BY THE KING.
A PROCLAMATION
FOR A BANK HOLIDAY.

GEORGE R.I.

WE, considering that it is desirable that Thursday, the first day of July next, should be kept as a close holiday in all Banks throughout the United Kingdom, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in pursuance of Section four of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, appoint the said Thursday, the first day of July next, to be observed as a Bank Holiday in the United Kingdom, for the purposes of the said Act, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly:

And whereas it is customary for the usual Bank Holidays to be kept as holidays by Our loving subjects generally and not only for the purposes of the said Act, but it is not Our intention that the said first day of July should be kept as a general holiday in the United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, We do hereby enjoin that

the said first day of July shall not be kept as or deemed by virtue of this Our Royal Proclamation to be a holiday in the United Kingdom, for any purposes whatsoever other than the purposes of the said Act.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Twenty-eighth day of *June*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty, and in the Eleventh year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 60 of the Supreme Court of Judicature Act, 1873, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council from time to time to direct that there shall be District Registrars of the

High Court in such places as shall be in such Order mentioned for districts to be thereby defined and for the purposes in the said Section referred to, and that His Majesty may thereby appoint that any person in the said Section referred to shall and may be a District Registrar of the High Court for the said purposes:

And whereas it is enacted by Section 13 of the Supreme Court of Judicature Act, 1875, that where any such Order has been made, two persons may, if required, be appointed to perform the duties of District Registrar in any district named in the Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. There shall cease to be a District Registry at Poole, and in lieu thereof there shall be a District Registry at Bournemouth.

2. The district of the said District Registry at Bournemouth shall be the Court District of the County Court of Dorsetshire and Hampshire held at Poole and Bournemouth.

3. The Joint Registrars for the time being of the said County Court held at Poole and Bournemouth shall be, and they are hereby, appointed to perform the duties of District Registrar in the said district.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1920, and may be cited as the District Registries (Poole and Bournemouth) Order in Council, 1920, and shall be read with the District Registries Order in Council, 1899, which shall have effect as amended by this Order.

WHEREAS by Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, it is (amongst other things) provided that, if a majority of the whole Council of a Borough agree to petition, and the Council thereupon petition, The King for the alteration of the number and boundaries of its Wards, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, from time to time, by Order in Council, to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough shall be divided, and that the Borough shall be divided into that number of Wards, and that where an Order in Council has been so made the Secretary of State shall appoint a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of the Wards, and apportioning the Councillors among them:

And whereas a majority of the whole Council of the Borough of Stamford, on the 11th day of August, 1919, agreed to petition, and the said Council thereupon petitioned, His Majesty for the alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the said Borough:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 25th day of November, 1919, to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough of Stamford should be henceforth divided, and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be three:

And whereas the Secretary of State did appoint Stephen Philpot Low, Esquire, a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of the said Wards, and apportioning the Councillors of the said Borough among them:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 8th day of March, 1920:—

“BOROUGH OF STAMFORD.

“Scheme for determining the Boundaries of, and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of, the Borough of Stamford.

“1. *Number of Wards.*

“By Order of His Majesty in Council, dated the 25th day of November, 1919, the number of the Wards of the said Borough was fixed at three.

“2. *Nomenclature of Wards.*

1. All Saints.
2. St. George's.
3. St. Mary's.

“3. *Boundaries of Wards.*

“1. ALL SAINTS' WARD.

