**TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.
WHOLESALE MANTLE AND COSTUME
TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).
MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS FIXED) FOR
FEMALE WORKERS.**

Effective as from 19th April, 1920.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for that branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, which is covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 20th November, 1919, with respect to the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade Board in Great Britain, having given due notice on 12th January, 1920, of Proposal to Fix General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female Workers, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they have fixed General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female Workers, and have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as fixed are as set out below.

And the Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 17th April, 1920, under Section 4-(2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying 19th April, 1920,* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

* NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer, who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates

shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 25th April, 1920.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Workers.

SECTION I.—Female Workers (other than Learners as specified in Section II. of Part I. of this Schedule), namely:—

(a) Workers other than those specified in Sub-section (b) of this Section:—

- (i) Workers other than Homeworkers, 8½d. per hour.
- (ii) Homeworkers, 8½d. per hour.

SECTION II.—Female Learners as defined in Section II. of Part IV. of this Schedule.

(a) Learners other than those specified in Sub-section (b) of this Section:—

(b) Workers employed as Cutters, Trimmers, and Fitters-up as defined in Section I. of Part IV. of this Schedule:—

Workers under 19 years of age, 8½d. per hour.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 9d. per hour.

Workers of 20 years of age and over, 9½d. per hour.

Provided that in the event of any female worker being employed for the first time as a Cutter, Trimmer, or Fitter-up at or over the age of 19 years, the rate to be paid during the first two months of her employment shall be at 1d. per hour less than the general minimum time-rate appropriate to her age, as set out in Sub-section (b) above.

Provided that learners commencing at 16 and under 18 years of age shall, on attaining the age of 18 years, be entitled, during the remainder of their learnership period, to receive 6s. 8d. per week of 48 hours in addition to the general minimum time-rates applicable, as set out in this column.

(i) The general minimum time-rates for learners under 14 years shall be 2½d. per hour. Such learners shall from the age of 14 be entitled to the amounts shown in Column I above, all employment prior to that age being disregarded.

(ii) The advances to be given to learners commencing under 21 years of age shall become due as from the first Monday in January and July of each year, the learner being entitled to her first advance on the first Monday in January or July, as the case may be, provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.

(iii) A learner shall cease to be a learner and be entitled to the full general minimum time-rate applicable to her under Section I of Part I of this Schedule upon the fulfilment of the following conditions:—

Age of Entering upon Employment and Conditions.

Under 15 years of age: The completion of not less than 3 years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years.

15 and under 16 years of age: The completion of not less than 2 years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years.

16 and under 21 years of age: The completion of 2 years' employment.

21 years of age and over: The completion of 1 year's employment.

(iv) No female learner shall be held to be entitled to the full general minimum time-rate under Section I of Part I of this Schedule until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had. Provided that in determining the age of entry and the length of employment, all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

(b) Learners who are occupied wholly or mainly in:—

(a) Fitting up;

(b) Hooking up material composed solely of cotton or linen to be used in making overalls and other similar washable garments:

When employed under 16 years of age, 15s. per week of 48 hours or 3½d. per hour.

When employed at 16 years and under 17 years, 18s. per week of 48 hours or 4½d. per hour.

When employed at 17 years and under 18 years, 22s. per week of 48 hours or 5½d. per hour.

The weekly rates for learners as set out in this Section are based on a week of 48 hours, and they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours spent under contract of employment by a learner in the factory or workshop in any week is less than 48.

PART II.

Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Female Workers.

All Female Workers (other than Cutters, Trimmers and Fitters-up, and other than Learners occupied in Fitting-up and Hooking-up as specified in Section II. (b) of Part I. of this Schedule):—

- (a) Workers (other than Homeworkers),
9½d. per hour.
(b) Homeworkers, 9½d. per hour.

In cases where a worker is employed on piece-work each piece-rate must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 9½d. per hour to an Ordinary worker. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies the foregoing conditions, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers other than Learners.

PART III.

Overtime Rates for Female Workers (All Ages).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:

- In any week, 48.
On any day (other than Saturday), 9.
On Saturday, 5.

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of such normal number of hours shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(A) For Female Workers on Time-Work.

(1) For the first two hours' Overtime on any day, except Saturdays, Sundays, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-quarter, that is to say, one-and-a-quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(2) For Overtime after the first two hours' Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-half, that is to say, one-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Double time, that is to say, twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-a-quarter except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Section. The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or, in the case of Saturday, exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(B) For Female Workers on Piece-Work.

