"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, to sanction, inter alia, the grant of allowances to certain Officers of the Engineer Branch when in charge of machinery and when Senior Engineer of a Ship in which an Engineer Commander is allowed in the complement:

"And whereas we are of opinion that allowances should be paid to ratings under similar

conditions:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the grant at our discretion of the allowances set forth in the annexed Schedule, with effect as from the dates on which Charge Pay and Senior Allowance cease to be payable under former Regula-

"2. A Senior Engineer's Allowance of 1s. per diem to Engine Room Artificer and Mechanician ratings performing the duties of Senior Engineer in Ships allowed an Engineer Commander, whether in commission or in reserve.

"3. Machinery and Senior Engineer's Allowances, each of 1s. per diem, under the above conditions to Engine Room Artificer and Mechanician ratings in Ships paid off out of commission for refit, except during periods when the Dockyard Officers take over entire charge of the Machinery of a vessel for

Thorough Repair.

A Machinery Allowance of 6d. per diem (in lieu of the Charge Pay authorized by Order in Council of 21st December, 1917) to Engine Room ratings, other than Artificers and Mechanician ratings (but including Motor Mechanic and Motor Boat Ratings), in charge of the machinery of Small Craft, whether steam or motor driven, the horse-power of which exceeds 100, such allowance not to be paid in respect of boats forming part of the equipment of Your Majesty's Ships or of vessels maintained in reserve

"5. A Machinery Allowance of 1s. per diem (in lieu of the Charge Pay authorized by Order in Council of 3rd February, 1916) to the rating in charge of engines at Your Majesty's Wireless

Telegraph Stations abroad."
