TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918. TIN BOX TRADE BOARD. (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS IN THE TIN BOX AND CANISTER TRADE IN GREAT BRITAIN.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under that Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Tin Box and Canister Trade in Great Britain, as defined in the regulations made by the Board of Trade, and dated 12th June, 1914, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918 (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such Notice being given), that they propose to vary the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time Rates, and Overtime Rates for male and female workers at present fixed and set out in the Schedule of their Notice dated 1st November, 1919, the proposed variation of the Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below :-

The Trade Board propose to cancel the following provision contained in Section I. of the Schedule of their Notice dated 1st November, 1919-that is to say :-

(c) Female Workers of 18 years of age and over, who have been employed in the trade for an aggregate period of less than 12 months, and who carnot suitably be employed on piece-work, shall, until the expiry of such 12 months' period of employment, be paid at a minimum rate of not less than 24s. per week of 48 hours (i.e., 6d. per hour);

and to provide that-

years of age

a Worker who enters the trade for the first time, at the age of 15 years or over, and who cannot suitably be employed on piece work, shall, until the expiry of six months' employment in the trade, be paid at a minimum rate of not less than three-quarters of the general minimum time rate which would otherwise be applicable according to her age.
