The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS under section two of the New Ministries and Secretaries Act, 1916, provision is made (amongst other things) for conferring on the Minister of Labour such powers and duties of any Government Department relating to labour or industry as His Majesty may by Order in Council transfer to the Minister:

And whereas by section thirteen of the War Pensions (Administrative Provisions) Act, 1918, it is provided that the power of making regulations under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, as amended by any subsequent enactments, shall include power to make regulations authorizing the Commissioners of Works to take possession of any land (including any buildings thereon) which the Minister may certify to be required for the purposes of carrying into effect the Naval and Military War Pensions &c. Act, 1915:

And whereas by virtue of the powers so conferred provision was made by Regulation 2A of the Defence of the Realm Regulations for

enabling the Commissioners of Works to take possession of any land certified to be required as aforesaid:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 8th day of May, 1919, provision was made for the transference to the Minister of Labour of certain powers of the Minister of Pensions under section 3 (1) (j) of the Naval and Military War Pensions &c. Act, 1915, as subsequently amended, relating to the training and employment of disabled officers (including nurses) and men after they have left the service:

And whereas it is expedient to transfer to the Minister of Labour the powers of the Minister of Pensions in relation to taking possession of land for the purposes of the powers formerly exercised by the Minister of Pensions under the said section 3 (1) (j):

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) The power of certifying that land is required for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of the Naval and Military War Pensions &c. Act, 1915, which power is conferred upon the Minister of Pensions by regulation 2A of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, made under section thirteen of the War

Pensions (Administrative Provisions) Act, 1918, is hereby, so far as the same relates to the purposes involved in the performance of the powers and duties of the Minister of Labour under section 3 (1) (j) of the Naval and Military War Pensions &c. Act, 1915, transferred to the Minister of Labour.

(2) This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Labour (Transfer of Powers) Order, 1920.

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 17th day of January, 1920, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Orders in Council bearing date the 5th July, 1911, and 14th September, 1915, respectively, Samuel Mackenzie Hammond and William Primmer, Keepers and Stewards of the Royal Cabins in Your Majesty's Yachts, were granted special promotion to Warrant Rank under certain conditions:

"And whereas we consider that these Officers should participate in the improved rates of pay recently introduced for Officers of Your Majesty's Fleet:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following arrangements:—

(a) These Warrant Officers to receive as from the 1st day of February, 1919, Active Service Pay according to seniority on the non-Mechanical scale for Warrant Officer, this pay to include pension and allowance for care of State furniture, and Samuel Mackenzie Hammond, who is at present in receipt of the bonus of 15 per cent. of full pay payable to Retired Officers voluntarily re-employed to continue in receipt of such bonus (calculated on the revised rate of pay) in addition, during the continuance of his appointment, subject to any general increase in the rate of this bonus which may subsequently be approved for the period of the war.

(b) The Retired Pay payable to these Officers on finally ceasing service to be the minimum Retired Pay for Warrant Officer without additions.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 17th day of January, 1920, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by His late Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 28th March, 1903, and subsequent Orders in Council, it is provided that certain Commissioned Warrant Officers and Warrant Officers shall be eligible for promotion to the rank, or corresponding rank, of Lieutenant, as a reward for long and zealous service, and that these Officers should be granted the rank or corresponding rank of Lieutenant-Commander on attaining 8 years' seniority in the rank or corresponding rank of Lieutenant:

"And whereas we are of opinion that similar advancement should be open to Commissioned Warrant Officers and Warrant Officers of the Regulating Electrician and Cookery Branches, and that the establishment of Officers of the Regulating and Electrician Branches authorized by Orders in Council of the 18th October, 1909, 16th November, 1917, and 13th October, 1910, should be increased:

"And whereas we are further of opinion that the titles of certain Warrant Officers and Officers promoted from Warrant rank require revision:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the arrangements shown in the annexed Schedules.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals where necessary.

#### "SCHEDULE A.

"Commissioned Electricians, Commissioned Masters-at-Arms and Commissioned Instructors in Cookery to be eligible for promotion to the relative rank of Lieutenant with the titles of Electrical Lieutenant, Lieutenant-at-Arms and Lieutenant Instructor in Cookery respectively.

