The KING has been pleased to issue a Warrant to the following effect amending the Regulations governing the Special Constabulary Long Service Medal:—

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come,

Greeting!

WHEREAS We, having taken into Our Royal consideration the faithful and devoted service rendered by members of the Special Constabulary during the War, and being desirous of distinguishing such service by some mark of Our Royal Favour, and also of providing a means of recognizing continued and efficient service which may be rendered in the future by members of any Special Constabulary Reserve hereafter constituted, did by Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the 30th August, 1919, institute and create a new Medal to be awarded for such service as aforesaid;

And WHEREAS We are desirous of amending the said Warrant, We are graciously pleased to make, ordain and establish the following Rules for the governance of the said Decoration :---

I. It is ordained that the Medal shall be designated and styled "The Special Constabulary Long Service Medal."

II. It is ordained that the Special Constabulary Long Service Medal shall consist of a circular Medal of Bronze with Our Effigy on the obverse, and on the reverse an appropriate design or inscription, and shall bear on the rim the name of the person to whom the Medal is awarded.

III. It is ordained that the Medal shall only be awarded to those of Our faithful subjects who, being or having been members of the Special Constabulary during the War or of any Special Constabulary Reserve, shall satisfy the following conditions, namely:---

(1) Shall have served as a Special Constable without pay during the War for not less than three years, and shall during that period have performed not less than 150 police duties; or

(2) Shall have served in a Special Constabulary Reserve for not less than nine years, and shall have (a) taken an approved course of training in Police duty, (b) voluntarily performed such actual police duty as may be required by the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with any general regulations which may be made by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home De-

partment, and by Our Secretary for Scotland, (c) been annually certified as efficient by the Chief Officer of Police.

Provided that in the case of a man who has served both in the Special Constabulary during the War and in a Special Constabulary Reserve, each period of service during the War amounting to one year or upwards in the course of which he completed not less than 50 police duties shall be reckoned as equivalent to three years' efficient service in the Reserve, and other periods in the same proportion.

IV. It is ordained that the Medal shall be awarded by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department or by Our Secretary for Scotland, and that the names of the persons eligible for such Medal shall be submitted to Our said Secretary of State or Secretary for Scotland by the Chief Officer of Police under whom such persons have served.

V. It is ordained that the Medal shall be worn on the left breast suspended from a riband of an inch and three-eighths in width, of which the central part (one-third of the whole) shall be red, while the remaining parts shall each have three longitudinal stripes of equal width, the central stripe being black and the other two white; and further, that in the case of those to whom the Medal is awarded for service during the War a bar or clasp shall be attached to the riband, bearing the words "The Great War, 1914-1918."

VI. It is ordained that if any person to whom this Medal is awarded shall be guilty of any crime or disgraceful conduct which in Our judgment disqualifies him for the same, his Medal shall, by an Order of Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department or of Our Secretary for Scotland, be for-feited, and the name of such person shall be erased from the record of those to whom the Medal shall have been awarded. It is hereby further declared that We, Our Heirs and Successors shall be the sole judges of the circum-stances demanding such forfeiture, and that every person whose Medal shall be so for-feited shall on being required so to do by Our said Secretary of State or Secretary for Scotland deliver up his Medal to such person as Our said Secretary of State or Secretary for Scotland may direct.

VII. The Warrant of the 30th day of August, 1919, is hereby revoked.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE PROFITEERING ACT, 1919 (9 AND 10 GEO. V., c. 66).

Whereas Section 1 of the Profiteering Act, 1919, provides that the Act may be applied by Order of the Board of Trade to any article or class of articles declared by the Order to be one or one of a kind in common use by the public or being material, machinery or acces-sories used in the production of such articles, but that the Act shall not apply to any articles which are from time to time declared to be controlled articles.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade do hereby declare that the article or class of articles set out in the Schedule annexed hereto are articles of a kind in common use by the public, and are articles which are not controlled, and do hereby order that the Profiteering Act, 1919, shall apply to each and every article or class of articles contained in Part I. of the Schedule to this Order and to each article of food specifically mentioned in Part II. of the Schedule hereto.

