On the expiration of one year's service in the trade, these workers shall receive such rates as their age may entitle them to under the foregoing provisions.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers.

Overtime Rates, calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates specified in Part I of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part III of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board dated 26th November, 1919, shall apply in substitution for the Minimum Rates otherwise applicable, as set out in Part I of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board, in the Notice above referred to, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III,

Section I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in respect of any time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919, that is to say:

- (a) The manufacture of corsets, stays, children's corset bodices, infants' stay bands, bust confiners, such as brassières and bandeaux when boned or with elastic webbing in their construction.
- (b) The manufacture of support or abdominal belts and similar articles, except where

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