“Commencing at the junction of the Borough Boundary and the Liberty of Peterborough at a point in the centre of the River Welland about 420 feet South-west of the Bridge leading to the Nuns, and, following the Borough Boundary to the Tinwell Road, continuing along the Borough Boundary to Empingham Road, and from thence to New Town Casterton and along the South side of the Great North Road to a point about 715 yards East of the Tinwell Cross Roads, continuing along the Borough Boundary to the Little Casterton Road, and from thence along the East side of the Little Casterton Road to a point about 440 yards North of the Brick Works and following the Borough Boundary to Borderville on the West side of the Bourne and Ryhall Road, from thence along the West side of the Bourne and Ryhall Road to the Drift Road passing along the North side of the Drift Road for about 147 yards to the hedge at the West Boundary of Doughty Street, from thence 4 feet to the East along the hedge to a point about 160 yards North of the Drift Road, from thence going in a westerly direction along a parallel line 4 feet South of the hedge which is the Northern Boundary of the fields on the North side of the Drift Road to a point on the East side of Emlyn's Street about 57 yards South of Alexandra Road, following along the East side of Emlyn's Street to the North-east corner of the junction of Alexandra Road and Emlyn's Street, from thence along the North side of Alexandra Road to King's Road, then South along the East side of King's Road to the junction with New Cross Road passing along the North side of New Cross Road to the East side of Conduit Road along the East side of Conduit Road in a southerly direction for 173 yards crossing the road at this point and passing through the garden known as 'Upwell,' 56, Conduit Road to Bentley Street along which street for a distance of 140 feet it is about 5 feet from the North side and for the remaining length of the street along the South side to the Recreation Ground Road, from thence passing across Recreation Ground Road and the Recreation Ground in a straight line to the South-east corner of the outbuildings to No. 4, Gibson's Cottages and following the South Boundary

of this house and garden to the Awarded Road known as Gibson's Lane, passing along the East side of this road to the North-west corner of Robert's Row, and from thence for a distance of 15 feet along the North side of Robert's Row where it strikes off in a southerly direction along the East side of No. 5, Robert's Row to the South-west angle of Messrs. Lowe, Son and Cobbold's Bottling Department and across North Street to the Boundary Cross on the South side, from thence through Browne's Hospital along the East Wall of No. 4 and the West Wall of No. 5 through the Boundary Cross in the Southern Boundary of Browne's Hospital to the centre of Broad Street, then along the centre of this street in a South-westerly direction for a distance of 81 yards from which it branches off to the centre of the Eastern end of Crown Street, passing along the centre of Crown Street to Red Lion Square and along the East side of the Square about 6 yards from the building line to a point 8 yards West of the South-west corner of the London City and Midland Bank, and thence along the Southern side of the Square to the South-east corner of the Butter Market, passing down the centre of Horse Shoe Lane and across the Sheep Market to the centre of the Castle Dyke along the centre of Castle Dyke to the centre of the Lammas Bridge on the Westerly side, striking off in an Easterly direction along the centre of the Mill tail stream to its junction with the centre of the River Welland in a South-westerly direction to the point South-west of the Bridge to the Nuns where the Ward Boundary commenced.

" 2. ST. GEORGE'S WARD.

" Commencing at a point in the centre of the Welland at the junction with St. Mary's Ward and opposite the Ford Wharf Road, thence in an Easterly direction along the centre of the Welland to the G.N. Station, continuing in the same direction along the Borough Boundary to Hudds Mill to the junction of the River Gwash, continuing along the Boundary past Newstead, Grindlepits Spinney to the North-east corner of the Borough, thence along the Boundary to the West side of the Bourne Road at Borderville, passing in a Southerly direction along the West side of the Bourne Road to the Drift Road, along the North side of the Drift Road to the hedge joining the West Boundary of the land abutting on Doughty Street, thence North along this hedge to the North Boundary of the three fields abutting on the Drift Road, passing along this fence in a Westerly direction to the East side of Emlyn's Street at the North-west corner of Mr. Deer's property, from thence along the East side of Emlyn's Street to Alexandra Road, along the North side of this road to King's Road, passing South down the East side of King's Road to New Cross Road, along the North side of New Cross Road to the East side of Conduit Road, passing South along the East side of Conduit Road to East Street following along the centre of East Street in a Westerly direction to the Fire Station, around the centre of road in front of same and then in an Easterly direction along the centre of Elm Street to the East Boundary of the Rising Sun Public House, and along such boundary to centre of Broad Street, Easterly along the centre of this street to the West side of Star Lane, along the West side of Star Lane for a

distance of 75 feet from the centre of Broad Street, and thence in a Westerly and Southerly direction along the East Boundary of premises used in connection with Mr. Sanders' Slaughter House and along the party wall between Nos. 3 and 4, St. Paul's Street, from thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of St. Paul's Street to the junction with the centre of St. George's Street, along the centre of St. George's Street to a point opposite the party wall between Nos. 21 and 22, St. George's Street, thence along such party wall to the rear of No. 22, along the party wall in a Southerly direction at the rear to the garden of same, passing thence in a Westerly direction to the West side of the garden wall and along the West side of the garden wall of Nos. 18, 19 and 20, St. George's Street to the junction with the North Boundary of the White Hart Public House, thence following the North and West Boundary of the White Hart Public House and No. 15, St. George's Street to the junction with the garden wall of Orme House, following along the North Boundary of Orme House to the centre of Maiden Lane, thence in a straight line to the centre of roadway in St. George's Square, going East along the centre of St. George's Square to a point opposite the centre of the passage between the Assembly Rooms and No. 21, St. George's Square, along the centre of this passage and across the gardens of No. 21 in a Southerly direction to the South side of Wharf Road, following around the West Boundary of the garden wall adjoining the Ford to the centre of the River Welland.

" 3. ST. MARY'S WARD.

" Commencing in the centre of the River Welland at a point 34 yards West of the Town Bridge, from thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of the Mill Stream to the West side of the Lammas Bridge, passing along the West side of the Bridge in a Northerly direction across Bath Row and along the centre of Castle Dyke to Castle Street, across the Sheep Market to the centre of Horse Shoe Lane, along the centre of Horse Shoe Lane to the South-east corner of the Butter Market, from thence along the South side of Red Lion Square about 3 yards from the building line to a point 8 yards West of the South-west corner of the London City and Midland Bank, then along the East side of Red Lion Square about 6 yards from the building line to a point opposite the centre of Red Lion Street, along the centre of Red Lion Street to a point about 4 yards North of the North-east corner of Wellington Lane, from thence to the centre of Broad Street about 10 yards East of 52, Broad Street, passing along the centre of Broad Street to a point opposite the Boundary Cross in front of Browne's Hospital, from this point in a Northerly direction across Broad Street and through Browne's Hospital to the Boundary Cross in North Street, across North Street to the South-west corner of Messrs. Lowe, Son and Cobbold's Bottling Department, thence in a straight line to the North side of Robert's Row 5 yards East of the North-west corner along the North side of Robert's Row to the North-west corner, and from thence in a Northerly direction along the East side of the lane leading to Gibson's Cottages, at the end of which it passes along the South Boundary wall of Gibson's Cottages and from the South-

east corner of same across the Recreation Ground in a straight line to the North-west corner of Bentley Street and along the South side of Bentley Street to the Black Path, from thence in a straight line 5 feet from the front fence of Emlyn's Cottages and adjoining houses passing through the garden known as 'Upwell,' 56, Conduit Road, across the Conduit Road to the East side, and from thence along the East side of Conduit Road to the centre of East Street, following along the centre of East Street in a Westerly direction to the Fire Station, around the centre of road in front of same and then in an Easterly direction along the centre of Elm Street to the East Boundary of the Rising Sun Public House and along such boundary of centre of Broad Street Easterly along the centre of this street to the West side of Star Lane, along the West side of Star Lane for a distance of 75 feet from the centre of Broad Street, and thence in a Westerly and Southerly direction along the East Boundary of premises used in connection with Mr. Sanders' Slaughter House and along the party wall between Nos. 3 and 4 St. Paul's Street, from thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of St. Paul's Street to the junction with the centre of St. George's Street along the centre of St. George's Street to a point opposite the party wall between Nos. 21 and 22 St. George's Street, thence along such party wall to the rear of No. 22 along the party wall in a Southerly direction at the rear to the garden of same, passing thence in a Westerly direction to the West side of the garden wall and along the West side of the garden wall of Nos. 18, 19 and 20 St. George's Street to the junction with the North Boundary of the White Hart Public House thence following the North and West Boundary of the White Hart Public House and No. 15 St. George's Street to the junction with the garden wall of Orme House, following along the Northern Boundary of Orme House to the centre of Maiden Lane, thence in a straight line to the centre of roadway in St. George's Square going East along the centre of St. George's Square to a point opposite the centre of the passage between the Assembly Rooms and No. 21 St. George's Square along the centre of this passage and across the gardens of No. 21 in a Southerly direction to the South side of Wharf Road, following around the West Boundary of the garden wall adjoining the Ford to the centre of the River Welland passing in an Easterly direction along the river to the Great Northern Station thence along the Borough Boundary to the South side of Barnack Road going West along Barnack Road South side to Park Lane following the East side of Park Lane through the grounds of Lady Anne's House and along the Burghley Park wall on the East side of London Road to the Bottle Lodges from thence in a Westerly direction across the fields to the Midland Railway crossing the Railway in a North-westerly direction to the centre of the Welland and following the centre of the Welland in a North-easterly direction to the commencement of the Boundary near to the Town Bridge.

