The following Amendments to the Statutes of Queen's College, Oxford, made by the Governing Body of the College on the 19th June, 1920, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

Whereas it is expedient that the interests of the University should be protected by providing (1) that there shall be no diminution in the assessed contribution of the College to the Common University Fund; (2) that existing charges for University purposes shall take priority over new charges whether for the College or for University purposes:

The College, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and of any other power enabling it, at a General Meeting of the Governing Body, specially summoned for the purpose, and after due notice, held upon the 19th day of June, 1920, by the unanimous vote of the persons present and voting made the following amendment to a Statute made by the University Commissioners for the Queen's College, Oxford, and ordered it to be submitted to His Majesty in Council, to be dealt with as provided by the said Act:

In *Statt. Tit. XXI (Disposal of Revenue)*, Clause 1, at the end of the clause, after the words "and to the payment of the charges imposed thereby" shall be added the words:

Provided that (1) any sum paid by the College for any University purpose in any year under the provisions of any Amending Statute made by the College on or after December 1, 1919, and subsequently approved by His Majesty in Council, shall not be reckoned against the amount of the contribution due from the College under the provisions of the Statute "Concerning College Contributions for University purposes" made by the University of Oxford Commissioners wholly for the University under the Powers of that Act.

(2) Any charges (including any increase of existing charges) imposed or authorized to be imposed on the revenues of the College, whether for College or for University purposes, by any Amending Statute made by the College on or after December 1, 1919, and subsequently approved by His Majesty in Council, shall in the event of any deficiency of the revenues of the College in any year be postponed to any charges for University purposes imposed or authorized by any Statute in force on November 30, 1919, and not subsequently repealed, or made by the College on or before November 30, 1919, and subsequently approved by His Majesty in Council.

Notice of denunciation of the Convention respecting Commercial relations between France and the Seychelles Islands, signed at London, April 16th, 1902, was given by the French Government on September 10th, 1918, and was published in the London Gazette of October 15th, 1918. His Majesty's Government having decided to terminate this Convention, notice to that effect was given to the French Government by His Majesty's Ambassador in Paris on the 5th instant.
