REGULATIONS UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE PUBLIC OFFICE FEES ACT, 1879.

FEES PAYABLE UNDER SECTION 3 (6) OF THE ACQUISITION OF LAND (ASSESSMENT OF COMPENSATION) ACT, 1919, IN RESPECT OF PROCEEDINGS BEFORE OFFICIAL ARBITRATORS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on Us by Section 2 and Section 3 of the Public Offices Fees Act, 1879, We, being Two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, hereby give notice, order, and direct as follows:—

(i) The fees for the time being payable under Section 3 (6) of the Acquisition of Land (Assessment of Compensation) Act, 1919, in respect of proceedings before Official Arbitrators shall be payable:—

(a) in the case of applications for the selection of an Arbitrator by means of an adhesive stamp, affixed to the application;

(b) in the case of the award of an Arbitrator by means of a stamp impressed on the award of the Arbitrator.

(ii) The adhesive stamp to be affixed to applications shall be overprinted with the words "Official Arbitration (Land)."

(iii) The impressed stamps shall be of such design and character as the Commissioners of Inland Revenue may from time to time adopt for the purpose.

(iv) The adhesive stamps shall be cancelled in black indelible ink by a hand stamp bearing the word "Cancelled" and the date of cancelling or otherwise as the Commissioners of Inland Revenue may from time to time direct.

ORDER OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER THE AIR NAVIGATION ACTS, 1911 to 1919.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Air Navigation Acts, 1911 to 1919, and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Right Honourable Edward Shortt, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by Order, make the following regulation amending the Air Navigation Regulations, 1919:—

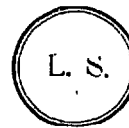

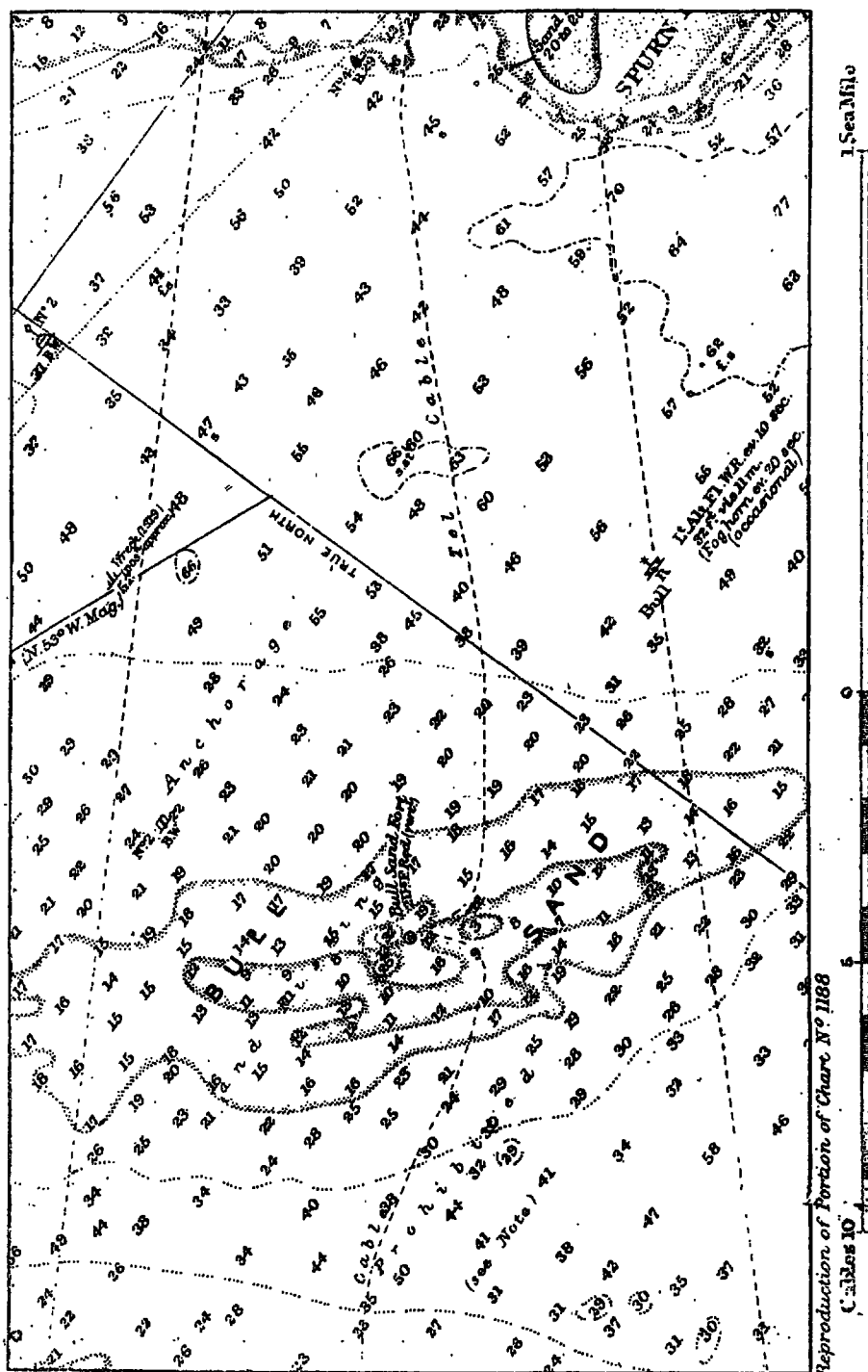
Details.—The accompanying reproductions of portions of chart No. 1188 show the area

