mended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say in the Parish of Aldershot:

Parish of Aldershot: "Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Master and Brethren (in testimony whereof they have sealed this Scheme with their Common or Corporate Seal), and with the consent of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Aldershot, now vested in the said Master and Brethren as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exer-cised by the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 22nd day of April, 1920, in the words and figures following, that is to say:— "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King Wälliam the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the Archdeaconry of Cheltenham, in the Diocese of Gloucester:

"Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council, bearing date the 29th day of October, 1919, and published in the London Gazette on the 31st day of the same month, the Parishes of Aston Magna, Blockley and Evenlode were severed from the Diocese of Worcester and included in the said Diocese of Gloucester and supervision thearchidiaconal of such Parishes was vested in the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Cirencester (now the Archdeaconry of Cheltenham) but no provision was made for the inclusion of the said Parishes in any of the Rural Deaneries within such Archdeaconry:

"And whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Edgar Charles Sumner, Bishop of Gloucester, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to some of the Rural: Deaneries within the said Archdeaconry of Cheltenham are desirable and should be carried into effect, and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Edgar Charles Sumner, Bishop said of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Com-missioners, humbly recommend and promissioners, humbly recommend and pro-pose that, as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the said Parishes of Aston Magna and Blockley shall be included in the Rural Deanery of Campden, and the said Parish of Evenlode shall be included in the Rural Deanery of Stow, and that each of the Parishes hereinbefore referred to shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery in which it is hereby included or to which it is hereby transferred and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other." matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas a No<sup>+</sup>ice of the said Scheme has, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore-mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Archdeacon affected by the Scheme, that is to say, the Archdeacon of Cheltenham, and such Archdeacon has expressed his approval of the proposed arrangements:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore. His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased
