WHEREAS by Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapelries, and other Places or Districts may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and Places altogether Extra-Parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted Separate Parishes for Ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place or District within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a separate Benefice by itself or be united to any other Parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, Parochial or Extra-Parochial, so as to form a separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a Separate Parish for Ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme

of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with any such scheme or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas The Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of York, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, certified to His Majesty in Council, by his Report dated the 10th day of March, 1920, as follows:—

"The undersigned Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of York, Primate of England and Metropolitan, in pursuance of the 26th Section of an Act passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the 1st and 2nd years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, hereby reports to Your Majesty in Council as follows:—

"1. That there are in the City and County of Kingston-upon-Hull in our Diocese of York certain Vicarages and Parishes specified in the Schedule hereunder written the boundaries whereof are well known and defined and are indicated so far as they are affected by this Scheme by red verge lines on the plan hereto annexed.

"2. That the populations, net annual values, Patrons and Incumbents of the said Parishes are also set out in the said Schedule.

"3. That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the 1st and 2nd years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, and the 2nd and 3rd years of the reign of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 49, the following alterations in the boundaries of the various Parishes men-

tioned in the said Schedule may be advantageously made to wit:—

(a) The part of the Parish of St. John Newland edged round with and hatched brown on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Mary Sculcoates.

(b) The part of the Parish of St. Matthew coloured yellow on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Thomas.

(c) The part of the Parish of St. Mary Lowgate which is situate within the limits of the boundaries of the Parish of Holy Trinity and coloured brown on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Holy Trinity and the triangular piece of the said Parish which lies north of a line drawn through the middle of Queens Dock and coloured yellow on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Philip.

(d) The detached parts of the Parish of Holy Trinity situate within the limits of the said Parish of St. Mary Lowgate and coloured red on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of St. Mary.

(e) The part of the Parish of St. Paul edged round with and hatched red on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Christ Church and the part thereof coloured yellow on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Philip.

(f) The part of the Parish of St. Barnabas coloured green on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Thomas and the part thereof coloured blue on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. James.

(g) The part of the Parish of St. Mary Sculcoates edged round with and hatched blue on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Paul.

(h) The detached part of the Parish of Holy Trinity edged round with and hatched lake on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Barnabas.

(i) The detached part of the Parish of Holy Trinity coloured lake on the said Plan bounded on the south-west side by the Parish of St. Matthew, on the north side by the Parish of St. Augustine, and on the east side by the Parish of St. Jude with the exception of that part thereof known as the Hymers College Estate situate in the centre thereof may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Jude.

(j) The part of the Parish of Holy Trinity which is edged round with and hatched yellow on the said Plan, with the exception of that part which forms the site of the old German Church at the corner of Nile Street, may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Luke and the part thereof which is edged round with and hatched green on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. James.

"4. That pursuant to the directions contained in the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament the said Archbishop has prepared a Scheme in writing appended to this Report describing the mode in which it appears to him the alterations above described may be made with justice to all parties concerned and I do certify the same to Your Majesty in Council with the Consents in writing to the said Scheme of the said Archbishop and other Patrons of the various Benefices concerned as set out in the said Schedule and also the Consents of the Incumbents thereof as also set out in the said Schedule and to be affected thereby to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it should be thought expedient so to do may make an Order for carrying such Scheme into effect.

The separation of those parts of the respective Parishes of St. John Newland, St. Matthew, St. Mary Lowgate, Holy Trinity, St. Paul, St. Barnabas, St. Mary Sculcoates from those Parishes as described in the Representation hereunto annexed and the annexation of the same to the several Parishes specified in the said Representation respectively.

“2. The Incumbents of the various Parishes from which the said parts are so separated as aforesaid shall cease to have Cure of Souls within such parts proposed to be transferred and the Incumbents of the various Parishes to which they are prepared to be so transferred shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the same respectively.

The fees for such Offices and Services performed for the Inhabitants of the said portions of the various Parishes proposed to be transferred as aforesaid or arising within the limit of the same and usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice shall belong to the Incumbents of the various Parishes and Benefices to which they are proposed to be transferred as aforesaid respectively.