(i) Female Workers (other than

Learners) employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable, a sum equivalent to the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, one-half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, or one-quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double time, Time-and-a-half, or Time-and-a-quarter respectively.

Female Learners Employed on Piece-Work.

(ii) Female Learners employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable, a sum equivalent to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, one-half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or one-quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-work were Double-time, Time-and-a-half, or Time-and-a-quarter respectively.

SECTION III.—Notwithstanding anything contained in Sections I and II of this Part of this Notice:—

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9½.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

(c) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply to workers in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

Provided that—

Where the employer requires attendance on any day on which it is not the established practice of the employer to require attendance, all time worked on such day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) shall be paid for at Time-and-a-quarter for the first two hours, Time-and-a-half for the second two hours, and Double time thereafter:

NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers and young persons are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.

PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

SECTION I.—Cutters, Trimmers and Fitters-up shall be deemed to be workers who are substantially occupied in one or more of the following processes, that is to say:—

(a) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings, or other materials.

(b) Laying-up, hooking-up or folding cloth or linings, or other materials.

(c) Cutting cloth or linings or other materials.

(d) Trimming, that is, the process as ordinarily carried on of cutting and assembling together the linings and fittings of garments.

(e) Dividing, that is, the process as ordinarily carried on by Cutters or their Assistants, of dividing, parting or separating the parts of garments after being cut, and of assembling them into suitable bundles for making up.

(f) Fitting-up, that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, basting, or machining, which consists of preparing and fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being basted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing and fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances; sewing, basting or machining forming no part or process of fitting-up.

SECTION II.—A female learner is a worker who:—

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(b) Has received a certificate, or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner on her first employment, in the branch or branches of the trade described in Part V of this Schedule, without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION III.—The expression "Home-worker" shall be held to mean a worker who works in her own home, or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

The respective minimum rates of wages set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all female workers in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 20th November, 1919, that is to say, women's, girls', and children's ready-made and wholesale bespoke tailoring, and all women's girls', and children's retail bespoke tailoring carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments, and any other branch of women's, girls', and children's tailoring which is not included within the scope of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board, including:—(1) All operations and processes of cutting, making, or finishing by hand or machine of coats, costumes, tailored skirts, coat-frocks, mantles, service clothing, or similar garments made by tailoring processes; (2) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of any of the above-mentioned tailored garments, except where included within the scope of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board; (b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of the garments; (3) The lining with fur of any of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments; (4) (a) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making, altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of any of the above-mentioned tailored garments other than hand-embroidery or hand-drawn thread work on garments made of linen or cotton or of mixed linen and cotton; (b) The following processes if done by machine, namely, thread-drawing, thread-clipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling and paring; (5) Warehousing, packing, and all other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned branches of tailoring; but excluding:—(1) Those branches of women's or girls' bespoke tailoring and all operations or processes covered by the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919; (2) The making of head-gear; (3) The making of rubberised or oilskin garments; (4) Warehousing, packing, and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the premises.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above minimum rates of wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above minimum rates of wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

For the classes of Male and Female Workers specified in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule, Overtime Rates calculated on the Minimum Rates set out in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule, in the manner set out in the Schedule of the Notice issued by the Trade Board, and dated 1st April, 1920, shall apply in substitution for the Minimum Rates set out in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule.

II. For the classes of Male Workers employed on Piece-Work in Hand Hackling:

(a) For the first two hours' Overtime on any day except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be a rate which is equivalent to the General Minimum Piece-

Rate with the addition of one-quarter of the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to Hand Hacklers, as set out in Section I. of Part I. of the Schedule of this Notice.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all overtime on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be a rate which is equivalent to the General Minimum Piece-Rate, with the addition of one-half of the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to Hand Hacklers, as set out in Section I. of Part I. of the Schedule of this Notice.

(c) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be a rate which is equivalent to the General Minimum Piece-Rate, with the addition of the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to Hand Hacklers, as set out in Section I. of Part I. of the Schedule of this Notice.

