both cases of 9½d. per hour.

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rates shall be as set out in sub-paragraphs (i) and (ii) of paragraph (a) above for male and female workers respectively, except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) above.

The Trade Board give similar notice, the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such notice being given, that they propose to vary the general minimum time rates and overtime rates at present fixed and set out in the schedule to their notice dated 31st December, 1919, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 29th December, 1919, in respect of the following class of male workers:—

For male workers ordinarily employed on piece work for which general minimum piece rates have been fixed in the Pan, Hairs, and Hand Finishing sections of the trade when temporarily employed on a time-work basis on work for which no general minimum piece rates are fixed, so that in lieu of the general minimum time rates at present fixed the general minimum time rate shall be

1s. 8d. per hour;

and in lieu of the overtime rates at present fixed *overtime rates* calculated on the minimum rates set out above, in the manner set out in the schedule of the above-mentioned notice issued by the Trade Board, and dated 31st December, 1919, shall apply, in substitution for the above minimum rate, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board, in the schedule above referred to, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

The minimum rates which the Trade Board have given Notice of Proposal to Fix and to Vary shall *not* apply to

(i) Carmen, Engineers, Powermen, Enginemen or Stokers.

(ii) Male Indentured Apprentices or Unbound Learners employed under an indenture or written agreement respectively entered into prior to 1st January, 1920, and providing for the proper instruction of the apprentice or learner in one or more of the following operations or branches of work, that is to say:—

“Pan” (Hair and Bass), “Hairs,” “Finishing” (i.e., the work of all woodworkers employed in finishing or part-finishing brushes or brooms by hand or machine), “Boring” (Hand and Machine Boring), “Drawing,” “Bone Brush Cutting,” “Bone Brush Fashioning,” “Bone Brush Drilling,” “Bone Brush Profiling,” the manufacture of Artists’, Medical, Painting, Whitewash and Tar Brushes and Brushes not otherwise specified; and

(a) The drafting, dressing (including cutting), or mixing of animal hair, bass, whisk or other fibre where the operative

performs the aforesaid operations singly or in combination by hand or partly by hand and partly by machine.

(b) The working of ivory or celluloid,

(c) The turning of bone,

where all or any of the operations specified in (a), (b) or (c) are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of brushes (other than feather brushes) or brooms;

(iii) Male Indentured Apprentices employed under indentures in a form prescribed by the Trade Board and who are working under conditions laid down by the Trade Board.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 13th January, 1920. Such objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2. It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

SPECIAL ORDER MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 1 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, WITH RESPECT TO THE LINEN AND COTTON HANDKERCHIEF AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND LINEN PIECE GOODS TRADE.

Whereas the Minister of Labour is empowered under and by-virtue of sub-section (2) of section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply if he is of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade or in any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that trade;

And whereas it is provided by sub-section (5) of section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, may be repealed or varied by a subsequent Special Order;

And whereas it is provided by sub-section (1) of section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that every Special Order may be varied or revoked by subsequent Special Order;

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the trade specified in the Appendix to this Order, except as regards such processes or operations as may be

covered by the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Embroidery) Order, 1913, and the Trade Boards (Laundry) Order, 1919;

And whereas the Minister of Labour is of opinion that it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to the trade specified in the Appendix to this Order;

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Robert S. Horne, K.B.E., K.C., M.P., Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers in me vested, as before recited, do hereby make a Special Order that from and after the sixteenth day of January, 1920, the following provisions shall have effect (that is to say):—

Article 1.—The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the trade specified in the Appendix to this Order.

Article 2.—The Trade Boards (Laundry) Order, 1919, and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, confirming, among other Orders, the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Embroidery) Order, 1913, are hereby varied by the exclusion therefrom of any processes or operations comprised therein, which may be included in the Appendix to this Order.

Article 3.—This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920.

TRADE.

The Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Trade (that is to say):—

I. The making of such articles as are specified in (a) and (b) below, from linen or cotton or mixed linen and cotton fabrics (excepting knitted fabrics), or from other textile fabrics when the work is carried on in establishments mainly engaged in the making of such articles from the before-mentioned fabrics, viz.:—

(a) Handkerchiefs (including Mufflers or Flags when made in association or conjunction with Handkerchiefs);

(b) Bed-linen, Towels, Dusters, Table-napery, Bed-spreads, Tea-cloths, Table-centres, Sideboard-covers, Cushion-covers, or similar household articles;

including all or any of the following operations:—

(i) Hooking, cutting or tearing the material;

(ii) Vice-folding;

(iii) Machine hemming, hem-stitching, spoking, over-locking, tambouring, button-holing, and other plain or fancy machine stitching;

(iv) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework done by machine, whether before or after the making of the articles of the description specified above;

(v) The following processes if done by machine: thread-drawing, thread-clipping, topsewing, scalloping, nickelling and paring;

(vi) All processes of laundering, smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, finishing,

warehousing, packing, and other similar operations incidental to or appertaining to the making of the articles of the description specified above.