"The boundaries as above described are more particularly delineated in the Plan which is annexed hereto and forms part of the Scheme.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 12th day of June, 1920, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas Your Majesty has been graciously pleased to sanction the provision and maintenance of a Naval Force by the Dominion of Canada and to approve of such Naval Force being designated the Royal Canadian Navy:

"And whereas provision has been made by the Parliament of the Dominion of Canada for the application to the Royal Canadian Navy of the Naval Discipline Act, 1866, as amended by any subsequent enactment, and of the Regulations for the government of the Royal Navy for the time being in force as regards disciplinary matters and for the coming into operation in relation to the Royal Canadian Navy of the Naval Discipline (Dominion Naval Forces) Act, 1911:

"And whereas it is desirable that the Officers of the Royal Canadian Navy shall be interchangeable with those of the Royal Navy and that all such Officers shall rank with those of the Royal Navy according to their rank and the dates of their Commissions:

"And whereas this object will be secured if the Officers of the Royal Navy and the Royal Canadian Navy have Commissions which will be effective both in the Royal Navy and in the Royal Canadian Navy:

"And whereas subject to Your Majesty's approval, it has been agreed between us and the Government of the Dominion of Canada that Commissions which may be granted for service in Your Majesty's Fleet, whether by us or by the Governor-General of the Dominion of

Canada, shall include service both in the Royal Navy and in the Royal Canadian Navy, and that all Naval Commissions hitherto issued, whether by us or in accordance with the law in force in the Dominion of Canada shall be deemed to have been issued for service in Your Majesty's Fleet:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to declare Your approval of the agreement aforesaid and to authorize us to grant Commissions for service in Your Majesty's Fleet as hereinafter defined to any Officers of the Royal Navy and to authorize the Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada to grant Commissions for service in Your Majesty's Fleet as hereinafter defined to any Officers of the Royal Canadian Navy:

"And we also beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may by such Order in Council declare that in all future Commissions that may be granted in the Royal Navy or the Royal Canadian Navy the expression "Service in Your Majesty's Fleet" shall include service in the Royal Navy and in the Royal Canadian Navy:

"And further that all Naval Commissions issued hitherto, whether by us or in accordance with the law in force in the Dominion of Canada, may be deemed to have been issued for service in Your Majesty's Fleet as above defined."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 9th day of June, 1920, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council, dated the 22nd day of January, 1920, it was enacted, *inter alia*, that an allowance of 2s. 6d. per diem should be paid to Surgeon Lieutenants, Surgeon Lieutenant-Commanders, and Surgeon Commanders who have specialised in certain professional subjects, provided in the case of Surgeon Commanders that they are not appointed solely for such specialist duties and that the number of such officers to whom the

said allowance is payable at any one time is limited to 44, in the following proportion:—

"And whereas we are of opinion that the said allowance should also be payable to Officers who have specialised in Bacteriology and Pathology, and that the number of Officers to whom the said allowance is payable at any one time should be increased to 46 and should not be confined to any particular number in any particular subject provided the total number of 46 is not exceeded:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of an allowance of 2s. 6d. per diem to Surgeon Lieutenants, Surgeon Lieutenant-Commanders, and Surgeon Commanders who have specialised in professional subjects as indicated below, provided that the said allowance is not paid to more than 46 Officers at any one time and, in the case of Surgeon Commanders, that they are not appointed solely for such specialist duties:—

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 16th day of June, 1920, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, bearing date the 19th day of July, 1912, to approve of the institution of the rank of Mate with a view

to the advancement of Warrant Officers and Petty Officers to Commissioned Rank at an earlier age than was possible under previous regulations:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council, dated 21st January, 1914, sanction was given, *inter alia*, for Acting Mates (E), failing to qualify for confirmation as Mate (E), to be regarded as eligible for promotion to Artificer Engineer, irrespective of qualifying service, if not already holding that rank:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable that promotion from the Lower Deck to Commissioned Rank should be obtainable at an earlier age than is at present possible, in order that Officers so promoted may have fuller opportunity of reaching high rank in Your Majesty's Service; and further that any Acting Mates (E), not promoted from Warrant Rank, who revert to their former ratings after failing to qualify for confirmation for the rank of Mate (E), should be required to fulfil the same conditions for promotion to Warrant Rank as are applicable to other candidates:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following proposals:—

"1. Leading Seamen, Leading Signalmen, and Leading Telegraphists, as well as Warrant Officers and Petty Officers, to be eligible for selection for the rank of Acting Mate.