(d) All hours worked in any week in excess of 48 shall be paid for as Overtime, irrespective of the number of hours worked on any particular day; and the Overtime Rate shall also be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or Customary Public or Statutory Holiday), the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

PART V.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain, as specified in Parts I., II. and III. of this Schedule, who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine, and Net) Order, 1919; that is to say, the making or re-making of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles; the bleaching, teasing, hackling, carding, preparing and spinning of the materials required for the making or re-making of any of the articles (a) to (g) above, when carried on in the same factory or work-

shop as such making or re-making; the manufacture of packings, gaskins, and spun yarns, when carried on in the same factory or workshop as the making or re-making of any of the articles (a) to (g) above; the braiding or splicing of articles made from rope, cord, twine or net; the mending of nets and the winding, twisting, doubling, laying, polishing, dressing, tarring, tanning, dyeing, balling, reeling, finishing, packing, despatching, warehousing and storing of any of the above articles, where these operations or any of them are carried on in a factory or workshop in which any of the articles (a) to (g) above are made or re-made; but excluding the making of wire rope (unless made in the same factory or workshop as hemp or similar rope or core for wire rope), and excluding the making of net in connection with the lace curtain trade and the weaving of cloth.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of

contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to Workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from 22nd April, 1920. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, The Rope, Twine and Net Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should

state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for that branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919; which is covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, and dated 12th December, 1919, with respect to the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade in Great Britain, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the minimum rates of wages for Female workers at present effective and set out in the Notice, dated 27th November, 1919, issued by the Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain) established under Regulations made by the Board of Trade, and dated 10th January, 1914, in their application to Female workers in any branch of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade in Great Britain specified in Part IV. of the Schedule hereof, and to FIX minimum rates of wages for Female workers in those branches of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade in Great Britain specified in Part IV. of the Schedule hereof, to which the minimum rates of wages set out in the above-mentioned Notice, dated 27th November, 1919, do not apply, and ALSO TO FIX Overtime Rates for Female workers in any branch of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade in Great Britain specified in Part IV. of the Schedule hereof, the Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages being as set out in the Schedule hereto.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the Notice of Proposal to Vary being given.

Provided that the General Minimum Time-Rate for Learners under 14 years of age shall be 9s. per week of 48 hours, or 2½d. per hour, and from the age of 14 years they shall be entitled to the General Minimum Time-Rates shown in Column I. above, as if they had commenced at 14.

(i.) The weekly rates set out above are based on a week of 48 hours, and are subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours actually spent by the learner in the factory or workshop in any week is less than 48.

- (ii.) The advances to be given to Learners commencing at under 21 years of age shall become due as from the first Monday in January and July of each year, the Learner being entitled to her first advance from the first Monday in January or July, as the case may be, provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.
- (iii.) A Female Learner shall cease to be a Learner and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to her under this Part of this Schedule upon the fulfilment of the conditions appropriate to her as set out below—

AGE OF ENTERING UPON EMPLOYMENT AND CONDITIONS.

Under 15 years of age	The completion of not less than 3 years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years.
15 and under 16 years of age	The completion of not less than 2 years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years.
16 and under 21 years of age	The completion of 2 years' employment.
21 years of age and over	The completion of 1 year's employment.

(iv.) No Female Learner shall be held to be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate under this Part of this Schedule until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had. Provided that in determining the age of entry and the length of employment, all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

(v.) Any Female Learner who has been previously employed in any branch of the Clothing trade shall, subject to the provisions of Sub-section IV. of this Section-count the whole period of such previous employment for the purpose of ascertaining the General Minimum Time-Rate at which she is to be paid.

SECTION IV.—In cases where a worker is employed on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable as set out in this Part of this Schedule. Provided that in determining as to whether any Piece-Rate satisfies this condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers other than Learners.

PART II.

Proposed Overtime Rates for Female Workers.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby give notice that they propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

- In any week, 48.
- On any day (other than Saturday), 9.
- On Saturday, 5.

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Trade Board give similar Notice that they propose to fix Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Female worker in excess of such normal number of hours, as follows, that is to say—

A.—For Female Workers (including Learners), as specified in Part I. of this Schedule, employed on Time-work:—

(1) For the first two hours' Overtime on any day, except Saturdays, Sundays, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-quarter, that is to say, one-and-a-quarter times the General Minimum Time-rate otherwise applicable.

(2) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-half, that is to say, one-and-a-half times the

General Minimum Time-rate otherwise applicable.

(3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Double Time, that is to say, twice the General Minimum Time-rate otherwise applicable.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-a-quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section. The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday, exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48. Provided that—

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9½.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

In the application of these provisos, where the employer requires attendance on

any day on which it is not the established practice of the employer to require attendance, all time worked on any such day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) shall be paid for at time-and-a-quarter for the first two hours and time-and-a-half thereafter.

