THE COAL (REVOCATION OF RESTRICTIONS)
ORDER AND DIRECTION, 1920, DATED THE
10th DAY OF MAY, 1920, MADE AND GIVEN BY
THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATIONS
2F, 2G, 2J, 2JJ AND 9G OF THE DEFENCE OF
THE REALM REGULATIONS.

The Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers vested in them by and under the Defence of the Realm Regulations as respects coal, hereby order and direct as follows:—

1. On and after the 12th day of May, 1920, the following Orders, Directions and Prescriptions shall cease to have effect, that is to say:—

(1) The Coal (Pit's Mouth) Prices Order and Direction, 1919, dated the 28th November, 1919, and all other Coal (Pit's Mouth) Prices Orders of earlier date made by the Board of Trade,

(2) The Wholesale Coal Prices Order, 1919, dated the 28th November, 1919, made

by the Board of Trade, and

(3) The Prescriptions dated respectively the 30th and 31st December, 1919, and made by the Controller of Coal Mines under the Coal (Pit's Mouth) Prices Order and Direction, 1919, aforesaid,

Provided that nothing in this Order and Direction shall affect any matter or thing done or suffered, proceeding taken or penalty or obligation incurred under such Orders, Directions, or Prescriptions, or any of them, before the date when they cease to have effect.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect the provisions of the Wholesale Coal Prices Order,

1917.

3. This Order may be cited as the Coal (Revocation of Restrictions) Order and Direction, 1920.

THE COAL (PIT'S MOUTH) PRICES ORDER, 1920, DATED THE 10TH DAY OF MAY, 1920, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE PRICE OF COAL (LIMITATION) A.CT, 1915.

Whereas the Board of Trade are satisfied that special circumstances affect all coal mines in Great Britain, now therefore, in exercise of the power conferred on them by Section 1,

sub-section (2), of the said Act, the Board of Trade hereby order as follows:—

- 1. On and after the 12th day of May, 1920, for the standard amount of 4s. fixed by Section 1, sub-section (2), of the said Act, there shall be substituted in the case of mines in the South Wales, Monmouthshire and the Forest of Dean districts, and in South Staffordshire and East Worcestershire south of a line drawn from Bushbury Station, on the London and North-Western Railway, to Streetly Station on the Midland Railway, and in so much of the area in South Staffordshire and East Worcestershire north of this line as is comprised in the Wolverhampton Union for Poor Law purposes, or the east divison of Wolverhampton for Parliamentary purposes, a standard amount of twenty-three shillings and twopence, and in the case of mines situated elsewhere a standard amount of twenty shillings and eightpence.
- 2. This Order shall take effect in substitution for all Orders heretofore made by the Board of Trade under the provisions of Section 1, sub-section (2), of the said Act.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Coal (Pit's Mouth) Prices Order, 1920.

# DEFENCE OF THE REALM.

THE COAL (BUNKERING AND EXPORT) PRICES ORDER AND DIRECTION, 1920, DATED THE 10TH DAY OF MAY, 1920, MADE AND GIVEN BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATIONS 2F, 2J, AND 2JJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Regulations 2F, 2J, and 2JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Board of Trade hereby order and direct as follows:—

- 1. The fixed prices, specified in the Schedule appended to the Directions of the Board of Trade as to the sale of coal for bunkering certain ships at ports in the United Kingdom, dated the 27th November, 1919, which were increased by 9d. per ton as from the 15th January, 1920, by the Directions of the Board of Trade as to such sales dated the 10th January, 1920, are hereby increased by a further four shillings and twopence per ton.
- 2. The increase ordered in the preceding paragraph shall be payable in respect of all coal despatched from a colliery on or after the 12th day of May, 1920, for bunkering the classes of vessels specified in paragraph 1 of the said Directions dated the 27th November, 1919.
- 3. All contracts for the sale of coal for bunkering the said classes of vessels in force at the date when this Order and Direction comes into effect are hereby modified so that the price of coal or of any instalment despatched from a colliery on or after such date shall be increased as hereby ordered, and the price to be paid by any person to whom the coal is delivered in pursuance of any subsidiary contract shall be in-

creased by an equivalent amount and, subject as aforesaid, all such contracts shall remain in force.

- 4. Paragraph (1) of the Directions of the Board of Trade as to the Sale of Coal, Cokeoven Coke, and Patent Fuel, dated the 28th May, 1919, is hereby revoked and cancelled.
- 5. Subject as aforesaid the said Directions dated respectively the 28th May, 1919, the 27th November, 1919, and the 10th January, 1920, shall have effect as if they were incorporated in this Order.
- 6. This Order and Direction shall come into force on the 12th day of May, 1920, and may be cited as the Coal (Bunkering and Export) Prices Order and Direction, 1920.

including-

(1) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating, or remaking of men's or boys' tailored garments, except where included within the scope of the above-mentioned Regulations with respect to Retail Bespoke Tailoring;

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating

or remaking of the garments;

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments;

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the abovementioned branches of tailoring;

(4) All warehousing, packing, and other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the branches of tailoring in question;

but excluding-

(1) The making of head-gear;

(2) The making of rubberised or oilskin garments;

(3) The making of boys' ready-made washing suits or sailor suits where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of garments to be worn by women or girls or by children without distinction of sex.

# TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

# HAT, CAP AND MILLINERY TRADE BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FIXED FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS. Effective as from 10th May, 1920.\*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in England and Wales under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919, having given due Notice on 30th January, 1920, of Proposal to Fix General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they have fixed General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers and have declared the normal number of hours of work in the Trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as fixed are as shown in the Schedule set out below, which is incorporated herewith.

And the Trade Board FURTHER GIVE NOTICE that they have received notification from

the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 6th May, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the minimum rates of wages as fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying 10th May, 1920\* as the date from which such minimum rates of wages shall become.

\* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 16th May, 1920.

The General Minimum Time-Rates for Learners under 14 years of age shall be 9s. per week o 48 hours, or 2½d. per hour, and from the age of 14 years they shall be entitled to the amounts shown in Column I. above as if they had commenced at 14.

(c) The Minimum Rates for Learners set out in Sub-sections (a) and (b) of this Section shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(i) The weekly rates set out above are based on a week of 48 hours, and are subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours actually spent by the learner in the factory or workshop in any week is less than 48.

(ii) The advances to be given to learners commencing at under 21 years of age shall become due as from the first Monday in January or July of each year, the learner being entitled to her first advance from the first Monday in January or July as the case may be, provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.

(iii) A learner shall cease to be a learner and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time Rate applicable to her under Section I. of Part I. of this Schedule, upon the fulfilment of the following conditions:—

(iv) No female learner shall be held to be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate under Section I. of Part I. of this Schedule until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had. Provided that in determining the age of entry and the length of employment, all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

Workers under 15 years of age ... ... ... ... 3d. ,, Workers commencing employment in the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade for the first time at and over the age of 19 may serve a period of six months at 7d. per hour, and thereafter a period of six months at 8\frac{3}{4}d. per hour.

On the expiration of one year's service in the trade, these workers shall receive such rates as their age may entitle them to under the foregoing provisions.

#### PART II.

#### Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates.

SECTION I.

#### FEMALE WORKERS.

(a) All FEMALE WORKERS other than Homeworkers ... 9½d. per hour. (b) HOMEWORKERS ... ... ... ... ... 9½d. "

In the case of all female workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield in the circumstances of the case not less than 9½d. per hour to an ordinary worker. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers other than learners.

#### SECTION II.

#### MALE WORKERS.

All MALE WORKERS ... ... ... ... ... 1s. 3½d. per hour.

In the case of all male workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid shall be such as would yield in the circumstances of the case not less than 1s. 3½d. per hour to an ordinary worker. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers of 22 years of age and upwards.

### PART III.

Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers (All Ages).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week, 48.

On any day (other than Saturday), 9.

On Saturday, 5.

Provided that any other day (not being Sunday) may be substituted by an employer for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours of work on such substituted day shall be 5, and the normal number of hours on Saturday shall be 9.

Provided also that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply

Section II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker, whether engaged on Time-work or on Piecework, in excess of the declared normal number of hours, shall be as follows, that is to say:—

1. For the first two hours' overtime on any day, except Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), Sundays, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rates shall be equivalent to Time and a Quarter, that is to say, one and a quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

- 2. For overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all overtime on Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time and a Half, that is to say, one and a half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.
- 3. For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Double Time, that is to say, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable.
- 4. For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be Time and a Quarter, except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section. The Overtime Rate shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday), the number of hours worked exceeds 9 or, in the case of Saturday (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), exceeds 5, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided—(a) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on 5 days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9½.

(b) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the

normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

(c) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

But in the application of these Provisos, where the employer requires attendance on any day on which it is not the established practice of the employer to require attendance, all time worked on such day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) shall be paid for at time and a quarter for the first two hours and time and a half thereafter.

Note.—The hours of work which female workers and young persons are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.

#### PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply: —

Section I.—A female learner is a worker

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade specified in Part V. of this Schedule by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

" Home-II.—The expression worker " shall be held to mean a worker who works in her own home or any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

#### PART V.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in England and Wales who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919, that is to say—the making from any material of men's, women's or children's headgear, or the trimming thereof;

operations incidental to or appertaining to the making or trimming of men's, women's or children's headgear;

But Excluding:-1. The casting and mak-

ing of solid metal helmets;
2. The making of rubberised or oilskin headgear where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of other rubberised or oilskin articles;

3. The making of nurses' or servants' caps, chefs' caps, hospital ward caps, or similar

articles;

4. The making of field bonnets, sun-bonnets, boudoir caps, or infants' millinery where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of dresses, non-tailored skirts, wraps, blouses, blouse-robes, jumpers, sports coats, neckwear, tea-gowns, dressing gowns, dressing jackets, pyjamas, underclothing, under-skirts, aprons, overalls, nurses' and servants' caps, juvenile clothing, baby linen or similar articles;

5. The making of fur hats, where made in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of furs or furriers' skins into gar-

ments, rugs, or similar articles;

6. The making of knitted headgear and the making of headgear from knitted fabrics where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of the knitted

7. Warehousing and packing of men's, women's, and children's headgear and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made or trimmed on the premises.

#### PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorized by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.
