WHEREAS by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, it is, amongst other things, provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order, to direct that Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, shall extend, with or without any exceptions, adaptations, or modifications, in the Order mentioned, to any foreign country in which, for the time being, His Majesty has jurisdiction, and that thereupon the said Section shall, to the extent of that jurisdiction, operate as if that country were a British Possession, and as

if His Majesty in Council were the Legislature of that Possession:

And whereas by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty The King has power and jurisdiction in the East Africa Protectorate:

And whereas by Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, it is provided that His Majesty The King may, by Order in Council, apply that Section to any British Possession where His Majesty is satisfied that by the law of such Possession either no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in the United Kingdom when passing on death, or that the law of such Possession as respects any duty so leviable is to the like effect as the foregoing provisions of that Section:

And whereas His Majesty the King is satisfied that by the law of the said East Africa Protectorate no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in the United Kingdom when passing on death:

And whereas it is expedient that Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, should be extended and applied to the said Protectorate:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, shall,

from the date of this Order, extend to the East Africa Protectorate to the intent that the said enactment shall operate as if the said Protectorate were a British Possession, and the said Section shall, from the date of this Order, apply to the said East Africa Protectorate.

And the Right Honourable Viscount Milner, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, is to give the necessary directions

herein accordingly.

We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us to waive the regulation quoted in the case of Engineer Lieutenants promoted to that rank for long and zealous service, with retrospective effect from the 1st day of February, 1919:

"And whereas, with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury, pending a general revision of pay, temporary bonuses were granted with effect from the 1st February, 1919, to all men and boys of Your Majesty's Navy and Marines, including the Coast Guard and Reserve

"And whereas we have had under consideration the rates of pay of the Petty Officers, Non-commissioned Officers, and men of Your Majesty's Navy and Marines, and are of opinion that it is desirable for the greater efficiency of these Forces that the existing rates of pay should be increased:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the Rates of Pay and General Provisions set forth in the annexed Schedules, the alterations therein tocome into force from the dates specified, power being reserved to us to vary the rates of pay within the Scales laid down or to associate payment with such conditions as may be deemed necessary:

" The Lords Commissioners of Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in these proposals.

(i) 1s. a day on obtaining the certificate of capability of taking a watch in the engine room of a small ship;

(ii) An additional 1s. on obtaining the certificate of capability of taking charge of the engines of a small ship, but not to be paid until attainment of the rating of Chief Engine-room Artificer, 2nd class.

These allowances to be paid under the above conditions to such chief and other Engine-room Artificers, Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, as have obtained or may obtain the above certificates.

Interpreter.—Ratings acting as Interpreter to receive an allowance of 1s. an hour while actually performing the duties, up to a maximum of 5s. a day.

Schoolmaster .- The rate of pay for Acting Schoolmaster to be continuous at the rate of 8d. a day, and no longer to depend upon the number of lessons given.

Diver .- The initial allowance to remain at 1d. a day. On the first occasion of requalifying after going to sea, men to be graded as 1st and 2nd class Divers. 1st class Divers to receive an allowance of 4d. a day, 2nd class Divers 1d. a day.

Artificer Diver.—The initial allowance to remain at 6d. a day. On the first occasion of requalifying after going to sea, men to be graded as 1st and 2nd class. First Class Artificer Divers to receive an allowance of 9d. a day, and Second Class Artificer Divers 6d. a day.

Good Conduct Pay.—The daily pay for each Badge to be 3d. instead of 1d. Royal Marines in future to come under the same regulations as Naval Ratings as regards good conduct Badges. Royal Marine ranks now in possession of more than three good conduct Badges to be paid at the new rates, for three Badges only; Badges in excess of three to be regarded as honorary, and in the event of a Badge being forfeited the forfeiture in the first instance to be applied to a paid Badge.

Good Conduct Medal and Gratuity.—This Medal to carry with it an immediate payment of £20 on award, and an allowance of £1 for each complete year of qualifying service rendered after earning the Medal, the amount so accruing being paid in a lump sum with the first payment of pension. The former scale of gratuity in respect of the Medal to be abolished. The new scale to be applicable to al men eligible for Good Conduct gratuity, regardless of rating, holding the Medal who are not due for pension as from a date prior to 1st May, 1919.

Allowance in Lieu of Sphrit.—The present scale of grog money to be replaced by a consolidated allowance of 21s. a quarter. For parts of a quarter or for broken periods the allowance to be credited at the rate of 3d. a day.