"Candidates finally selected by the Admiralty to be promoted to the rank of Acting Mate on appointment to undergo their courses.

"Acting Mates to be confirmed with their original seniority on satisfactorily completing all their courses.

"2. The provision in the Order in Council of 21st January, 1914, for Acting Mates (E), not promoted from Warrant Rank, who fail to qualify for confirmation to the rank of Mate (E) and are reverted to their former ratings, to be promoted to Warrant Rank irrespective of qualifying service, to be cancelled.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals where necessary."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of June, 1920, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been

an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas payment of Separation Allowances and kindred allowances in respect of members of Your Majesty's Marine Force borne on the books of Your Majesty's Ships during the period of hostilities has been duly sanctioned by Your Majesty's Orders in Council but payment of those allowances in respect of Marines not so borne has not yet received such sanction:

"And whereas when borne on shore strength Marines are subject to the provisions of the Army Act and of the Regulations and Orders for the Army, and Separation and kindred Allowances have, in consequence, been paid in respect of Marines while borne for service on shore at rates sanctioned from time to time by Your Majesty's Royal Warrant:

"And whereas in view of the conditions of Service which render Marines liable to serve afloat as well as on shore, and in order to avoid confusion, the Naval Regulations generally govern the issue of payment in respect of Marines on shore strength, whilst the rates payable are those in force for Your Majesty's Army:

"And whereas we consider it undesirable that such difference between rates payable in respect of Marines serving afloat and those on shore strength shall be continued:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the payments of Separation Allowance, Family Allowance, Parents' Allowance, London Allowance and Allotment Concession, which have already been effected at rates in force for Your Majesty's Army, and such further payments of these Allowances and their issue under Navy Regulations as may be so made up to the 30th September, 1920, in respect of members of Your Majesty's Marine Force while not borne on the books of Your Majesty's Ships:

"As from 1st October, 1920, Marines on shore strength to be entitled to Separation Allowances at the same rates and under the same conditions as may then be applicable to Seamen and Marines borne on the books of Your Majesty's Ships.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

1. This Order may be cited as "The China Order in Council, 1920," and shall be read as one with "The China Order in Council, 1904" (hereinafter called the "Principal Order"), and with any Order amending the same.

2. The words in Article 119 (f) of the Principal Order "not exceeding, as regards any matters provided for by 'The Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891,' fees fixed and allowed from time to time by any Order in Council made under that Act" are repealed.

3. The words in Article 164 of the Principal Order "shall, if not paid in British gold, be paid in China in British or Mexican dollars at the rate of exchange fixed periodically by the Treasury" are repealed, and the following words are substituted therefor:—

"shall, if not paid in British gold, be paid in China in dollar currency at the rate of 10 dollars to the pound sterling."

4. Any fee paid previous to the making of this Order shall be deemed to be valid if paid in accordance with the provisions of Articles 2 and 3 of this Order.

5. This Order shall take effect on the day on which it is first exhibited in the public office of the Supreme Court at Shanghai.

"5. The above fees, if not paid in British gold, are to be paid in China in dollar currency at the rate of 10 dollars to the pound sterling."

3. Any fee paid previous to the making of

this Order shall be deemed to be valid if paid in accordance with the provisions of Article 2 of this Order.

4. This Order shall take effect on the day on which it is first exhibited in the public office of the Supreme Court at Shanghai.

And the Right Honourable George Nathaniel, Earl Curzon of Kedleston, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

WHEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapelries, and other Places or Districts may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and Places altogether Extra-Parochial may, in some instances, with advantage, be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place or District within the Diocese of such Archbishop or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other Parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, Parochial or Extra-Parochial, so as to form a Separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend Edwin, Lord Bishop of Chelmsford, hath made a Re-

presentation in writing, dated the 24th March, 1920, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

“ I, John Edwin, by Divine Permission Bishop of Chelmsford, do in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Act of Parliament of the First and Second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria hereby represent to your Grace:—

“ 1. There is in the county of Essex and my Diocese of Chelmsford the Vicarage of Epping the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the Parish of Theydon Garnon and contains according to the census of 1911 a population of Two thousand five hundred and eight and the net annual value thereof is Six hundred and thirty-six pounds.

