Colonial Probates Act, 1892, should apply to

certain British Possessions, including the
Colony of Lagos:

And whereas by Letters Patent under the
Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great
Britain and Ireland bearing date at West-
minster the 28th day of February, 1906, His
late Majesty King Edward the Seventh was
pleased to declare that the Colony of Lagos
should from the coming into operation of the
said Letters Patent be known as the Colony of
Southern Nigeria:

And whereas by further Letters Patent bear-
ing date the 29th day of November, 1913, His
Majesty the King was pleased to declare that
the said Colony of Southern Nigeria should
from the date of the coming into operation of
the said Letters Patent be known as the Colony
of Nigeria:

And whereas it is expedient that the Colonial
Probates Act, 1892, shall continue to apply to
the British Possession formerly known as Lagos
and now known as Nigeria:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the
Legislature of the said British Possession has
made adequate provision for the recognition in
that Possession of Probates and Letters of Ad-
ministration granted by the Courts of the
United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The above-recited Order in Council of the 29th day of January, 1894, so far as it relates to the British Possession formerly known as Lagos, shall from the commencement of this Order be revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder.

2. The Colonial Probates Act, 1892, shall apply to the British Possession hereunder mentioned:—

The Colony of Nigeria.

And the Right Honourable Viscount Milner, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas His Majesty The King is satisfied that the Legislature of the said Protectorate has made adequate provision for the recognition therein of Probates and Letters of Administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom:

And whereas it is expedient that the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, should be extended to the said Protectorate:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, shall, from the date of this Order, apply to the Nigeria Protectorate as though the said Protectorate were a British Possession.

And the Right Honourable Viscount Milner, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that it is expedient that the Rules of Court hereto annexed, having been duly prepared by the proper authority as required by the said Act, should be established and be in force in the Supreme Court of Trinidad and Tobago in its Admiralty jurisdiction on and from such day as the Governor of Trinidad may appoint by notice in the Government Gazette:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve the Rules of Court hereto annexed, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said Rules of Court shall come into force in the Supreme Court of Trinidad and Tobago in its Admiralty jurisdiction on such day as the Governor of Trinidad may appoint, by notice in the Government Gazette.

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that certain powers and duties conferred or imposed upon the Secretary of State under the Anatomy Acts, 1832 and 1871, relate to matters affecting or incidental to the health of the people and that it is expedient that the said powers and duties should be transferred to the Minister of Health:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Health (Anatomy Acts, Transfer of Powers) Order, 1919.

(2) The Interpretation Act applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. On and after the 17th day of May, 1920, the powers and duties in England and Wales of the Secretary of State under the Anatomy Acts, 1832 and 1871, set out in the Schedule hereto shall be transferred to the Minister of Health, and the Sections of the said Acts specified in the first column of the said Schedule shall be read as though "Minister of Health" were substituted for "Secretary of State."

3. References to the Minister of Health shall be substituted for references to the Secretary of State in Sections four, ten, twelve and fourteen of the Anatomy Act, 1832.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Health (Lunacy and Mental Deficiency, Transfer of Powers) Order, 1920.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. On and after the 17th day of May, 1920, the powers and duties of the Secretary of State set out in the First Schedule to this Order shall be transferred to the Minister of Health and the several Sections and Sub-sections of the Acts specified in the first column of the said Schedule shall be read as though "Minister of Health" were substituted for "Secretary of State" in those Sections and Sub-sections.

3.—(1) References to the Minister of Health shall be substituted for references to the Secretary of State in Sections 41 (1), 237 (5), 248 (2), and 321 (2) of the Lunacy Act, 1890, and in Sections 10 (2), 25 (2) (other than the proviso to that Sub-section), 47 (other than the proviso to that Section), and 65 (1) of the Mental Deficiency Act, 1913, and in paragraph (5) of the Schedule to that Act.

(2) Sections 26 and 54 (2) of the Mental Deficiency Act, 1913, shall be read as though the references therein to the Secretary of State included reference to the Minister of Health.

