CARGOES EX ENEMY VESSELS SEIZED BY PORTUGAL.

With reference to the notification which was published in the London Gazette on the 18th ultimo, relative to goods still unclaimed exenemy vessels seized by Portugal, His Majesty's Minister at Lisbon reports that, ac-

cording to information which he has received from the Portuguese authorities, the ordinary Customs regulations, under which claims can be made in respect of goods lying in the Portuguese Customs are now applicable to these goods, and that on such claims being presented to the Portuguese authorities any contemplated sales are suspended.