"Lieutenants-at-Arms, Electrical Lieutenants and Lieutenant Instructors in Cookery

on attaining 8 years' seniority as such to have the relative rank of Lieutenant-Commander.

*" Pay.*

" Pay of Electrical Lieutenants and Electrical Lieutenant-Commanders to be on the scales authorized for Lieutenants and Lieutenant-Commanders promoted from Warrant rank (Mechanical Branch). Pay of Lieutenants-at-Arms, Lieutenant Instructors in Cookery and Lieutenant-Commanders promoted therefrom to be on the scale for Lieutenants and Lieutenant-Commanders promoted from Warrant Rank (non-Mechanical Branch).

*" Retired Pay, &c.*

" Retired Pay, Widows' Pensions and Compassionate allowances for children to be on the scales authorized for Lieutenants and Lieutenant-Commanders promoted from Warrant rank.

*" Numbers.*

" The number of Lieutenants-at-Arms, Electrical Lieutenants and Lieutenant Instructors in Cookery to be not more than 8 per cent. of the total number of Officers of Warrant rank and above in the respective branches.

**" SCHEDULE B.**

*" Titles of Warrant Officers and Officers promoted from Warrant Rank.*

" 1. The collective expression and title of 'Commissioned Warrant Officers' to be abolished; such Officers when referred to collectively to be termed:—

(a) *Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank* when it is desired to refer only to

Officers of the grade lying between Warrant Officer and Lieutenant.

(b) *Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank and above* when it is desired to refer to Officers described at (a) above, together with Lieutenants, Lieutenant-Commanders and Commanders promoted from Warrant Rank.

(c) *Warrant Officers and above* when it is desired to refer to the above together with Warrant Officers.

" 2. The titles of Warrant Officers and above to be as follows:—

" The establishment of the Regulating and Electrician Branches to be as follows:—

*Regulating Branch.*

- 1 Lieutenant-at-Arms.
- 3 Commissioned Masters-at-Arms.
- 9 Warrant Masters-at-Arms.

*Electrician Branch.*

- 2 Electrical Lieutenants.
- 9 Commissioned Electricians.
- 19 Warrant Electricians.

" The above number of Commissioned Masters-at-Arms and Commissioned Electricians to be temporary pending the operation of the rule under which deserving Warrant Officers are promoted to Commissioned Warrant rank after 10 years' service as Warrant Officer.

" The above provisions to have effect in the case of the Regulating and Ships' Cooks' branches from the 13th September, 1918, and in the case of the Electrician branch from 12th December, 1919.

#### PATENTS AND DESIGNS ACTS, 1907 AND 1919.

Whereas Section 29 (3) of the Patents and Designs Act, 1907, as amended by Section 8 of the Patents and Designs Act, 1919, provides as follows:—

“(3) The right to use an invention for the services of the Crown under the provisions of this Section or any provisions for which this Section is substituted shall include and shall be deemed always to have included the power to sell any articles made in pursuance of such right which are no longer required for the services of the Crown”;

And whereas Section 22 of the Patents and Designs Act, 1919, provides, *inter alia*, as follows:—

“The provisions of this Act relating to the terms on which an invention or registered design can be made, used or exercised by or on behalf of a Government department shall not come into operation until such time as may be fixed by order of the Board of Trade”:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade do hereby order that Section 29 (3) of the Patents and Designs Act, 1907, as amended by Section 8 of the Patents and Designs Act, 1919, shall come into operation on the 21st day of January, 1920.

## BRUSH AND BROOM TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

## PROPOSAL TO VARY AND TO FIX CERTAIN MINIMUM RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Great Britain for the branches of Trade specified in the Trade Board's (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such Notice being given) the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated 31st December, 1919, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 29th December, 1919, in respect of certain classes of male workers, and that they propose to Fix General Minimum Time-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for a certain class of female workers as shown in the Schedule set out below.

## SCHEDULE.

## PART I.

*Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates for certain Classes of Male Workers.*GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AT PRESENT  
FIXED.