4. Nothing in this Order shall affect any of the powers and duties of the Secretary of State set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

And whereas the Minister of Health as the successor to the Local Government Board exercises and performs certain powers and duties in

relation to public libraries, museums, and gymnasiums which appear to His Majesty not to relate to matters affecting or incidental to the health of the people:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Health (Public Libraries, Museums and Gymnasiums, Transfer of Powers) Order, 1920.

2. On and after the 17th day of May, 1920, the powers and duties of the Minister of Health specified in the Schedule hereto shall be transferred to the Board of Education.

3. On and after the 17th day of May, 1920, the notices required by subsection (4) of Section 3 of the Museums and Gymnasiums Act, 1891, and Section 8 of the Public Libraries Act, 1901, shall be given to the Board of Education in addition to the Minister of Health.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The County Court of Cumberland held at Wigton shall be held at Silloth as well as at Wigton, by the name of the County Court of Cumberland held at Wigton and Silloth.

2. The District of the County Court of Dorsetshire held at Poole shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Hampshire held at Bournemouth; and a Court shall be held in the District formed by the said consolidation at Poole and at Bournemouth by the name of the County Court of Dorsetshire and Hampshire held at Poole and Bournemouth.

3. The District of the County Court of Lancashire held at Garstang, except the parishes detached therefrom by paragraph 8 hereof, shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Lancashire held at Preston and Chorley; and from the 30th day of June, 1920, the holding of the said Court at Garstang shall be discontinued, and all powers and jurisdiction theretofore exercisable thereby shall thenceforth be exercised by the said Court held at Preston and Chorley, and the said Court held at Preston and Chorley shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.

4. The District of the County Court of Northamptonshire held at Brackley, except the parishes detached therefrom by paragraph 8 hereof, shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Oxfordshire held at Banbury; and from the 30th day of June, 1920, the holding of the said Court at Brackley shall be discontinued, and all powers and jurisdiction theretofore exercisable thereby shall thenceforth be exercised by the said Court held at Banbury; and the said Court held at Banbury shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.

5. The District of the County Court of Northumberland held at Rothbury, except the parishes detached therefrom by paragraph 8 hereof, shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Northumberland held at Morpeth and Blyth; and from the 30th day of June, 1920, the holding of the said Court at Rothbury shall be discontinued, and all powers and jurisdiction theretofore exercisable thereby shall thenceforth be exercised by the said Court held at Morpeth and Blyth, and the said Court held at Morpeth and Blyth shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.

6. The District of the County Court of Northumberland held at Wooler, except the parishes detached therefrom by paragraph 8 hereof, shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Northumberland held at Alnwick; and from the 30th day of June, 1920, the holding of the said Court at Wooler shall be discontinued, and all powers and

jurisdiction theretofore exercisable thereby shall thenceforth be exercised by the said Court held at Alnwick; and the said Court held at Alnwick shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.

7. The District of the County Court of Yorkshire held at Hedon shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Yorkshire held at Kingston-upon-Hull, and a Court shall be held in the District formed by the said consolidation of Kingston-upon-Hull and at Patrington by the name of the County Court of Yorkshire held at Kingston-upon-Hull and Patrington, and from the 30th day of June, 1920, the holding of the said Court at Hedon shall be discontinued, and all powers and jurisdiction theretofore exercisable thereby shall thenceforth be exercised by the said Court held at Kingston-upon-Hull and Patrington.

8. The parishes set out in the first column to the Schedule to this Order shall, save as to any cases pending upon the 30th day of June, 1920, be detached from, and cease to form part of, the Districts set opposite to their names respectively in the second column, of the said Schedule, and shall be transferred, to, and form part of, the Districts set opposite to their names respectively in the third column thereof.

9. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1920, and shall be read with the County Courts Districts Order in Council, 1899, which shall have effect as amended by this Order.

