### SPEN VALLEY LIGHT RAILWAYS (AMENDMENT) ORDER.

The Light Railway Commissioners have submitted to the Minister of Transport for confirmation, under the above-mentioned Acts, an Order made by them authorising an increase in certain rates, charges and fares specified in the Spen Valley Light Railway Order, 1901.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, the Minister of Labour is pleased, under and by virtue of the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, to establish a Trade Board for Dressmaking and the making of Women's

Light Clothing in Scotland, that is to say:—
Those branches of the Women's Clothing Trade that are engaged in the making of Non-Tailored Garments, namely, the making from textile or knitted fabrics of (a) non-tailored wearing apparel (other than handkerchiefs) worn by women or girls, or by children without distinction of sex, or (b) boys' ready-made washing suits or sailor suits, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of garments to be worn by women or girls, or by children without distinction of sex;

including-

1. All operations and processes of cutting, making or finishing by hand or machine of dresses, non-tailored skirts, wraps, blouses, blouse-robes, jumpers, sports-coats, neckwear, tea-gowns, dressing-gowns, dressingjackets, pyjamas, underclothing, underskirts, aprons, overalls, nurses' and servants' caps, juvenile clothing, baby-linen or similar non-tailored articles;

2. The making of field bonnets, sun bonnets, boudoir caps, or infants' millinery where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 1 above;

3. (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of any of the above-mentioned

articles

(b). The cleaning of any of the above-mentioned articles where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of

such articles;

- 4. All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making, altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of such articles other than hand embroidery or hand-drawn-thread work on articles made of linen or cotton or of mixed linen and
- 5. The following processes if done by machine, thread-drawing, thread-clipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling and par-
- 6. Laundering, smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, packing, warehousing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the making, altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of any of the above-men-· · ioned articles;

### but excluding-

A. The making of knitted articles; the making of underclothing, socks and stockings from knitted fabrics; and the making from knitted fabrics of articles mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of the knitted fabric;

B. The making of gloves, spats, gaiters,

boots, shoes and slippers;
C. The making of headgear other than the articles mentioned in paragraph 2 above

D. The branches of trade covered by the

Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919;

E. The making of rubberised or oilskin

garments;

F. The making of women's collars and cuffs and of nurses' stiff washing belts where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of men's or boys' shirts or collars;

G. Warehousing, packing and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on

the premises.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

(Purchase by Council of Lands, Seashore and Foreshore at Exmouth; Confirmation of Agreement with Lord Clinton; Purchase of Lands by Agreement; Maintenance of Lands, &c., as Pleasure Grounds; Appropriation and Use of Pleasure Grounds for Games and making of Charges for Use and Admission; Provision of Concert Halls, &c., and Charges for Admission; Provision of Entertainments, &c., and Letting of Buildings for same; General Powers of Management of Seashore and Foreshore and with regard to Erection of Booths, Tents, &c.; Prohibiting or Regulating Hawking, &c., on Seashore and Foreshore and Bye-laws with reference thereto; Penalties; Provision of Seats and Chairs; Prohibiting Removal of Sand; Appointment of Officers; Advertising District; Further Powers with regard to Drains; Borrowing Powers; Application of Revenue; Financial Provisions; Amendment and Incorporation of Acts.)

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session by the Urban District Council of the Urban District of Exmonth, in the county of Devon (hereinafter referred to as "the Council"), for an Act for all or some of the following purposes and objects (that is to say):—

To authorize the Council to purchase by agreement from the Right Honourable Baron Clinton certain lands and properties situate in the parish and urban district of Exmouth, including the lands known as the Maer, the Plantation, Madeira Walk, and other lands and premises adjacent or near thereto, parts of which are now let to the Golf Club, the Cricket Club, the Lawn Tennis Club and others, and the foreshore between high and low-water marks, and certain rights therein and below low-water mark, between Rodney Point on the east and the Pier on the west (hereinafter in this notice collectively referred to as "the lands "), and all rights or easements whatsoever in, over, under, affecting or connected with the same, and to confirm an agreement made or to be made between the said Baron Clinton and the Council for the sale of the lands to the Council.

To enable the Council to acquire by agreement or take on lease additional lands for any, of the purposes of the intended Act.

To enable any person under disability to convey his estate, right or interest in any lands to be acquired as aforesaid, and to grant easements, rights or privileges in and over the same:

To provide that the lands shall be maintained by the Council as pleasure grounds, and to apply to the same the provisions of the intended Act and of the Public Health Acts relating to pleasure grounds and to the borrowing of money for the purposes thereof.