A.—For Male Workers of 21 years of age and over who are employed in one or more of the following operations or branches of work and who have had not less than three years' experience in one or more of the following operations or branches of work, that is to say:—

"Pan" (Hair and Bass), "Hairs," "Finishing" (i.e., the work of all wood-workers employed in finishing or part-finishing brushes or brooms by hand or machine), "Boring" (Hand and Machine Boring), "Drawing," "Bone Brush Cutting," "Bone Brush Fashioning," "Bone Brush Drilling," "Bone Brush Profiling," the manufacture of Artists', Medical, Painting, Whitewash, and Tar Brushes, and Brushes not otherwise specified:

1s. 5½d. per hour.

B.—For Male Workers of all ages who have served an apprenticeship of not less than five years in one or more of the operations or branches of work specified in paragraph A above:

1s. 5½d. per hour.

C.—For all other Male Workers:—

Workers of 21 years of age and over, 1s. 2d. per hour.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 1s. per hour.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 10d. per hour.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 8d. per hour.

Workers of 17½ and under 18 years of age, 7½d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 17½ years of age, 6½d. per hour.

Workers of 16½ and under 17 years of age, 6d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 16½ years of age, 5½d.

*Variation Proposed.*

I. For Male Workers of 21 years of age and over who are employed in one or more of the following operations or branches of work, and who have had not less than three years' experience in one or more of the following operations or branches of work, that is to say:—

"Pan" (Hair and Bass), "Hairs," "Finishing" (i.e., the work of all wood-workers employed in finishing or part-finishing brushes or brooms by hand or machine), "Boring" (Hand and Machine Boring), "Drawing," "Bone Brush Cutting," "Bone Brush Fashioning," "Bone Brush Drilling," "Bone Brush Profiling," the manufacture of Artists', Medical, Painting, Whitewash, and Tar Brushes, and Brushes not otherwise specified; and

(a) The Drafting, Dressing (including Cutting), or Mixing of Animal Hair, Bass, Whisk or other Fibre where the operative performs the aforesaid operation singly or in combination by hand or partly by hand and partly by machine.

(b) The working of Ivory or Celluloid.

(c) The Turning of Bone.

Where all or any of the operations specified in (a), (b) or (c) are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of Brushes (other than Feather Brushes) or Brooms: 1s. 5½d. per hour.

II.—For Male Workers of all ages who have served an apprenticeship of not less than five years in one or more of the operations or branches of work specified in paragraph I. above: 1s. 5½d. per hour.

III.—For all other Male Workers:—

Workers of 21 years of age and over, 1s. 2d. per hour.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 1s. per hour.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 10d. per hour.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 8d. per hour.

Workers of 17½ and under 18 years of age, 7½d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 17½ years of age, 6½d. per hour.

Workers of 16½ and under 17 years of age, 6d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 16½ years of age, 5½d. per hour.

## SCHEDULE.—Continued.

## PART I.—Continued.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AT PRESENT  
FIXED.

Workers of 15½ and under 16 years of age, 4½d. per hour.

Provided that the rates set out in paragraph C above shall not apply to apprentices, as defined in Part IV. of the Schedule of the Trade Board's Notice dated 31st December, 1919.

Workers of 15½ and under 16 years of age, 4½d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 15½ years of age, 4d. per hour.

Workers of 14½ and under 15 years of age, 3½d. per hour.

Workers under 14½ years of age, 3d. per hour.

Provided that the rates set out in paragraph III. above shall not apply to:—

(a) Male indentured apprentices who are employed under indentures in a form prescribed by the Trade Board and are working under conditions laid down by the Trade Board.

(b) Male indentured apprentices or unbound learners employed under an Indenture or written agreement respectively entered into prior to 1st January, 1920, and providing for the proper instruction of the apprentice or learner in one or more of the operations or branches of work specified in paragraph I. above.

## PART II.

*Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates and Guaranteed Time-Rates for Female Learners.*

Section I.—For Female Learners as defined in Section II. of this part of this Notice:—

For learners commencing at 16 and under 21 years of age:—

During 1st 6 months of employment, 3½d. per hour.

During 2nd 6 months of employment, 4½d. per hour.

During 3rd 6 months of employment, 5d. per hour.

During 4th 6 months of employment, 6d. per hour.

