LAUNCESTON.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Launceston (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban District Council for the said Borough, have made application to the Ministry of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and section 59 of the Local Government Act, 1888, to partially repeal, alter, or amend the Local Act, 3 Victoria, ch. lxxv., entitled "An Act for regulating the Markets and for erecting a Market House in the Town of Launceston, in the County of Cornwall," and the Borough of Launceston Order, 1889 (confirmed by the 52 and 53 Vict., ch. clxxii.), so as—

1. To provide for the discharge of the outstanding debt on the Markets (amounting at the present time to £6,400 in bonds) by annual contributions out of the Borough or District Fund or otherwise; and to make provisions with regard to the period for and method of repayment of such debt or of

moneys borrowed to repay it, and with regard to the security for such debt.

2. To provide for the demolition and alienation of part or parts of the market property.

3. To extend the operation of the Local Act as amended by the proposed Provisional Order so as to apply to the whole Borough.

4. To require the sanction of the Ministry of Health to the borrowing of further moneys under or for the purposes of the Local Act as amended by the Provisional Order.

5. To render applicable to the Market undertaking the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, and the enactments incorporated therewith with regard to Markets.

6. For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of the Local Government Act, 1888, in force in the said Borough as may be necessary or desirable;

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;

Notice is hereby given, that R. C. Maxwell, Esquire, LL.D., Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspectors of the said Ministry, will attend at the Guildhall, Launceston, on Friday, the twentieth day of February, 1920, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.

And notice is hereby further given, that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry and be heard with reference to the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.

MANCHESTER.

Whereas the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Manchester (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said City, have made application to the Ministry of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, to partially repeal, alter or amend the Manchester Corporation Act, 1875, as amended by the Manchester Orders, 1880 to 1904, and the Manchester Corporation Act, 1911, so as to enable the Corporation:—

(1) to borrow further moneys not exceeding in the aggregate one million pounds for the purposes of their gas undertaking; and

(2) to borrow an additional sum of eight hundred and fifty thousand pounds for the purposes of the Main Drainage Scheme authorised by the said Act of 1911.

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application, and that it should make such provision for the repayment of moneys to be borrowed thereunder and such
