#### PRESENT,

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by proviso (i) to subsection (1) of Section 3 of the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, it is enacted that the duties heretofore performed by the Medical Research Committee shall after the date of the commencement of the Act be carried on by or under the direction of a Committee of the Privy Council appointed by His Majesty for that purpose:

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the ninth day of February, 1920, the first day of April, 1920, has been appointed as the date of the commencement of the Act for the purposes aforesaid, and the Medical Research Committee constituted by the National Health Insurance (Medical Research Fund) Regulations, 1914, will on and after that date cease to exist:

And whereas for the purpose of securing the continued performance of the duties heretofore performed by the Medical Research Committee a Petition has been presented to His Majesty in Council by the Minister of Health praying for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation to the present members of the Medical Research Committee, under the tyle and title of the Medical Research Council, to act under the direction of the Committee of the Privy Council to be appointed by His Majesty for

that purpose as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, it is this day ordered by His Majesty in Council that the Lord President of the Council, the Minister of Health, the Secretary for Scotland, and the Chief Secretary for Ireland, respectively, for the time being, be, and they are hereby appointed a Committee for the purposes aforesaid.

And it is ordered that during His Majesty's pleasure the Minister of Health shall preside over the said Committee in the absence of the

Lord President.

And it is further ordered that the said Committee may out of moneys provided by Parliament or otherwise available, and subject to such conditions as the Treasury may prescribe, furnish the Medical Research Council with such funds as may be necessary for the performance of their duties by the Council, and shall exercise and perform in relation to the Council such powers and duties as in the Charter aforesaid they shall be authorized and empowered to exercise and perform.

And it is further ordered that the Secretary of the Medical Research Council for the time being shall act as Secretary of the said Com-

And it is ordered that the said Committee

shall in every year cause to be laid before both | Houses of Parliament a report of their proceedings and of the proceedings of the Medical Research Council during the preceding year.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

SPECIAL ORDER MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SEC-TION ONE OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, WITH RESPECT TO THE TOY TRADE.

Whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, apply to the trades specified in Schedule to the Trades Boards Act, 1909, and to the Trades specified in the the Trade Boards Schedule to visional Orders Confirmation Act, and the Minister of Labour is empowered under and by virtue of Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply, if he is of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rate of wages prevailing in the trade, or any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that trade;

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the trade specified in the Appendix to this Order, and the Minister of Labour as respects that trade is of the opinion aforesaid;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers in him vested by Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and by any other Statute in that behalf, does hereby make a Special Order that from and after the twenty-third day of March, 1920, the following provision shall have effect (that is to say):—

Article 1. The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the trade specified in the Appendix to this Order.

Article 2. This Order may be cited as the

Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920.

TRADE.

The Toy Trade, that is to say, the manufacture of articles intended for the amusement of children, including dolls, metal, wooden or other hard toys, soft toys, books made from textile materials, requisites for table games, bricks, blocks, puzzles, balls, Christmas crackers, Easter eggs, masks or drums,

including also,

- (a) The assembling of parts of any of the above-mentioned articles.
- (b) The operations of storing, boxing, packeting, labelling or despatching, and all other warehousing or packing operations incidental to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles,

but excluding,

- (a): The manufacture of toys when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of other articles, so as to form a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers.
  - (b) The manufacture of sports requisites.
- (c) The manufacture of toy perambulators, toy wheel-barrows, toy scooters, nursery yachts, toy cycles, toy cars, toy horses, dolls' houses, or other similar toys when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of perambulators, invalid carriages or folding push cars, so as to form a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers.
- (d) The manufacture from ceramic materials of dolls or dolls' parts, dolls' china, marbles or similar articles when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of other pottery.
- (e) The making of articles from sugar confectionery.
- (f) The making of hollow-ware including boxes and canisters, from sheet iron, sheet steel or timplate, or any operations incidental thereto.

#### Civil Service Commission, March 23, 1920.

The Civil Service Commissioner's hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

TEMPORARY RECONSTRUCTION REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF THE GENERAL CONSULAR SERVICE.

(These regulations are liable to alteration at any time after due notice.)