To empower the Council, subject to any lease or tenancy, to hold, use and appropriate part or parts of the lands for games and recreation; to maintain, alter, regulate and manage golf courses, lawn tennis courts, croquet lawns, bowling greens and grounds for cricket, football, hockey, archery and other similar purposes, with all proper and convenient pavilions, works, buildings and conveniences, and to close the same to the public, and to make charges for the use of and for admission to the same, and to let the same to or permit the use thereof by any person on such terms as the Council think fit.

To authorize the Council to appoint and pay officers and servants for any of the purposes of the intended Act and to provide any apparatus necessary in connection with games, and to make charges for the use of the same.

To empower the Council to erect, maintain, furnish and equip concert halls, pavilions, winter gardens, bandstands, assembly, refreshment and reading rooms, baths and other buildings, and to charge for admission to and in respect of the use of the same.

To authorize the Council to provide and carry on or arrange for the provision and carrying on of entertainments, exhibitions and amusements, and to pay or contribute to the cost of advertising the same, to let buildings for any such purposes, and to provide and sell or authorize persons to provide and sell programmes of any concerts, entertainments, exhibitions or performances.

To make provision in regard to the management and use of the seashore, and in particular to enable the Council to erect, provide, equip and repair, and to let or permit persons to erect, use and carry on booths, tents, batthing huts, shops, stalls and stands for the sale of refreshments, etc., and for any purposes of recreation, to make charges for the use of the same and for admission to entertainments, exhibitions and amusements therein; to let for hire bathing tents, costumes and other apparatus for bathing purposes, and construct sheds and other conveniences for storing the same; to empower the Council to employ and pay boatmen to protect persons bathing, and to provide boats for the purpose.

To impose penalties on persons erecting, maintaining, using or carrying on unauthorized booths, tents, bathing huts, shops, stalls or other erection or obstruction in any pleasure grounds of the Council or on the seashore or foreshore.

To empower the Council to prescribe and define an area or areas for the sale or hawking or offering for sale of articles and commodities in any pleasure grounds and on the foreshore and seashore; to authorize the Council to demand charges from any person selling or hawking or offering for sale articles within any area so defined, and to prohibit any such selling, hawking or offering for sale elsewhere than within any area or areas so defined and except upon such terms and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed by the intended Act or by any bye-law made thereunder, and to authorize the Council to make bye-laws for securing the preservation of order and good conduct among persons frequenting any pleasure grounds and the foreshore and seashore or for any of the purposes aforesaid or of the intended Act.

To authorize the Council to provide seats and chairs for public use and to make charges for the use of same and also for the use of any portion of pleasure grounds set apart under Section 76 of the Public Health Acts (Amendment) Act, 1907.

To prohibit the removal of sand and other material from the foreshore and seashore.

To empower the Council to expend money in advertising the advantages and attractions of the district.

To enable the Council to order houses to be drained by a combined operation, and to amend or extend Section 19 of the Public Health Acts (Amendment) Act, 1890, and to extend the definition of the expressions "drain" and "sewer."

To authorize the Council to borrow money for and incident to the acquisition of the lands and for all or any of the purposes of the intended Act and for such purposes to charge the district fund and general district rate and the rates, revenues and other properties of the Council or any of such securities, and to execute and grant and issue mortgages and other securities and to authorize the Council to apply any of their funds or other moneys authorized to be raised to any of the purposes of the intended Act, and to exempt the powers of borrowing moneys under the intended Act from the restrictions contained in Section 234 of the Public Health Act, 1875.

To extend the powers of the Council with regard to borrowing under the Public Health Acts and to enable them to reborrow and to use any sinking fund instead of borrowing, and to repeal section 23 of the Exmouth Urban Dis-

trict Water Act, 1910.

To provide for the application of the revenue to be derived from the lands and pleasure grounds and to authorize the Council to make good any deficiency in such revenue out of the district fund and general district rate, and to make all-necessary provisions with regard to the recovery of penalties and the paying over of penalties recovered to the Treasurer of the Council.

To vary or extinguish all or any rights and privileges inconsistent with or which would or might in any way interfere with the objects of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.

To apply and incorporate with or without alterations and amendments all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts and the Public Health Acts and any Acts amending the same.
