THE PROFITEERING ACTS, 1919 AND 1920,
ORDER (No. 14), DATED JULY 24TH, 1920,
MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER
SECTION 1 OF THE PROFITEERING ACT, 1919
(9 & 10 GEO. 5, C. 66), AS AMENDED BY THE
PROFITEERING (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1920 (10
& 11 GEO. 5, C. 13).

Whereas Section 1 of the Profiteering Act,
1919 (9 & 10 Geo. 5, c. 66), as amended by the
Profiteering (Amendment) Act, 1920 (10 & 11
Geo. 5, c. 13), provides that that Section may
be applied by Order of the Board of Trade to
any article or class of articles declared by the
Board to be one or one of a kind in common
use by the public, or being material, machinery
or accessories used in the production thereof.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade do
hereby declare that the articles of food set out

in the Schedule annexed hereto are articles of
a kind in common use by the public, and do
hereby order that Section 1 of the Profiteering
Act, 1919 (9 & 10 Geo. 5, c. 66), as amended
by the Profiteering (Amendment) Act, 1920
(10 & 11 Geo. 5, c. 13), shall apply to each
article of food specifically mentioned in the
Schedule hereto.

This Order shall come into force as from the
second day of August, 1920, and may be
cited as the Profiteering Acts, 1919 and 1920,
Order (No. 14).

CORSET TRADE BOARD.

PROPOSAL TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES, PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES
AND OVERTIME RATES FOR FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the
Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade
Boards Act, 1918, for the Corset Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919,
HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that
they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and
Overtime Rates for Female and Male Workers, at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their
Notices dated the 26th November, 1919, and 12th March, 1920, the proposed Variations in the
Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the Notice of Proposal to Vary being given.

The General Minimum Time-Rates for Learners under 14 years of age shall be 10s. per week of 48 hours, or 2½d. per hour, and from the age of 14 years they shall be entitled to the amounts shown in Column I. above as if they had commenced at 14.
