tioned in the said Schedule may be advantageously made to wit:-

(a) The part of the Parish of St. John Newland edged round with and hatched brown on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Mary Sculcoates.

(b) The part of the Parish of St. Matthew coloured yellow on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St.

Thomas.

(c) The part of the Parish of St. Mary Lowgate which is situate within the limits of the boundaries of the Parish of Holy Trinity and coloured brown on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Holy Trinity and the triangular piece of the said Parish which lies north of a line drawn through the middle of Queens Dock and coloured yellow on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St.

(d) The detached parts of the Parish of Holy Trinity situate within the limits of the said Parish of St. Mary Lowgate and coloured red on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of

St. Mary.

(e) The part of the Parish of St. Paul edged round with and hatched red on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Christ Church and the part thereof coloured yellow on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Philip.

(f) The part of the Parish of St. Barnabas coloured green on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Thomas and the part thereof coloured blue on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. James.

(g) The part of the Parish of St. Mary Sculcoates edged round with and hatched blue on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Paul.

( $\hbar$ ) The detached part of the Parish of

Holy Trinity edged round with and hatched lake on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Barnabas.

(i) The detached part of the Parish of Holy Trinity coloured lake on the said Plan bounded on the south-west side by the Parish of St. Matthew, on the north side by the Parish of St. Augustine, and on the east side by the Parish of St. Jude with the excep-tion of that part thereof known as the Hymers College Estate situate in the centre thereof may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Jude.

(j) The part of the Parish of Holy Trinity which is edged round with and hatched yellow on the said Plan, with the exception of that part which forms the site of the old German Church at the corner of Nile Street,

may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Luke and the part thereof which is edged round with and hatched green

on the said Plan may be separated from that Parish and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. James.

"4. That pursuant to the directions contained in the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament the said Archbishop has prepared a Scheme in writing appended to this Report describing the mode in which it appears to him the alterations above described may be made with justice to all parties concerned and I do certify the same to Your Majesty in Council with the Consents in writing to the said Scheme of the said Archbishop and other Patrons of the various Benefices concerned as set out in the said Schedule and also the Consents of the Incumbents thereof as also set out in the said Schedule and to be affected thereby to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it should be thought expedient so to do may make an Order for carrying such Scheme into effect.