“The undersigned, Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of York, hereby states that it having appeared to him that the Benefice (being a Rectory) of West Heslerton, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of East Heslerton, both in the County and Diocese of York, might with advantage to the interests of Religion be united into one Benefice for Ecclesiastical purposes, under the Acts of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, and of the 13th and 14th years of the same reign, Chapter 98, he made inquiries into the circumstances of the case, and that on such Inquiry it appeared to him that the said union might be usefully made, and that the said Benefices, if united, would not be of inconvenient extent, and that he therefore caused to be published as required by the said first mentioned Act a Statement in writing of the facts, with notice to any person or persons interested to show cause in writing within the time prescribed by the said Act against such union and that such time has expired without any reasonable notice having been shown to him. Wherefore the said Archbishop doth hereby pursuant to the said first mentioned Act certify to Your Majesty in Council the circumstances of the case respecting

the said union appeared on the before-mentioned Inquiry to be as follows:—

“That the said Rectory and Vicarage and the Benefices of the same are contiguous.

“That the aggregate population of the Parishes of the said two Benefices according to the latest Returns of population made under the Authority of Parliament does not exceed 482 persons. The population of West Heslerton being 274 persons, and the population of East Heslerton being 208 persons.

“That the net yearly value of the Benefice of West Heslerton is £284 or thereabouts, and the net yearly value of the Benefice of East Heslerton is £334 or thereabouts.

“That there is a Church belonging to each of the said two Benefices of West Heslerton and East Heslerton sufficient for the accommodation of the Inhabitants thereof.

“That each of the said Benefices has a house of Residence and in case the proposed Union of such Benefices should be carried into effect it is proposed that the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall reside in the Parsonage House of the Benefice of West Heslerton as the Parsonage House of the United Benefice, and that the Parsonage House of the Benefice of East Heslerton shall be let or sold or assigned as a Residence House for any Curate who may be Licensed to the said United Benefice.

“That the Patronage of both the said Benefices of West Heslerton and East Heslerton is vested in His Most Gracious Majesty King George the Fifth, who has signified his consent to the Union hereinbefore proposed.

“That the Reverend Lawrence Stafford Gresley, Clerk, M.A., is the present Rector of the said Benefice of West Heslerton and the Vicarage and Benefice of East Heslerton is now vacant.

“That if the proposed union is carried into effect it is proposed that the Patronage or Right of Presentation to the said united Benefice of West Heslerton, with East Heslerton shall be vested in His said Majesty and His Successors.

“That if the proposed union is carried into effect the said united Benefice shall be known by the name of the Rectory of West Heslerton with the Vicarage of East Heslerton.

“The said Inquiry and Consents are thus certified by the said Archbishop to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, by virtue of the said Acts, issue an Order, if Your Majesty in Council shall so think fit, for uniting the said Benefices of West Heslerton and East Heslerton into one Benefice with Cure of Souls for Ecclesiastical purposes only.”

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Vicarage of East Heslerton, situate in the County and Diocese of York, and the Rectory of West Heslerton, situate in the same County and Diocese, shall be united into one Benefice with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

Brewer had descended into the Wet Provision Room of H.M.S. "Tiger," in company with J. H. Anderson, a shipwright, when he was overcome by poisonous gases and collapsed. Anderson, himself feeling the effect of the gases, left the compartment as quickly as possible to obtain assistance, and Mathers and Bowman, who were near to the scene, descended without hesitation to endeavour to rescue Brewer. They did not wait for further assistance or for safety appliances, though they were fully aware of the cause of Brewer's collapse and consequently of the grave risk they were running. They were at once overcome by the noxious gases in the compartment, and when removed were in an unconscious condition.

Every endeavour was made to restore them to consciousness, but without success.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for that branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919, which is covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, and dated 15th January, 1920, with respect to the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade in Great Britain, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time Rates and Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Male Workers at present effective and set out in the Notice dated 27th November, 1919, issued by the Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain) established under Regulations made by the Board of Trade, and dated 10th January, 1914, in their application to certain classes of Male Workers in any branch of the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade in Great Britain specified in Part IV. of the Schedule hereof, and TO FIX General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Male Workers in those branches of the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade in Great Britain specified in Part IV. of the Schedule hereof, to which the said Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the above-mentioned Notice, dated 27th November, 1919, do not apply, and ALSO TO FIX Overtime Rates for Male Workers in any branch of the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade in Great Britain specified in Part IV. of the Schedule hereof, the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the Notice of Proposal to Vary being given.