B.—For Female Workers (including Learners) as specified in Part I. of this Schedule, employed on Piece-work:—

Workers employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked in addition to Piece-rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-rate applicable as set out in Part I. of this Schedule, a sum equivalent to the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-rate, one-half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-rate, or one-quarter of the appropriate

Piece-work Basis Time-rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph A of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were double-time, time-and-a-half, or time-and-a-quarter respectively.

SECTION III.—Where a worker is of the Jewish Religion, and, subject to the provisions of Section 48 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, is employed on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply to such worker in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday," and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

NOTE.—The hours which females and young persons are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.

PART III.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definition shall apply:—

A Female Learner is a worker who—

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning, and

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other

conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

PART IV.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, and of this Notice to all Female Workers who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade in Great Britain as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 12th December, 1919—that is to say—

Those branches of men's, women's, boys' and girls' bespoke tailoring in which the tailor supplies the garment direct to the individual wearer and employs the worker direct.

A worker shall be deemed to be employed by the tailor direct, if employed by another worker in the employ of the tailor, to whom a minimum rate of wages fixed under the Trade Boards Acts is applicable, or if employed by a sub-contractor engaged in cutting, making or finishing garments exclusively for the tailor in the tailor's shop or in a building of which the shop forms part or to which the shop is attached;

Including—

(1) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of men's, women's, boys' or

girls' tailored garments where carried out for the individual wearer by a tailor who employs the worker direct as defined above.

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the repairing, renovating or re-making of the garments;

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments;

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

(4) The packing and all other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

But excluding—

(1) All or any of the above-mentioned operations where carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments;

(2) The making of head-gear.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National

Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect

of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above proposals to vary and fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 21st April, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or

her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, The Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS FIXED) FOR
MALE WORKERS, EFFECTIVE AS FROM 19TH
APRIL, 1920.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for that branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, which is covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 20th November, 1919, with respect to the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade Board in Great Britain, having given due notice on 12th January, 1920, of Proposal to Fix General Minimum Time-rates, Piece-work Basis Time-rates, and Overtime Rates for Male Workers, hereby give Notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they have Fixed General Minimum Time-rates, Piece-work Basis Time-rates, and Overtime Rates for Male Workers, and have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as Fixed are as set out below.

And the Trade Board further give Notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 17th April, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as Fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying 19th April, 1920,* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

* *Note.*—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 25th April, 1920.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

*General Minimum Time-Rates for Male
Workers.*

SECTION I.—*Male Workers other than
Learners:*—

(a) For Cutters, Knifemen, Tailors, Fitters-up, Passers, Pressers, and Machinists, as defined in Section I. of Part IV. of this Schedule, 1s. 5d. per hour.

(b) For Under-Pressers and Plain Machinists, as defined in Section I. of Part IV. of this Schedule, 1s. 3d. per hour.

(c) For all other Workers:

(1) Workers other than Homeworkers,
1s. 2d. per hour.

(2) Homeworkers, 1s. 2d. per hour.

SECTION II.—*Male Learners (as defined in
Section II. of Part IV. of this Schedule):*—

When employed under 15 years of age, 12s. per week of 48 hours, or 3d. per hour.

When employed at 15 and under 16 years of age, 14s. per week of 48 hours, or 3½d. per hour.

When employed at 16 and under 17 years of age, 16s. per week of 48 hours, or 4d. per hour.

When employed at 17 and under 18 years of age, 20s. per week of 48 hours, or 5d. per hour.

When employed at 18 and under 19 years of age, 29s. per week of 48 hours, or 7½d. per hour.

When employed at 19 and under 20 years of age, 33s. per week of 48 hours, or 8½d. per hour.

When employed at 20 and under 21 years of age, 38s. per week of 48 hours, or 9½d. per hour.

When employed at 21 and under 22 years of age, 43s. per week of 48 hours, or 10½d. per hour.

(a) The weekly rates for Learners, as set out above, are based on a week of 48 hours, and they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours spent under contract of employment by a Learner in the factory or workshop in any week is less than 48.

