FULWOOD.

Whereas the Urban District Council for the Fulwood Urban District (hereinafter called the Council) have made application to the Ministry of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, to partially repeal, alter, or amend the Fulwood and Whittingham Water Act, 1882, the Fulwood Local Board Act, 1885, and the Fulwood Local Board (Water) Act, 1894, as altered by certain Provisional Orders duly confirmed by Parliament, so as:—

(1) To confirm and give effect to an Agreement to be entered into by the Council with the Right Honourable the Earl of Derby, K.G., and the Right Honourable Lord Stanley (hereinafter called "the Sessors") for the grant to the Council by the Sessors for the term of 999 years of the exclusive right (a) to take water for supply by the Council throughout their water limits from a Tank to be constructed by the Sessors on their estate at or near Saddle End in the Township of Chipping, in the County of Lancaster, (b) to all water percolating or flowing in, through, under or upon a portion of the said estate, consisting of certain lands in the said Township of Chipping known as Saddle Fell, and also the Enclosures to the south-east thereof numbered 2 and 3 and parts of Enclosures numbered 4, 6, 13, 14, 15 and 27 on the 1/2500 Ordnance map, Lancashire sheet XLVI. 1, such water to be collected and conveyed by means of pipes and other works to be constructed by Lord Derby to the said Tank, and (c) to lay an aqueduct for carrying water from the said Tank for the purposes of the Water Undertaking of the Council, and to enable the Council and the Sessors to carry the aforesaid Agreement into effect and to make the same binding upon the parties thereto;

(2) To authorise the construction by the Council of an aqueduct, conduit or line or lines of pipes in the Townships of Chipping and Goosnargh from the said Tank to the Barnsfold Reservoir of the Council;

(3) To provide that all works executed and all lands, rights and privileges acquired by the Council and all things done by them in pursuance of the proposed Provisional Order shall be deemed to be included in the water undertaking of the Council as defined by the Local Acts;

(4) To provide that Section 20 of the said Act of 1894 shall have effect as if the words "or at such other rate as the Ministry of Health may from time to time approve" were inserted in Paragraph 1 of that Section after the words "three pounds per centum per annum";

(5) To repeal Section 30 of the said Act of 1885 and Section 21 of the said Act of 1894, and to enact new provisions in regard

to the reborrowing of borrowed money paid off by the Council; and

(6) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Acts, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said District as may be necessary or desirable;

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;

Notice is hereby given, that C. E. Roberts, Esquire, M.Inst.C.E., one of the Inspectors of the said Ministry, will attend at the Council Offices, Fulwood, on Thursday, the fifth day of February, 1920, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.

And Notice is hereby further given, that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry and be heard with reference to the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order

which parishes are at present wholly included in the rural district of Stapleford;

- (22) the parish of Edwalton,
- (23) the parish of Holme Pierrepont,
- (24) the parish of Radcliffe-on-Trent,

which parishes are at present wholly included in the rural district of Bingham;

And whereas a Provisional Order issued under the said Act may be made for any of the purposes mentioned in sections 54 and 59
