**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 4th day of February, 1920, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we have had under consideration the pay of boy shipwrights, Royal Navy, undergoing training in the Royal Dockyards in their trades:

"And whereas these ratings are, while serving in the Royal Dockyards, subject to the general Dockyard Regulations in the same way as Dockyard apprentices and have in the past

been paid at the same rates of pay as Dockyard apprentices:

"And whereas the rates of pay of the Dockyard apprentices have been advanced from time to time on and since the 28th March, 1915, both by an addition of temporary increases and by a raising of the permanent scale of remuneration:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the boy shipwrights should continue to be paid at the same rates as the Dockyard apprentices:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us, at our discretion, to extend to the boy shipwrights the scale of remuneration payable to the Dockyard apprentices, with effect from the 28th March, 1915.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 5th day of February, 1920, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we have found it necessary to employ Aircraft ratings belonging to the Royal Naval Air Service as Aerial Gunlayers and Armament Instructors:

"And whereas we are of opinion that performance of these duties warrants payment of non-substantive pay in each case, which should, we consider, be as follows:—

(a) 8*d.* a day, paid continuously, in the case of Royal Naval Air Service Instructors in Gunnery ('Armament Instructors'), payment to be restricted to the Aircraft Branch and to Leading Ratings and above.

(b) 4*d.* a day, paid continuously to Royal Naval Air Service Gunlayers ('Aerial Gunlayers'), payment to be restricted to the Aircraft Branch.

(c) The non-substantive allowances for Aerial Gunlayer and Armament Instructor, not to be paid simultaneously, but an Aerial Gunlayer who is also qualified as an Armament Instructor, to receive non-substantive pay at the rate of 8*d.* a day.

(d) Aerial Gunlayers (whether of the 'Mechanic' or 'Aircraft' Branches) to be eligible for continuous Flying Pay of 2*s.* a day when employed in an area of operations.

(e) Payment of the foregoing allowances not to be made in respect of any period prior to the 11th August, 1917.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the above proposals, which have received the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury."

Turret Director Layer ... 10*d.* a day.

Secondary Director Layer 8*d.* a day.

Light Director Layer ... 8*d.* a day.

**W**HEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of

the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by Orders in Council, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council, dated the 20th December, 1919:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that paragraph one of the Order in Council of the 20th day of December, 1919, shall extend to the Isle of Man.

THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868.

## WINCHESTER COLLEGE.

### I.

#### FEES PAYABLE BY SCHOLARS: EXHIBITIONS AWARDABLE TO SCHOLARS.

We, the Warden and Fellows of Winchester College, being the Governing Body of Winchester College, do hereby, in exercise of the powers of the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of the Acts amending the same, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf, resolve and enact as follows:—

*A Statute for amending Section 10 of Statute XI, and Section 2 of Statute XII, of the Statutes of Winchester College approved by his late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council on the 24th day of October, 1904.*

1. Each of the above mentioned Sections shall be amended by substituting therein, for the words "twenty guineas," the words "thirty guineas":

Provided always that such amendments shall in no wise apply to any Scholar of the College who shall have been admitted or elected at any time before the approval of this Statute by His Majesty the King in Council, and that with respect to every such Scholar the above-mentioned Sections shall continue to be read as if they had not been amended by this Statute.

2. This Statute shall come into force immediately upon the approval thereof by His Majesty the King in Council.

## II.

### SUPERANNUATION ALLOWANCES OR GRATUITIES FOR MASTERS AND DEATH GRATUITIES FOR THEIR LEGAL PERSONAL REPRESENTATIVES OR DEPENDANTS.

We, the Warden and Fellows of Winchester College, being the Governing Body of Winchester College, do hereby, in exercise of the powers of the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of the Acts amending the same, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf, resolve and enact as follows:—

*A Statute concerning superannuation allowances or gratuities for masters and death gratuities for their legal personal representatives or dependants.*

1. The Warden and Fellows shall have power to make such provision as they shall from time to time think fit for the granting and paying, out of the income of the College, in all such cases as they shall deem proper, of (i) superannuation allowances or gratuities to Masters upon their ceasing to hold office, and (ii) death gratuities to the legal personal representatives or dependants of Masters who shall die in office: such grants and payments to be on lines analogous to, but not necessarily identical with, those laid down in the School Teachers (Superannuation) Act, 1918.

2. The Warden and Fellows shall also have power to create and maintain out of the income of the College, in such manner as they shall from time to time think fit, a Fund out of which the said grants and payments may be made, and to administer the said Fund in accordance with such Regulations as they shall from time to time make for the administration thereof.