(b) Learners commencing employment in the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade at and over the age of 19 may serve a period of six months at 30s. per week of 48 hours, or 7½d. per hour; and thereafter, a period of six months, at 35s. per week of 48 hours, or 8½d. per hour. Provided that these General Minimum Time-rates shall be increased by 6s. per week of 48 hours, or 1½d. per hour, in the case of any such worker who is 22 years of age or over. Learners to whom this sub-section applies shall, on the expiration of one year's service in the trade, receive such General Minimum Time-rates as their age may entitle them to under the foregoing provisions.

PART II.

*Piecework Basis Time-rates for Male
Workers.*

(a) Cutters, Knifemen, Tailors, Fitters-up, Passers, Pressers, and Machinists, as defined in Section I of Part IV of this Schedule, 1s. 6½d. per hour.

(b) Under-Pressers and Plain Machinists, as defined in Section I of Part IV of this Schedule, 1s. 4½d. per hour.

(c) All other Workers, 1s. 3½d. per hour.

In cases where a worker is employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker an amount not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-rate applicable. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies the above condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers other than Learners.

PART III.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE WORKERS.

SECTION I

(All Ages.)

In accordance with Section 3 (1), (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On any day (other than Saturday)...	9
On Saturday	5

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker, in excess of such normal number of hours shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(A) For Male Workers on Time-work.

(1) For the first two hours' Overtime on any day, except Saturdays, Sundays, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-quarter, that is to say, one-and-a-quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(2) For Overtime after the first two hours' Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-half, that is to say, one-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Double Time, that is to say, twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-a-quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section. The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or, in the case of Saturday, exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(B) For Male Workers on Piece-work.

(i) Male Workers (other than Learners) employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked in addition to piece-rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of

the case, to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, a sum equivalent to the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, one-half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, or one quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double-Time, Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-quarter respectively.

Male Learners employed on Piece-work.

(ii) Male Learners employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked in addition to piece-rates each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, a sum equivalent to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, one-half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate or one-quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Paragraph (A) of this Section if the Worker had been employed on Time-work were Double-time, Time-and-a-half or Time-and-a-quarter respectively.

SECTION III.

Notwithstanding anything contained in Sections I and II of this Part of this Notice:—

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9½.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

(c) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply to workers in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday," and the work "Sunday" for "Saturday."

Provided that:—

Where the employer requires attendance on any day on which it is not the established practice of the employer to require attendance, all time worked on such day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) shall be paid for at Time-and-a-quarter for the first two hours, Time-and-a-half for the second two hours and Double-time thereafter.

NOTE.—The hours which young persons are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.

PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

SECTION I.—A Cutter is any person:—

(a) who is employed in:

(i) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings or other materials.

(ii) Laying-up, hooking-up, or folding cloth or linings, or other materials.

(iii) Cutting cloth or linings, or other materials.

(iv) Dividing—that is the process ordinarily carried on by cutters or their assistants, of dividing, parting, or separating the parts of garments after being cut, and of assembling them into suitable bundles for making-up; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a cutter or knifeman, as defined in this Section.

A. Knifeman is any person:—

(a) who is employed on hand electric or hand-knife operations; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a knifeman or cutter, as defined in this Section.

A. Tailor is any person:—

(a) who is employed in sewing by hand in the process of making a garment or portion of a garment; and

(b) has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a tailor, as so defined.

A. Fitter-up is any person:—

(a) who is employed in fitting-up—that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, basting or machining, which consists of preparing or fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being basted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing or fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances; sewing, basting or machining forming no part or process of fitting-up; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a fitter-up or tailor, as defined in this Section.

A. Passer is any person:—

(a) who is employed in examining garments in the process of being made up or upon completion; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a passer or tailor, as defined in this Section.

A. Presser is any person:—

(a) who is employed in pressing off by hand or by machine; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a presser or under-presser, as defined in this Section.

A. Machinist is any person:—

(a) who is employed in machining other than as a plain machinist, as hereinafter defined; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a machinist or plain machinist, as defined in this Section.

A. Plain Machinist is any person:—

(a) who is employed in the process of making up plain sleeves, facings, linings, inside pockets, quilting, and padding; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a plain machinist or a machinist.

An Under-presser is any person:—

(a) who is employed in pressing processes other than pressing off; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as an under-presser or presser.

SECTION II.—A Male Learner is a worker who:—

(a) is employed during the whole or a substantial part of his time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(b) has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a male learner on his first employment in the branch or branches of the trade, as described in Part V. of this Schedule, without a certificate or registration, for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at his employment, the probation period shall be included in his period of learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions of this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if he works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of his parent or guardian.