“5. No alteration shall be made in respect of the Patronage or any Glebe Land, Tithe, Tithe Rentcharge or other Endowment of any of the said Benefices or Parishes proposed to be affected by this Scheme.

"That there is in the County and Diocese of York, the Parish of the Rectory of Stokesley which comprises the Township of Great Busby (which includes the hamlet of Little Busby) the boundaries whereof are well known and defined, and of which The Reverend Canon Robert Fisher, M.A., is Incumbent.

"That there is also in the same County and Diocese the Parish of the New Vicarage of Carlton in Cleveland which adjoins the said Township of Great Busby and of which the Reverend John Latimer Kyle, B.A., is Incumbent.

"That according to the last census the population of the said Parish of Stokesley, inclusive of the said Township of Great Busby was 1789 persons, that of the said Parish of Carlton in Cleveland was 282 persons, and that of the said Township of Great Busby 122 persons.

"That the net annual value of the said Rectory of Stokesley is £941 or thereabouts and that of the said New Vicarage of Carlton in Cleveland is £89 or thereabouts.

"That the Patronage of the said Rectory of Stokesley is vested in us The said Archbishop in right of our Archbishopric, and that of the said New Vicarage of Carlton in Cleveland in Fred Hall of Carlton in Cleveland, aforesaid, Esquire.

"That the said Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefices of Stokesley and Carlton in Cleveland are consenting parties to the separation and annexation hereinafter proposed.

"That the said Township of Great Busby is distant upwards of two miles by the nearest road from the Parish Church of Stokesley, and is only a distance of about half a mile or thereabouts from the Parish Church of Carlton in Cleveland.

"That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of the said Act of

Parliament, the Township of Great Busby may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Stokesley to which it at present belongs, and be united for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Carlton in Cleveland aforesaid.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the before mentioned Act the Archbishop has prepared a Scheme in writing appended to this Report describing the mode in which it appears to him the alterations above referred to may be best effected, and how the changes consequent thereupon in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments and in respect of Patronage and Rights to Pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, and the said Archbishop being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with such Scheme he doth by this Report to Your Majesty in Council certify the same to Your Majesty in Council with the Consents in writing of the respective Patrons and Incumbents of the said Parishes of Stokesley and Carlton in Cleveland, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it shall be thought expedient and proper so to do make an Order for carrying such Scheme into effect.

"COSMO EBOR."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Archbishop and the Consents of the Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefices respectively are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That the Township of Great Busby (which includes the hamlet of Little Busby) in the Parish of Stokesley in the County and Diocese of York shall be separated from that Parish to which it at present belongs and be united to and form part of the Parish of Carlton in Cleveland for Ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the Incumbent of the Parish of Stokesley shall cease to have Cure of Souls within the said Township of Great Busby and the Incumbent of the Parish of Carlton in Cleveland shall have exclusive Cure of Souls within such Township.

"That the inhabitants of the said Township of Great Busby shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the Parish Church of Stokesley or any other Church or Chapel now or hereafter to be erected within that Parish, but shall be liable as other Inhabitants of the Parish of Carlton in Cleveland subject to the provisions of 'The Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868,' for the repair of the Parish Church of Carlton in Cleveland aforesaid.

"That the inhabitants of the said Township of Great Busby shall have the same rights as to pews and the performance of all offices and services of the Church at the said Parish Church of Carlton in Cleveland and otherwise in relation to the said Church as the other inhabitants of the said Parish of Carlton in Cleveland.

"That the Fees for all such offices and services performed for the inhabitants of the said Township of Great Busby transferred as aforesaid arising within the limits of the same and usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice shall belong to and be received by the Incumbent of the Benefice of Carlton in Cleveland aforesaid.

"That no alteration shall be made as to the Patronage or Endowment or as to Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent charges and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates or Payments of either of the said

two Benefices of Stokesley and Carlton in Cleveland to be affected by this Scheme.

"CONSENTS.