This Order shall come into force as from the 12th day of February, 1920, and may be cited as the Profiteering Act, 1919, Order (No. 5).

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918. BRUSH AND BROOM TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO FIX GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES, GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES, GUARANTEED TIME-RATES, PIECE WORK BASIS TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE APPRENTICES.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st -October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Great Britain, for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by Sec-tion 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to fix General Minimum Time-Rates, General Minimum Piece-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates, Piece Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain -classes of Male Apprentices (as hereinafter defined) as shown in the Schedule set out below.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Proposed Minimum Rates for Male Appren-.tices (as Defined in Part III. of this Schedule).

The General Minimum Time-Rates, General Minimum Piece-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates, Piece Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Apprentices as defined in Part III. of this Schedule who are employed in the branches of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, under the respective conditions set out in this Notice shall be as follows:-

SECTION I.-Male Apprentices who are apprenticed to :-

(a) Any two of the following branches of ; the trade: (i) Pan Work (Hair and Bass); (ii) Hairs; (iii) Drawing; (iv) Wood Spindling; (v) Sand Papering by machine; (vi) the manufacture of Whitewash o**(vi)** Brushes; (vii) the manufacture of Tar Brushes and "Sundries "; (viii) Boring; or (b) the Cutting, Sorting and Dressing of Bass by hand when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of brushes (other than feather brushes) or

brooms; shall receive :-

During the 1st year of their apprenticeship, one-half *

During the 2nd year of their apprentice-ship, one half *

During the 3rd year of their apprenticeship, seven-twelfths *

During the 4th year of their apprentice-.ship, two-thirds *

During the 5th year of their apprenticeship, three-quarters *

* of (a) the General Minimum Piece-Rates proposed by the Trade Board and set out in their Notice dated 12th January, 1920, or

where no General Minimum Piece-Rates applicable to the work in which the apprentice is engaged have been fixed, of (b) Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. $5\frac{1}{2}d$. an hour to an ordinary worker.

Provided that during the first twelve months of apprenticeship the apprentice shall receive a Guaranteed Time-Rate of not less than 12s. per week of 48 hours, and during the first six months of employment in a section of the (

Trade other than that in which the appren tice commences his apprenticeship, a guaranteed time-rate not less than the General Minimum Time-Rate appropriate to a worker other than an apprentice, notwithstanding that his earnings on piece-work are less than such rate.

Provided also that the Minimum Rates set out in this Section shall only apply in cases where a journeyman instructor has responsibility for the work of the apprentice during the first 12 months and supervision of the apprentice during the remainder of the apprenticeship in the journeyman's own section of the trade, and where during the first nine months of employment in any branch of the trade a journeyman is paid by the employer in respect of the instruction of and responsibility for the apprentice, a sum each week equivalent to the difference between the earnings of the apprentice on the above minimum piece-rates and the sum which the apprentice would have earned if he had been employed at the General Minimum Piece-Rates proposed by the Trade Board and set out in their Notice dated 12th January, 1920, or, where no General Minimum Piece-Rates applicable to the work in which the apprentice is engaged have been fixed, at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. $5\frac{1}{2}d$. an hour to an ordinary worker.

SECTION II .- Male Apprentices who are apprenticed to:-

(i) Hand Finishing (Common and Toilet), or

(ii) Hand Finishing (Common or Toilet) and Hand Boring, or

(iii) Any three or more of the following processes of Bone Brush Making: (a) Cutting; (b) Fashioning; (c) Profiling; (d) Drilling; shall receive:

During the 1st year of their apprenticeship, 12s. per week of 48 hours.

During the 2nd year of their apprenticeship, 16s. per week of 48 hours.

