INCREASE OF RENT AND MORTGAGE INTEREST (RESTRICTIONS) ACT, 1920.

The Lord Chancellor has, in accordance with Section 17 of the Increase of Rent and Mortgage Interest (Restrictions) Act, 1920, made Rules with reference to the said Act which will come into operation on the 15th day of July, 1920.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that the Rule Committee of the Supreme Court propose to make the following Rules:—

1. The following Rule shall be added in Order XXXVI immediately after Rule 9, viz.:—

9A.—(1) All jury precepts, warrants, writs, lists and returns required to be issued or made under the Juries Acts, or any of them, shall include all women qualified and liable to serve

as jurors, and the jurors' books shall be made up accordingly.

- (2) All persons qualified and liable to serve as jurors shall be summoned to serve on juries without distinction of sex, but otherwise as heretofore; provided that a husband and wife shall not both be summoned to serve on the same occasion.
- (3) The number of women appearing upon any panel of jurors shall be in the same proportion, as near as may be, to the number of men appearing thereon as the total number of women is to the total number of men in the jurors' books or other list of jurors from which the panel is drawn.

Provided that it shall be the duty of the Under-Sheriff or other person upon whom is cast the duty of summoning jurors to secure that, wherever possible, there shall not be less than fourteen women upon the jury panel.

Provided also that this Rule shall not apply to Grand Juries.

- (4) On every trial by jury, the jury shall be selected from the panel by ballot in manner prescribed by Section 26 of the Juries Act, 1825; provided that this Rule shall be without prejudice to the power of the Court under Sec. 17 of the Juries Act, 1870, to order that a Special Jury be struck according to the practice then prevailing; provided also that this Rule shall not apply to Grand Juries.
- (5) Upon every jury summons served upon a woman there shall appear a notice that she may

apply to the Summoning Officer for exemption from attendance as a juror on account of pregnancy or other feminine condition or ailment provided that such application is received by the Summoning Officer within three days of the receipt of the Jury Summons by the applicant.

(6) The Under-Sheriff or other person upon whom is cast the duty of forming the Jury Panels may in his discretion exempt from attendance any woman who has been summoned to serve as juror, if he is satisfied by medical certificate or otherwise that on account of pregnancy or some other feminine condition or ailment she is, or will be, unfit to serve.

(7) In any civil cause, matter or issue to be tried in the High Court of Justice in London or at the Assizes with a Jury, an application under Section 1 (b) of the Sex Disqualification (Removal) Act, 1919, that the jury shall be composed of men only or of women only shall be made whenever possible by summons to be served not less than one clear day before the hearing of the application to the judge in whose list the case stands for hearing or to whom the case has been definitely assigned for trial; or, if such application by summons is not practicable, may be made to the judge at the trial.

2. These Rules may be cited as the Rules of the Supreme Court (Women Jurors), 1920.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918. BRUSH AND BROOM TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

Proposal to Vary and to Fix Certain Minimum Rates of Wages for Male Apprentices.

In accordance with Regulations made under section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Great Britain,

Provided that during the first twelve months of apprenticeship the Appentice shall receive a Guaranteed Time-Rate of not less than 12s. per week of 48 hours, and during the first six

for the branches of Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to fix General Minimum Time-Rates, General Minimum Piece-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male Apprentices specified in Section IV. of Part I. of the Schedule to this Notice, and to vary (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such notice being given) the General Minimum Piece-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Indentured Apprentices as defined in the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 28th May, 1920, employed on Piece-work, the proposed Mini-mum Rates and the proposed Variation of the Minimum Rates together with the General Minimum Time-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Apprentices as set out in the Trade Board's Notice dated 28th May, 1920, which will remain unaffected by these proposals being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Proposed Minimum Rates' and I'roposed Variation of Minimum Rates for Male Apprentices. (As defined in Part III. of this Schedule.)

The General Minimum Time-Rates, General Minimum Piece-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Apprentices as defined in Part III. of this Schedule who are employed in the branches of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, under the respective conditions set out in this Notice shall be as follows:—

SECTION I.—Male Apprentices who are apprenticed to:—

- (a) Any two or more of the following branches of the trade: (i.) Pan Work (Hair and Bass); (ii.) Hairs; (iii.) Drawing; (iv.) Wood Spindling; (v.) Sand Papering by Machine; (vi.) the manufacture of Whitewash Brushes; (vii.) the manufacture of Tar Brushes and "Sundries"; (viii.) Boring; or
- (b) The Cutting, Sorting and Dressing of Bass by hand when carried on in association with or conjunction with the manufacture of brushes (other than feather brushes) or brooms; shall receive:—
- of (a) The Proposed General Minimum Piece-Kates set out in Part I. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice of Proposal dated 10th May, 1920;

Where no General Minimum Piece-Rates applicable to the work on which the apprentice is engaged have been made effective; of

(b) Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker, not less than 1s. 5½d. an hour.

Provided also that the Minimum Rates set out in this section shall only apply in cases where a Journeyman Instructor has responsibility for the work of the Apprentice during the first 12 months and supervision of the Apprentice during the remainder of the apprenticeship in the journeyman's own section of the trade, and where during the first nine months of employment in any branch of the trade a Journeyman is paid by the employer in respect of the instruction of and responsibility for the Apprentice, a sum each week equivalent to the difference between the earnings of the Apprentice on the above Minimum Piece-Rates and the sum which the Apprentice would have earned if he had been employed at the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the General Minimum Piece-Rate applicable as set out in Part I. of this Schedule, or, where no General Minimum Piece-Rate has been made effective, a Piece-Rate which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker at least the same amount of money as the General Minimum Time-Rate, with the addition in both cases of One-Half of the General Minimum Time-Rate which would ue applicable to the worker if he were

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:-

- 1. The Norfolk (Emneth District) (Footand-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920, and the Norfolk (Emneth District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1920 (Nos. 2, 3, 4, and 5), hereinafter referred to as "the existing Orders," are modified in the manner hereinafter appearing.
- 2. The Scheduled District for the purposes of the existing Orders shall be the district described in the First Schedule hereto.
- -(1) The Areas described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be Prohibited Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order.'
- (2.) Part III of the principal Order shall apply to such parts of the Scheduled District, which includes the said Prohibited Areas, as are not within a Prohibited Area.
- (3.) The provisions of Article 2 of the Norfolk (Emneth District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 shall continue to apply to the Prohibited Areas, and the provisions of Article 6 of the "principal Order" shall be read and have effect subject to this modifica-
- This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty.
- 5. This Order may be cited as the Norfolk (Emneth District) (Foot and Mouth (EMNETH DISTRICT) (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 6), and shall be read with the existing Orders.

- (2) An Area comprising the city and county borough of Sheffield (15 March, 1920).
- (3) An Area comprising the petty sessional division of Dewsbury, and the parishes of Drighlington, Hunsworth, Cleckheaton, Clifton, Hartshead and Kirkheaton, in the administrative county of the West Riding of Yorkshire, and also comprising the county borough of Huddersfield (3 July, 1920).
