PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the County Courts Act, 1888, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council from time to time to alter the number and boundaries of the Districts and the place of holding any Court, and to order the discontinuance of the holding of any Court, and the consolidation of any two or more Districts, and the division of any District, and to order by what name and in what towns and places a Court shall be held in such District:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) The County Court of Lancashire held at Bacup and Rawtenstall shall cease to be held at Bacup and shall be held at Rawtenstall by the name of the County Court of Lancashire held at Rawtenstall.

(2) The County Court of Lancashire held at Blackburn and Darwen shall cease to be held at Darwen and shall be held at Blackburn by the name of the County Court of Lancashire held at Blackburn.

(3) So much of the Township of Sabden as is now within the District of the County Court of Lancashire held at Clitheroe shall cease to form part of the said District, and shall be transferred to, and form part of, the District of the County Court of Lancashire held at Burnley.

(4) The County Court of Lancashire held at Haslingden and Accrington shall cease to be held at Haslingden, and shall be held at Accrington by the name of the County Court of Lancashire held at Accrington.

(5) The Parishes set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order shall be detached from, and shall cease to form part of, the Districts set opposite to their names respectively in the second column of the said Schedule, and shall be transferred to, and form part of, the Districts set opposite to their names respectively in the third column thereof.

(6) The District of the County Court of Warwickshire held at Solihull, excluding the parishes detached therefrom by the last preceding paragraph hereof, shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Warwickshire held at Birmingham; and the holding of the said Court at Solihull shall be discontinued, and the jurisdiction thereof shall be transferred to the said Court

held at Birmingham; and the County Court of Warwickshire held at Birmingham shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.

(7) The District of the County Court of Yorkshire held at Holmfirth shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Yorkshire held at Huddersfield; and the holding of the said Court at Holmfirth shall be discontinued, and the jurisdiction thereof shall be transferred to the said Court held at Huddersfield; and the County Court of Yorkshire held at Huddersfield shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.

(8) This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1920, and shall be read with the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899, which shall have effect as amended by this Order.

TIN BOX TRADE BOARD.

(GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS IN THE TIN BOX AND CANISTER TRADE IN GREAT BRITAIN.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under that Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Tin Box and Canister Trade in Great Britain, as defined in the regulations made by the Board of Trade, and dated 12th June, 1914, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918 (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such Notice being given), that they propose to vary the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time Rates, and Overtime Rates for male and female workers at present fixed and set out in the Schedule of their Notice dated 1st November, 1919, the proposed variation of the Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below:—

- (c) Female Workers of 18 years of age and over, who have been employed in the trade for an aggregate period of less than 12 months, and who cannot suitably be employed on piece-work, shall, until the expiry of such 12 months' period of employment, be paid at a minimum rate of not less than 24s. per week of 48 hours (*i.e.*, 6d. per hour);

and to provide that—

- a Worker who enters the trade for the first time, at the age of 15 years or over, and who cannot suitably be employed on piece work, shall, until the expiry of six months' employment in the trade, be paid at a minimum rate of not less than three-quarters of the general minimum time-rate which would otherwise be applicable according to her age.

The Trade Board propose to cancel the following provisions contained in Section I. of the Schedule of their Notice dated 1st November, 1919—that is to say:—

Provided that Male Workers of 21 years of age and upwards, employed as knife hands or press hands, who have been employed in the trade for an aggregate period of less than 12 months, and who cannot suitably be employed on piece-work, shall, until the expiry of such 12 months' period of employment, be paid at a minimum rate of not less than 52s per week (*i.e.*, 1s. 1d. per hour);

and (b) Male Workers of 21 years of age and upwards who have been employed in the trade for an aggregate period of less than 12 months, and who cannot suitably be employed on piece-work, shall, until the expiry of such 12 months' period of employment, be paid at a minimum rate of not less than 45s. per week (*i.e.*, 11½d. per hour);

and to provide that—

a Worker who enters the trade for the first time at the age of 15 years or over, and who cannot suitably be employed on piece-work shall, until the expiry of 6 months' employment in the trade, be paid at a minimum rate of not less than three-quarters of the General Minimum Time Rate which would otherwise be applicable according to his age.

SECTION III.—In cases where the Worker is employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid shall be sufficient to yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary Worker an amount not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable, as set out above.

SECTION IV.—The above weekly rates are on the basis of a week of 48 hours, and are subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours actually spent by the Worker in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less than 48.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers (all ages).