3. The powers conferred by this Statute shall be in addition to the powers conferred by Statute XIV of the Statutes of Winchester College approved by His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council on the 24th day of October, 1904.

4. This Statute shall come into force immediately upon the approval thereof by His Majesty the King in Council.

Rule Committee of the Supreme Court to make the following Rules:—

1. The following new Rules shall be inserted after Order LXV., Rule 10a:—

Order LXV., Rule 10b.—The total in any Bill of Costs of the fees prescribed by this Order (as distinct from payments) shall in respect of business done in any cause or matter in the Supreme Court after the 31st day of August, 1919, be increased by 33- $\frac{1}{3}$  per centum, and such increase shall be allowed upon any taxation of costs in respect of any such business as well between Party and Party as between Solicitor and Client, and in taxations under or pursuant to the Solicitors Act, 1843.

This Rule shall apply to all references to arbitration and to all proceedings on the Crown side, and to all proceedings assigned to the Crown Office Department; and to all criminal proceedings in the King's Bench Division of the High Court of Justice.

The increase hereby authorised shall not affect the question whether a bill of costs taxed is or is not less by one-sixth part than the bill delivered, sent or left.

Provided that this Rule shall not (a) affect the power to direct payment of a sum in lieu of costs under Order 65, Rule 23, or the power to allow a fixed sum for costs under Order 65, Rule 27 (38), or a gross sum under Order 65, Rule 27 (38a); or (b) apply to bills of costs which have, at the date on which this Rule comes into operation, already been delivered to the client sought to be charged therewith, or to the person chargeable therewith or liable therefor, or to bills then already taxed and certified or allowed.

Order LXV., Rule 10a, is hereby revoked, except in respect of business done before the 1st day of September, 1919, and except as regards those bills of costs which are excluded from the operation of this Rule by the last preceding proviso to this Rule.

2. These Rules may be cited as the Rules of the Supreme Court (Solicitors' Remuneration Rules), 1920.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, the Minister of Labour is pleased to establish a Trade Board for the Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Trade in Great Britain as specified in the Trade Boards (Perambulator and Invalid Carriage) Order, 1919, namely:—

The manufacture, wherever carried on, of Perambulators, Invalid Carriages (including Spinal Carriages), or Folding Push Cars;

including:

(a) the manufacture of fittings or accessories where made in association with or in conjunction with perambulators, invalid carriages, folding push cars or wheels intended for use on these articles;

(b) the manufacture of wheels, excluding cycle wheels, intended for use on perambulators, invalid carriages, or folding push cars;

(c) the manufacture of motor cycle side-car bodies where made in association with or in conjunction with perambulators, invalid carriages, or folding push cars,

(d) the repair of perambulators, invalid carriages, or folding push cars when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture thereof;

(e) the manufacture of toy perambulators, toy wheel-barrow, toy scooters, nursery yachts, toy cycles, toy cars, toy horses, dolls' houses or other similar toys, when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of perambulators, invalid carriages or folding push cars, so as to form a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers

(f) packing, warehousing, or despatching, or other similar operations incidental to the manufacture of any of the above-named articles;

but excluding:

(g) the manufacture of motor scooters;

(h) the manufacture of wicker or cane bodies for perambulators, invalid carriages or folding push cars when such manufacture is carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of other wicker or cane articles so as to form a

common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers.

In accordance with the Regulation with respect to the constitution and proceedings of the above-mentioned Trade Board, dated 19th January, 1920, the Trade Boards shall consist of:—

(1) Three appointed members, namely:—

### TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918. RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

#### PROPOSAL TO VARY AND FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for that branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919, which is covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 12th December, 1919, with respect to the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade in Great Britain, hereby give notice as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary the minimum rates of wages for male workers at present effective and set out in the Notice dated 27th November, 1919, issued by the Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain) established under Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 10th January, 1914, in their application to male workers in any branch of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade in Great Britain specified in Part III of the Schedule hereof, to which the minimum rates of wages set out in the above-mentioned Notice dated 27th November, 1919, do not apply, the proposed minimum rates of wages being as set out in the Schedule hereto.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the Notice of Proposal to Vary being given.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### PART I.

*Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Male Workers.*

##### *Section I.—For Male Workers.*

(a) Who have completed not less than five years' apprenticeship or learnership and less than one year's subsequent employment in the trade:—

Proposed General Minimum Time-Rate,  
1s. 5d. per hour.

Proposed Piece-work Basis Time-Rate,  
1s. 6½d. per hour.