For learners commencing at 21 years of age and over:—

During 1st 3 months of employment, 5d. per hour.

During 2nd 3 months of employment, 6d. per hour.

During 3rd 3 months of employment, 6½d. per hour.

During 4th 3 months of employment, 7½d.

A "learner" employed on piece-work shall be entitled to be paid not less than the guaranteed time-rate applicable to a "learner" of her age and experience as set out in the above table, notwithstanding that her earnings on piece-work are less than such sum.

Section II.—For the purpose of this Notice a female "learner" shall be deemed to be:—

A Female Worker of 16 years of age and over who enters the trade for the first time on or after 1st January 1920, and

(1) is employed in learning any one of the following branches of the trade by an employer who provides the worker with reasonable facilities for such learning:—

- (i) Polishing by hand,
- (ii) Drawing by hand,
- (iii) Shaving brush making,
- (iv) Enamel brush making,
- (v) Bone brush drilling,
- (vi) Machine filling

and (2) has received a certificate, or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that the certificate or registration of the learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner on her first employment, in one of the branches of trade described in para. (1) of this section, without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this section, a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

## PART III.

*Proposed Overtime Rates for Female Learners and Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for certain Classes of Male Workers.*

In respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in their Notice dated 31st December, 1919, to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade:

(a) Overtime Rates calculated in the manner set out in the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 31st December, 1919, shall apply, in the case of workers employed on Time-Work in substitution for the Minimum Rate which would otherwise be applicable as set out above; and

(b) Overtime Rates calculated in the manner set out in the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 12th January, 1920, shall apply, in the case of workers employed

imum Rate which would otherwise be applicable, as set out above.

#### PART IV.

*Section I.*—The respective minimum rates set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this Notice, to all Workers (including Home Workers) in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, that is to say, the manufacture of brushes (other than feather brushes) or brooms, including the following operations, where all or any of them are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such Brushes or Brooms:—

(a) The drafting, dressing or mixing of bass, whisk or similar fibres or animal bristles or hair and the working of wood, bone, ivory or celluloid;

(b) All finishing, warehousing, packing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such Brushes or Brooms;

but excluding the following operations:—

The sawing and turning of wood as a preliminary operation to the manufacture of such brushes or brooms, the making of metal parts and the mounting of brushes with metal or tortoiseshell backs.

Provided that the rates shall not apply to workers employed as Carmen, Engineers, Powermen, Enginemens or Stokers.

*Section II.*—The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 23rd January, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

- (4) the parish of Blaenhondda,
- (5) the hamlet of Coedfrank,
- (6) the hamlet of Duffryn Clydach,
- (7) the hamlet of Dylais Lower,
- (8) the hamlet of Llantwit Lower,

which parishes and hamlets are at present wholly included in the rural district of Neath;

And whereas, in pursuance of the said sec-

tion, a representation has been made by the Council of the borough of Aberavon that it is desirable that by a Provisional Order under the said Act the boundary of the said borough should be altered so as to include

- (1) the urban district of Briton Ferry,
- (2) the urban district of Glyncoiwg,
- (3) the urban district of Margam,
- (4) the urban district of Porthcawl,
- (5) the hamlet of Baglan Higher,
- (6) the parish of Baglan Lower,
- (7) the parish of Michaelstone super Afon Lower,
- (8) the parish of Michaelstone super Afon Upper,
- (9) the hamlet of Higher Tythegston,
- (10) the parish of Kenfig,
- (11) the hamlet of Lower Tythegston,
- (12) the parish of Pyle,
- (13) the parish of Skerr,

which hamlets and parishes are at present wholly included, as regards Numbers 5 to 8, in the rural district of Neath, and as regards Numbers 9 to 13 in the rural district of Penybont;

And whereas, by section 297 of the Public Health Act, 1875, any Act confirming any Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts, or of that Act, may be repealed, altered or amended by Provisional Order made by the Minister of Health and confirmed by Parliament;

