THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868.

THE GOVERNING BODY OF HARROW SCHOOL having, on the 11th day of November, 1919, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, made a Statute in the terms appended hereto amending Statute IV. of the existing Statutes of the said School, the said Statute is hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And Notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute.

STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Harrow School on the 11th day of November, 1919.

"WHEREAS Statutes for the Government of Harrow School were made by the Governing Body of the said School under the Public Schools Act, 1868, and approved and sealed by the Special Commissioners appointed for the purposes of the said Act on the 24th day of February, 1874:

And whereas the said Governing Body, in exercise of the powers for this purpose con-

ferred upon them by Section Eleven of the said Act, have resolved to alter Statute IV. of the said Statutes in manner hereinafter appearing:—

"Be it enacted as follows:—

1. From and after the date of His Majesty's Order in Council approving this Statute, the Lower School of John Lyon and the funds appropriated thereto shall be managed and administered according to the direction and under the superintendence of a Committee of Management appointed wholly or partly by the Governing Body of Harrow School, and such Committee shall be the Governing Body of the said Lower School of John Lyon:

2. The fees payable by each boy at the said Lower School of John Lyon may exceed Twelve pounds per annum, but shall not exceed Fifteen pounds per annum:

3. In all other respects Statute IV. of the above-mentioned Statutes shall remain in force:

His Majesty the KING has been pleased to award the Edward Medal to Charles Whelpton, Edward Naylor and Horace Ball, under the following circumstances:—

On August 26th, 1919, two steeplejacks were engaged in repainting the brickwork at the top of a chimney 150 feet high at the Atlas Works of Messrs. John Brown and Co., Ltd., at Sheffield. Before the work was completed, gas fumes were accidentally permitted to pass through the chimney, with the result that one of the men was overcome. His companion, a lad, was able to attract attention, but was unable to assist him.

Whelpton, Naylor and Ball, who were not steeplejacks, but had formerly been used to work at a height; at once ascended the ladder, which, however, only reached a spot 7 feet from the summit. They then had to climb outwards over a projecting chimney crown by means of the steel straps which run round the shaft. On reaching the top, which was only 9 inches wide, they applied artificial respiration to the unconscious man for 20 minutes, and then with great difficulty lowered him to the ground in a canvas ambulance sling, which had in the meantime been passed up by means of a rope.

All three men undoubtedly risked their lives in saving the life of another.

Trade Board for the Button-making Trade in Great Britain as specified in the Trade Boards (Button-making) Order, 1919, namely:—

The manufacture of buttons, button moulds, upholsterers' buttons or upholsterers' button-headed nails (excluding the shanks) from any material by the processes of cutting, sawing, stamping, pressing, turning, drilling, fancying, grinding, barrelling, polishing, japanning, lacquering, dyeing, colouring, painting, varnishing, sewing, crocheting or the covering of button moulds;

including:

(a) the manufacture of studs, links or parts thereof from any material other than metal, where such manufacture is carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for workers;

(b) the manufacture of shanks for buttons where carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making;

(c) the carding of any of the above articles wherever carried on;

(d) all despatching, packing, warehousing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above articles;

(e) the manufacture of wooden button moulds;

(f) the covering of button moulds where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of wearing apparel.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, the Minister of Labour is pleased to establish a Trade Board for the Stamped or Pressed Metal-ware Trade in Great Britain as specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-ware) Order, 1919, namely:—

The manufacture from metals (other than precious metals) by the processes of cold stamping or cold pressing (including cutting or piercing) of cabinet fittings, window fittings, curtain accessories, stationers' sundries, drapers' sundries, fittings for gas or electric light, fittings for suit-cases or handbags or purses, buckles, eyelets, ferrules, labels, collar studs, tie-clips, thimbles, photograph frames, stamped chains, bells, fancy nails (excluding the shanks), parts of safety razors (excluding the blades), parts of braces or suspenders, corset steels or busks, whistles, tin-openers, medals, or any similar articles or metal parts of such articles;

including:—

(a) the operations of annealing, hardening, barrelling, polishing, bronzing, nickelling, lacquering, japanning, non-vitreous enamelling, tinning or assembling where these operations are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

(b) the operations of carding, boxing, packeting, labelling, weighing, packing, warehousing or despatching where these operations are incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

but excluding:—

(a) the operations specified in the Trade Boards (Hollowware) Order, 1913;

(b) the making of buttons or any operations incidental thereto;

(c) the making of coffin furniture or any operations incidental thereto;

