DEFENCE OF THE REALM.

THE HAY (RETURNS) ORDER, 1919, REVOCATION ORDER, 1920, DATED 4TH MAY, 1920.

The Board of Trade in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Regulations 2G and 2JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and of all other powers them hereunto enabling hereby order as follows:—

1. The Hay (Returns) Order, 1919, made by the Board of Trade on 16th October, 1919 (Statutory Rules and Orders, 1919, No. 1478), shall be revoked as from the 5th day of April, 1920.

2. This Order may be cited as the Hay (Returns) Order, 1919, Revocation Order, 1920.

SHIRTMAKING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS, AND TO FIX PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES FOR FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under that Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Shirtmaking Trade in Great Britain, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 26th December, 1913, **HEREBY GIVE NOTICE**, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they **PROPOSE TO VARY** the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female and Male Workers at present fixed and set out in the Schedule of their Notices dated 22nd November 1919, and 27th February, 1920, and **TO FIX** Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Female and Male Workers, the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the Notice of Proposal to Vary being given.