And whereas it is proposed that Provisional Orders should be made by the Minister of Health for carrying into effect the proposals contained in the said representations, or such other proposals as he may deem expedient, and that such Orders should, so far as seems necessary or proper for the purpose thereof, provide for the matters specified in section 54 or section 59 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, or some of them, and should, so far as appears to be necessary, amend the provisions of the local Acts in force in the boroughs aforesaid or in any area to be affected by such Orders and of the Acts confirming Provisional Orders made under the Sanitary Acts or the Public Health Act, 1875, and relating to the boroughs aforesaid or any area to be affected, or of some of such Acts;

Notice is hereby given, that H. R. Hooper, Esquire, M.Inst.C.E., one of the Inspectors of the Ministry of Health, will attend at the Guildhall, Swansea, on Wednesday, the eleventh day of February, 1920, at half-past ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold Local Inquiries into the subject-matter of the said proposals and all other matters relating thereto; and that the said representations of the Councils of the boroughs of Swansea and Neath, so far as they relate to areas common to both representations, will be taken first, and that the subsequent stages of the Inquiries, including any adjournment to some place or places other than the Guildhall, Swansea, will be determined by the Inspector.

And notice is hereby further given, that any person interested may attend at such Inquiries and be heard with reference to the said proposals and the other matters aforesaid.

HAMPSHIRE AND DORSET (FOOT-  
AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF  
1920 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Modification of Order.*

1. The Hampshire (Foot- and - Mouth Disease) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," the Hampshire and Dorset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920, and the Hampshire and Dorset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 (No. 2) are modified in the manner hereinafter contained.

*Continued Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Areas.*

2.—(1) The provisions of the principal Order shall apply without modification except as authorized in the Hampshire and Dorset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 (No. 2) to the areas described in the First Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as Prohibited Areas.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

*Provision as to movement for slaughter into the parts of the Scheduled District not included in a Prohibited Area.*

3.—(1) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by railway or by vessel without a licence from premises not situate within the Scheduled District to a railway station or landing place in the Scheduled District which is not situate in a Prohibited Area; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing place to any slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District which is not situate in a Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or landing place is situate.

(2) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises not situate within the Scheduled District to any slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District which is not situate in a Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

*Movement within the Scheduled District excluding a Prohibited Area.*

4. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his district should be permitted to be moved from premises in the Scheduled District not situate in a Prohibited Area to any other premises in the Scheduled

District not situate in a Prohibited Area, he may authorize such movement by a Movement Licence.

*Provisions as to Movement Licences.*

5.—(1) Where the movement authorized by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughterhouse from premises other than a railway station or landing place, an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:—

*Cattle.*—By the clipping of a broad arrow, ↑ about six inches long, on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle, and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

*Sheep.*—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep, and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

*Swine.*—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned

(2) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in a Prohibited Area.

(3) Where the movement authorized by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority, or of the Ministry by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(4) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorized to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorized to be moved.

(5) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(6) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorized by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(7) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of



an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(8) A copy of a Licence which authorizes movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

*Movement through Prohibited Areas by Rail.*

6. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of a Prohibited Area where they are moved through such Prohibited Area by railway from a place outside such area to another place outside such area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such area except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

*General Provisions as to Movement.*

7. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

*Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.*

8. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorizing—

(i) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii) movement into or out of a foot-and-mouth disease infected place; or

(iii) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry given under any Order of the Minister.

*Saving for Orders and Regulations.*

9. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Minister, and also subject to any Regulation, made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Minister for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

*Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.*

10.—(1) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Ministry or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Holding of Markets and Sales in the Scheduled District (except in Prohibited Areas).*

11.—(1) A market or sale of animals may be

held on any premises in the Scheduled District except in a Prohibited Area if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter, and the market or sale is authorized by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorized under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorized under this Article shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 5 of this Order.

*Offences.*

12.—(1) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

13. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Ministry” means the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Commencement.*

14. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty.

*Short Title.*

15. This Order may be cited as the HAMPSHIRE AND DORSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 3), and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article 1.

*To be Printed as Indorsement on Licence.*

The movement of animals under this Licence is subject to any Order of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, and also to any Regulation made by a Local Authority for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

This Licence does not authorize movement of an animal which is affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease or movement into or out of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place, or movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by a notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries given under any Order of the Minister.

