

be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II. of the Principal Order are hereby fixed to be the thirty-first day of July and the first day of September.

Revocation.

4. The Sheep Dipping (Black Mountain District) Order of 1919 is hereby revoked.

Offences.

5. If the owner or person in charge of sheep to which a licence granted under Article 2 of this Order relates fails to comply with any condition specified in such licence he shall, according to his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 5TH JULY 1920.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Suffolk (Swine-Fever) Order of 1914 shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Suffolk and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.
