

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134; of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49; and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 25th day of March, 1920, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134; of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49; and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Germain, Edgbaston, situate in the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Birmingham:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Germain, Edgbaston, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Russell, Bishop of Birmingham, (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint

Germain, Edgbaston, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Germain, Edgbaston':

"And with the like consent of the said Henry Russell, Bishop of Birmingham, (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Germain, Edgbaston, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being:

"Provided always that so long as the Reverend Francis Rosslyn Courtenay Bruce, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all such fees or dues shall be paid over by the Minister of the said Church of Saint Germain, Edgbaston, to the said Francis Rosslyn Courtenay Bruce.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Germain, Edgbaston, being:—

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Birmingham, which is bounded upon the north-east by the New Parish of Christ Church, Summerfield, Birmingham, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north by the New Parish of Saint Chad, Smethwick, in the County of Stafford and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, upon the north-west and upon the south-west by the New Parish of St. Mary, Smethwick, in the said County of Stafford and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of Hagley Road at or near its junction with Warley Road and Barnsley Road, where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Smethwick, and the New Parish of Saint John, Harborne Heath, in the said County of Warwick and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, all meet, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Hagley Road for a distance of 42 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the Bridge which carries such road across the Harborne Branch Line of the London and North-Western Railway, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said branch line of railway for a distance of 43 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Summerfield, Birmingham."