Leave Allowance in future to be payable at the same rate as the allowance in lieu of provisions, as approved where Government provisions are not taken up.

Assisting in Clerical Duties.—Ratings of the Victualling Branch when employed on Ship's office duties in addition to their own to be eligible for extra pay under the conditions laid down in King's Regulations.

'Steaming in Tropics' Allowance in future to be called 'Tropical Allowance.' A flat rate of 1s. 6d. a day to be substituted for the present scale based on substantive pay, and to be payable in steam and oil-burning vessels other than open motor-boats, to all Engine Room, Officers' and Ship's Cook ratings (including Maltese, but excluding native ratings) both when at sea and in harbour.

Detained Pay.—To be payable under the conditions hitherto in force, and, in addition, to men detained on a Foreign Station beyond expiration of engagement, awaiting passage home up to the actual date of discharge to the shore.

Allowance for Work in Double Bottoms.— The day (including intermediate dinner hour) to be reckoned as 8 hours instead of 10 hours.

Allowance for acting as Senior Officer's or Captain's Clerk.—The allowance previously payable to an Officer to be payable to a Writer, when called upon to act in such capacity owing to the exigencies of the service.

Hardlying Money for Crews of Surveying Vessels.—Hardlying money on the Torpedo Boat Destroyer scale to be payable as follows:

(a) Surveying Vessels employed in Foreign Waters: From the date of commissioning at home or abroad until paid off, but not when on passage to or from a foreign station unless in a surveying vessel.

(b) Surveying Vessels employed in Home Waters: During the period that these vessels are completed to full complement or actually employed in surveying work, whether with reduced crews or not. No allowance to be paid when vessels are laid up, except in cases when the services of a boat's crew are specially required for surveying work for a definite period.

The Senior Allowance of 6d. a day payable to half the number of Active Service Chief Yeoman of Signals, and Chief Petty Officer Telegraphists to be payable also to such pensioners holding these ratings as are called up within 5 years of being discharged from active service, or of enrolment in the Royal Fleet Reserve, Class A, whichever may be the later, provided they were receiving the allowance on discharge or were enrolled in the Royal Fleet Reserve therewith.

D.-MISCELLANEOUS.

Application of Revised Rates.—The revised rates to be applicable to equivalent ratings in the following:—

Retention of old rates.—In any cases in which the transfer from the old to the revised rates of pay would involve a loss of pay, ratings to continue to be paid at their old rates until such time as promotion or length of service entitles them to pay equal to or greater than the old rates.

Allowance to Senior Armourer in Gunnery and Torpedo Schools.—This allowance of 7d. a day to continue to be paid where a rating is in charge, but not if there is a Warrant Officer in charge.

Hospital Stoppages.—Hospital stoppages to continue to be applicable only to ratings whose disability is due to misconduct, carelessness or

neglect.

E.—DATE ON WHICH THE FOREGOING IMPROVEMENTS TAKE EFFECT.

The new scales of Substantive pay and Badge pay to be ante-dated to the 1st February, 1919, for all those in the Naval Service on the 1st May, 1919, and not dispersed prior to that date. Existing allowances absorbed in the new rates of substantive pay not to be payable concurrently therewith.

"Whereas under and by virtue of the several indentures, particulars whereof are set forth in the schedule hereunder written, certain mineral rights within the lands situate in the Parishes of Finedon, Burton Latimer, and Cranford Saint John aforesaid, and particularly described in the same indentures and schedule became yested in us:

CARGOES EX ENEMY VESSELS SEIZED BY PORTUGAL.

Foreign Office, May 14, 1920.

With reference to previous notifications published in the London Gazette respecting the release of Allied and Neutral merchandise found on enemy vessels in Portuguese harbours, particularly to those published on May 30th, 1916, August 3rd, 1917, and April 11th, 1919, a translation of a Decree which has now been issued by the Portuguese Government providing for the sale of such cargoes as are still unclaimed or are enemy property is appended.

It is understood that a further Decree is under consideration by the Portuguese Government, and will shortly be issued, in accordance with which fresh claims for goods will be admissible, and providing that, should such

goods have in the meantime been sold, or requisitioned, the owners, on substantiating their rights, will receive the proceeds of sale, or, in the latter event, the market value of their property.

DECREE No. 6556, April 17th, 1920. (Translation.)