(d) the making of pins, hairpins, hooks and eyes, hair-curlers, snap fasteners or safety pins or any operations incidental thereto;

(e) the making of steel pens and the making of stationers' metal sundries or other similar metal articles when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the making of steel pens, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers;

(f) The minting of coinage of the realm;

(g) the process of hand-embossing.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, the Minister of Labour is pleased, under and by virtue of the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, to establish a Trade Board for Dressmaking and the making of Women's Light Clothing in England and Wales, that is to say:—

Those branches of the Women's Clothing Trade that are engaged in the making of Non-Tailored Garments, namely, the making from textile or knitted fabrics of (a) non-tailored wearing apparel (other than handkerchiefs) worn by women, or, girls or by children without distinction of sex, or (b) boys' ready-made washing suits or sailor suits, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of garments to be worn by women or girls or by children without distinction of sex;

Including—

1. All operations and processes of cutting, making or finishing by hand or machine of dresses, non-tailored skirts, wraps, blouses, blouse-ropes, jumpers, sports-coats, neck-wear, tea-gowns, dressing-gowns, dressing-jackets, pyjamas, underclothing, underskirts, aprons, overalls, nurses' and servants' caps, juvenile clothing, baby linen, or similar non-tailored articles;

2. The making of field bonnets, sun bonnets, boudoir caps, or infants' millinery where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 1 above;

3.—(a) The altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of any of the above-mentioned articles.

(b) The cleaning of the above-mentioned articles where carried on in association with

or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of such articles.

4. All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making, altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of such articles other than hand embroidery or hand-drawn thread work on articles made of linen or cotton or of mixed linen and cotton;

5. The following processes if done by machine, thread-drawing, thread-clipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling and paring;

6. Laundering, smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, packing, warehousing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the making, altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of any of the above-mentioned articles;

But excluding—

A. The making of knitted articles, the making of underclothing, socks and stockings from knitted fabrics, and the making from knitted fabrics of articles mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of the knitted fabric;

B. The making of gloves, spats, gaiters, boots, shoes and slippers;

C. The making of headgear, other than the articles mentioned in paragraph 2 above;

D. The branches of trade covered by the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919.

E. The making of rubberised or oilskin garments;

F. The making of women's collars and cuffs and of nurses' stiff washing-belts, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of men's or boys' shirts or collars;

G. Warehousing, packing and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the premises.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, the Minister of Labour, under and by virtue of

the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919, is pleased to establish a Trade Board for Retail Bespoke Tailoring in Great Britain, namely:—

Those branches of men's, women's, boys' and girls' bespoke tailoring to which the tailor supplies the garment direct to the individual wearer and employs the worker direct.

A worker shall be deemed to be employed by the tailor direct if employed by another worker in the employ of the tailor, to whom a minimum rate of wages fixed under the Trade Boards Acts is applicable; or if employed by a sub-contractor engaged in cutting, making or finishing garments exclusively for the tailor in the tailor's shop or in a building of which the shop forms part or to which the shop is attached;

Including—

(1) The altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of men's, women's, boys' and girls' tailored garments where carried out for the individual wearer by a tailor who employs the worker direct as defined above.

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the repairing, renovating or remaking of the garments;

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments;

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

(4) The packing and all other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

But excluding—

(1) All or any of the above-mentioned operations where carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments;

(2) The making of headgear.

In accordance with the Regulations with respect to the Constitution and Proceedings of the above-mentioned Trade Board dated 12th December, 1919, the Trade Board shall consist of—

TRADE BOARD ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

SPECIAL ORDER MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION ONE OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, WITH RESPECT TO THE WASTE MATERIALS RECLAMATION TRADE.

Whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, apply to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and to the Trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, and the Minister of Labour is empowered under and by virtue of Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply, if he is of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade, or any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that trade:

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the trade specified in the appendix to this Order, and the Minister of Labour as respects that trade is of the opinion aforesaid:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and by any other Statute in that behalf, does hereby make a Special Order that from and after the 20th day of February, 1920, the following provisions shall have effect (that is to say):—

Article 1.—The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the Trade specified in the appendix to this Order.

Article 2.—This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation) Order, 1920.

APPENDIX. TRADE.