During the 3rd year of their apprentice-ship, 22s per week of 48 hours. During the 4th year of their apprentice-

ship, two-thirds *

During the 5th year of their apprentice-

ship, three-quarters * * of (a) the General Minimum Piece-Rates proposed by the Trade Board and set out in their notice dated 12th January, 1920, or

where no General Minimum Piece-Rates applicable to the work in which the apprentice is engaged have been fixed, of (b) Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. 5¹/₂d. an hour to an ordinary worker.

Provided that the Minimum Rates set out in this Section shall only apply in cases where a journeyman instructor has responsibility for the work of an apprentice throughout the apprenticeship and where during the first three years of apprenticeship the journeyman is paid by the employer in respect of the instruction of and responsibility for the apprentice a sum each week equivalent to the difference between the appropriate Minimum Time-Rates under the above scale and the sum which the apprentice would have earned on piece-work had he been employed at the General Minimum Piece-Rates proposed by the Trade Board and set out in their Notice dated 12th January, 1920, or, where no General Minimum Piece-Rate is applicable, at Piece-Rates each of which would

yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker not less than 1s. $5\frac{1}{2}d$. an hour.

SECTION III.—Male Apprentices who are apprenticed to:—

Painting Brush Making and Finishing (to include (a) Sash Tools and (b) other Painting Brushes) shall receive:

During the 1st year of their apprenticeship, one-half *

During the 2nd year of their apprenticeship, one-half*

During the 3rd year of their apprenticeship, seven-twelfths *

During the 4th year of their apprenticeship, two-thirds *

During the 5th year of their apprenticeship, three-quarters*

* of (a) the General Minimum Piece-Rates proposed by the Trade Board and set out in their Notice dated 12th January, 1920, or

their Notice dated 12th January, 1920, or where no General Minimum Piece-Rates applicable to the work in which the apprentice is engaged have been fixed of (b) Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. $5\frac{1}{2}d$. an hour to an ordinary worker.

Providing that during the first 12 months of apprenticeship the apprentice shall receive a guaranteed time-rate of not less than 12s. per week of 48 hours, notwithstanding that his earnings on piece-work are less than such rate.

Provided also that the Minimum Rates set out in this Section shall only apply where a journeyman instructor has responsibility for the work of the apprentice during the first twelve months and supervision of the apprentice during the remainder of the apprenticeship in the journeyman's own branch of the trade, and where:—

(a) During the first two years of apprenticeship the apprentice is taught sash tool making and during the first eight months of this period the journeyman is paid by the employer in respect of the instruction and supervision of the apprentice a sum each week equivalent to the piece-work earnings of the apprentice in that week, that is to say, one-half of the sum which the apprentice would have earned if he had been employed at the General Minimum Piece-Rates proposed by the Trade Board and set out in their Notice dated 12th January, 1920, or, where no General Minimum Piece-Rate is applicable, at Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker, not less than 1s. 5¹/₂d an hour.

(b) During the remainder of the apprenticeship the apprentice is taught the manufacture of other painting brushes and during ten months (in the aggregate) of this period, the journeyman is paid by the employer in respect of the instruction and supervision of the apprentice a sum equivalent to the difference between the piece-work earnings of the apprentice and the sum which the apprentice would have earned if he had been employed at the General Minimum Piece-Rates proposed by the Trade Board and set out in their Notice dated 12th January, 1920, or, where no General Minimum Piece-Rate is applicable, at Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker, not less than 1s. 5]d. an hour.

PART II.

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Proposed Overtime Rates for Male Apprentices (as Defined in Part III. of this Schedule).

In respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in their Notice dated 31st December, 1919, to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade:—

(a) Overtime Rates calculated in the manner set out in the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 12th January, 1920, shall apply, in substitution for the Minimum. Rate which would otherwise be applicable, in the case of Apprentices employed on. Piece-Work; and

(b) Overtime Rates calculated in the manner set out in the Notice dated 31st. December, 1919, shall apply in substitution for the Minimum Rate which would otherwise be applicable in the case of Apprentices employed on Time Work.