(b) Who have completed not less than five years' apprenticeship or learnership and not less than one and less than three years' subsequent employment in the trade:—

Proposed General Minimum Time-Rate,  
1s. 6d. per hour.

Proposed Piece-Work basis Time-Rate,  
1s. 7½d. per hour.

(c) Who have completed not less than five years' apprenticeship or learnership and not less than three years' subsequent employment in the trade:—

Proposed General Minimum Time-Rate,  
1s. 7d. per hour.

Proposed Piece-Work basis Time-Rate,  
1s. 8½d. per hour.

Provided that in the case of male workers who are employed in the following branches of the trade, namely, the making up of (a) Military dress uniforms (excluding khaki), (b) Naval frock and dress uniforms, (c) Hunt coats and hunt riding breeches, (d) Frock and dress coats, and (e) Court and diplomatic garments, and who have completed not less than five years' apprenticeship or learnership in the trade, the General Minimum Time-Rate and Piece-work basis Time-Rate shall be:—

Proposed General Minimum Time-Rate,  
1s. 9d. per hour.

Proposed Piece-Work basis Time-Rate,  
1s. 10½d. per hour.

In cases where a worker is employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker not less than the Piece-work basis Time-Rate applicable as set out in this Section.

##### *Section II.—For Male Apprentices.*

Who are learning to make the various garments throughout under a contract in writing and are registered with the Trade Board in accordance with rules laid down from time to time by the Trade Board:—

Proposed General Minimum Time-Rate.

For the first year of Apprenticeship in the trade, 10s. per week of 48 hours.

For the second year of Apprenticeship in the trade, 12s. per week of 48 hours.

For the third year of Apprenticeship in the trade, 17s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

For the fourth year of Apprenticeship in the trade, 25s. per week of 48 hours.

For the fifth year of Apprenticeship in the trade, 35s. per week of 48 hours.

The weekly rates for male apprentices as set out in this Section are based on a week of 48 hours, and they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours spent by the apprentice in the factory or workshop in any week is less than 48.

In cases where an apprentice is employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker not less than the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable as set out in this Section.

##### PART II.

*Proposed Overtime Rates for Male Workers.*

##### *Section I.*

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby give notice that they propose to declare

the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week	...	...	...	48
On any day (other than Saturday)	9			
On Saturday	...	...	...	5

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

#### Section II.

•The Trade Board give similar Notice that they propose to fix Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Male Worker in excess of such normal number of hours, as follows, that is to say:—

(a) For Male Workers employed on Time-work.

(1) For the first two hours' Overtime on any day, except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to time-and-a-quarter, that is to say, one-and-a-quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(2) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to time-and-a-half, that is to say, one-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to double time, that is to say, twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be time-and-a-quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this section. The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday, exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that:—

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9½.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

In the application of these Provisos, where the employer requires attendance on any day on which it is not the established practice of the employer to require attendance, all time worked on such day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) shall be paid for at time-and-a-quarter for the first two hours and time-and-a-half thereafter.

(b) For Male Workers employed on Piece-work.

(i) A Male Worker as specified in Section I. of Part I. of this Schedule employed on piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of overtime worked, in addition to piece-rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable as set out in Section I. of Part I. of this Schedule, a sum equivalent to the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, one-half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, or one-quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the overtime rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on time-work, were double-time, time-and-a-half, or time-and-a-quarter respectively.

(ii) A Male Apprentice as specified in Section II. of Part I. of this Schedule employed on piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of overtime worked, in addition to piece-rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker not less than the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable as set out in Section II. of Part I. of this Schedule, a sum equivalent to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, one-half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or one-quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the overtime rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on time-work, were double-time, time-and-a-half, or time-and-a-quarter respectively.

#### Section III.

Where a worker is of the Jewish Religion, and, subject to the provisions of Section 48 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, is employed on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply to such worker in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

NOTE.—The hours which young persons are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.

#### PART III.

The above respective minimum rates of wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to the above-mentioned classes of male workers employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade in Great Britain as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 12th December, 1919, that is to say:

Those branches of men's, women's, boys' and girls' bespoke tailoring in which the tailor supplies the garment direct to the individual wearer and employs the worker direct.

A worker shall be deemed to be employed by the tailor direct, if employed by another worker in the employ of the tailor, to whom a minimum rate of wages fixed under the Trade Boards Acts is applicable, or if employed by a sub-contractor engaged in cutting, making or finishing garments exclusively for the tailor in the tailor's shop or in a building of which the

shop forms part or to which the shop is attached;

*Including:*

(1) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of men's, women's, boys' or girls' tailored garments where carried out for the individual wearer by a tailor who employs the worker direct as defined above.