The Waste Materials Reclamation Trade, that is to say:—

(1) the collecting, sorting or grading of

the following materials:—Rags; waste paper; paper stock; woollen, worsted, cotton, jute, flax, hemp or other textile waste; textile clippings or cuttings; used bags, sacks or sacking; scrap rubber; scrap iron or other scrap metal; fur cuttings; rabbit skins; bones or fat; used tins; broken glass or earthenware;

(2) the collecting, sorting or grading of the following articles when collected, sorted or graded in association with or in conjunction with the collecting, sorting or grading of the waste materials specified above:—Discarded clothing (including headgear or footgear); discarded textile articles; old ropes; used bottles or used jars;

(3) the following operations when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the collecting, sorting or grading of any or all of the waste materials specified in (1) above:—The ripping of worn clothes for rags; the picking of old ropes; the trimming of paper salvage; the washing of used bottles or used jars; the washing of used tins; the breaking of scrap metal; the drying of rabbit skins; the making or repairing of sacks or bags; the willowing, pulling, scouring, carbonising, or putting down mixings of textile waste;

(4) the operations of receiving, packing, compressing, teagling, craning, despatching or warehousing when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any or all of the above-mentioned operations;

But excluding—

(a) any or all of the above-mentioned operations when carried on in the establishment in which the waste materials are produced or in which they are used as raw materials for further manufacture;

(b) the making or repairing of sacks or bags when carried on in a factory or workshop engaged solely or mainly in the making or repairing of sacks or bags.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE.

THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (INCREASE OF BENEFIT) REGULATIONS, 1920, DATED THE 11TH FEBRUARY, 1920.

For the purpose of adapting the provisions of paragraph (b) and (c) of sub-section (1) of section 14 of the National Insurance (Part II. Amendment) Act, 1914, to the increase in the rate of unemployment benefit effected by the National Insurance (Unemployment) Act, 1919, the Minister of Labour, by virtue of the powers conferred on him by section 3 of the last-mentioned Act, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, with the consent

of the Treasury, hereby makes the following regulations varying the provisions of those paragraphs in manner hereinafter appearing:—

1. The said paragraph (b) shall have effect as if the word "twenty-one" were therein substituted for the word "seventeen" wherever that word occurs in the said paragraph.

2. The said paragraph (c) shall have effect as if the word "seventeen" were therein substituted for the word "thirteen" where that word first occurs in the said paragraph, and as if the words "but there shall be excluded four-elevenths of such sum and in addition a further part thereof, viz:—an amount bearing the same proportion to seven-elevenths of the whole amount as a sum equal to four shillings less than such highest rate of weekly payments bears to thirteen shillings," were therein substituted for the words "but such part thereof only as bears the same proportion to the whole amount as such highest rate of weekly payment bears to thirteen shillings."

3. These regulations shall come into operation as from Thursday, the 25th day of December, 1919, and may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Increase of Benefit) Regulations, 1920.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 14TH FEBRUARY 1920.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (CONTROL OF
MOVEMENT) ORDER OF 1920

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Application of Order.

1.—(1) In this Order "Scheduled District" means a District to which Part I. of this Order is applied by an Order of the Minister, and "Prohibited Area" means an Area within a Scheduled District which is declared by an Order of the Minister to be a Prohibited Area for the purposes of Part III. of this Order.

(2) Part II. or Part III. of this Order shall not apply to any Scheduled District unless it is expressly applied thereto by an Order of the Minister.

(3) An Area declared by Order of the Minister to be a Prohibited Area shall not by reason of such declaration cease to form part of a Scheduled District.

PART I.

Prohibition of Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

2.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be moved, by land or water, into or out of a Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon, a highway or thoroughfare within a Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of a Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District, without unnecessary delay, and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly outside a Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District

Power to Restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

3.—(1.) An Inspector of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction may by a Notice served on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in a Scheduled District, prohibit the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right-of-way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the Notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say;

(i) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the

agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry.

(2.) Copies of such Notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3.) A copy of every such Notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the General Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W. 1.

Power to restrict Movement of Dogs and Poultry in Certain Cases.

4.—(1.) An Inspector of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by a Notice served on the occupier of any premises in a Scheduled District, require him:—

- (a) to keep in confinement, or under control, as may be prescribed by the Notice, dogs on such premises; or
- (b) to confine live poultry on such premises in a pen or other like enclosure; or
- (c) to prevent the access of live poultry to any specific part of the premises to which cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have, or recently have had, access;

and if any occupier after service of any such Notice shall fail to comply with the requirements thereof, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) An Inspector of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by Notice affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed, require dogs to be kept by the person in charge thereof under control while passing along any road or footpath in a Scheduled District and specified in such Notice, and if any person in charge of a dog while passing along any road or footpath to which any such Notice relates fails to keep the dog under control, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) Every Notice served on an occupier of premises shall remain in operation until it is withdrawn by a further Notice served by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(4.) A copy of every Notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the General Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W. 1.

