PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Sub-sections (2) and (4) of Section three of the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, it is provided that His Majesty may from time to time by Order in Council transfer to the Minister of Health any powers and duties in England and Wales of any Government Department which appear to His Majesty to relate to matters affecting or incidental to the health of the people, and may make such incidental, consequential and supplemental provisions as may be necessary or expedient for the purpose of giving full effect to any such transfer and may make such adaptations in the enactments relating to such powers or duties as may be necessary to make exercisable by the Minister and his Officers the powers and duties so transferred:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that certain powers and duties conferred or imposed upon the Secretary of State under the Anatomy Acts, 1832 and 1871, relate to matters affecting or incidental to the health of the people and that it is expedient that the said powers and duties should be transferred to the Minister of Health:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Health (Anatomy Acts, Transfer of Powers) Order, 1919.

(2) The Interpretation Act applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. On and after the 17th day of May, 1920, the powers and duties in England and Wales of the Secretary of State under the Anatomy Acts, 1832 and 1871, set out in the Schedule hereto shall be transferred to the Minister of Health, and the Sections of the said Acts specified in the first column of the said Schedule shall be read as though "Minister of Health" were substituted for "Secretary of State."

3. References to the Minister of Health shall be substituted for references to the Secretary of State in Sections four, ten, twelve and fourteen of the Anatomy Act, 1832.

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SCHEDULE.

Statute.	Power or Duty transferred.
<i>Anatomy Act,</i> 1832.	
Section 1 ...	To grant licences to practise anatomy.
Section 2 ...	To appoint and remove inspectors.
Section 3 ...	To appoint districts for inspectors and to regulate their duties.
<i>Anatomy Act,</i> 1871.	
Section 2 ...	To vary period within which certificates of interment are to be transmitted to district inspectors.

WHEREAS by paragraph (b) of Sub-section (2) and Sub-section (4) of Section 3 of the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council transfer to the Minister of Health all or any of the powers and duties of the Secretary of State under the enactments relating to lunacy and mental deficiency and may by Order in Council make such incidental, consequential, and supplemental provisions as may be necessary or expedient for the purpose of giving full effect to such transfer, and may make such adaptations in the said enactments as may be necessary to make exercisable by the Minister and his Officers the powers and duties so transferred:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Health (Lunacy and Mental Deficiency, Transfer of Powers) Order, 1920.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. On and after the 17th day of May, 1920, the powers and duties of the Secretary of State set out in the First Schedule to this Order shall be transferred to the Minister of Health and the several Sections and Sub-sections of the Acts specified in the first column of the said Schedule shall be read as though "Minister of Health" were substituted for "Secretary of State" in those Sections and Sub-sections.

3.—(1) References to the Minister of Health shall be substituted for references to the Secretary of State in Sections 41 (1), 237 (5), 248 (2), and 321 (2) of the Lunacy Act, 1890, and in Sections 10 (2), 25 (2) (other than the proviso to that Sub-section), 47 (other than the proviso to that Section), and 65 (1) of the Mental Deficiency Act, 1913, and in paragraph (5) of the Schedule to that Act.

(2) Sections 26 and 54 (2) of the Mental Deficiency Act, 1913, shall be read as though the references therein to the Secretary of State included reference to the Minister of Health.

4. Nothing in this Order shall affect any of the powers and duties of the Secretary of State set out in the Second Schedule hereto.
