EXCHEQUER BONDS.

Repayable at Par on the 1st February, 1925.

Bearing Interest from the date of purchase at £5½ per Cent. per annum, payable Half-Yearly, on the 1st February and 1st August.

Price of Issue fixed by H.M. Treasury at £100 per Cent
Payable on Application.

The Governor and Company of the Bank of England are authorized by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to receive applications for the above Bonds.

The Principal and Interest of the Bonds are chargeable on the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom.

The Bonds will be repayable at par on the 1st February, 1925, but a holder of Bonds of this issue may give notice during the month of January in either of the years 1921, 1922 or 1923 requiring repayment of the Bonds at par on the 1st February in the year next succeeding that in which such notice is given. Under no

circumstances may notice once given be subsequently withdrawn.

Bonds of this issue, and the Interest payable from time to time in respect thereof, will be exempt from all British taxation, present or future, if it is shown in the manner directed by the Treasury that they are in the beneficial ownership of a person who is neither domiciled nor ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

AERATED WATERS TRADE BOARD
(ENGLAND AND WALES).

PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES
FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in England and Wales under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Aerated Waters Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Aerated Waters) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to fix General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, and to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, as set out below:—

PART I.

Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates.

Section I.—Male Workers.

Workers of 15 years and under 16 years of age, 25s. per week of 47 hours.

Workers of 16 years and under 17 years of age, 30s. per week of 47 hours.

Workers of 17 years and under 18 years of age, 35s. per week of 47 hours.

Workers of 18 years and under 19 years of age, 40s. per week of 47 hours.

Workers of 19 years and under 20 years of age, 45s. per week of 47 hours.

Workers of 20 years and under 21 years of age, 50s. per week of 47 hours.

Workers of 21 years of age and over, 61s. per week of 47 hours.

Section II.—Female Workers.

Workers of 15 years and under 16 years of age, 20s. per week of 47 hours.

Workers of 16 years and under 17 years of age, 24s. per week of 47 hours.

Workers of 17 years and under 18 years of age, 28s. per week of 47 hours.

Workers of 18 years of age and over, 33s. 6d. per week of 47 hours.

The above General Minimum Time-Rates are weekly rates based on a week of 47 hours and shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours spent by the worker in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less than 47.

PART II.

Proposed Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates.

Section I.—All Male Workers, 1s. 7½d. per hour.

In the case of all Male Workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid shall be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. 7½d. per hour to an ordinary worker. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies the foregoing condition regard shall be had only to the earn-

ings of Male Workers of 21 years of age and over.

Section II.—All Female Workers, 10 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour.

In the case of all Female Workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid shall be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 10 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour to an ordinary worker. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies the foregoing condition regard shall be had only to the earnings of Female Workers of 18 years of age and over.

PART III.

Proposed Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers.

Section I.

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any Week	47
On Saturday	4 $\frac{1}{2}$

Provided that any other day, not being Sunday, may, by agreement in writing between an employer and a worker, be substituted in the place of Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours on such substituted day shall be 4 $\frac{1}{2}$.

Provided also that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Statutory Bank Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

Section II.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime for all Male and Female Workers in respect of hours worked by a worker, whether employed on Time-Work or on Piece-Work, in excess of the normal number of hours proposed to be declared by the Trade Board, as set out in Section I. of this Part of this Notice, shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(1) For all time worked on Sundays and Statutory Bank Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to *Double Time*, that is to say, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

(2) For all time worked in excess of 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours on a Saturday (or on the weekly short day substituted therefor under the terms of the first Proviso to Section I. of this Part of this Notice) the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to *Time and a Half*, that is to say, one and a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week may not exceed 47.

(3) For all time worked in excess of 47 hours in any week the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to *Time and a Quarter* for the first two hours and *Time and a Half* thereafter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Section.

NOTE.—The hours of work which female workers and young persons are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.

PART IV.

The above minimum rates of wages shall

apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in England and Wales who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Aerated Waters) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The manufacture, wherever carried on, of mineral or aerated waters, non-alcoholic cordials, flavoured syrups, unfermented sweet drinks and other similar beverages, and the manufacture in unlicensed premises of brewed liquors, including:—

(a) the operations of bottle washing, bottling and filling and all other operations preparatory to the sale of any of the aforesaid liquors in bottles, jars, syphons, casks or other similar receptacles; and including also:—

(b) the operations of bottle washing, bottling and filling, and all subsidiary operations preparatory to the sale in bottles, jars or other similar receptacles of cider, ale, stout, porter and other alcoholic beers, where all or any, of such last mentioned operations are, or is, conducted or carried on in association with or in conjunction with all or any of the operations specified under (a) above so as to form a common or interchangeable form of employment for workers, and whether the two sets of operations or any of them are, or is, carried on simultaneously or not.

PART V.

Section I.

The above General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

Section II.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposal to Fix Minimum Rates which may be lodged with them within two months from 19th January, 1920. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Aerated Waters Trade Board (England and Wales), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

SPECIAL ORDER MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION ONE OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, WITH RESPECT TO THE MILK DISTRIBUTIVE TRADE.

Whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, apply to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and to the Trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, and the Minister of Labour is empowered under and by virtue of Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply, if he is of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade, or any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that trade:

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the trade specified in the appendix to this Order, and the Minister of Labour as respects that trade is of the opinion aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers given to me by Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and by any other Statute in that behalf, do hereby make a Special Order that from and after the twentieth day of January the following provision shall have effect (that is to say):—

Article 1.—The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the Trade specified in the appendix to this Order.

Article 2.—This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920.

