During an attack upon a convoy on the 15th July, 1919, between Lakaband and Kapip, this N.C.O., although severely wounded, maintained communication with his Commanding Officer until the latter was killed.

For great coolness under fire at Hindubagh on the 28th July, 1919. He kept the two guns in his car working to the best advantage and inflicted heavy casualties on the enemy.