2. The making-up in linen warehouses or in establishments mainly engaged in linen lapping, of linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile fabrics in the piece, or of linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile articles cut from the piece, including:—

Measuring, cutting, lapping, ornamenting, boxing, warehousing, packing and similar operations.

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NOTICE TO AIRMEN (No. 5).

OFFICIAL TRIALS OF AIRCRAFT.

It is hereby notified that:—

In order to assist the Aircraft Industry in the testing of new machines it has been arranged by the Air Council that facilities shall be afforded for full official trials of machines, irrespective of the question of granting Certificates of Airworthiness.

It has been found unnecessary to subject Constructors to the delay and inconvenience which would be caused under Section 3, paragraph 8, of Pamphlet A.N.D. (1) (Directions issued under the Air Navigation Regulations), which lay down that in order to obtain a certificate of airworthiness type aircraft must be submitted to full official trials. Such trials are now limited to a test flight by a Government Pilot, usually at an aerodrome selected by the owner of the aircraft.

To meet cases, however, where Constructors desire any official trials without reference to the question of airworthiness the Air Council have decided that such trials shall be undertaken under the conditions specified below:—

(a) That the tests are carried out at the place appointed by the Director of Research and under the instructions and supervision of the O.C. Station, and by a pilot or pilots nominated by the O.C. Station, or by the Director of Research.

(b) That the Director of Research has satisfied himself that the machine is reasonably safe to fly before an official test pilot is required to carry out the test.

(c) That the machine is to be flown to the Station by the applicant's pilot, and collected by the applicant immediately on receiving notice to do so from the Director of Research. In case the machine has to be dismantled for any purpose or collected or transported by rail, the dismantling, collection and transportation will be done by the applicant at his own risk and expense and without undue delay.

(d) That the machine shall be entirely at the risk of the applicant, not only during test, but throughout the whole time it remains at any R.A.F. station, and also during transit to or from any such station, and that the applicant shall have no claim against any Government Department, or any officer, N.C.O., or man of the R.A.F. for any damage however done to the machine.

(e) That a fee of £20 is paid by the applicant (cheque or draft made payable to "the Assistant Financial Secretary, Air Ministry," and crossed "Bank of England"). This fee will cover the use of such Government labour and accommodation for the storage of the machine as may be available unless applicant fails to comply with the next condition (f), but all petrol, oil, spares and accessories must be provided by the applicant or paid for by him if provided from Government stocks, and no expense in connection with the tests will be borne by the public.

(f) If for any reason the Director of Research gives notice to the applicant to remove the machine, the removal must take place with all possible speed, and no claim for damages or expenses will lie against the Air Council or any other Government Department in respect thereof.

(g) That the Director of Research shall receive notification at least three clear days in advance of the date on which it is proposed to despatch the machine to the place appointed for the trials, and no machine shall be despatched until the concurrence of the Director of Research has been received.

(h) That the report of the trials is not to be published without the consent of the Director of Research.

HAMPSHIRE AND DORSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 2).

The Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Movement of Animals into certain Boroughs, etc., for Immediate Slaughter.

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Hampshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920, an animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved without a licence by railway or by vessel from outside the Scheduled District described in the Schedule to that Order, as extended by the Hampshire and Dorset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920, to a railway station or landing place situate within any borough or urban district mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing place to any slaughterhouse or bacon factory situate within the same borough or urban district, as the case may be, if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough or urban district.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

2.—(1) The movement of an animal with a Movement Licence under this Order shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(i.) The animal shall be moved to the slaughterhouse or bacon factory specified in the Licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained until it is slaughtered.

(ii.) The animal during the movement to the slaughterhouse or bacon factory shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals not being moved with a Licence under this Order.

(iii.) After completion of the movement the Licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same district by the person in charge of the animal at the time of completing such movement.

(2) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall

be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

Exception of Certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by Regulation of a Local Authority or by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry given under any Order of the Ministry.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Ministry or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the HAMPSHIRE AND DORSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 2).