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the repairing, renovating or remaking of the garments;

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments;

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

(4) The packing and all other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

*But excluding:*

(1) All or any of the above-mentioned operations where carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments;

(2) The making of head-gear.

PART IV.

*Section I.*

The above minimum rates of wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

*Section II.*

The above minimum rates of wages are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Vary and Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 13th February, 1920. Such objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

## CORN PRODUCTION ACT, 1917.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES BOARD  
(ENGLAND AND WALES).

SPECIAL MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR HORSEMEN, COWMEN, SHEPHERDS AND HWSMON (BAILIFFS) IN ANGLESEY AND CARNARVON.

The Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales) hereby give notice, as required by the above Act, that they have made the following Order:—

1. The rates of wages fixed by the Order of the 25th September, 1919, shall not apply to any male workman of 18 years of age and over employed wholly or mainly as Horseman, Cowman, Shepherd or Hwsmon (Bailiff) in the area comprising the administrative counties of Anglesey and Carnarvon (except the parish of Llysfaen), and in lieu thereof the wages payable for employment of any male workman of the said age and of any of the said classes employed in the said area shall be for a week of 61 hours (including Sunday) in Summer, and 58 hours (including Sunday) in Winter, not less than wages at the following minimum rates, that is to say:—

For workmen of 21 years of age and over, 46s. per week.

For workmen of 20 and under 21 years of age, 44s. per week.

For workmen of 19 and under 20 years of age, 43s. per week.

For workmen of 18 and under 19 years of age, 41s. 6d. per week.

2. Provided that where a whole-time workman is employed by the week or any longer period, the wages payable to him for the hours of work agreed between him and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) shall not be less than the amount specified in clause 1 above and applicable to that workman; notwithstanding that those hours are less than the hours specified in the said clause.

3. The differential rates for overtime in the case of employment of any workman to whom this Order applies shall, in lieu of any differential rates which would otherwise be applicable, be as follows, that is to say:—

(a) In respect of overtime employment on weekdays:—

For workmen of 21 years of age and over, 10d. per hour.

For workmen of 20 and under 21 years of age, 9½d. per hour.

For workmen of 19 and under 20 years of age, 9½d. per hour.

For workmen of 18 and under 19 years of age, 9d. per hour.

(b) In respect of overtime employment on a Sunday:—

For workmen of 21 years of age and over, 1s. per hour.

For workmen of 20 and under 21 years of age, 11½d. per hour.

For workmen of 19 and under 20 years of age, 11½d. per hour.

For workmen of 18 and under 19 years of age, 11d. per hour.

4. For the purpose of the above rates the following employment is defined as overtime employment, that is to say:—

(a) All employment in excess of 61 hours in any week (including Sunday) in Summer.

(b) All employment in excess of 58 hours in any week (including Sunday) in Winter.

(c) All employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday or such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the workman, but so that:—

(i) no employment in connection with the feeding and cleaning of stock shall rank as overtime employment under this paragraph; and

(ii) the said paragraph shall not apply in the case of any workman who under an agreement with his employer is entitled in each half-year either to one week's holiday on full pay or to payment of double pay for one week's work.

5. For the purpose of the above rates the expression "employment in Summer" shall mean employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and ending on the last Sunday in October, and the expression "employment in Winter" shall mean employment during the rest of the year.

6. For the purpose of the application of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a workman who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of March, 1920.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 10TH FEBRUARY 1920.)

WILTSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-  
AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF  
1920 (No. 4).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Modification of Order.*

1. The Wiltshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," is modified in the manner hereinafter contained.

*Continued Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Area.*

2.—(1.) The provisions of the principal Order shall apply without modification, except as authorised in the Wiltshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 (No. 2), to the area described in the First Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as the Prohibited Area.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

*Provision as to movement for slaughter into the parts of the Scheduled District not included in the Prohibited Area.*

3.—(1.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by railway without a licence from premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a scheduled district for the purposes of an Order of the Minister relating to foot-and-mouth disease, to a railway station in the Scheduled District which is not situate in the Prohibited Area, and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District which is not situate in the Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station is situate.

(2.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a scheduled district for the purposes of an Order of the Minister relating to foot-and-mouth disease to any slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District which is not situate in the Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

*Movement within the Scheduled District excluding the Prohibited Area.*

4. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his district should be permitted to be moved from premises in the Scheduled District not situate in the Prohibited Area to

any other premises in the Scheduled District not situate in the Prohibited Area, he may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

*Provisions as to Movement Licences.*

5.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughterhouse from premises other than a railway station an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:—

*Cattle.*—By the clipping of a broad arrow  $\uparrow$  about six inches long on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

*Sheep.*—By the clipping of a broad arrow  $\uparrow$  on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

*Swine.*—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(2.) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in a Prohibited Area.

