Whereas Section 1 of the Profiteering Act, 1919 (9 & 10 Geo. 5, c. 66), as amended by the Profiteering (Amendment) Act, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. 5, c. 13), provides that that Section may be applied by Order of the Board of Trade to any article or class of articles declared by the Order to be one or one of a kind in common use by the public or being material, machinery

or accessories used in the production thereof.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade do hereby declare that the articles of food set out in the Schedule annexed hereto are articles of a kind in common use by the public, and do hereby order that Section 1 of the Profiteering Act, 1919 (9 & 10 Geo. 5, c. 66), as amended by the Profiteering (Amendment) Act, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. 5, c. 13), shall apply to each article of food specifically mentioned in the

Schedule hereto.

This Order shall come into force as from the twelfth day of July, 1920, and may be cited as the Profiteering Acts, 1919 and 1920, Order (No. 11).
