ACQUISITION OF LAND (ASSESSMENT OF COMPENSATION) FEES RULES, 1920.

In pursuance of sub-section (6) of section three of the Acquisition of Land (Assessment of Compensation) Act, 1919, the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby make the following rules :---

1.---(1) These rules may be cited as the Acquisition of Land (Assessment of Compensation) Fees Rules, 1920.

(2) In these rules the expression "the Act" means the Acquisition of Land (Assessment of Compensation) Act, 1919.

2. On every application for the selection of an arbitrator made in accordance with the rules made under the Act by the Reference Committee there shall be paid the fee of  $\pounds 1$ .

3.—(1) On an award by an official arbitrator under the Act there shall be paid a fee calculated by reference to the amount awarded to the claimant in accordance with the following scale:—

•For the purpose of the foregoing provision any time spent by the arbitrator in viewing any land which is the subject matter of the proceedings before him shall be treated as part of the hearing :

## BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALLIENS ACTS, 1914 and 1918.

In the Matter of Karl Bachert Strauss.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied, as the result of an inquiry conducted by the Certificates of Naturalization (Revocation) Committee, that Karl Bachert Strauss, to whom a certificate of naturalization numbered 19713 was granted on the 11th November, 1910, has shown himself by act to be disaffected and disloyal to His Majesty, and has during the recent war unlawfully traded and communicated with subjects

of an enemy State; and, further, that the continuance of the certificate of the said Karl Bachert Strauss is not conducive to the public good.

Now; therefore, by this Order, made in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 7 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said certificate, and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof; and I further order the said certificate to be given up and to be cancelled.

And I further direct that the wife and any child of the said Karl Bachert Strauss shall cease to be British subjects.