(3.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(4.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(5.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(6.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(7.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal

is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(8.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

*Movement through the Prohibited Area by Rail.*

6. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Prohibited Area where they are moved through the Prohibited Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Area except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

*General Provisions as to Movement.*

7. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

*Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.*

8. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—

(i) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii) movement into or out of a foot-and-mouth disease infected place; or

(iii) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry given under any Order of the Minister.

*Saving for Orders and Regulations.*

9. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Minister, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Minister for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

*Production of Licences; names and Addresses.*

10.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Ministry or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Holding of Markets and Sales in the Scheduled District (except in the Prohibited Area).*

11.—(1.) A market or sale of animals may be held on any premises in the Scheduled District, except in the Prohibited Area, if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Article shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 5 of this Order.

*Offences.*

12.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

13. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Ministry” means the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Commencement.*

14. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty.

*Short Title.*

## DEVONSHIRE (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

### *Modification of Order.*

1. The Devonshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," is modified in the manner hereinafter contained.

### *Continued Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Areas.*

2.—(1) The provisions of the principal Order shall apply without modification to the areas described in the First Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as the Prohibited Areas.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

### *Provision as to movement for slaughter into the parts of the Scheduled District not included in the Prohibited Areas.*

3.—(1) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by railway or by vessel without a licence from premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a scheduled district for the purposes of an Order of the Minister relating to foot-and-mouth disease to a railway station or landing place in the Scheduled District which is not situate in a Prohibited Area, and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing place to any slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District which is not situate in a Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or landing place is situate.

(2) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a scheduled district for the purposes of an Order of the Minister relating to foot-and-mouth disease to any slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District which is not situate in a Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

### *Movement within the Scheduled District excluding the Prohibited Areas.*

4. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his district should be permitted to be moved from premises in the Scheduled District not situate in a Prohibited Area to any other premises in the Scheduled District not situate in a Prohibited Area, he may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

### *Provisions as to Movement Licences.*

5.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughterhouse from premises other than a railway station or landing place an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:

*Cattle.*—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ about six inches long on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

*Sheep.*—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

*Swine.*—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(2.) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in a Prohibited Area.

(3.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority, or of the Ministry by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(4.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved; and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(5.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(6.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(7.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(8.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than

the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

*Movement through the Prohibited Areas by Rail.*

6. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of a Prohibited Area where they are moved through the Prohibited Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Area except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

*General Provisions as to Movement.*

7. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route, and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

*Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.*

8. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—

(i) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii) movement into or out of a foot-and-mouth disease infected place; or

(iii) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry given under any Order of the Minister.

*Saving for Orders and Regulations.*

9. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Minister, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Minister for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

*Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.*

10.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Ministry or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Holding of Markets and Sales in the Scheduled District (except in the Prohibited Area).*

11.—(1.) A market or sale of animals may be held on any premises in the Scheduled Dis-

trict, except in a Prohibited Area, if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Article shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 5 of this Order.

*Offences.*

12.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.*

1.—(1) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be landed in or moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District, without unnecessary delay, and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

*Power to Restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.*

2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a Notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right-of-way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the Notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say;

(i) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Copies of such Notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3.) A copy of every such Notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

*Power to restrict Movement of Dogs and Poultry in Certain Cases.*

3.—(1.) An Inspector of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by a Notice served on the occupier of any premises in the Scheduled District, require him:—

(a) to keep in confinement, or under control, as may be prescribed by the Notice, dogs on such premises;  
or (b) to confine live poultry on such premises in a pen or other like enclosure;  
or (c) to prevent the access of live poultry to any specific part of the premises to which cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have, or recently have had, access;  
and if any occupier after service of any such Notice shall fail to comply with the requirements thereof, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) An Inspector of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by Notice affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed, require dogs to be kept by the person in charge thereof under control while passing along any road or footpath specified in such Notice, and if any person in charge of a dog while passing along any road or footpath to which any such Notice relates fails to keep the dog under control, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) Every Notice served on an occupier of premises shall remain in operation until it is withdrawn by a further Notice served by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(4.) A copy of every Notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the General Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority

*Offences.*

5.—(1.) If an animal is landed in contravention of this Order, the Owner, and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof,

and the person causing, directing or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