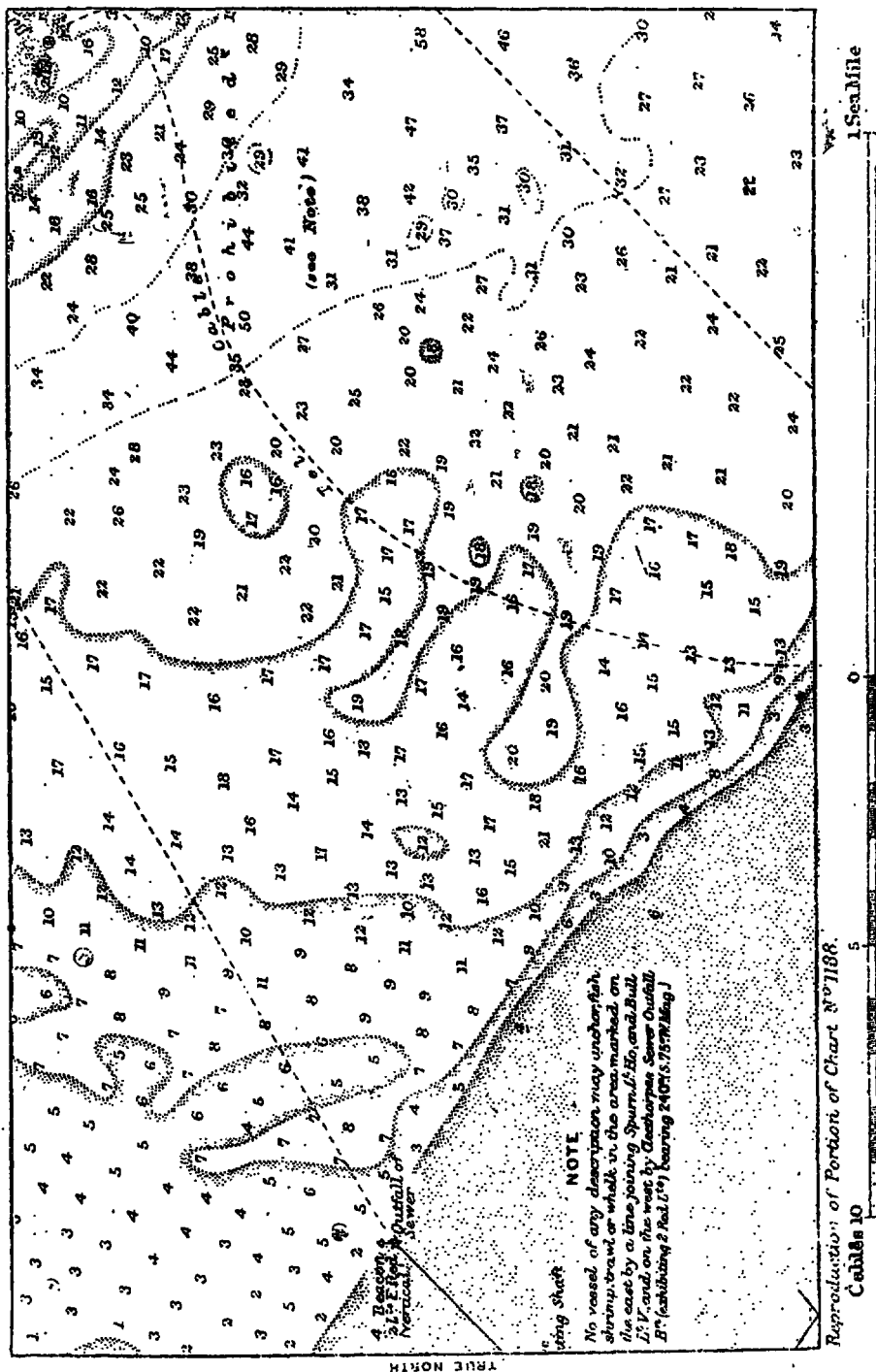

LOWESTOFT CORPORATION BILL. ADDITIONAL PROVISION.

(Use of further area of the Denes for use for Plots for Pickling and Curing Fish; Transfer of the Battery Green to the Corporation and Application thereto of the Trusts and Statutory Provisions relating to the Lowestoft

Lamp Lands; Power to Borrow on Security of Lamp Lands; Leasing of Omnibuses; Incorporation, Repeal and Amendment of Acts.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Lowestoft

(hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") by petition for additional provision for leave to introduce into the Bill now pending in Parliament under the above title (hereinafter referred to as "the Bill") provisions and amendments to give effect to all or some of the following objects and purposes (that is to say):—

1. To amend section 69 of the Lowestoft Corporation Act, 1901, further so as to extend the area of the Denes which may be used for plots for pickling, curing and storing fish and for other purposes incidental thereto, to 20 acres.

2. To transfer to and vest in the Corporation the lands comprised in the Schedule to the Lowestoft Improvement Act, 1854, commonly called the Battery Green, upon the like trusts to those upon which the lands known as the Lowestoft Lamp Lands are held, and to extend and apply to the Battery Green the unrepealed provisions of the Lowestoft Improvement Act, 1854, and the provisions of the Lowestoft Corporation Act, 1901, relating to the Lowestoft Lamp Lands.

3. To empower the Corporation by agreement to purchase and acquire the land and buildings in the borough adjacent to the Battery Green and known as the "Old Battery," and to hold the same on the like trusts to those referred to in paragraph 2 hereof, and to apply the provisions of the Acts referred to in that paragraph relating to the Lowestoft Lamp Lands to the said land and buildings known as the "Old Battery" when acquired by the Corporation.

4. To authorize the Corporation to borrow or raise money on the security of the Lowestoft Lamp Lands for all or any purposes connected with any lands for the time being held upon the trusts relating to the said Lowestoft Lamp Lands, and to execute and grant and issue mortgages and other securities in respect thereof.

5. To empower the Corporation to demise to any local authority, company, body or person the powers of the Bill with reference to the running of omnibuses, and the construction or use of depôts, buildings and sheds in connection therewith, and of demanding and taking the fares, rates and charges to be authorized by the Bill in respect of the running of such omnibuses.