SECTION III.—The expression "Home-worker" shall be held to mean a worker who works in his own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART V.

The respective minimum rates of wages set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all male workers in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour dated 20th November, 1919, that is to say, women's, girls' and children's ready-made and wholesale bespoke tailoring, and all women's, girls' and children's retail bespoke tailoring carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments; and any other branch of women's, girls' and children's tailoring, which is not included within the scope of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board, including:—(1) All operations and processes of cutting, making or finishing by hand or machine of coats, costumes, tailored skirts, coat-frocks, mantles, service clothing or similar garments made by tailoring processes; (2) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-mentioned tailored garments, except where included within the scope of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board; (b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of the garments; (3) The lining with fur of any of the above-mentioned garments, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments; (4) (a) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried on in asso-

ciation with or in conjunction with the making, altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-mentioned tailored garments other than hand-embroidery or hand-drawn thread work on garments made of linen or cotton, or of mixed linen and cotton; (b) The following processes, if done by machine—namely, thread-drawing, thread-clipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling and paring; (5) Warehousing, packing and all other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned branches of tailoring; but excluding—(1) Those branches of women's or girls' bespoke tailoring and all operations or processes covered by the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919; (2) The making of head-gear; (3) The making of rubberised or oilskin garments; (4) Warehousing, packing and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the premises.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above minimum rates of wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above minimum rates of wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

VARIATION OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES IN THEIR APPLICATION TO MALE AND FEMALE LEARNERS TO HAND OR MOULD CIGAR MAKING.

In accordance with regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Tobacco trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Tobacco) Order, 1919 (that is to say, the manufacture of Tobacco, Cigars, Cigarettes, Cigarette Tubes and Snuff, including all preparatory processes, and including also the operations of storing and store-keeping, boxing, packeting, labelling, parcelling and despatching and all other warehousing and packing operations incidental to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles), having given due notice on the 6th December, 1919, of Proposal to Vary the Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Workers then in operation in their application to Male and Female Learners to Hand or Mould Cigar Making hereby give notice that they have varied the Minimum Rates of Wages fixed and set out in the Schedule of their Notice dated 5th August, 1919, in their application to Male and Female Learners to Hand or Mould Cigar

Making, the variation being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

And the Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 16th April, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the variation and specifying 19th April, 1920, as the date from which such variation shall become effective.

SCHEDULE.

SECTION I.

Learners to Hand or Mould Cigar Making as defined in Section II of the Schedule of this Notice shall be excluded, for the first 12 months of their learnership, from the operation of the Minimum Rates of Wages at present fixed for Male and Female Workers and set out in the Schedule to the Notice dated 5th August, 1919.

Thereafter a learner shall be entitled to the General Minimum Time Rate and Overtime Rate applicable to a worker of his or her age or to piece-rates of wages, each of which will yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker at least the same amount of money as the General Minimum Time Rate or Overtime Rate applicable to a worker of his or her age.

SECTION II.

For the purpose of this Notice, a learner is a male or female worker who:—

(a) Is employed under a verbal or written agreement (not being an Indenture of Apprenticeship), providing for his or her effective instruction in the making of hand or mould cigars for a period of 4 years, such period to include a probationary period of six months, on the completion of which the learnership may be determined at the instance either of the employer or learner; and

(b) Has been registered, in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board; or has made application for such registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under that Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Hollow-ware Trade as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 6th July, 1914, hereby give Notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such notice being given, that they Propose to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for

Male Workers at present in operation and set out in their Notice dated 10th April, 1920, as set out in the Schedule below.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates, Male Workers.

PROPOSED VARIATION.

1. For Male Learners of under 14 years of age, from 3½d. per hour to 15s. per week of 47 hours.

2. For Male Learners of 14 and under 15 years of age, from 3¾d. per hour to 16s. per week of 47 hours.

3. For Male Learners of 15 and under 16 years of age, from 4¼d. per hour to 20s. per week of 47 hours.

4. For Male Learners of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 6d. per hour to 26s. per week of 47 hours.

5. For Male Learners of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 7d. per hour to 30s. per week of 47 hours.*

6. For Male Learners of 18 and under 19 years of age, from 9d. per hour to 37s. 9d. per week of 47 hours.*

7. For Male Learners of 19 and under 20 years of age, from 10d. per hour to 41s. 9d. per week of 47 hours.*

8. For Male Learners of 20 and under 21 years of age, from 11d. per hour, to 45s. 9d. per week of 47 hours.*

* Provided that a Male Learner entering the trade between 17 and 21 years of age may serve a period of one year at a General Minimum Time-Rate which during the first six months is 5s. per week of 47 hours and during the second six months is 2s. 6d. per week of 47 hours less than the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable as set out above.