Overtime rates, calculated on the minimum rates set out above in the manner set out in the Schedule of the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 1st November, 1919, shall apply, in substitution for the above minimum rates, in respect of all hours worked in excess

of the number of hours therein declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, and of this Notice, apply to all Workers who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in the trade

for which the Trade Board is established, namely, the making of boxes and canisters from tinplate, excluding the sealing of filled boxes and canisters with solder, and excluding the following branches of work, namely, the lining of packing cases with tinplate, the making of trunks, uniform cases, suit and dress cases, bonnet and helmet boxes, cash and deed boxes, despatch boxes, letter boxes, kegs and drums, and any other branch of work which does not form part of the tin box and canister trade. Provided that, notwithstanding anything contained in this Section, the above minimum rates shall not apply to persons occupied merely as Clerks, Salesmen, Saleswomen, Travellers, Carpenters, Vanmen, Watchmen, Outside Messengers, Cleaners of Premises, Timekeepers, or to any other workers whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of the foregoing excluded classes.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to Workers earning Higher Rates of Wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Vary and Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 12th March, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Tin Box Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR SPECIAL CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS, EFFECTIVE AS FROM 15TH MARCH, 1920.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Corset Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919, having given due Notice on the 8th December, 1919, of Proposal to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates, and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male Workers, hereby give Notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the

Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they have varied the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates, and Overtime Rates fixed and set out in the Schedule of their Notice dated 26th November, 1919, in their application to the classes of Male Workers specified in the Schedule hereto, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied are shown in the Schedule set out below which is incorporated herewith.

And the Trade Board further give Notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 10th March, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied by the Trade Board, and specifying 15th March, 1920,* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

* NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 21st March, 1920.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for certain classes of Male Workers.

SECTION I.—For Male Workers employed as Cutters, Markers-out (other than Process Workers), Hand Pressers, Matchers-up and Shaders, who have had not less than 3 years' experience after the age of 19 years in one or more of the occupations specified in this Section, 1s. 5d. per hour, General Minimum Time-Rate; 1s. 6½d. per hour, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate.

Provided that for the purpose of reckoning previous experience a worker shall be entitled to count not more than twelve months' experience after the age of 19 years in any of the occupations specified in Section II. of this Part of this Schedule.

SECTION II.—For Male Workers employed as Folders, Hand-Fitters, Parters, Separaters and Makers-up, who have had not less than 3 years' experience after the age of 19 years in one or more of the occupations specified in this Section, 1s. 3d. per hour, General Minimum Time Rate; 1s. 4½d. per hour, Piece-Work Basis Time Rate.

PART II.

Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male Workers.

The Minimum Rates for overtime to apply in substitution for the above Minimum Rates of Wages in respect of all hours worked by the above classes of workers, in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade, shall be as follows, subject to the provisions of Section II of Part III of the Schedule to the Notice of the Minimum Rates of Wages fixed, dated 26th November, 1919, viz. :—

(a) For the first two hours' overtime on any day, except Saturdays, Sundays, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, one-and-quarter times the above minimum rate applicable;

(b) For overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all overtime on Saturdays, one-and-a-half times the above minimum rate applicable;

(c) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, twice the above minimum rate applicable;

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, one-and-a-quarter times the above minimum rate applicable, except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) above.

PART III.

SECTION I.—The above respective Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Workers as specified in Part I of this Schedule who are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

(a) The manufacture of corsets, stays, children's corset bodices, infants' stay bands, bust confiners, such as brassieres and bandeaux when boned or with elastic webbing in their construction.

(b) The manufacture of support or abdominal belts and similar articles except where made in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of surgical instruments.

(c) The assembling of stocking suspenders in conjunction with or in association with the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

(d) All warehousing, packing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between

employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

And the Trade Board further give notice, that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 10th March, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied by the Trade Board and specifying 15th March, 1920,* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

* NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 21st March, 1920.

During the first twelve months of service as a Machine Tackler, 1s. 1½d. per hour, or 55s. per week of 48 hours.

During the second twelve months of service as a Machine Tackler, 1s. 3d. per hour, or 60s. per week of 48 hours.

During the third twelve months of service as a Machine Tackler, 1s. 4½d. per hour, or 66s. per week of 48 hours.

After three years' service as a Machine Tackler, 1s. 6d. per hour, or 72s. per week of 48 hours.

Paper Bag Cutters.

During the first twelve months of service as a Paper Bag Cutter, 1s 1½d. per hour, or 55s. per week of 48 hours.

During the second twelve months of service as a Paper Bag Cutter, 1s. 2½d. per hour, or 58s. per week of 48 hours.