"We, Cosmo Gordon by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of York, Primate of England and Metropolitan, the Patron or person entitled to present to the Rectory and Parish Church of Stokesley, and I, Fred Hall, the Patron or person entitled to present to the New Vicarage and Parish Church of Carlton in Cleveland, both in the County of York, and Canon Robert Fisher, Clerk, M.A., and John Latimer Kyle, Clerk, B.A., the respective Incumbents of the said Rectory and Parish Church of Stokesley and the said New Vicarage and Parish Church of Carlton in Cleveland do hereby respectively signify our assent to the foregoing Report and Scheme and to the several matters and things therein stated and proposed.

AERATED WATERS TRADE BOARD (SCOTLAND).

PROPOSAL TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Scotland under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Aerated Waters Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Aerated Waters) Order, 1919, hereby give notice as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918 (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such Notice being given), that they Propose to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates as set out in their Notice dated 11th June, 1920, in their application to certain classes of Male and Female Workers, the proposed variation of the Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below:—

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates for Certain Classes of Male and Female Workers.

SECTION I.

For Male Workers of 21 years of age and over, from 1s. 2d. per hour to 1s. 3d. per hour.

SECTION II.

For Female Workers of 18 years of age and over, with not less than six months' experience in the trade, from 7½d. per hour to 8d. per hour.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Certain Classes of Male and Female Workers.

Overtime Rates calculated on the General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Part I of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part II of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board, dated 11th June, 1920, fixing Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Workers, shall apply in substitution for the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule in respect of hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board, in the said Notice dated 11th June, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III.

The above minimum rates of wages shall apply subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this notice, to all workers in Scotland who are employed during the whole

or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Aerated Waters) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The manufacture, wherever carried on, of mineral or aerated waters, non-alcoholic cordials, flavoured syrups, unfermented sweet drinks and other similar beverages, and the manufacture in unlicensed premises of brewed liquors,

including:

(a) the operations of bottle washing, bottling and filling and all other operations preparatory to the sale of any of the aforesaid liquors in bottles, jars, syphons, casks or other similar receptacles;

and *including also:*

(b) the operations of bottle washing, bottling and filling and all subsidiary operations preparatory to the sale in bottles, jars or other similar receptacles of cider, ale, stout, porter and other alcoholic beers, where all or any of such last-mentioned operations are, or is, conducted or carried on in association with or in conjunction with all or any of the operations specified under (a) above so as to form a common or interchangeable form of employment for workers, and whether the two sets of operations or any of them are or is, carried on simultaneously or not.

PART IV.

SECTION I.

The above minimum rates of wages shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorized by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.

The above minimum rates of wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposal to vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 6th July, 1920. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Aerated Waters Trade Board (Scotland), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

GENERAL ORDER (TEMPORARY AMENDMENT) OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR AREAS IN ENGLAND.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order:—

Areas to which the Order applies.

1. This Order shall apply to all Areas or

parts of Areas situate in England to which the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, have been applied and in which hours for the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor in licensed premises and clubs are prescribed by Article 2 of the Orders of the Board in force in the said Areas.

Effect of Order.

2. During the prescribed period in which the Summer Time Act, 1916, is in force for the year 1920 the hours between 7 p.m. and 10 p.m. shall be substituted for the Sunday evening hours prescribed by the said Article in each of the said Orders for the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor for consumption on the premises and be the hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises and be consumed in licensed premises and clubs in the evening on Sundays; and the hours between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. shall be substituted for the Sunday evening hours prescribed by the said Article for the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor for consumption off the premises and be the hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied for consumption off the premises in licensed premises and clubs and taken and dispatched therefrom in the evening on Sundays:

And each of the said Orders of the Board shall during the said period be read and have effect as if amended accordingly.

Exhibition of Order.

3. The secretary of every club to which this Order applies and every holder of a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor shall during the said period keep affixed in some conspicuous place in the club or in the licensed premises a copy of this Order.

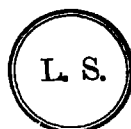