9. For Male Workers other than Learners, from 1s. 1½d. per hour to 58s. 6d. per week of 47 hours.

The weekly rates as proposed and set out in this Part of this Schedule are based on a week of 47 hours, and are subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours spent by the worker in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less than 47.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Male Workers.

Overtime Rates calculated on the Minimum Rates proposed above in the manner set out in the Schedule of the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 10th April, 1920, shall apply in substitution for the above Minimum Rates in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours therein declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III.

For the purpose of this Notice a "Learner" shall be deemed to be a person who is employed under conditions which, in the circumstances of the case, afford a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate for workers other than learners. Provided that no male person shall be deemed to be a learner who is over 21 years of age.

PART IV.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Workers in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in those branches of the hollow-ware trade which are engaged in the making of hollow-ware from sheet iron or sheet steel, including the processes of galvanising, tinning, enamelling, painting, japanning, lacquering, and varnishing.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 19th April, 1920. SUGAR CONFECTIONERY AND FOOD PRESERVING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES, PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under that Act, and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the branches of the trade covered by the Trade Board's (Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving) Order, 1913, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918 (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such Notice being given) that they propose to vary the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice, dated 20th February, 1920, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 18th February, 1920, the Variations proposed being as shown in the Schedule set out below:—

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates.

SECTION I.—(a) All Male Workers; and (b) certain classes of Female Workers, namely, Female Workers who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the following occupations:—

Cocoa Making.

Boiling Sugar for Boiled Sweets other than the Boiling of Sugar in Vacuum Pans.

Brogueing of Hermetically-Sealed Receptacles containing Meat, Poultry, Fish or Soup, during the Process of Cooking.

Hand-Soldering of Hermetically-Sealed Receptacles containing Meat, Poultry, Fish or Soup.

Tongue Pumping.

Butchers' or Pork Butchers' Work in Preparing Meat for Sausages or "Smalls."

Brining Vegetables for Pickling.

Making Extract of Meat.

Proposed Variation.

Workers under 15 years of age, from 3d. to 3½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 13s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, from 4d. to 4½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 17s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 5½d. to 5½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 22s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 6½d. to 6½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 27s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, from 7½d. to 8½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 34s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, from 8d. to 9½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 38s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, from 9½d. to 10½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 42s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 21 and under 22 years of age, from 10½d. to 11½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 46s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 22 and under 23 years of age, from 11½d. to 1s. 0½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 50s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 23 and under 24 years of age, from 1s. 0½d. to 1s. 1½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 54s. per week of 48 hours.

For Workers of 24 years of age and upwards, and those to whose employment the General Minimum Time-Rate of 54s. per week is applicable under Section I. of Part I. of the Schedule of the Notice issued by the Trade Board, and dated 20th February, 1920, from 1s. 1½d. per hour to 1s. 2½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 58s. per week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.—Female Workers other than those specified in Section I. (b) of this part of this Schedule:—

Proposed Variation.

Workers under 15 years of age, from 3d. to 3½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 13s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, from 4d. to 4½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 17s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 5½d. to 5½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 22s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 6½d. to 6½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 27s. per week of 48 hours.

For workers of 18 years of age and upwards, and others to whose employment the general minimum time-rate of 30s. per week of 48 hours is applicable under the terms of paragraph (a) of section II. of part I. of the Schedule of the notice issued by the Trade Board, dated 20th February, 1920, from 7½d. to 8½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 34s. per week of 48 hours.

The Trade Board propose to cancel the following provision set out in paragraph (b) of

section II. of part I. of the Schedule of their notice, dated 20th February, 1920:—

In the case of workers of the age of 18 years and upwards who have been employed in the trade for an aggregate period of less than six months and cannot suitably be engaged on piece-work, such workers shall, until the expiry of such six months' period of employment in the trade, be paid at a rate of not less than 28s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 7d. per hour, in lieu of the above general minimum time-rate of 30s. per week of 48 hours, provided that the Trade Board shall have issued a certificate, on the ground that they are satisfied that the employment is not merely temporary or seasonal, authorising such lower rate to be paid, or have received an application for such certificate, which is still under consideration.