- 1. Age.—Candidates must have been born on or after the 2nd August, 1892, and have attained the age of 22 on the date fixed for the qualifying examination described below.
- 2. Nationality.—Candidates must be natural-born British subjects, and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within those territories, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case they can be allowed to compete by special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.
- 3. Military Service.—Candidates must have served in His Majesty's Naval, Military, or Air Forces; provided that a candidate who has been found unfit, on grounds of health, for general service, has served for at least a year in a Government Department, has there shown himself to be up to or above the standard of ability usually obtained from competitive examinations, and is recommended by his Department, may also be considered; provided also that a candidate who has been interned in an enemy country in such manner as to preclude him from serving in His Majesty's. Forces may be eligible.
- 4. Education.—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received whole-time, continuous and systematic education of a high type until at least the age of 17, or, alternatively, education as described up to the date of joining H.M. Forces.
- 5. Health and Character.—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

No candidate will be passed who cannot be sent to any climate.

The loss of a limb will not in itself be regarded as a disqualification, but the loss of

sight, deafness, or a bad stammer will be so

regarded.

(iii.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest policestation in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

ADMIRALTY NOTICE TO MARINERS. No. 478 of the year 1920. WIRELESS METEOROLOGICAL INFORMATION TO AND FROM SHIPS AT SEA.

General Remarks.

Former Notice.—No. 8 of 1920; hereby can-

1. It is earnestly hoped that all concerned will assist in making the wireless meteorological service a success. Negotiations are now in hand to extend and unify the system of collecting weather data by wireless from ships at sea all over the world, and at the same time to organise the free transmission of weather bulletins from a sufficient number of wireless stations to admit of ships being constantly supplied with reliable weather reports and fore-

casts wherever they may be.
2. It should be borne in mind that the needs of ships at sea in regard to information regarding the weather will march hand in hand with the requirements of aircraft. portance of this service will therefore be constantly increasing, and its success or failure will largely depend upon the co-operation of ships at sea in providing the data without which accurate forecasting is impossible. The matter does not depend solely upon the efforts of the ships selected to furnish the data. essence of success lies in rapidity in passing

such data by wireless from the ship to the coast station and thence to the central meteorological office. It follows, therefore, that all ships not taking an active part in supplying data shou'd use the greatest care not to interfere with the transmission of the wireless messages to the shore

3. The following particulars refer to the scheme now being undertaken by the British Meteorological Office. This Notice will, however, be subject to revision from time to time, and endeavours will be made to include in each revision all information available to date of the weather bulletins issued by the wireless stations of the world. Earnest endeavours are being made to obtain international agreement as to the form of these weather bulletins and the methods and times of transmissions. It is hoped that the messages will eventually all be made in an international code at fixed times, so arranged that a ship with only one wireless operator will be able to read them. A similar scheme for time signals is being evolved.

COLLECTION OF WEATHER DATA FROM SHIPS.

4. Certain ships are being asked surply data regularly three times a day

and in addition to the regular observations, which are taken at 0100, 0700 and 1300 Greenwich time and sent as soon as possible to Malin head (GMH) or Valentia (GCK) coast stations, these ships may, on request from either of these coast stations, send special data messages at other times.

Precise instructions as to the procedure for ships which intend to send a data message, together with the necessary code, will be issued at an early date.

Issue of Weather Bulletins to Ships.

6. A wireless weather bulletin may contain both or either of the following:-

(a) A weather report, which is an official statement of existing weather conditions;

(b) A weather forecast, which is an official opinion of probable future weather condi-

7. The accompanying schedule of wireless weather bulletins is intended to provide, in a formsuitable to give all information required by the wireless operator, a complete and up-to-date list of all weather bulletins transmitted at fixed times by wireless stations throughout the The same information will be found in detail in the Sailing Directions and in the International List of Radiotelegraph Stations (the Berne List).

8. The times given in the third column of the schedule are expressed in the 4-figure notation employed for signalling during the war. The term "G.M.T." here means the civil mean time of the meridian of Greenwich, with the day commencing at midnight and the hours

reckoned from 00 to 23.

9. Operators are reminded that Article 45 of the International Service Regulations imposes the general obligation of not interfering with reception of weather bulletins by other