APPENDIX.

TRADE.

The Milk Distributive Trade, that is to say:—

1. (a) The wholesale or retail sale of fresh milk when carried on as a main or distinct business or as a distinct branch or department of a business;

(b) the sale of food or drink for consumption on the premises or of other goods when any such sale is carried on in association with and as a subsidiary part of such business, branch or department as aforesaid, if such sale involves the employment of workers who are principally employed in the sale specified in (a) above;

2. (a) the following operations when incidental to the sales specified in 1, above:

(i) boxing, parcelling, labelling, weighing, measuring, checking, bottling, unpacking, packing;

(ii) collecting, delivering, despatching, horse-keeping, cleaning vehicles;

(iii) portering, lift or hoist operating, time-keeping, storing, stock-keeping, warehousing, cleaning premises;

(iv) pasteurising, cooling, separating of milk;

(v) cleaning utensils or receptacles;

(vi) blending, testing, sampling;

(vii) other incidental operations;

(b) clerical work or canvassing when incidental to and carried on in conjunction with the work specified in 1, above;

but excluding any operations in—

(a) the transport of goods by common carriers;

(b) any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto;

(c) Post Office business;

(d) Agriculture within the meaning of the Corn Production Act, 1917.

Whereas it is provided by Paragraph 1 of the Regulations, dated 10th January, 1914, with respect to the Constitution and Proceedings of a Trade Board for certain branches of the Tailoring Trade in Great Britain, that:—

“ A Trade Board shall be established for those branches of the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring in Great Britain which are engaged in making garments to be worn by male persons and for those branches of the bespoke Tailoring Trade in Great Britain which are engaged in making garments to be worn by male persons, and in which at least three persons or two female persons (in both cases exclusive of cutters and trimmers) are engaged in making one garment.”

And whereas it is provided by Paragraph 16 of the said Regulations that:—

“ The Trade Board shall continue in existence for three years and thereafter until dissolved by Order of the Board of Trade.”

And whereas a Trade Board was established in accordance with the above-mentioned Regulations on 18th March, 1914, for the period of three years commencing 23rd March, 1914, and thereafter until dissolved by order of the Board of Trade;

And whereas by the New Ministries and Secretaries Act, 1916, provision is made, amongst other things, for the transfer to the Minister of Labour of the powers and duties of the Board of Trade under the enactment mentioned in the Schedule to the Act;

And whereas the said Trade Boards Act is one of the enactments mentioned in the Schedule to the said New Ministries and Secretaries Act;

And whereas it is further provided by the said New Ministries and Secretaries Act that, where any powers and duties are transferred by virtue of the Act, the transfer is to take effect from a date to be fixed by Order of His Majesty in Council, and that different dates may be fixed for different powers and duties;

And whereas it is provided by the Minister of Labour (Transfer of Powers) Order, 1917, that the transfer to the Minister of Labour by virtue of the said New Ministries and Secretaries Act of the powers and duties of the Board of Trade under the enactments mentioned in the Schedule to that Act shall take effect as from the 10th day of January, 1917;

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Robert S. Horne, K.B.E., K.C., M.P., Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers in me vested as before recited, do by this Order hereby dissolve the said Trade Board.

(b) To empower the Corporation to grant leases of the Aquarium Estate for any term not exceeding 60 years as they may think fit, and for such purposes or uses (in addition to those mentioned in section 17 of the said Act of 1901 or to be authorised by the proposed Order) as shall be deemed by the Corporation to be in the best interests of the inhabitants of the Borough;

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 15TH JANUARY 1920.)

WILTSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, to be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such Dis-

tract without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding, or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Power to restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:—

(i.) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries

(2) Copies of such notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3) A copy of every such notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Power to restrict Movement of Dogs and Poultry in Certain Cases.

3.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by a notice served on the occupier of any premises in the Scheduled District, require him:—

(a) to keep in confinement, or under control, as may be prescribed by the notice, dogs on such premises;

or (b) to confine live poultry on such premises in a pen or other like enclosure;

or (c) to prevent the access of live poultry to any specific part of the premises to which cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have, or recently have had, access;

and if any occupier after service of any such notice shall fail to comply with the requirements thereof, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) An Inspector of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by notice affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed,

require dogs to be kept by the person in charge thereof under control while passing along any road or footpath specified in such notice, and if any person in charge of a dog while passing along any road or footpath to which any such notice relates fails to keep the dog under control, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) Every notice served on an occupier of premises shall remain in operation until it is withdrawn by a further notice served by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(4.) A copy of every notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the General Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

5.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the WILTSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920.

WILTSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-
AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF
1920 (No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders, as follows:—

Movement of Animals into certain Boroughs, etc., for Immediate Slaughter.

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Wiltshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920, an animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved without a licence by railway from outside the Scheduled District described in the Schedule to that Order to a railway station situate within any borough or urban district mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughterhouse or bacon factory situate within the same borough or urban district, as the case may be, if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough or urban district.

Provisions as to Movement-Licences.

2.—(1) The movement of an animal with a Movement Licence under this Order shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(i) The animal shall be moved to the slaughterhouse or bacon factory specified in the Licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained until it is slaughtered.

(ii.) The animal during the movement to the slaughterhouse or bacon factory shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals not being moved with a Licence under this Order.

(iii.) After completion of the movement the Licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same district by the person in charge of the animal at the time of completing such movement.

(2) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall be in force for not more than four

days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

Exception of Certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by Regulation of a Local Authority or by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry given under any Order of the Ministry.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

4.—(1). Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Ministry or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the WILTSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 2).