And to provide as follows:—

A Female Worker (other than a female worker specified in section I. (b) of this part of this Schedule) who enters the trade for the first time at the age of 15 years or over, and who cannot suitably be engaged on piece-work, shall be paid for the first three months' employment in the trade at a minimum rate 3s. per week less than the general minimum time-rates which would otherwise be applicable, according to her age, and for the second three months' employment in the trade at a minimum rate, 1s. 6d. per week less than the general minimum time-rate which would otherwise be applicable according to her age.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Piece-work Basis Time-Rates.

Proposed Variation Per Hour.

SECTION I.—(a) All Male Workers; and (b) those classes of Female Workers specified in section I. (b) of part I. of this Schedule, from 1s. 4d. to 1s. 5d.

In the case of workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as will yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. 5d. per hour to an Ordinary worker. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers of 24 years and upwards.

Proposed Variation Per Hour.

SECTION II.—All Female Workers (other than those specified in section I. (b) of part I. of this Schedule), from 9d. to 10d.

In the case of workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as will yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 10d. per hour to an Ordinary worker. Provided that, in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers of 18 years of age and upwards.

PART III.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates.

In lieu of the overtime rates at present fixed and set out in the Notice issued by the Trade Board, and dated 20th February, 1920, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 18th February 1920, the minimum rates for overtime in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in their notice

above referred to, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be as follows, that is to say:—

A.—For Male and for all Female Workers on time-work:—

Male and Female Workers employed on time-work shall be entitled to receive overtime rates, calculated on the proposed general minimum time rates, set out in Part I. of the Schedule of this notice, in the manner set out in Part III. of the Schedule of the notice issued by the Trade Board, and dated 20th February, 1920, in substitution for the minimum rate which would otherwise be applicable.

B.—For Male and Female Workers employed on piece-work:—

I.—(a) For Male Workers of 24 years of age and over; and

(b) Those classes of Female Workers of 24 years of age and over, specified in section I. (b) of Part I. of the Schedule of this notice; and

(c) All other Female Workers of 18 years of age and over who are employed on piece-work, shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of overtime worked, in addition to piece-rates each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker not less than the piece-work basis time-rate applicable, the appropriate piece-work basis time-rate, one-half of the appropriate piece-work basis time-rate or one-quarter of the appropriate piece-work basis time-rate, according as the overtime rate which is at present in operation under the provisions of Part III. of the Schedule of the Board's notice, dated 20th February, 1920, is double time, time-and-a-half, or time-and-a-quarter respectively.

II.—(a) Male Workers under 24 years of age; and

(b) Those classes of Female Workers under 24 years of age specified in section I. (b) of Part I. of the Schedule of this notice; and

(c) All other Female Workers under 18 years of age who are employed on piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of overtime worked, in addition to piece-rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker not less than the piece-work basis time-rate applicable, a sum equivalent to the appropriate general minimum time-rate, one-half of the appropriate general minimum time-rate, or one-quarter of the appropriate general minimum time-rate, according as the overtime rate which is at present in operation under the provisions of Part III. of the Schedule of the Board's notice, dated 20th February, 1920, is double time, time-and-a-half, or time-and-a-quarter respectively.

PART IV.

Section I.—The above proposed minimum rates of wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all

workers who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade of making Sugar Confectionery, Cocoa, Chocolate, Jam, Marmalade, Preserved Fruits, Fruit and Table Jellies, Meat Extracts, Meat Essences, Sauces and Pickles; the preparation of Meat, Poultry, Game, Fish, Vegetables, and Fruit for sale in a preserved state in tins, pots, bottles, and similar receptacles; the process of wrapping, filling, packing, and labelling in respect of articles so made or prepared; excluding the covering and filling of biscuits, wafers and cakes with chocolate or sugar confectionery. Provided that notwithstanding anything contained in this Section, the above minimum rates shall not apply to Clerks, Salesmen, Saleswomen, Travellers, Engineers, Carpenters, Vanmen, Watchmen, Outside Messengers, Cleaners of Premises, Timekeepers, or to any other workers whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of the foregoing excluded classes.

SECTION II.—The above proposed minimum rates of wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorized by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION III.—The above proposed minimum rates of wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary, which may be lodged with them within two months from 22nd April, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, The Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.


