## ISSUE OF METEOROLOGICAL REPORTS BY WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY.

*It is hereby notified that:—*

1. On and after June 1st, 1920, the following meteorological reports will be issued for general use, in addition to the hourly reports which are at present issued primarily for the Aviation Services between London and the Continent (M.O.2622).

2. *Synoptic Telegrams* in the same code as hitherto used (M.O.2620) will be issued at:—

0315 G.M.T.

2015     "

(NOTE.—The 0845 G.M.T. message takes the place of the message previously issued at 0915 G.M.T.)

3. *General Inferences* in plain language based upon observations at 0700 and 1800 G.M.T. will be issued at:—

4. The following is an example of such an inference:—

"Pressure has again become high over Iceland and a deep depression over the Skagerak region is increasing in intensity.

The resultant North-Westerly to Northerly wind current over the British Isles will maintain rather cold weather with local showers and variable skies during the next day or two."
