

INCOME TAX.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

NOTICE is hereby given, that by an Order dated the 30th day of June, 1920, the Minister of Health has confirmed an Order made on the 4th day of May, 1920, by the Urban District Council of Frimley, in pursuance of Section 112 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by Section 51 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, declaring each of the trades of Blood-drier, Tanner, Leather-dresser, Glue-maker, Size-maker, Gut-scraper, and Rag and bone dealer within the Urban District of Frimley to be an offensive trade.

SPECIAL ACTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1915.

BY virtue and in pursuance of the provisions of the above-named Act, the Minister of Transport hereby orders that the time limited by the Order of the Board of Trade

dated the 8th day of August, 1919, (1) for the completion of the railway and (2) for the exercise of the powers for the compulsory purchase of lands authorised by the North Devon and Cornwall Junction Light Railway Order, 1914, shall be extended for one year from the 28th day of August, 1920.

Extending time limited by Section 5 of the Llanfaelog Water Act, 1914.

VALLEY RURAL DISTRICT.

To the Rural District Council of Valley;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of the Llanfaelog Water Act, 1914, it is enacted that the powers of the Rural District Council of Valley (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purposes of that Act shall cease after the expiration of five years from the 8th day of July, 1914;

And whereas in pursuance of Section 1 of the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915, the Council applied to the Local Government Board before the expiration of the time limited as aforesaid for an Order extending that time;

And whereas the powers and duties of the Local Government Board have been transferred to the Minister of Health:

Now therefore, the Minister of Health, in pursuance of his powers in that behalf, hereby extends until the 8th day of July, 1920, the time within which the Council may exercise their powers for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purposes of the Llanfaelog Water Act, 1914.
