the Subsistence they can for their Troops.
The Forces of the Allies do almost equal
the Enemy's, especially in Foot; They are
very advantageously posted, and their de-
sign seems to be, to let the Enemy haras
themselves, that they may deal with them
upon better Terms when their Army is
diminished.

Vienna, June 13. The 9th Instant, being the
Emperor's Birth-day, (when he entred into the
57th year of his Age,) was observed here with
much Solemnity. They continue to send great
quantities of Provisions and Ammunition by Wa-
ter to *Hungary*, for the use of the Imperial Army,
which, by our freshest Advice, marches towards
the River *Theysse*; from whence they will proceed,
according to the Account they receive of the
Enemy's Motions.

Francfort, June 20. N.S. General *Thungen*, who was
lately taken Prisoner by a small French Party, is
released, and returned to *Mentz*, of which place
he is Governor.

Dublin, June 17. The Letters from
Corke, of the 14th Instant, give an Ac-
count, that a Squadron of English Men
of War appeared off that Harbour, and
that they were going to *Galway*.

Guernsey, June 11. Capt. *Bowles*, Commander of
His Majesty's Ship the *Lime*, is come in here, and
brought with him a French Privateer of 6 Guns,
4 Patereroes, and 52 Men, called the *St. Anne* of
St. Malo, which he took the 8th Instant, near the
Starrs. Capt. *Bowles* re-took also a Ketch, called the
St. Joseph of *Bilboa*, bound to *Topham*; which was
taken the day before by the said Privateer.

Newcastle, June 20. Yesterday, and this day,
above 200 Sail of Laden Colliers went over the
Bar, and intend to fail this evening, or to mor-
row morning, under Convoy of two Men of
War.

Falmouth, June 20. The 17th, arrived here the
Spanish Expedition, in 4 days from the *Groyne*.
This morning came in the *Panther* of *London*, of
36 Guns, Capt. *Fuller* Commander; and brought
in with him the *Hopewell* of *London*, which he re-
took from the French off the Lands End.

Dartmouth, June 21. My Lord *Berkeley* intend-
ed to sail with the Fleet on *Thursday*, and on *Sa-*
unday last; but the contrary Winds and bad Wea-
ther keep them still in *Torbay*.

Bristol, June 23. On the 18th arrived here the
Sloop Frigate of this place, in 9 weeks from *Mont-*
ferrat; and this day the *Concord* and *Herman*, both
from *Jamaica*.

The Association of the Nonconforming Mini-

The Associations of the County of *Kerry*,
of the Borough of *Port Arlington*, and of the
Inn-Keepers and Victuallers of the District of
Armagh, in the Kingdom of *Ireland*, have been
likewise presented to their Excellencies.

The Dutch Mail of Friday last is not yet come in.