“ 2. In the same County and Diocese is the Rectory of Theydon Garnon the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of One thousand three hundred and thirty and the net annual value thereof is Five hundred and eighty pounds.

“ 3. The north-west part of the Parish of Theydon Garnon which lies to the north-west of the Chipping Ongar branch of the Great Eastern Railway lies at a considerable distance from the Parish Church of Theydon Garnon but close to the Parish Church of Epping and it appears to me that the following alterations in the boundaries thereof may be made with advantage to the interests of religion, videlicet—the said portion of the Parish of Theydon Garnon which lies to the north-west of the Chipping Ongar branch of the Great Eastern Railway being contiguous to the Parish of Epping may be united to the last mentioned Parish.

“ 4. Sir John Henry Thorold, of Syston Park, Grantham, in the County of Lincoln, Baronet, The Most Honourable Frederick William Fane, Marquess of Bristol, M.V.O., and John Augustine Longley of 41 Draycott Place in the County of London, Barrister-at-Law, are on the nomination of Ernest James Wythes of Copped Hall, Epping, in the said County of Essex, Esquire, J.P. the Patrons of the said Benefice of Epping and Sir Anthony Charles Sykes Abdy of No. 100 Eaton Square in the County of London, Baronet, is the Patron of the said Benefice of Theydon Garnon.

“ 5. The Reverend Henry Eden Olivier is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Epping and the Reverend Walter Pountney Rowley is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Theydon Garnon.

“ 6. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said Act I, the said Bishop, have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the said portion of the Parish of Theydon Garnon proposed to be annexed to the said Parish of Epping and the mode in which it appears to me the alteration may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithes, Dues, Rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents and in case you shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied therewith I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consents of the

Patrons and Incumbents thereto to His Majesty in Council.”

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

“ SCHEME.

“ 1. It is proposed to separate the following District from the Parish of Theydon Garnon in the County of Essex and Diocese of Chelmsford and unite the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of Epping in the same County and Diocese.

“ Such District shall consist of that portion of the said Parish of Theydon Garnon which is bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the centre of the Great Eastern Railway running between London and Chipping Ongar immediately beneath the centre of the Bridge which crosses the said Railway at Stonards Hill and proceeding thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of the said Railway until it reaches the eastern boundary of the Parish of Theydon Bois and proceeding thence in a northerly and westerly direction along the said boundary until it reaches the south-eastern boundary of the Parish of Epping and proceeding thence in a north-easterly direction along the said boundary until it reaches the centre of Stonards Hill whence it proceeds in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Stonards Hill aforesaid until it reaches the point in the centre of the Bridge crossing above mentioned Railway from whence the said imaginary line commenced which said District is coloured pink on the plan annexed hereto.

“ 2. The Inhabitants of the said District shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the Parish Church of Theydon Garnon (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within the said Church and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same) and shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the said Parish Church of Theydon Garnon but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Epping and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868, to the repair of the said Church.

“ 3. The Incumbent of the Parish of Epping shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the above mentioned District.

“ 4. No alteration shall be made in the Patronage or endowments of either of the said Benefices except that all fees in respect of Banns and Marriages of persons residing within the District above referred to shall continue to be received by the present Incumbent of the Parish of Theydon Garnon during his Incumbency thereof on the determination of which such fees shall be received by the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of Epping aforesaid.

“ CONSENTS.

“ We, Sir John Henry Thorold of Syston Park, Grantham, in the County of Lincoln, Baronet, The Most Honourable Frederick William Fane, Marquess of Bristol, M.V.O., and John Augustine Longley, of 41 Draycott Place, in the County of London, Barrister-at-Law, being the Patrons or persons entitled to present to the Benefice of Epping in the County of Essex and Diocese of Chelmsford in case the

same were now vacant on the nomination of Ernest James Wythes, of Copped Hall, Epping, in the County of Essex, Esquire, J.P., and the said Ernest James Wythes and the Reverend Henry Eden Olivier the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Epping, Sir Anthony Charles Sykes Abdy, of No. 100 Eaton Square, in the County of Middlesex, Baronet, being the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefice of Theydon Garnon in the said County and Diocese in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend Walter Pountney Rowley the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Theydon Garnon do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter therein contained.