SECTION II.—In cases where the worker is employed on Piece-work, each Piece Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY Worker, an amount not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable. Provided that in determining as to whether any Piece-Rate satisfies this condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers of 22 years of age and over.

PART II.

PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE WORKERS.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby give Notice that they propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On any day (other than Saturday)	5
On Saturday	5

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Trade Board give similar Notice that they propose to fix Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a

Male Worker in excess of such normal number of hours, as follows, that is to say:—

(A) For Male Workers specified in Part I of this Schedule employed on Time-Work:—

(1) For the first two hours' Overtime on any day, except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-quarter, that is to say, One-and-a-quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(2) For the second two hours' Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-half, that is to say, One-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(3) For all time worked on Sundays and

Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for Overtime after the first four hours' Overtime on any other day, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Double Time, that is to say, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-a-quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Section. The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of a Saturday exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that:

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9½.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

(c) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply to workers in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday," and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

In the application of these provisos, where the employer requires attendance on any day on which it is not the established practice of the employer to require attendance, all time worked on such day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) shall be paid for at Time-and-a-quarter for the first two hours, Time-and-a-half for the second two hours and Double Time thereafter.

(B) For Male Workers specified in Part I of this Schedule employed on Piece-Work:—

(i) Male Workers of 22 years of age and over employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker, not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable, the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, one Half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, or One-quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double Time, Time-and-a-half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

(ii) Male Workers under 22 years of age employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the

case, to an Ordinary Worker, not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable, the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or One-quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double-Time, Time-and-a-half, or Time-and-a-quarter respectively.

NOTE.—The hours which young persons are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.

PART III.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

SECTION I.—A Measure Cutter is a person:—

(a) who is employed in any process of Measure Cutting and is capable of taking a complete set of measures, and of cutting any garment for a Male person from model patterns, and has sufficient technical knowledge to draft men's trousers and alter the balance and distribution of widths, lengths, etc., for any garment for a Male person (excluding alterations to stock patterns); and

(b) who has been employed not less than five years after the age of 19 in actual cutting processes, including not less than three years as a Measure Cutter as defined.

A Stock Cutter is a person:—

(a) who is employed in:—

(i) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings or other materials.

(ii) Laying-up, hooking-up or folding cloth or linings or other materials;

(iii) Cutting cloth or linings or other materials; and

(iv) Dividing; that is, the process ordinarily carried on by Cutters or their assistants, of dividing, parting, or separating the parts of garments after being cut and of assembling them into suitable bundles for making up; and

(b) who has been employed not less than five years after the age of 19 upon the above processes, including not less than three years as a Cutter of any class specified in this Part of this Schedule.

A Knife Cutter or Knifeman is a person:—

(a) who is wholly or mainly employed on Band, Electric or Hand Knife processes; and

(b) who has been employed not less than five years after the age of 19 as a Cutter of any class specified in this Part of this Schedule, including not less than three years' experience as a Knife Cutter or Knifeman as defined.

A Fitter-up is a person:—

(a) who is employed in Fitting-up; that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, basting or machining, which consists of preparing or fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being basted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing or fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances, sewing, basting or machining forming no part or process of fitting-up; and

(b) who has been employed not less than five years after the age of 19 as a Fitter-up or Tailor as defined in this Section, including

not less than three years as a Fitter-up as defined.

A Tailor is a person:—

(a) who is employed in Sewing by hand in the process of making a garment or portion of a garment; and

(b) who has been employed not less than five years after the age of 19 as a Tailor as defined.

A Presser is a person:—

(a) who is employed in Pressing-off by hand or by machine; and

(b) who has been employed not less than five years after the age of 19 in the processes of Pressing-off or Under-Pressing, including not less than three years as a Presser-off.

A Machinist is a person:—

(a) who is employed in Machining, and is capable of machining any garment through-out; and

(b) who has been employed as a Machinist as defined not less than five years after the age of 19.