During the third twelve months of service as a Paper Bag Cutter, 1s. 3½d. per hour, or 61s. per week of 48 hours.

After three years' service as a Paper Bag Cutter, 1s. 4d. per hour, or 64s. per week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.—*For Hydraulic Pressers, Slitters, Stock-keepers, Packers, and Despatchers, of 21 years of age and over.*

During the first twelve months of service after the age of 21 years in any one of the occupations specified in this Section, 1s. 1½d. per hour, or 55s. per week of 48 hours.

During the second twelve months of service after the age of 21 years in the same occupation, 1s. 2d. per hour, or 56s. per week of 48 hours.

During the third twelve months of service after the age of 21 years in the same occupation, 1s. 2½d. per hour, or 58s. per week of 48 hours.

After three years' service after the age of 21 years in the same occupation, 1s. 3d. per hour, or 60s. per week of 48 hours.

PART II.

OVERTIME RATES.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime to apply in substitution for the above Minimum Rates of Wages in respect of all hours worked by the above classes of workers, in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade, shall be as follows, subject to the provisions of Section 2 of Part III. of the Schedule to the Notice of the Minimum Rates of Wages fixed, dated 22nd November, 1919, viz.:—

(a) For the first two hours' overtime, on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, one-and-a-quarter times the above Minimum Rate applicable;

(b) For the second two hours' overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, one-and-a-half times the above Minimum Rate applicable;

(c) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for Overtime after the first four hours' Overtime on any other day, twice the above Minimum Rate applicable;

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, one-and-a-quarter times the above Minimum Rate applicable, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) above.

PART III.

For the purpose of this Notice a Machine Tackler shall be deemed to be a Male person who is engaged in setting, adjusting, and keeping running Paper Bag Machines, and in superintending and carrying through all other operations that can be performed in whole or in part by such machines.

PART IV.

The above respective Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Machine Tacklers, Paper Bag Cutters, Hydraulic Pressers, Slitters, Stock-keepers, Packers and Despatchers in Great Britain employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Paper Bag Trade) Order, 1919—that is to say, the manufacture from paper (including gauze-lined or cloth-lined paper) of any bag or container without a gummed flap, including the operations of packing, parcelling, warehousing, receiving, store-keeping, despatching, time-keeping, lift-operating, and cleaning, when these operations are carried on in connection with paper-bag manufacture, and including the printing of paper bags when the printing apparatus is attached to the making apparatus, but excluding the manufacture of bags or containers with ungummed flaps (for use in the transmission of printed matter or samples) when made by the same process as gummed envelopes, and excluding the manufacture of receptacles from cardboard, such as boxes, cartons or skillets.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorized by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

Withdrawal of Restrictions from Parts of Scheduled District.

1. The restrictions on the movement of animals imposed by the Gloucestershire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of

1920, hereinafter referred to as the principal Order, shall apply only to the Prohibited Area described in the Second Schedule to the Gloucestershire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 (No. 4), and that Area shall be the Scheduled District for the purposes of the principal Order, which shall apply thereto without modification except as authorised by the Gloucestershire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 (No. 2).

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty.

1. The Oxfordshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920, and the Oxfordshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1920 (Nos. 2 to 4), all of which are hereinafter referred to as "the existing Orders," are modified in the manner hereinafter contained.

Contraction of Scheduled District and of Prohibited Area.

(Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 (No. 4) were the Scheduled District for the purposes of those Orders, and as if the three Areas described in the Schedule to this Order were Prohibited Areas for those purposes.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the OXFORDSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 5), and shall be read with the existing Orders.

3. An Area in the administrative counties of Oxford and Buckingham.

Comprising the parishes of Shabbington and Albury, and portions of the parishes of Chilworth Ickford, Waterstock, Teddington, Great Haseley, and Thame, and lying within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the Three Pigeons Inn in Ryecote Lane, south of Albury Village, thence in a north-easterly direction along that lane to its junction with the road leading from

(3) St. Mary's Sub-District to consist of St. Mary's and St. Paul's Wards;

(4) St. Martin's Sub-District to consist of Market Hall, and St. Martin's and Deritend Wards;

(5) Sparkbrook Sub-District to consist of Small Heath and Sparkbrook Wards.

(c) *Aston Registration District*:—

(1) St. Bartholomew's Sub-District to consist of St. Bartholomew's and Saltley Wards;

(2) Duddeston Sub-District to consist of Duddeston and Nechells and Washwood Heath Wards;

(3) Aston Sub-District to consist of Aston and Lozells Wards, and

(4) Erdington Sub-District to consist of Erdington North and Erdington South Wards.