" That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Pluralities Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithe Rent Charges and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments and in

respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which Scheme together with the Consents in writing of Sir John Henry Thorold, Baronet, The Most Honourable Frederick William Fane, Marquess of Bristol, M.V.O., and John Augustine Longley being the Patrons entitled to present to the Benefice of Epping in case the same were now vacant on the nomination of Ernest James Wythes and the said Ernest James Wythes and the Reverend Henry Eden Olivier, the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Epping, Sir Anthony Charles Sykes Abdy, Baronet, being the Patron entitled to present to the Benefice of Theydon Garnon in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend Walter Pountney Rowley, the Incumbent of the Benefice of Theydon Garnon.

" The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the Consents above referred to are hereunto annexed.

" And We, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said Scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect.

COMMUNICATION BETWEEN CREDITORS AND DEBTORS OF BRITISH AND GERMAN NATIONALITY.

THE TREATY OF PEACE ORDER, 1919.

As a result of communications which have passed between the British and German Clearing Offices, the practice regulating direct intercourse between British and German creditors and debtors upon the subject of their pre-war debts has been agreed upon, and the British Clearing Office, pursuant to Section I (ii) of the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, hereby licenses such intercourse to the following extent, namely:—

British creditors and debtors may communicate in writing with their German debtors and creditors direct with regard to pre-war debts or debts arising out of pre-war transactions or contracts, with the sole object of ascertaining the particulars of indebtedness between the parties, provided that no proposal or suggestion is made for the payment or settlement of such debts except through the Clearing Offices, and that the party so communicating shall retain true copies of such communications and the original replies thereto, and hand the same to the Controller on demand at any time.

Any direct communication outside the scope of this licence is an offence punishable by fine, with or without imprisonment.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Fur Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Fur) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Trade Board's notice dated 9th April, 1920, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 8th April, 1920, in respect of certain classes of Male Workers, the variations of the Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the Notice of Proposal to Vary being given.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates for Certain Classes of Male Workers.

SECTION I.—Male Workers of 21 years of age and over in the Dyers' and Dressers' Section of the Trade:—

Variation Proposed. Per Week of 48 Hours.

(a) Workers employed as Grounders, Smearers, or as Drum and Cage Hands (not including workers employed merely in carrying Skins to Drums and Cages), from 55s. to 58s.

(b) Workers employed as Combers or Dippers and all other Male Workers of 21 years of age and over employed in the Dyers' and Dressers' Section of the Trade, excepting Tubbers, from 53s. to 56s.

No variation is proposed in respect of the General Minimum Time-Rate fixed for Tubbers.

Variation Proposed. Per Week of 48 Hours.

SECTION II.—All other Male Workers in the Trade of 21 years of age and over (except Tubbers) other than those specified in Section I of this Schedule and other than those specified in Sections I, II and IV of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board dated 9th April, 1920, from 53s. to 56s.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates.

Overtime Rates, calculated on the General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Part I of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part IV of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board, dated 9th April, 1920, shall apply in substitution for the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board, in the Notice above referred to, to be the Normal Number of hours of Work in the Trade.

PART III.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the Provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this Notice, to all workers (including Homeworkers) in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Fur) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The dressing, dyeing and making-up of furs or of skins for Furriers' purposes; including the dressing or dyeing or general preparation of furs or skins; the manufacture of furs or skins into garments, rugs or other articles; the remaking, repairing or

cleaning of articles made from furs or skins where carried on by fur dressers or fur manufacturers; the lining with fur of coats, cloaks, mantles, capes, gloves or similar articles where carried out by fur manufacturers; bundling, packing, warehousing and other operations carried on by fur skin merchants, fur dressers, fur dyers or fur manufacturers, but excluding the making-up of fur toys, purses, boots, shoes, or slippers, the making of fur hats, when carried on in association or in conjunction with the making or trimming of men's, women's or children's headgear from other materials; warehousing, packing, and other similar operations carried on in shops wholly, mainly or substantially engaged in the Retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the premises.

