AN Exprefs has brought the following Advice
from *Falmouth*.

Falmouth, April 20. At past Ten at Night. This
Evening put into this Port the *Anna Jacoba* of
Flushing from Cruising, *Joseph Berge* Commander,
who says, That yesterday morning, about 9 of the
Clock, being about 6 Leagues off from *Ushant*, he
came up with the *Martysboome* of *Flushing* laden
with Wine, Oyl, and Almonds from *Cadiz*, *Daniel*
Marcus Master, who reports, that he left *Cadiz* 21
days before, under Convoy of Admiral *Rooke*, and
that they were in all about 180 Sail, whom he part-
ed from on the 14th, about 60 Leagues to the
Westward of *Ushant*, trusting to the goodness of
failing; And added, That he believed, at that time,
they were not above 20 Leagues a Stern.

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
