THEIR MAJESTIES' COURTS, 1920.
REGULATIONS.

1. The King and Queen will hold two Courts during the coming season, one in the first week in June and one in the third week in June, for the presentation of ladies to Their Majesties.

- 2. Ladies who have themselves been presented, and who desire to be summoned to one of these Courts for the purpose of making presentations, are requested to make a written application to the Lord Chamberlain, St. James's Palace, S.W. 1, as soon as possible. The names of the ladies to be presented should be forwarded by the lady who wishes to make the presentations when she sends in her own name.
- 3. No applications can be received from ladies who wish to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the ladies who wish to make the presentations.

4. 'A' lady presented for the first time can only present her daughters or daughters-in-law at the Court at which she is presented.

5. Ladies may be accompanied to Court by their husbands if the latter have been presented, but gentlemen do not pass before The King and Queen. Ladies who wish to be accompanied by their husbands should state the fact in their applications, and they should also state if the ladies they desire to present wish to be accompanied by their husbands. Once the summons has been issued, the amending of a summons card in order to include a lady's husband can only be permitted under the most exceptional circumstances.

6. The Dress Regulations are:—Ladies: Court Dress without feathers and trains. Gentlemen: Full Court Dress.

It is urgently requested that all applications will be made strictly in accordance with the above Regulations.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918. ROPE, TWINE AND NET TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FIXED FOR FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS, EFFECTIVE AS FROM 2ND APRIL, 1920.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Rope, Twine and Net Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, having given due notice on 22nd December, 1919, of Proposal to Fix General Minimum Time-rates, Piece-work Basis Time-rates and Overtime Rates for Female and Male Workers, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they have fixed General Minimum Time-rates, Piece-work Basis Time-rates and Overtime Rates for

Female and Male Workers, and have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as fixed are as shown in the Schedule set out below.

And the Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 31st March, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the minimum rates of wages fixed by the Trade Board and specifying 2nd April, 1920,* as the date from which such minimum rates of wages shall become effective.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 8th April, 1920.

SCHEDULE.

Part I.

General Minimum Time-Rates.

SECTION I.—Female Workers.

(a) For Workers other than Home-Workers:

Workers of 18 years of age and upwards, $8\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

Workers of $17\frac{1}{2}$ years of age and under 18, $7\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

Workers of 17 years of age and under $17\frac{1}{2}$, 61d. **per ho**ur.

Workers of 16½ years of age and under 17, 5∦d. per hour

Workers of 16 years of age and under 161, 5d. per hour.

Workers of 15 years of age and under 16,

4½d. per hour.

Workers under 15 years of age, 4d. per hour. Provided that workers entering the Trade for the first time at or over the age of 16 years may be employed for a period not exceeding six months at a minimum rate which is less by 1d. per hour than the mimimum rate applicable under the above scale.

b) For home workers:-

(i) General Minimum Time-rate, to operate from 2nd April, 1920, to 1st October, 1920, $7\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

(ii) General Minimum Time-rate, to operate from 2nd October, 1920, to 1st April, 1921, 8d. per hour.

(iii) General Minimum Time-rate, to operate as from 2nd April, 1921, 81d. per hour.

Provided that workers entering the trade for the first time at or over the age of 18 years may be employed for a period not exceeding six months at a minimum rate which is less by ld. per hour than the minimum rate applicable under the above scale.

PART II.

Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates.

SECTION I.—For all Female Workers other than Home-workers, 9d. per hour.

(a) In the case of Female Home-workers employed on Piece-work, each Piece-rate paid shall be such as would yield in the circumstances of the case to an Ordinary worker not less than the General Minimum Time-rate for Home-workers applicable as set out in Section I. (b) of Part I. above.

(b) In the case of all Female Workers, other than Home-workers, employed on Piece-work,

each Piece-rate paid shall be such as would yield in the circumstances of the case not less than 9d. an hour to an Ordinary worker. Provided that in determining as to whether any Piece-rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers of 18 years of age and over who have had not less than six months' experience in the

SECTION II.—For all Male Workers.