Animals while being moved under this Licence must be accompanied by the Licence and must, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved. They must be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughter-house or bacon factory they must be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence must forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an Officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same district by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

This Licence is not available if it is granted by the owner of the animals to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animals, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which animals are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

*Caution.*—Persons acting without a Licence where a Licence is necessary, or acting thereon after the Licence has expired, or counterfeiting, fabricating, or altering, or obtaining or endeavouring to obtain a Licence by means of a false pretence, or granting or issuing a Licence knowing the same to be false in any respect, or committing other offences with respect to a Licence, are liable under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, to fine and imprisonment.

#### LANCASHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders, as follows:—

##### *Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.*

1.—(1) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be landed in or moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District, without unnecessary delay, and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

*Power to Restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.*

2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a Notice on the occupier of any field, shed or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right-of-way, no person shall enter the field, shed or other place to which the Notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:

(i) The owner of the field, shed or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii) Any other person may enter such field, shed or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Copies of such Notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3.) A copy of every such Notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

*Power to restrict Movement of Dogs and Poultry in Certain Cases.*

3.—(1.) An Inspector of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by a Notice served on the occupier of any premises in the Scheduled District, require him:—

(a) to keep in confinement, or under control, as may be prescribed by the Notice, dogs on such premises;

or (b) to confine live poultry on such premises in a pen or other like enclosure;

or (c) to prevent the access of live poultry to any specific part of the premises to which cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have, or recently have had, access;

and if any occupier after service of any such Notice shall fail to comply with the requirements thereof, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) An Inspector of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by Notice affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed, require dogs to be kept by the person in charge thereof under control while passing along any road or footpath specified in such Notice, and if any person in charge of a dog while passing along any road or footpath to which any such Notice relates fails to keep the dog under control, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) Every Notice served on an occupier of premises shall remain in operation until it is withdrawn by a further Notice served by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(4.) A copy of every Notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the General Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

5.—(1.) If an animal is landed in contravention of this Order, the Owner, and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Short Title.*

6. This Order may be cited as the LANCA-SHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920.

#### BEDFORDSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

##### *Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.*

1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

##### *Power to restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.*

2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry

of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:—

(i.) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Copies of such notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3.) A copy of every such notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

##### *Power to restrict Movement of Dogs and Poultry in Certain Cases.*

3.—(1.) An Inspector of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by a notice served on the occupier of any premises in the Scheduled District, require him:—

(a) to keep in confinement, or under control, as may be prescribed by the notice, dogs on such premises;

or (b) to confine live poultry on such premises in a pen or other like enclosure;

or (c) to prevent the access of live poultry to any specific part of the premises to which cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have, or recently have had, access;

and if any occupier after service of any such notice shall fail to comply with the requirements thereof, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) An Inspector of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by notice affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed, require dogs to be kept by the person in charge thereof under control while passing along any road or footpath specified in such notice, and if any person in charge of a dog while passing along any road or footpath to which any such notice relates fails to keep the dog under control, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) Every notice served on an occupier of premises shall remain in operation until it is withdrawn by a further notice served by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(4.) A copy of every notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the General Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture

ture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

5.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### WARNING SIGNALS DISPLAYED BY BRITISH VESSELS ACCOMPANYING SUBMARINES.

*Former Notice.*—No. 6 of 1918.

Attention is specially drawn to the following information with regard to vessels accompanying Submarines:—

British men-of-war, Auxiliary Patrol vessels, Royal fleet and Mercantile fleet Auxiliaries and all British Merchant vessels, whenever proceeding in company with Submarines are to fly "M" (International) at the masthead, accompanied by a group from the numeral table in the International Code of Signals, indicating the number of Submarines in company. This signal is a warning to vessels that Submarines are in the vicinity. When "M" flag is displayed vessels are cautioned to steer so as to give the escorting vessel a berth of at least one mile, and also to pass astern of her. When from any cause this cannot be done, the escorting vessel should be approached at slow speed until warning is given of the danger zone by flags, semaphore or megaphone, as most convenient, a good look-out being kept meanwhile for the Submarines, whose presence may be only indicated by their periscopes showing above water. The use of the large red flag has been discontinued for this purpose.