Provided that the above Minimum Rates of Wages shall not apply to workers employed in the dressing, or dyeing, or general preparation of Skins, or in the manufacture of skins into garments, rugs or other articles except where such dressing, dyeing, general preparation or manufacture is carried on by fur dressers, fur dyers or fur manufacturers, or otherwise for furriers' purposes.

PART IV.

Section I.—The above General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Section II.—The above Minimum Rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 26th June, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Fur Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

The sale of other goods when any such sale is carried on in association with the sales specified in paragraph 1 or paragraph 2 above if such sale involves the employment of workers who are also employed in those sales; including the following or similar operations when incidental to or carried on in conjunction with the sales specified in 1, 2, or 3 above:

(i) checking, testing, grading;

(ii) weighing, measuring;

(iii) packeting, boxing, bundling, bagging, parcelling, packing, unpacking, labelling;

(iv) collecting, despatching, delivering;

(v) stock-keeping, warehousing, storing, cold storing, refrigerating;

(vi) portering, loading, unloading, lift or hoist operating;

(vii) timekeeping, cleaning premises;

(viii) adjusting implements, cleaning implements, utensils or receptacles;

(ix) cleaning goods;

(x) window or show-case dressing;

(xi) garaging, horse or motor keeping, cleaning vehicles;

(xii) mixing, blending, crushing, grinding, mincing, shredding, cutting;

(d) operations performed by workers engaged in any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto;

(e) Post Office business;

(f) operations in agriculture within the meaning of the Corn Production Act, 1917;

(g) operations performed by workers employed by wholesale brokers or merchants who do not employ warehouse workers or carters;

(h) sales and operations incidental thereto covered by the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920.

RABIES.

The parishes of Oakley, Worminghall, Ickford, Shabbington, and Long Crendon.

In the Administrative County of Oxford.

The petty sessional divisions of Watlington (except the parishes of Lewknor, Aston Rowant, Crowell, Chinnor, Emmington, Sydenham, and the detached part of South Weston) and Bullingdon (except the parishes of Iffley, Cowley, Headington, Marston, Wolvercot, Cutslow, Woodeaton, Elsfield, Stowood, Stanton, St. John, Horton-cum-Studley, Studley, Beckley, Noke and its detached part, Hampton Gay and Hampton Poyle), and the parishes of Crowmarsh Gifford, Newnham Murren, Mongewell, North Stoke, Ipsden, Checkendon, South Stoke, Goring, Whitchurch, Nettlebed, and Bix.

In the Administrative County of Berks.

The boroughs of Wallingford and Abingdon; the petty sessional divisions of Wallingford and Abingdon (except the parishes of Garford, Lyford, Frilford and its detached part, Tubney and its detached part, Fyfield, Kingston Bagpuize, Draycott Moor, Appleton with Eaton, Bessels Leigh, Cumnor, North Hinksey, South Hinksey, and Wytham), and the parishes of Harwell, Chilton, Compton, Aldworth, Streatley, Basildon, and Ashampstead.

(2) A District comprising :—

In the Administrative County of Kent.

The boroughs of Folkestone and Hythe, the petty sessional division of Elham (except the parishes of Elmsted, Stelling, Stelling Minnis, and Acrise, the two detached parts of the parish of Aldington which adjoin the parish Bonnington, and such portion of the parish of

Elham as lies to the north and north-east of the road from Acrise to Elmsted via Acrise Place, Millhill Farm, Mount, and Mockbeggar), and the parishes of Smeeth, Bircholt, Brabourne (excluding its detached part), Dymchurch, Orgarswick, Eastbridge, and Burmarsh, and the detached part of the parish of Brook.

(3) A District comprising :—

In the Administrative County of Essex.

The boroughs of Colchester and Harwich, and the petty sessional divisions of Tendring, and Lexden and Winstree.

The petty sessional divisions of Chertsey and Woking, and the parishes of Walton-upon-Thames, Cobham, Stoke D'Abernon, Esher, West Molesey, East Molesey, Thames Ditton, Long Ditton, and Hook.

In the Administrative County of Middlesex.

The petty sessional division of Spelthorne.

(5) *In the Administrative County of Glamorgan.*