(i.) Piece-work Basis Time-rate to operate from 2nd April, 1920, to 1st October, 1920, 1s. 2½d, per hour.

(ii.) Piece-work Basis Time-rate to operate from 2nd October, 1920, to 1st April, 1921, 1s. 3d. per hour.

(iii.) Piece-work Basis Time-rate to operate as from 2nd April, 1921, 1s. 4d. per hour.

In the case of all Male Workers employed on Piece-work, each Piece-rate paid shall be such as would yield in the circumstances of the case to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piecework basis Time-rate set out above and applic-Provided that in determining as to whether any Piece-rate satisfies the foregoing condition regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers of 21 years of age and over who have had not less than six months' experience in the trade.

PART III.

Overtime Rates for Female Workers (other than Home-workers) and for Male. Workers $(all\ Ages).$

Section I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:

In any week

On any day (other than Saturday)
On Saturday

Provided that any other day, not being Sunday, may be, by agreement in writing between an employer and a worker, substituted in place of Saturday as the wkekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours on such substituted day shall be five, and the normal number of hours on Saturday shall be nine.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the

Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The minimum rates for overtime in respect of hours worked by male or female workers (other than female homeworkers) whether engaged on time-work or on piece-work in excess of the declared normal number of hours, shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(a) For the first two hours' overtime on any day, except Saturdays, Sundays and customary public and statutory holidays, the overtime rate shall be equivalent to timeand-a-quarter, that is to say, one-and-aquarter times the minimum rate otherwise

applicable.

(b) For overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day except Sundays and customary public and statutory holidays, and for all overtime on Saturdays, the overtime rate shall be equivalent to time-and-a-half, that is to say, one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

(c) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Double Time, that is to say, twice the mini-

mum rate otherwise applicable.

(d) All hours worked in any week in excess of 48 shall be paid for as Overtime, irrespective of the number of hours worked on any particular day, and the Overtime Rate shall also be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does The Overtime Rate payable not exceed 48. for hours worked in excess of 48 in any week shall be: -(a) As respects any day except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, time-and-aquarter for the first two hours, and timeand-a-half thereafter; (b) as respects Saturdays, time-and-a-half; (c) as respects Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, double time.

SECTION III.—Notwithstanding anything contained in Sections I. and II. of this part of this Notice:

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week the Overtime Rate shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9½.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturdays is required shall be deemed to be 50.

(c) In the application of clauses (a) and

(b) of this Section, where the employer requires attendance on any day on which it is not the established practice of the employer to require attendance, all time worked on such day shall be paid for as overtime at the respective overtime rates set out in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of Section II.

Note.—The hours which female workers and young persons are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop

Acts

PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice the expression "Home-worker" shall be held to mean a worker who works in her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART V.

The above minimum rates of wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919; that is to say, the making or re-making of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine, (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles; the bleaching, teazing, hackling, carding, preparing and spinning of the materials required for the making or re-making of any of the articles (a) to (g) above, when carried on in the same factory or workshop as such making or re-making; the manufacture of packings, gaskins, and spun yarns, when carried on in the same factory or workshop as the making or remaking of any of the articles (a) to (g) above; the braiding or splicing of articles made from rope, cord, twine or net; the mending of nets and the winding, twisting, doubling, laying, polishing, dressing, tarring, tanning, dyeing, balling, reeling, finishing, packing, despatching, warehousing and storing of any of the above articles, where these operations or any of them are carried on in a factory or workshop in which any of the articles (a) to (g) above are made or re-made; but excluding the making of wire rope (unless made in the same factory or workshop as hemp or similar rope or core for wire rope), and excluding the making of net in connection with the lace curtain trade and the weaving of cloth.

PART VI.

Section I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are

earning higher rates of wages.