PART III.

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates set out in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule a Male Apprentice is defined as being a Male Worker who:—

(a) Is employed during the whole of his time in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule under an indenture for a period of five years in the form prescribed. by the Trade Board as set out in Part IV. of this Schedule.

(b) Has been registered with the Trade Board in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such registration. which has been duly acknowledged and us still under consideration.

Provided that ----

(i.) The registration may be cancelled if the other conditions of apprenticeship arenot complied with.

(ii.) An employer may employ a worker at the special rates and under the special conditions for apprentices without registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks; but in the event of such worker being continued thereafter at his employment as an Apprentice the probation period shall be included in his period of Apprenticeship.

The registration and the employment of Male Workers as Apprentices at the Minimum Rates set out in Part I. of this Notice shall be limited to:---

and thereafter one additional Apprentice may be employed for every additional five or fewer than five such Journeymen.

PART IV.

Form of Indenture of Apprenticeship. For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates set out in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule an Apprentice shall be employed under an Indenture of Apprenticeship in the following form:—

This Indenture made the day of between of a minor of the age

of years (hereinafter called "the Apprentice") of the first part,

of the parent or guardian of the Apprentice (hereinafter called the "Guardian") of the second part and of (hereinafter called the "Frm

(hereinafter called the "Employer") of the third part;

Witnesseth as follows, that is to say : ---

1. The Apprentice of his own free will and with the consent of the Guardian hereby binds himself to serve the Employer as his Apprentice in his trade of for the term of five years from the date of these presents.

2. In consideration of the covenants and agreements entered into by the Guardian and the Apprentice, the Employer hereby covenants with the Guardian and the Apprentice and with each of them severally as follows:—

(a) That he will keep the Apprentice as his Apprentice during the said term and to the best of his power, skill and knowledge instruct the Apprentice or cause him to be instructed in the section or sections of the Brush and Broom Trade known as

(b) That he will keep the Apprentice under his own supervision or place him under a fully qualified Journeyman (or Journeymen).

(c) That he will pay to the Apprentice every week during the said term wages in accordance with the appropriate scale of wages as fixed by the Trade Board for Male Apprentices.

(d) That if the employer shall die or become permanently incapacitated through illness or injury (to be certified by a duly qualified Medical Practitioner) or cease to carry on the said trade of

before the expiration of the said term of apprenticeship, then, and in any such case, the Employer or his Executors or his Administrators, as the case may be, shall, subject to the consent and approval of the Guardian and of the said Apprentice being first obtained, find another suitable Employer for the Apprentice to take over this Indenture.

(e) That he will not hold the Apprentice liable to make good the value of any work which he may spoil whilst learning his trade, except in the case of wilful or malicious damage.

(f) That he will cause the Apprentice to attend during the term of this Indenture such approved technical classes as may be agreed by the parties concerned in the Indenture, the Apprentice to suffer no loss of wages by reason of such attendance or by reason of his attendance at school in accordance with the Education Act, 1918, and the time so spent to be reckoned as an equivalent part of the usual working hours and not extra thereto.

3. In consideration of the premises, the Guardian and the Apprentice respectively severally covenant with the Employer as follows:—

(a) That the Apprentice shall truly and faithfully during the said term serve the

Employer as his Apprentice and his secrets keep and shall diligently attend to the said trade and at all times willingly obey the lawful and reasonable commands of the Employer, and shall not absent himself from the Employer's service without leave.

(b) That the Apprentice shall not do any damage or knowingly suffer any damage to be done to the goods, moneys or other property of the Employer.

(c) That the Apprentice shall willingly perform all such shop duties as are usually done by Apprentices.

(d) That the Apprentice shall attend such continuation classes between the hours of 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. as the Employer desires provided that the Apprentice suffer no loss of wages by reason of such attendance.