PART II.

Movement of Animals into Boroughs, etc., in Scheduled Districts, for Immediate Slaughter.

5. Notwithstanding anything in Part I. of this Order, an animal may, subject as herein-after provided, be moved without a licence by railway or by vessel from outside a Scheduled

District to a railway station or landing place situate within any borough or urban district to which this Part of this Order is applied by a subsequent Order of the Minister; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing place to any slaughterhouse or bacon factory situate within the same borough or urban district, as the case may be, if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough or urban district.

PART III.

Maintenance of Prohibition of Movement in Prohibited Area.

6.—(1.) The prohibition of movement of animals contained in Part I. of this Order shall apply to a Prohibited Area without modification, except as may be authorised in any Order of the Minister for the time being in force applying Part II. of this Order.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly outside a Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

Provision as to movement for slaughter into the parts of Scheduled District not included in a Prohibited Area.

7.—(1.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by railway or by vessel without a licence from premises not situate within a Scheduled District to a railway station or landing place in a Scheduled District which is not situate in a Prohibited Area; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing place to any slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled District which is not situate in a Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or landing place is situate.

(2.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises not situate within a Scheduled District to any slaughterhouse in a Scheduled District which is not situate in a Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

Movement within parts of Scheduled District not included in a Prohibited Area.

8. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his District should be permitted to be moved from premises in a Scheduled District not situate in a Prohibited Area to any other premises in the same Scheduled District not situate in a Prohibited Area, he may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence. A Licence for such movement may be granted by an Inspector of the Ministry.

Holding of Markets and Sales in Scheduled District (except in a Prohibited Area).

9.—(1.) A market or sale of animals may be held on any premises in a Scheduled District (except in a Prohibited Area) if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter, and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Article shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 11 of this Order.

PART IV.

GENERAL.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

10.—(1.) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in a Prohibited Area.

(2.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(3.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(4.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(5.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(6.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

(7.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

General Provisions as to Movement.

11.—(1.) Animals while being moved with a Movement Licence under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of

destination specified in the Licence and not elsewhere, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(2.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughterhouse from premises other than a railway station or landing place, an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow, ↑ about six inches long, on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle, and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

12. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising:—

(i) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii) movement into or out of a foot-and-mouth disease infected place; or

(iii) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry given under any Order of the Minister.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

13. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Minister, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Minister for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

14.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Ministry or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

15. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

16.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the movement; and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person allows an animal to stray in contravention of this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

17. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Minister” and “The Ministry” mean the Minister and the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon factory.

“Local Authority” means local authority for the purposes of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

18. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (CONTROL OF MOVEMENT) ORDER OF 1920.

GENERAL INFORMATION WITH REGARD TO WIRELESS TIME SIGNALS.

Former Notice.—No. 171 of 1920; hereby cancelled.

The accompanying list of wireless time signals is intended to provide, in a form suitable to give all information required by the wireless operator, a complete and up-to-date list of all time signals issued by wireless stations throughout the world. The details showing the method of transmission of any given time signal will be found in the "Admiralty List of Lights and Time Signals" or in the "International List of Radiotelegraph Stations" (The Berne List).

The times given in the 4th column of the list are expressed in the 4-figure notation employed for signalling during the war. The term "G.M.T." here means the civil mean time of the meridian of Greenwich, with the day commencing at midnight and the hours reckoned from 00 to 23. Where two times are joined by a hyphen, the times denote respectively the beginning and end of the signal.

Most of the wireless time signals at present transmitted are sent by means of an automatic arrangement operated by the pendulum of a chronometer situated at some observatory. In such cases absolute reliance may be placed upon the accuracy of the signal. There are, however, many stations in the world which are very suitably situated for transmitting time signals to ships which could otherwise not receive them, where it would be very difficult or impossible to establish an automatic system. In such cases "hand" signals may be provided; but in general these signals should not be trusted to be accurate within closer limits than about two seconds.

It is hoped that all wireless time signals will eventually be standardised, so that there shall be only two kinds of signals transmitted, the automatic signals being all alike and quite distinctive from the hand signals. It is further expected that arrangements will be made for all time signals to be transmitted at times so selected that a ship with only one wireless operator will be able to read them. A similar scheme for wireless weather bulletins is being evolved.
