The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 25th day of March, 1920, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or Perpetual right

of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Aldershot, in the County of Southampton, and in the Diocese of Winchester :

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Aldershot is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Master and Brethren of the Hospital of Saint Cross, near Winchester, and the Almshouse of Noble Poverty (hereinafter called ‘ the said Master and Brethren ’):

“ And whereas the said Master and Brethren are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Aldershot, now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Winchester :

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, now Bishop of Winchester, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese, which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned :

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Aldershot which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recom-