Articles 31 and 33 of the Decree No. 2350 of the 20th of April, 1916, having provided that the goods found on board enemy ships at the time in Portuguese waters, or discharged therefrom, should be sold by public auction, the respective proceeds being deposited, with an indication of their origin, in the Caixa Geral De Depositos, whenever they could not without great loss be kept under administrative control, it being presumed that such goods as were not proved, within the period of thirty days, a period which was subject to extension and was in fact several times extended, to be the property of allies or neutrals to whom they would be delivered on being claimed or their value restored should they have requisitioned by the Portuguese Government; and

According to the statement made by the Directorate-General of Customs that considerable quantities of the said goods exist which it has not yet been possible to identify, either because there are no cargo documents or because no one has appeared with a right to claim them; and that in order to restore the goods belonging to allies or neutrals, successive decrees, published between the 13th July, 1917, and the 22nd of March, 1919, have extended the original period of thirty days, which periods have now elapsed; and

Considering that, in order to carry out the provisions enacted by the Decree of the 20th of April, 1916, a later Decree, No. 2366 of the 4th of May of the same year, assigned to the Intendencia Dos Bens Dos Inimigos, the liquidation of such enemy property "provided no inconvenience is likely to result therefrom"; and the above-mentioned goods being not only of that nature, but their indefinite retention in State warehouses, which are always in demand for commercial traffic, is further prejudiced by this accumulation;

Considering that the goods in quest on will, in the majority of cases, suffer depreciation in value in proportion to the length of time they are kept in deposit:

Considering that once these goods have been put upon the home market by sale at a public auction, they will help to reduce the shortage of raw materials and manufactured articles so prejudicial to national interests;

In view of the provisions of Article 297, subclause (b) of the Treaty of Peace approved by the Law No. 962 of the 2nd instant; and

Availing of the power granted to the Government by the Law 491 of the 12th of March, 1916, and on the advice of the Council of Ministers:

I herebý decree as follows:—

ARTICLE I.

The goods found on board the ex-German ships requisitioned by the State and at the time lying in Portuguese waters and which are still deposited within the judicial districts of the Custom Houses of continental Portugal and the adjacent Islands, shall be sold by public auction at the said Custom Houses in

accordance with the terms of legislation in force, the nett proceeds to be placed in the custody of the Caixa Geral De Depositos with an indication of their origin.

ARTICLE II.

In order to carry out the provisions of Article I. all packages containing the said goods shall be opened in succession, so that the contents may be briefly examined and the basis of sale fixed.

ARTICLE III.

The examination and valuation referred to in the previous Article shall be effected by as many committees as may be necessary for the rapid completion of the sale.

ARTICLE IV.

All packages examined and valued shall obtain a rotation number and be duly entered in special books, and, as far as possible, in groups of Custom House marks and according to nature of contents.

ARTICLE V.

Objects of recognised historical, artistic or archæological value, publications of political propaganda, arms and ammunitions not specified in paragraph I of this Article, are excluded from the provisions of Article I. whenever the Government think fit.

Paragraph I.—The following are excluded from the sale provided for by this Decree:—

(a) Arms and munitions of war;

(b) Merchandise in contravention to Portuguese laws or to Agreements and Treaties of an international character to which Portugal has adhered.

ARTICLE VI.

The provisions of this Decree do not include goods the sale of which has already been advertised at the date of its publication, nor those which have been requisitioned as well as those the release of which has been authorised or of which the delivery orders are registered in the Custom Houses within the period of fifteen days counting from the above-mentioned date.

ARTICLE VII.

The sales by auction shall be presided over by the Director of the Custom House concerned, by the sub-Director, or by a Chief of Department.

ARTICLE VIII.

Persons presenting themselves to bid must previously deposit in the treasury of the Custom House in which the sale takes place the sum of 200 escudos, and a further sum of 25 per cent. on the purchase money.

Paragraph I.—Bidders are obliged to remove the goods purchased by them within a period of five days, under penalty of forfeiting the deposits mentioned in this Article.

ARTICLE IX.

The proceeds of the sales of goods referred to in this Decree shall only be subject to the payment of duties and other legal imposts, with the exception of charges for warehousing.

ARTICLE X.

The Custom Houses shall forward beforehand to the Directorate-General of Customs the lists of objects and goods about to be sold by auction, in order that the higher authorities may decide which may be disposed of exclusively for internal consumption.

ARTICLE XI.

Legislation to the contrary is hereby revoked.

The President of the Ministry and the Ministers of the other Departments shall accordingly cause this Decree to be put into effect.