A Passer is a person:—

(a) who is employed in examining Garments, either in the processes of being made up or upon their completion; and

(b) who has been employed not less than five years after the age of 19 as a Passer or Tailor as defined.

An Under-Presser is a person:—

(a) who is employed in Pressing Processes other than Pressing-off; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as an Under-Presser or Presser.

A Plain Machinist is a person:—

(a) who is employed in the process of making up Plain Sleeves, Facings, Linings, Inside Pockets, Quilting, and Padding; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a Plain Machinist or a Machinist.

A Warehouseman is a person employed wholly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., the assembling, keeping, storing and distributing of stock, but *excluding* such operations included in the definitions of a Packer or Porter.

A Packer is a person employed wholly or mainly upon the operation of packing goods and materials, but *excluding* such operations included in the definitions of a Porter or Warehouseman.

A Porter is a person employed wholly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., unpacking, moving, loading or unloading of goods or materials, or in cleaning and sweeping premises, but *excluding* such operations included in the definitions of a Packer or Warehouseman.

SECTION II.—The expression "London District" shall be deemed to mean the Metropolitan and City of London Police Districts.

SECTION III.—The expression "Heavy Cotton Clothing" shall be deemed to mean articles of clothing for Male persons made wholly or mainly of cords, moles, or other fustians, jeans, drills or other similar cotton material, but *excluding* gabardine raincoats.

PART IV.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this Notice, to all Male

Workers in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, and dated 15th January, 1920; that is to say:—

Men's and Boys' ready-made and wholesale bespoke tailoring; and all men's and boys' retail bespoke tailoring carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments; and any other branch of men's and boys' tailoring which is not included within the scope of the Regulations dated 12th December, 1919, with respect to the Constitution and Proceedings of a Trade Board in Great Britain for Retail Bespoke Tailoring;

Including:—

(1) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of men's or boys' tailored garments, except where included within the scope of the above-mentioned Regulations with respect to Retail Bespoke Tailoring.

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of the garments;

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments.

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the above-mentioned branches of tailoring.

(4) All warehousing, packing, and other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the branches of tailoring in question.

But excluding:—

(1) The making of head-gear;

(2) The making of rubberised or oilskin garments;

(3) The making of boys' ready-made washing suits or sailor suits, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of garments to be worn by women or girls, or by children without distinction of sex.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The above minimum rates of wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of wages are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

3. *Military Service*.—Candidates must have served in His Majesty's Naval, Military, or Air Forces; provided that a candidate who has been found unfit on grounds of health for general service, has served for at least a year in a Government Department, has there shown himself to be up to or above the standard of ability usually obtained from competitive examinations, and is recommended by his Department, may also be considered; provided also that a candidate who has been interned in an enemy country in such manner as to preclude him from serving in His Majesty's Forces may be eligible.

The loss of a limb will not in itself be regarded as a disqualification, but the loss of sight, deafness, or a bad stammer will be so regarded.

 Arithmetic,

and those whom the Civil Service Commissioners judge to approximate to the standard of ability usually obtained from competitive examinations for these situations will be considered as qualified to appear before a Selection Board (see Clause 8).

A candidate who has passed the qualifying examination may not present himself again for examination, whilst a candidate who has failed in the qualifying examination may present himself again for examination on one subsequent occasion but not twice in the same calendar year.

8. *Competitions*.—Candidates who pass the qualifying examination and are of the requisite age, health and character will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board. The Selection Board will hold competitions at intervals while these regulations remain in force, and on each competition they will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifica-

tions, and their decision will be final; but a candidate who has passed the examination and, although judged suitable for appointment, has not been appointed on the results of one competition, may be reserved by the Selection Board for consideration in later competitions and, if so reserved, will be invited to appear before the next Selection Board.

The Selection Board will take into account together with the candidate's record and his personal qualities as shown at the interview any special merit that he may have shown in any subject of the examination.

9. *Warning*.—Any attempt on the part of a candidate to enlist support for his application through Members of Parliament, or other influential persons, will disqualify him for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work whether at school, at the university, in the Forces, or otherwise.

10. *Fee*.—Every candidate is required to pay a fee of ten shillings, payable when the Application Form is sent in.
