AERIAL LIGHTHOUSE AT ST. INGLEVERT.

It is hereby notified that:—

An Aerial Lighthouse has been installed at
the aerodrome at St. Inglevert (approx. E.
by N. 7 miles from Cape Grisnez), and will be
in operation every evening from sunset to two
hours after sunset. Its characteristic signal is
the letter "A" of the Morse code; every
8 seconds, thus:— Light, $\frac{1}{2}$ second; eclipse,