(e) That in case the Apprentice shall at any time during the said term be wilfully disobedient to lawful orders or commands of the said Employer, or be slothful or negligent or shall otherwise grossly misbehave himself towards the Employer, then it shall be lawful to discharge the said Apprentice.

PART V.—General.

Section I.—The General Minimum Time-Rates and Guaranteed Time-Rates set out in this Schedule are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours and shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours worked is less than 48.

Section II.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall be paid direct to the Apprentice by the Employer and not by the Journeyman.

Section III.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

Section IV.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall not apply to Indentured Apprentices or Unbound Learners employed under an indenture or written agreement respectively entered into prior to 1st January, 1920, and providing for the proper instruction of the apprentice or learner in one or more of the following operations or o branches of work, that is to say:—

ORDER OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER THE: AIR NAVIGATION ACTS, 1911 TO 1919.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on meby the Air Navigation Acts, 1911 to 1919, and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I. the Right Honourable Winston Spencer Churchill, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by Order, make the following regulation amending the Air Navigation Regulations, 1919.

Regulation 2 of the Air Navigation Regulations, 1919, shall have effect as though the following provision were inserted at the end thereof :

(4) A fixed balloon shall not be flown within five miles of any aerodrome except with the special permission, in writing, of the Secretary of State, and subject to any conditions that may be attached to any such permission, and the Secretary of State may, on the granting of such permission or subsequently, direct that the provisions of those Regulations or any of them shall not apply to the balloon in question or shall apply subject to such modifications as he thinks fit.

NORTH ESSEX AND SUFFOLK (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Modification of Orders.

1.—The North Essex and Suffolk (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1919, and the North Essex and Suffolk (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the existing Orders"), are modified in the manner hereinafter appearing.

Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of certain Inner Controlled Areas.

2.—(1) No dog shall be moved out of either of the Areas described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "an Inner Controlled Area," unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Minister authorizing such movement and signed by an Officer of the Ministry, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Minister may think necessary or desirable, and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to the movement of a dog through either of such areas by railway from a place outside the area to another place outside the area without unnecessary delay and without being rebooked within the area.

(2) Articles 2 and 3 of the Principal Order shall apply to dogs moved in contravention of this Article.

Withdrawal of Requirement of Leading from the Borough of Colchester.

3.—The Colchester (Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 is hereby revoked.

Provision for Temporary Movement of Dogs by Licence into and out of the Scheduled District (excepting the Inner Controlled Areas).

4.—(1) A dog may be temporarily moved from any premises in the Scheduled District not situate in an Inner Controlled Area to any place outside the Scheduled District, if such movement is authorized by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the premises from which the dog is to be moved are situate, but subject to and in accordance with the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, namely:—

(i) The dog shall be moved back into the Scheduled District within twenty-four hours after its movement out of the Scheduled District; (ii) The licence shall forthwith immediately after the completion of the return movement of the dog be delivered up to the Inspector by whom the licence was granted, or to his representative;

(iii) The dog shall at all times during the movement under the licence be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle, but this condition shall not apply to any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for sporting purposes, or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep, or to any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants.

(2) The restrictions imposed by the existing Orders on the movement of dogs out of the Scheduled District shall not apply to a dog which has been moved to any place in the Scheduled District, not situate in an Inner Controlled Area, from premises outside the Scheduled District for sporting purposes or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep, provided that the return movement of the dog out of the Scheduled District is authorized by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District, and that the return movement is completed within twenty-four hours of the movement of the dog into the Scheduled District.

(3) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Order the owner or person in charge of the dog shall produce to him a certificate signed by a Veterinary Surgeon or Veterinary Practitioner, showing that the dog was examined by him within three days before the date of the intended movement and was found to be free from any symptoms indicative of rabies.

Application of the Existing Orders to Licences under this Order.

5. For the purposes of the existing Orders a licence under this Order shall be treated as a licence under those Orders.

Offences.


6. If the conditions of any licence granted under this Order are not complied with, the owner or person in charge of the dog in respect of which the licence is granted shall, each in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the sixth day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty.

LANCASHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Modification of Order.

1. The Lancashire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," is modified in the manner hereinafter contained.

Continued Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Area.

2.---(1) The provisions of the principal Order shall apply without modification to the area described in the First Schedule hereto hereinafter referred to as the Prohibited Area.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

Provision as to movement for slaughter into the parts of the Scheduled District not included in the Prohibited Area.

3.—(1) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by railway or by vessel without a licence from premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a scheduled district for the purposes of an Order of the Minister relating to foot-andmouth disease to a railway station or landing place in the Scheduled District which is not situate in the Prohibited Area, and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing place to any slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District which is not situate in the Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or landing place is situate.

(2) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a scheduled district for the purposes of an Order of the Minister relating to footand-mouth disease to any slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District which is not situate in the Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

Movement within the Scheduled District excluding the Prohibited Area.

4. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his district should be permitted to be moved from premises in the Scheduled District not situate in the Prohibited Area to any other premises in the Scheduled District not situate in the Prohibited Area, he may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

Provision's as to Movement Licences.

5.—(1.) Where the movement authorsed by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughterhouse from premises other than a railway station or landing place an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow \uparrow about six inches long on the left hindquarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow \uparrow on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(2.) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in a Prohibited Area.

(3.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority, or of the Ministry by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

. (4.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(5.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(6.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(7.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(8.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

Movement through the Prohibited Area by Rail.

6. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Prohibited Area where they are moved through the Prohibited Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Area except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

General Provisions as to Movement.

7. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

8. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising-

(i) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii) movement into or out of a foot-andmouth disease infected place; or

(iii) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry given under any Order of the Minister.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

9. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Minister, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Minister for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

10.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Ministry or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on de-mand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Holding of Markets and Sales in the Scheduled District (except in the Prohibited Area).

-(1.) A market or sale of animals may 11.be held on any premises in the Scheduled Dis-

trict, except in the Prohibited Area, if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Article shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 5 of this Order.

Offences.

12.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

13.—In this Order-

"The Act of 1894," means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

"The Ministry" means the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries. "Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats

and swine. "Slaughterhouse" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

14. This Order shall come into operation on the seventh day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty.

Short Title.

15. This Order may be cited as the LANCA-SHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 3), and shall be read with the principal Order.

(2) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a scheduled district for the purposes of an Order of the Minister relating to footand-mouth disease to any slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District which is not situate in the Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

Movement within the Scheduled District excluding the Prohibited Area.

4. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his district should be permitted to be moved from premises in the Scheduled District not situate in the Prohibited Area to any other premises in the Scheduled District C.2 not situate in the Prohibited Area, he may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

5.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughterhouse from premises other than a railway station an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow \uparrow about six inches long on the left hindquarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(2.) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in a Prohibited Area.

(3.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority, or of the Ministry by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(4.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(5). Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(6.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(7.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(8.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

Movement through the Prohibited Area by Rail.

6. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Prohibited Area where they are moved through the Prohibited Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Area except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

`General Provisions as to Movement.

7. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

8. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—

(i) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii) movement into or out of a foot-andmouth disease infected place; or

(iii) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry given under any Order of the Minister.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

9. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Minister, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Minister for prohibiting or regulating the movement of. animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

10.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Move, ment Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Ministry or of a Local Authority produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Holding of Markets and Sales in the Scheduled District (except in the Prohibited Area).

11.(1.) A market or sale of animals may be held on any premises in the Scheduled District, except in the Prohibited Area, if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Article shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 5 of this Order.

Offences.

12.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

13. In this Order-

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

"The Ministry" means the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

"Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

"Slaughterhouse" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

14. This Order shall some into operation on the seventh day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty.

Short Title.

15. This Order may be cited as the BEDFORD-SHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 2), and shall be read with the principal Order.

Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915: Extending time for operation of a Confirming Act.

BOROUGH OF CROYDON.
